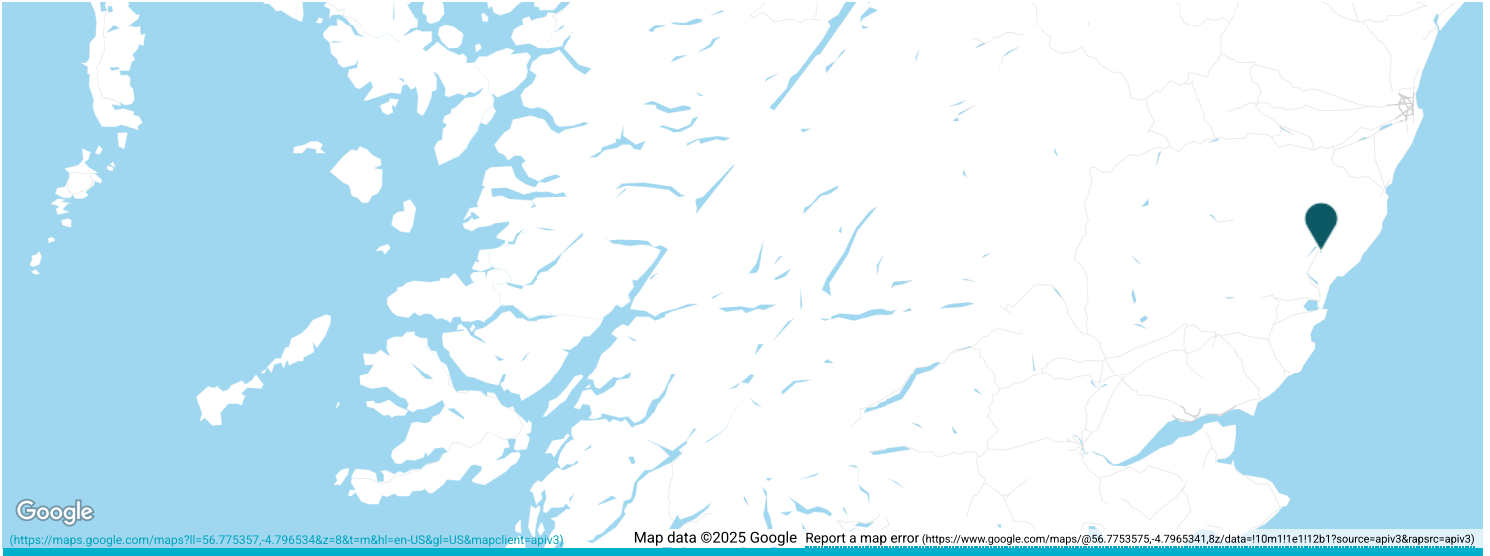




Lossiemouth

Lossiemouth is in Moray. It developed as a fishing village and port for Elgin. It is dominated by RAF Lossiemouth.

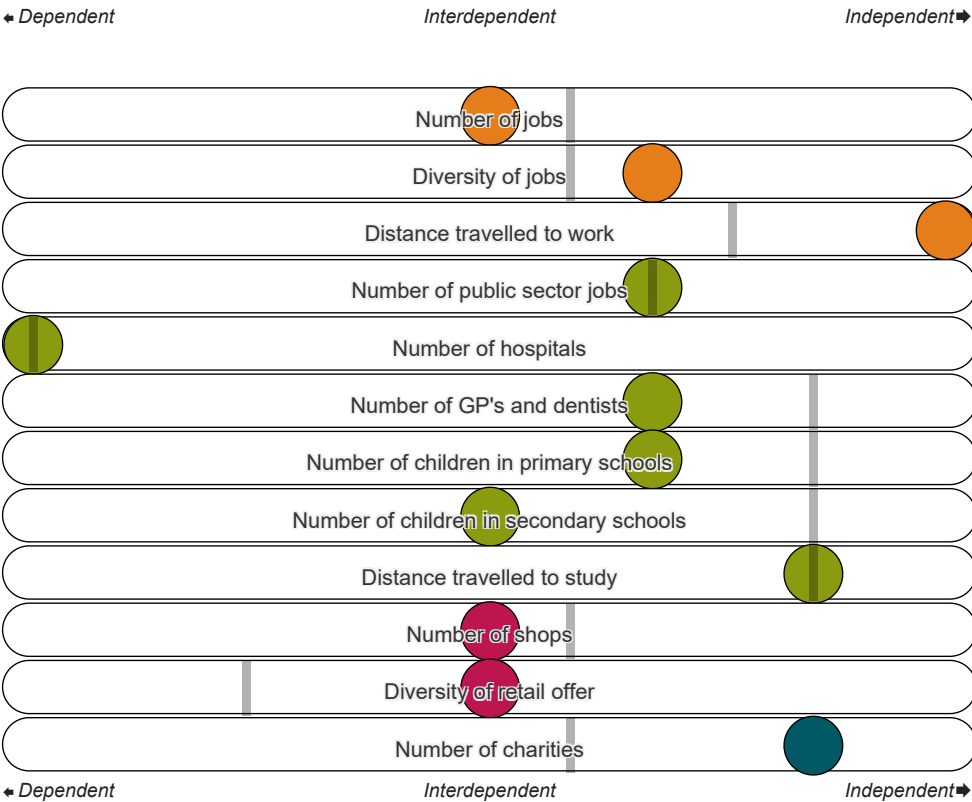
In this and similar medium towns, this population comprises families with a higher proportion of adults in the 25–44 age grouping. Higher rates of full time employment are found.

Lossiemouth is an **interdependent to independent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Lossiemouth is grouped with 4 other towns. It also has similarities in the diversity of jobs, and the distance travelled to study.

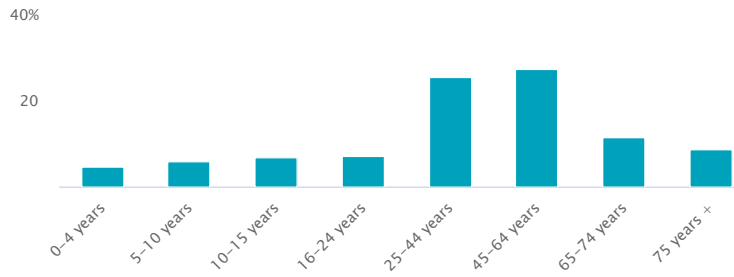

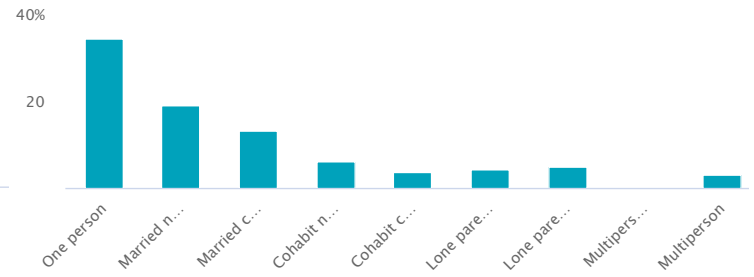

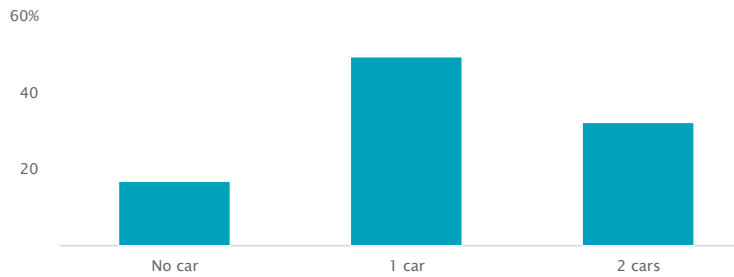

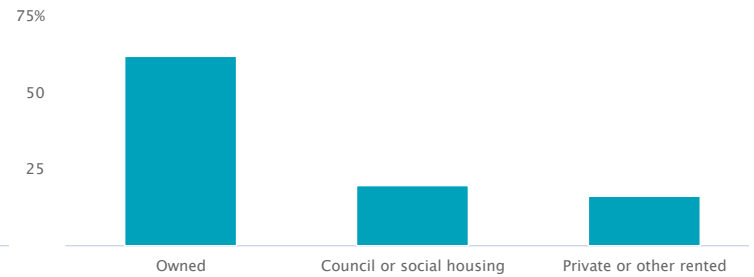

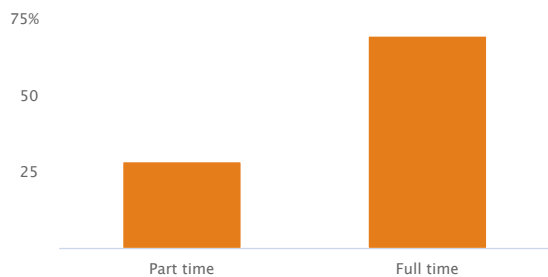

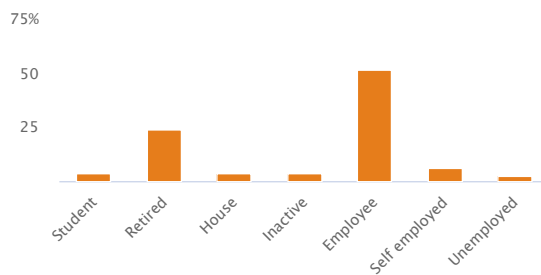
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



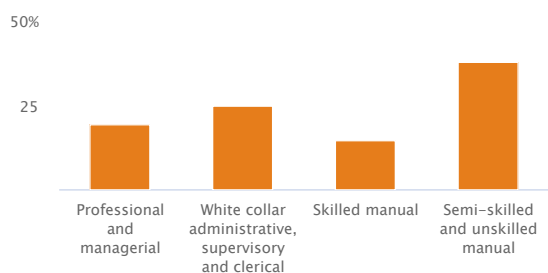
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

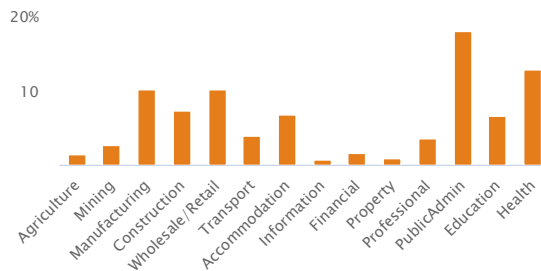


Social Grade

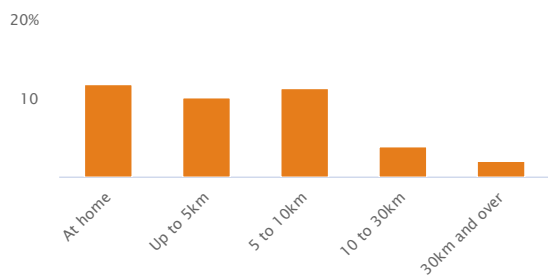
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

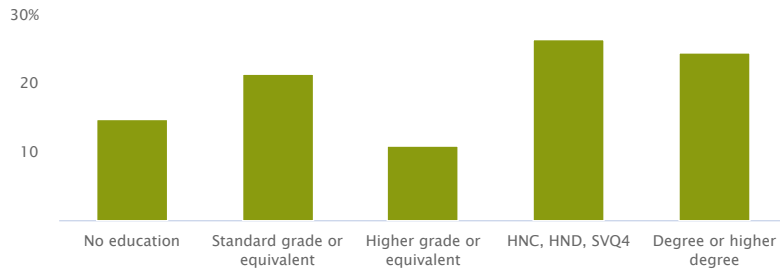


Distance travelled to work

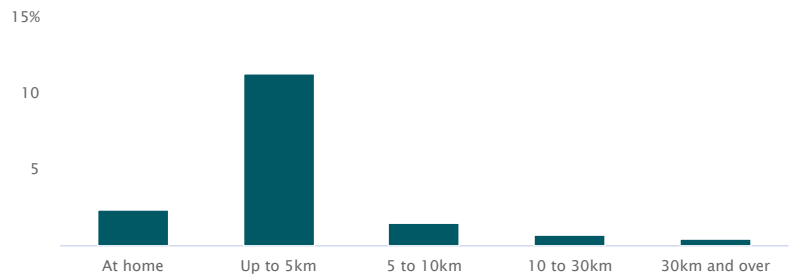
