Lhanbryde is in Moray. It is the church place of St Bryde and was a kirkton whose development increased following the arrival of the railway. The station is now closed but the town is popular with commuters to Elgin.

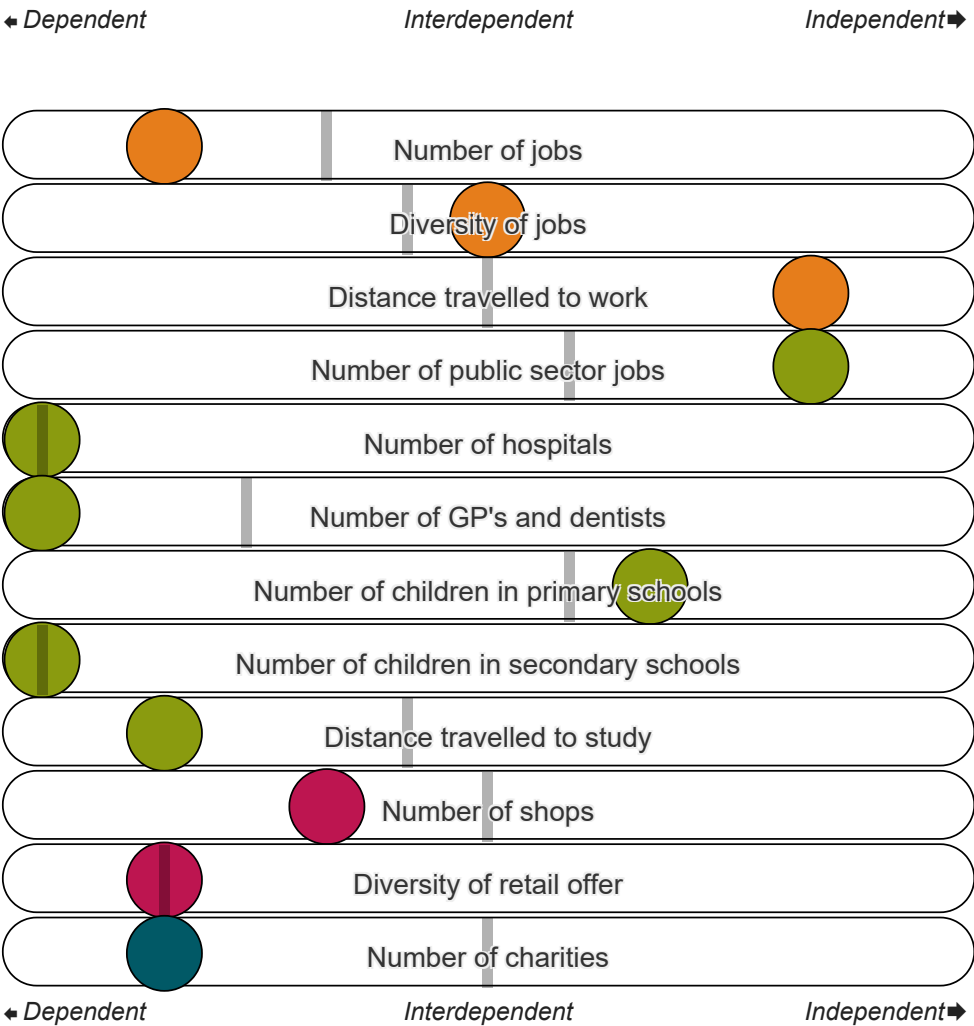
In this, and similar small towns, people experience more challenging circumstances with higher rates of unemployment, poorer health, lack of a car, lower levels of education and lower social grades than other groups. A higher proportion live in social rented housing. There is a higher proportion of single person households and lone parents.

Lhanbryde is an **interdependent to dependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Lhanbryde is grouped with 13 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of hospitals, children in primary schools, children in secondary schools, jobs, shops, and diversity of retail offer. It also has similarities in the diversity of jobs.

It differs in terms of the number of public sector jobs. It also differs in the distance travelled to work. Lhanbryde differs most from its group in the number of charities; and the distance travelled to study.

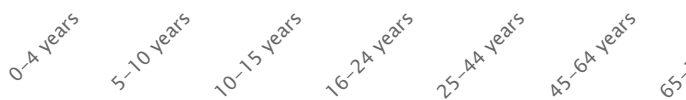

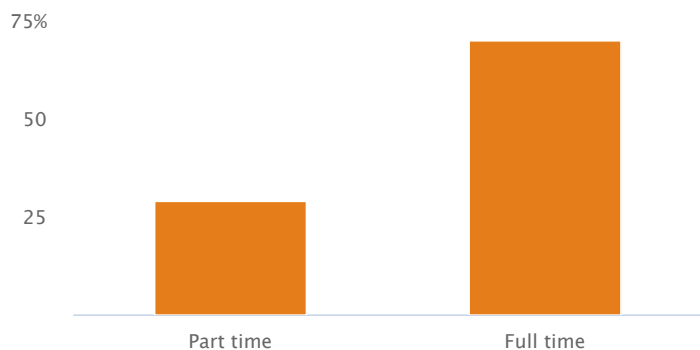

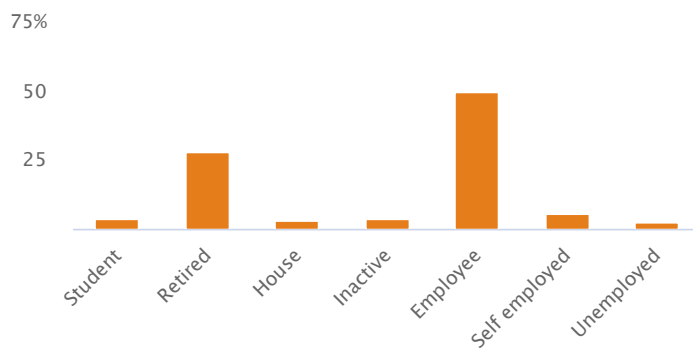
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



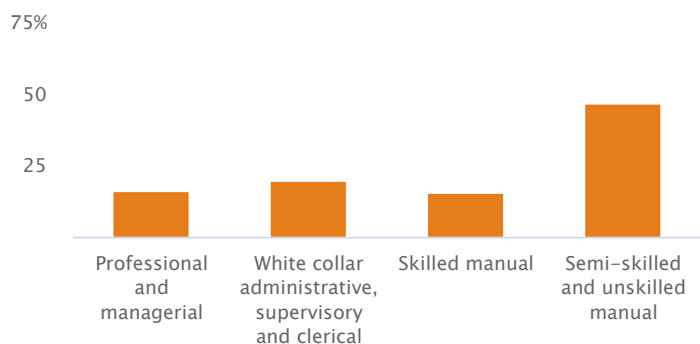
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

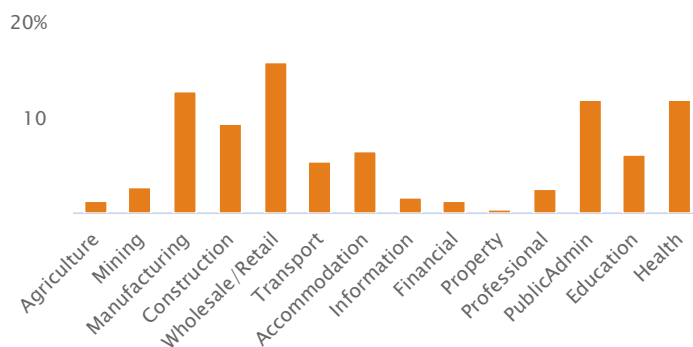


Social Grade

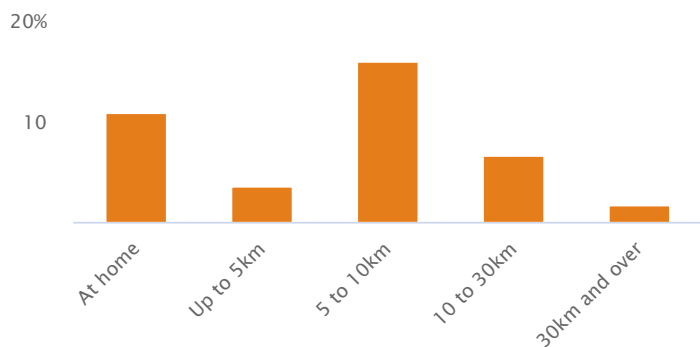
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

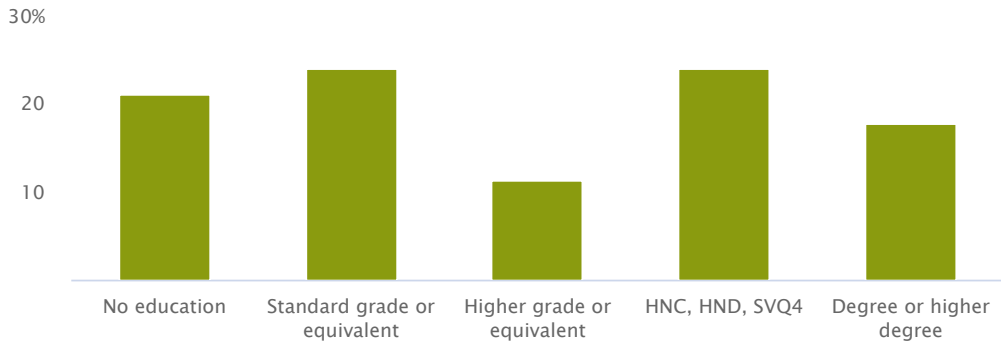


Distance travelled to work

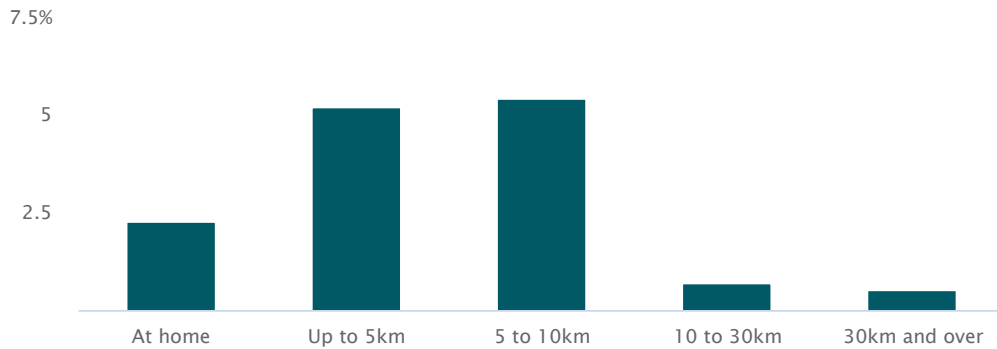
