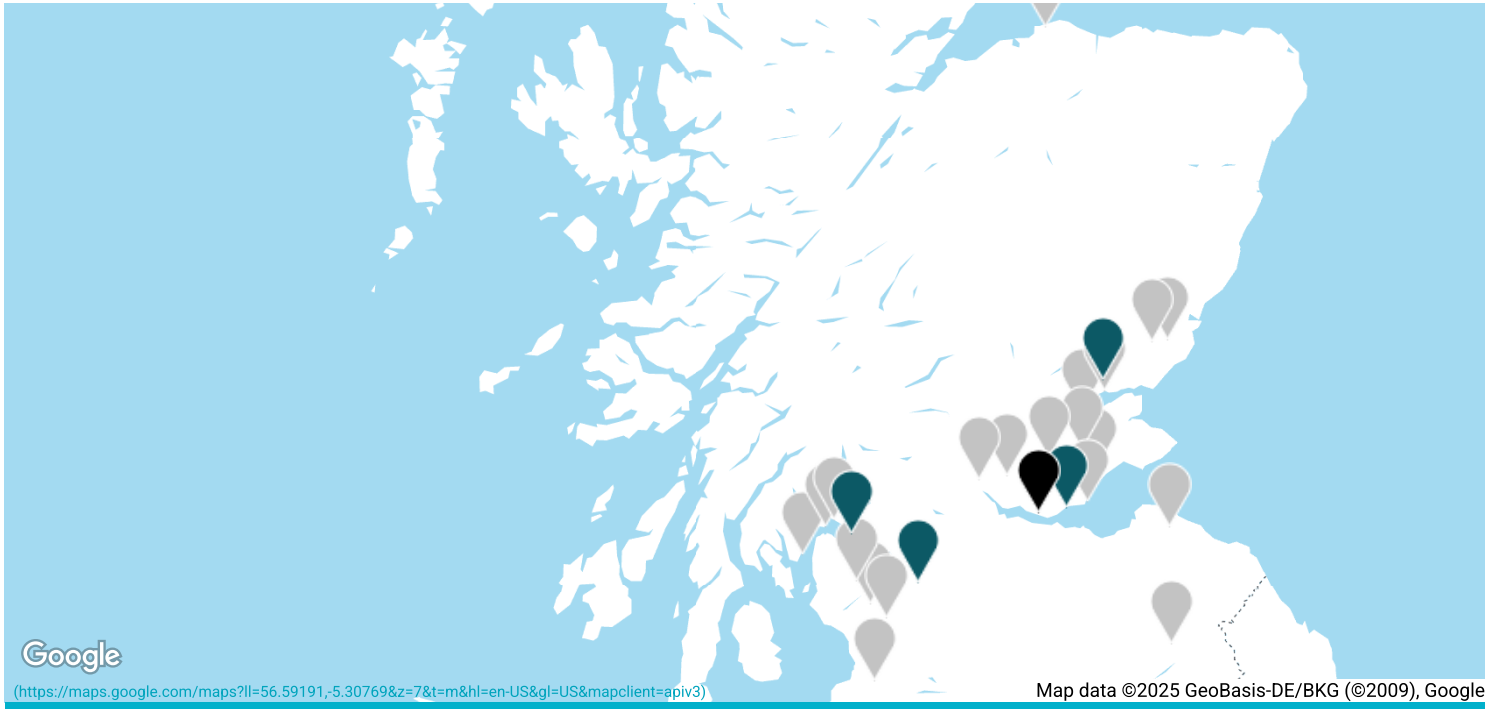




Limekilns and Charlestown

Limekilns in Fife was the medieval port for Dunfermline. As its name suggests lime was one of the exports. Rope and soap were manufactured in medieval times. A ferry across the River Forth operated from Limekilns. Today it is a conservation village and is primarily residential.

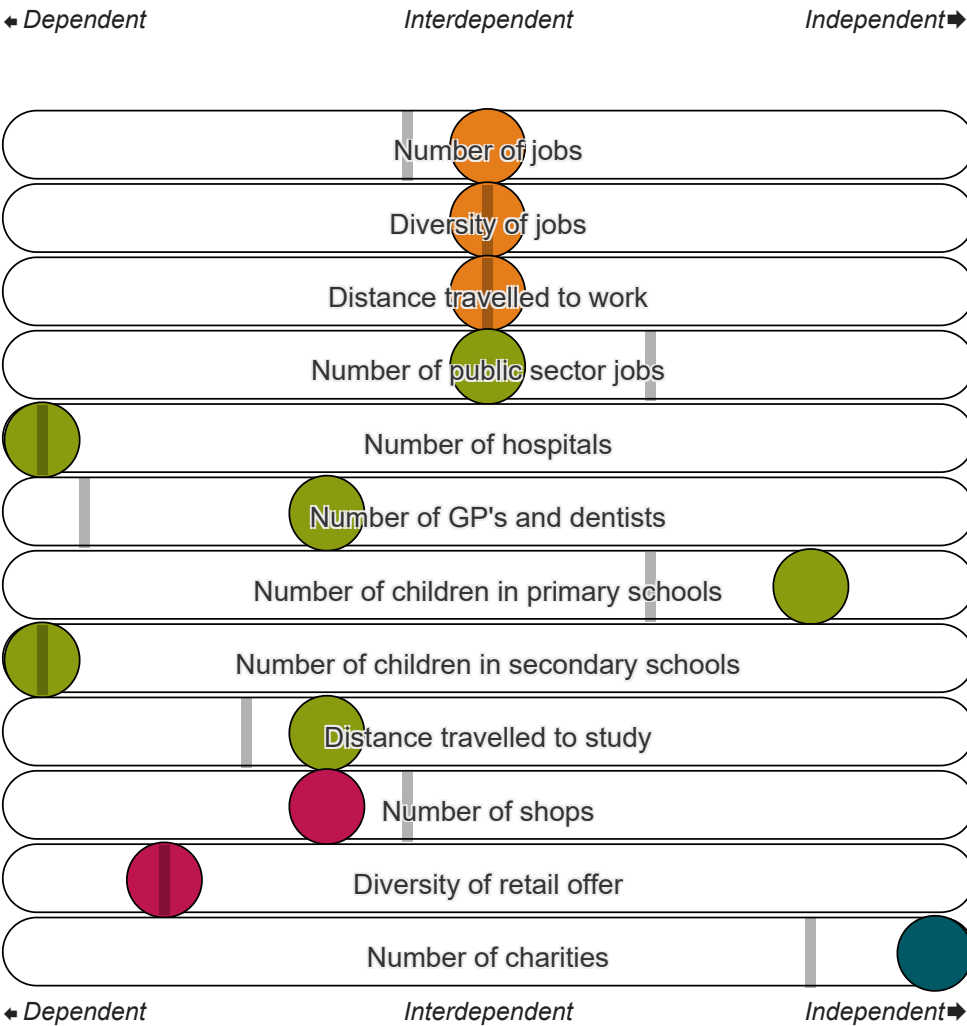
In this and similar small towns, the population is commonly older. The group has higher social grade status than other groups, a higher proportion are owner occupiers and car ownership is also higher.

Limekilns and Charlestown is an interdependent to dependent town.

Limekilns and Charlestown is an **interdependent to dependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Limekilns and Charlestown is grouped with 24 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of hospitals, children in primary schools, children in secondary schools, jobs, public sector jobs, shops, and diversity of retail offer. It also has similarities in the diversity of jobs, the distance travelled to work, and the distance travelled to study.

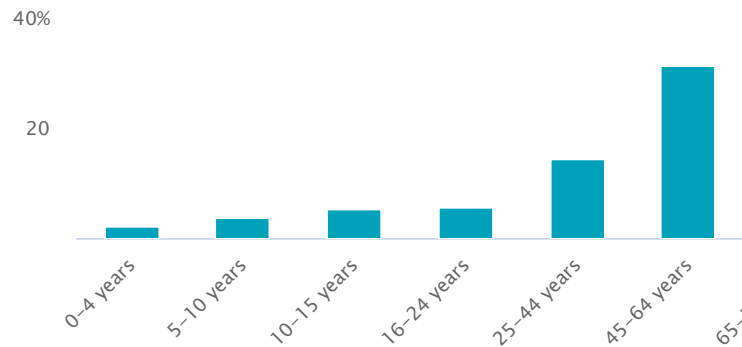

Population change 2011 to 2022**-7%**

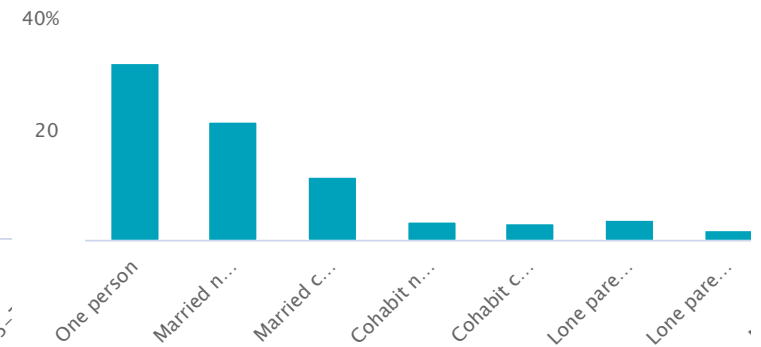

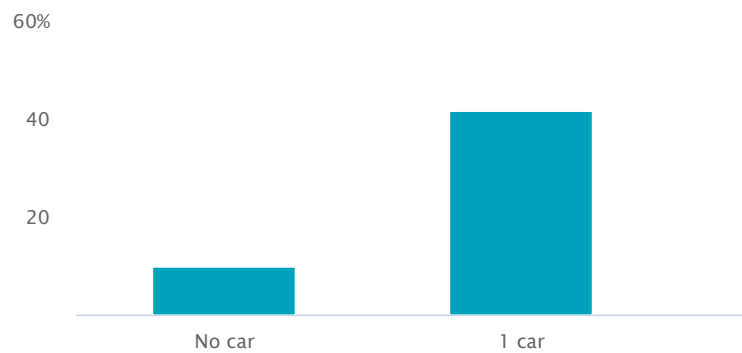

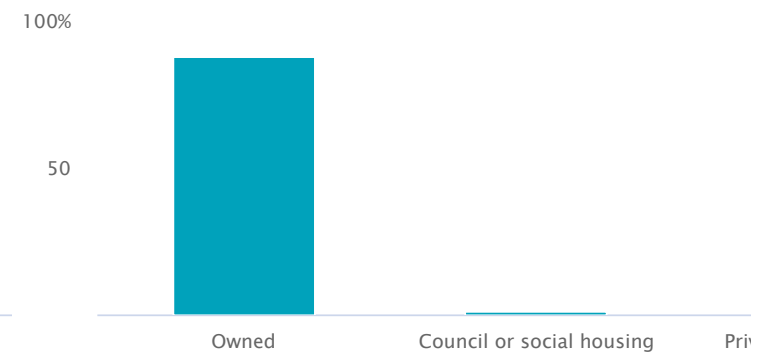
Household composition

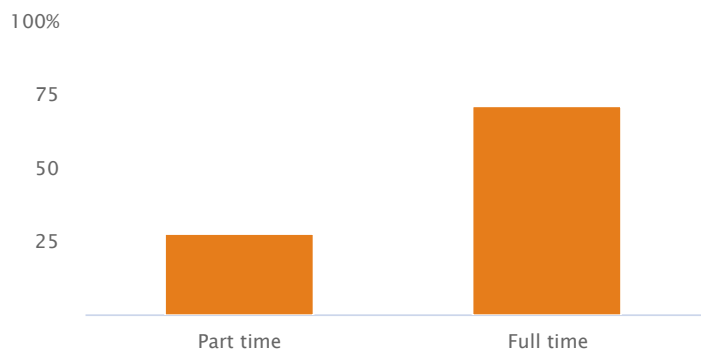

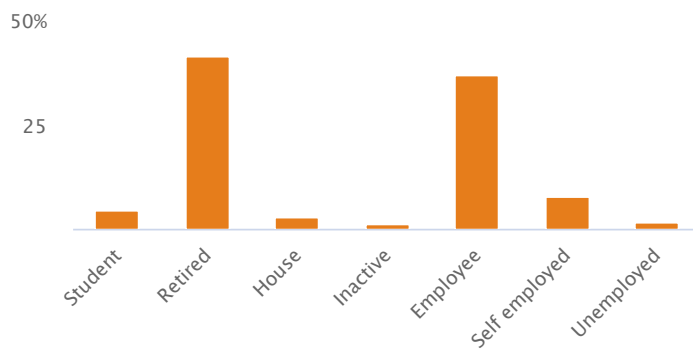
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



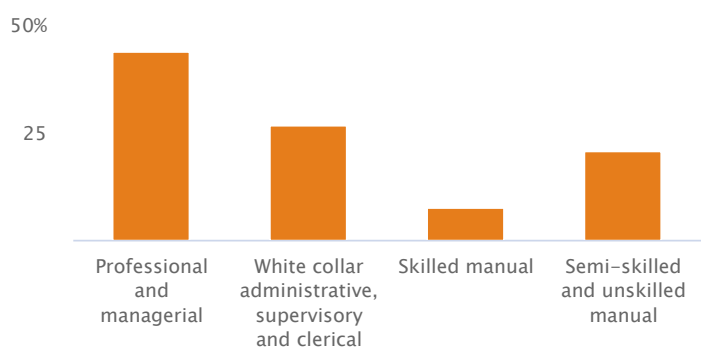
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

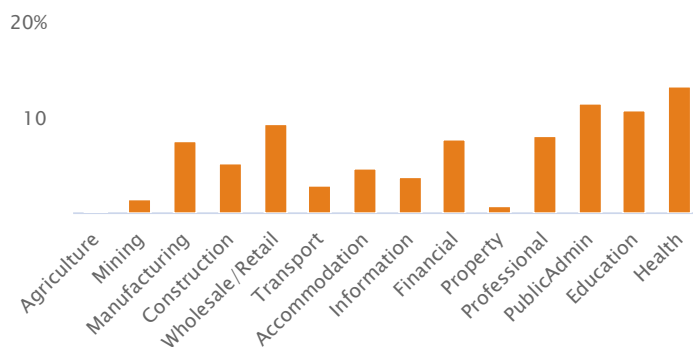


Social Grade

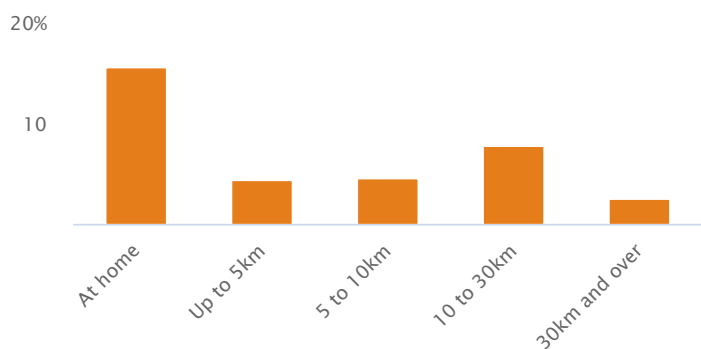
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

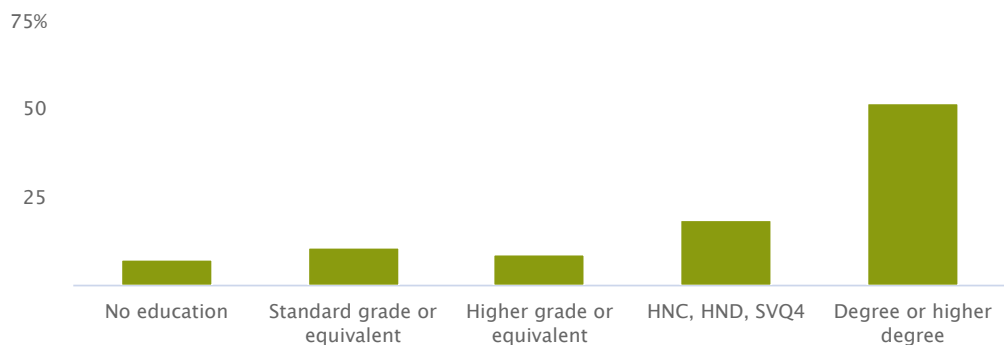


Distance travelled to work

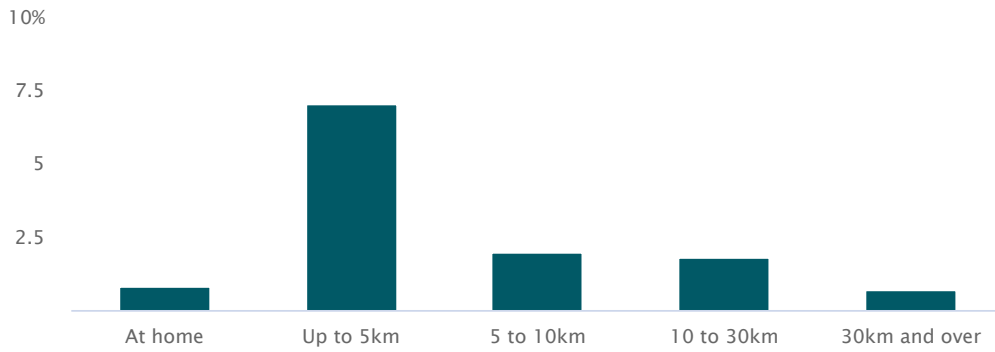
