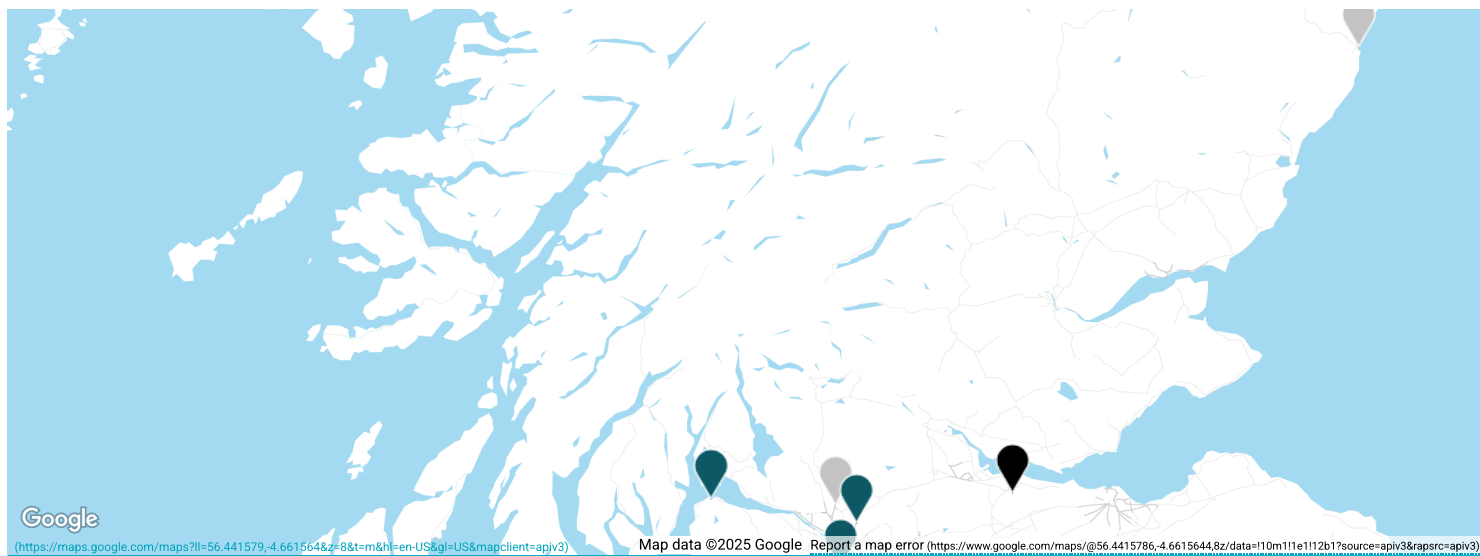




Linlithgow

POPULATION **12,517**

Linlithgow in West Lothian is the administrative centre of the council region. It was a Roman fort and later an historic burgh. As a favourite with royalty (the palace is 12th century) it obtained commercial privileges. These declined after the reformation and the Union of the Crowns. In the 19th and early 20th centuries industries included the Nobel explosive works, tanneries and a distillery. Since the 1960s redevelopment of the town and new housing have seen its popularity with commuters increase. It remains a local service centre.

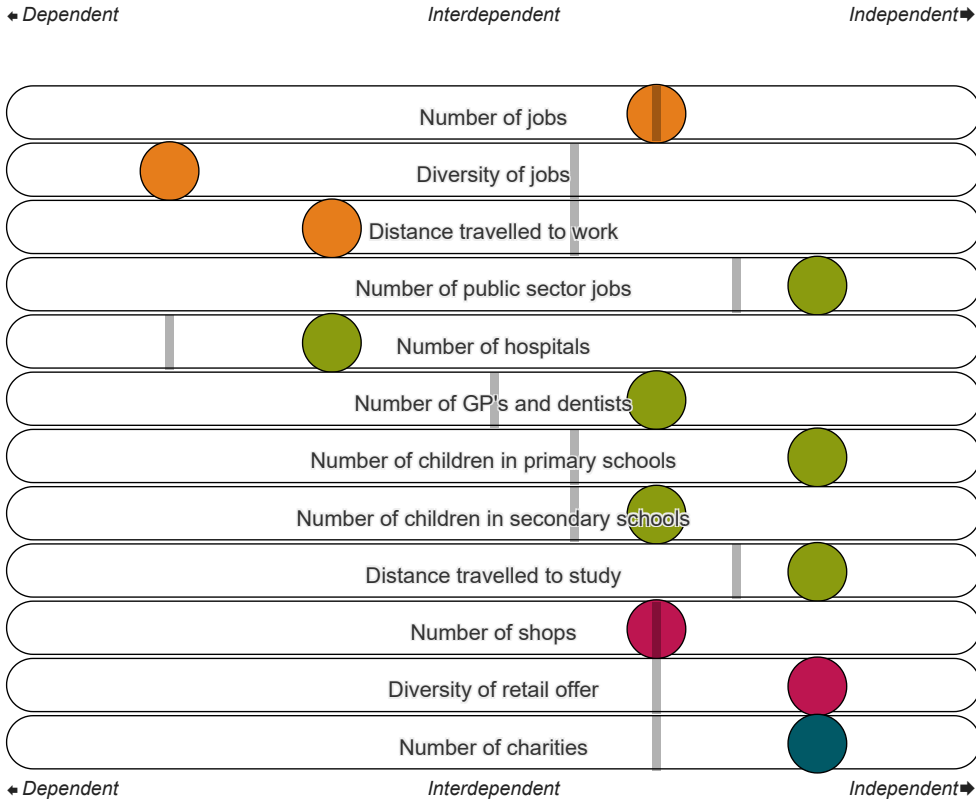
In large towns such as this one, the population typically is older. The group has higher social grade status than other groups, a higher proportion are owner occupiers and car ownership is also higher.

Linlithgow is an interdependent to independent town.

Inter-relationships



Linlithgow is an **interdependent to independent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Linlithgow is grouped with 7 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of children in secondary schools, jobs, public sector jobs, shops, and diversity of retail offer. It also has similarities in the distance travelled to study.

It differs in terms of the number of children in primary schools. It also differs in the distance travelled to work. Linlithgow differs most from its group in the diversity of jobs.

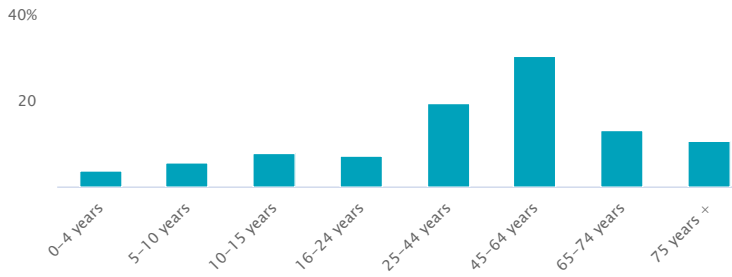

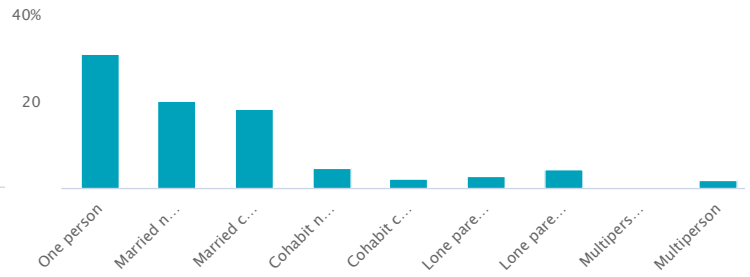

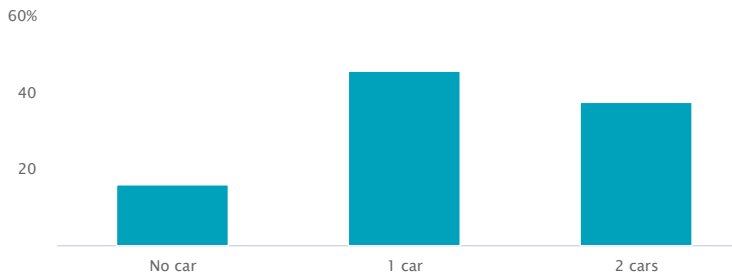

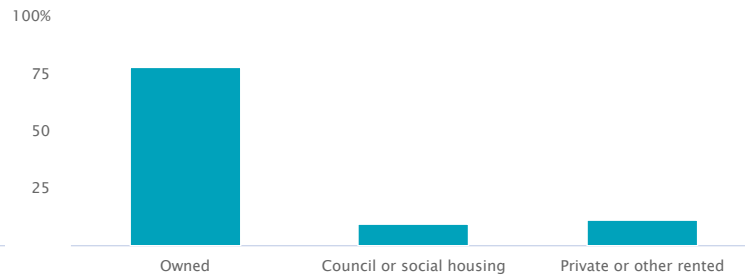

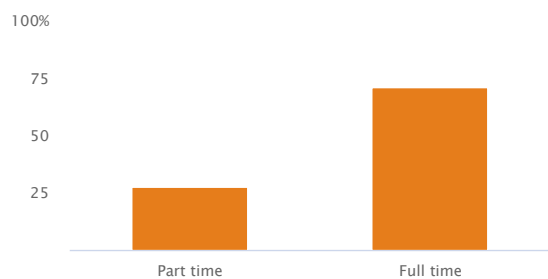

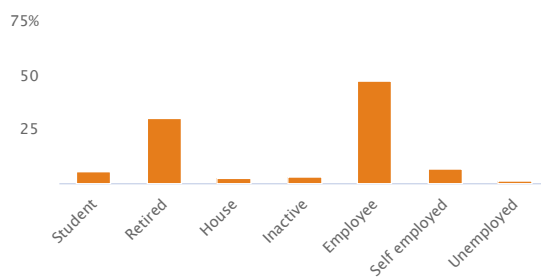
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



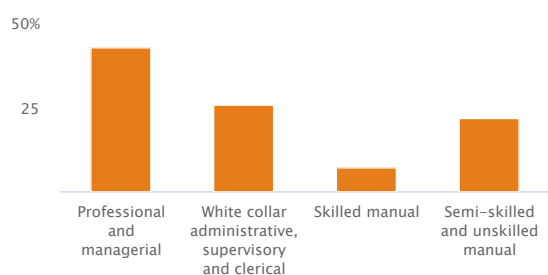
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

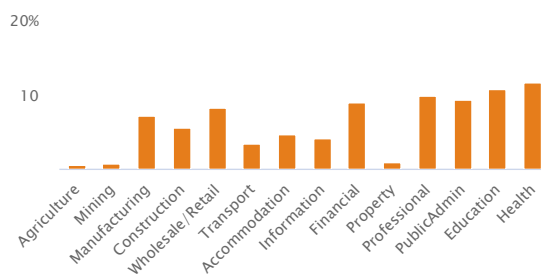


Social Grade

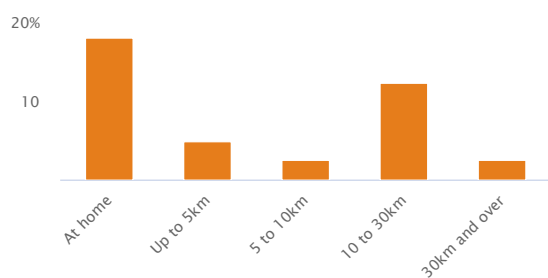
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

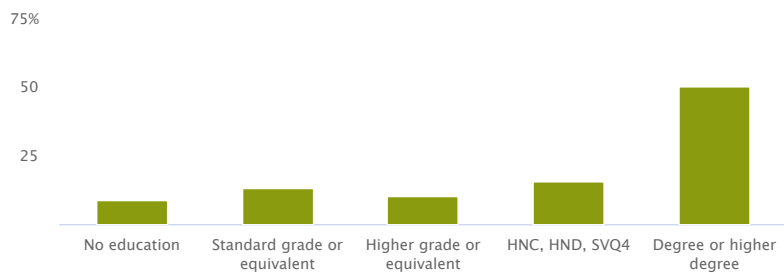


Distance travelled to work

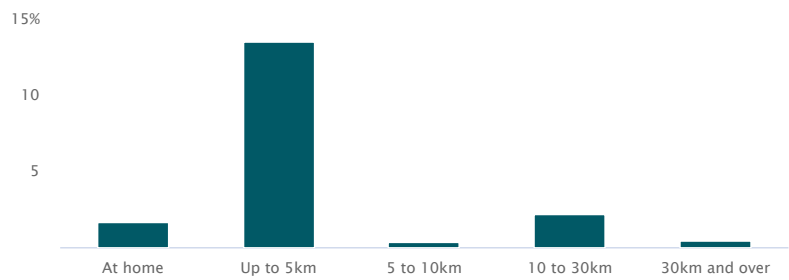
