Macduff is in Aberdeenshire. The original hamlet was called Doune but as the town developed and a harbour was built local landowner Duff gave the town its name. Both historically and today fishing is a key activity and the town has become known for its shellfish. A soft drinks manufacturer also provides employment and the 18th century harbour attracts tourists.

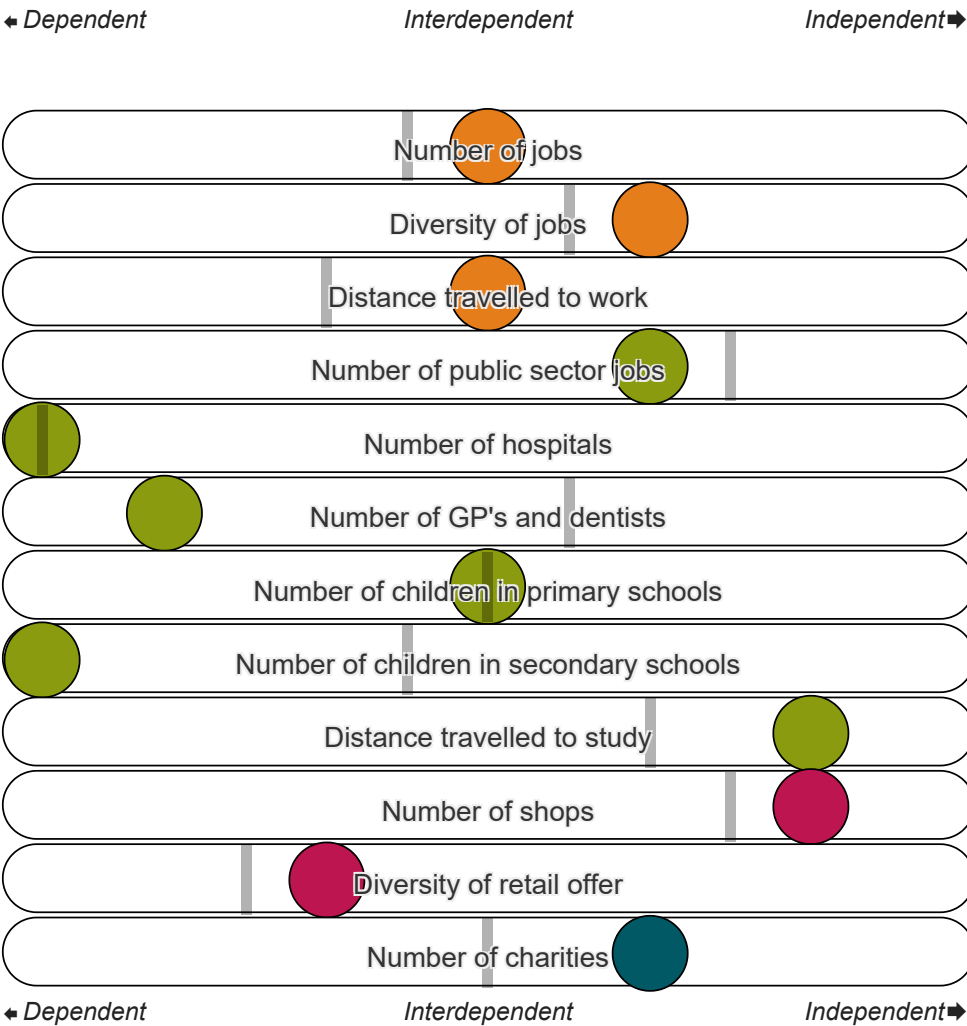
In this medium town, population includes older people, some still in work often in less well paid sectors. It also includes a significant inactive population, some in poorer health. There is a higher proportion of single households and car ownership is lower.

Macduff is an interdependent town.

Macduff is an **interdependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Macduff is grouped with 5 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of charities, hospitals, children in primary schools, jobs, public sector jobs, shops, and diversity of retail offer. It also has similarities in the diversity of jobs, the distance travelled to work, and the distance travelled to study.

It differs in terms of the number of GP's and dentists. Macduff differs most from its group in the number of children in secondary schools.

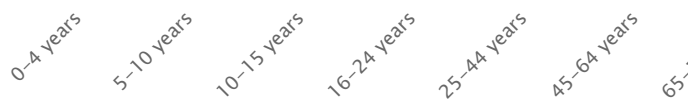

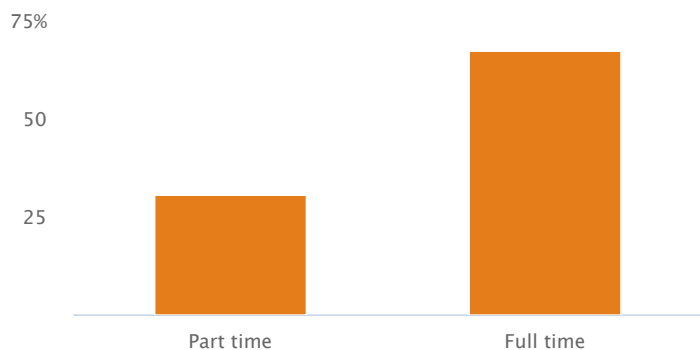

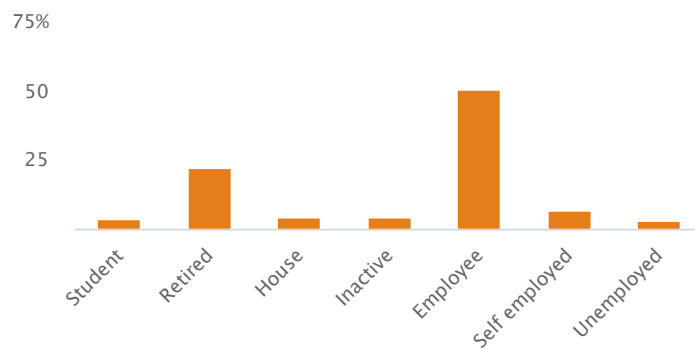
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



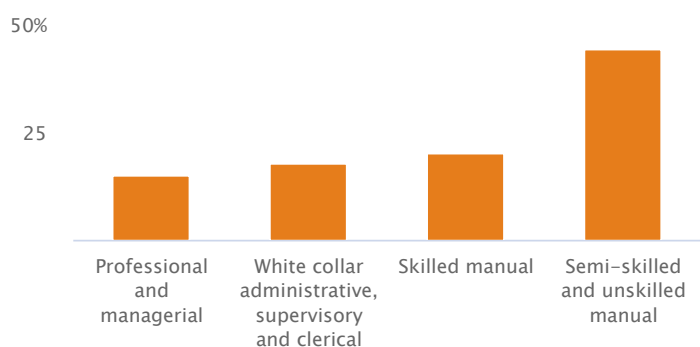
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

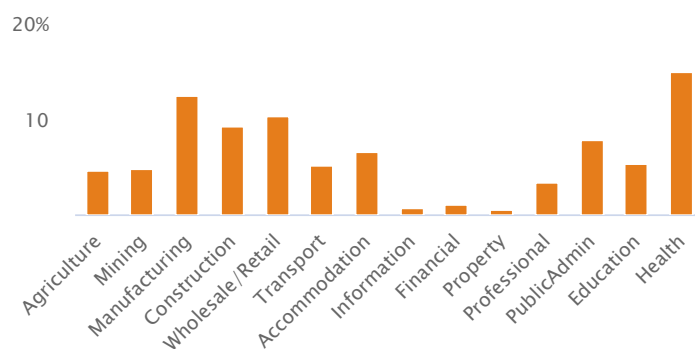


Social Grade

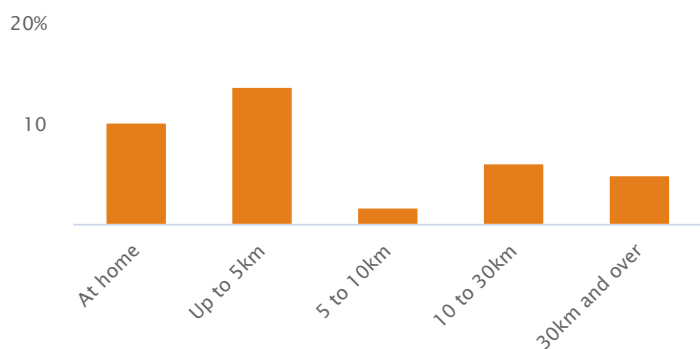
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

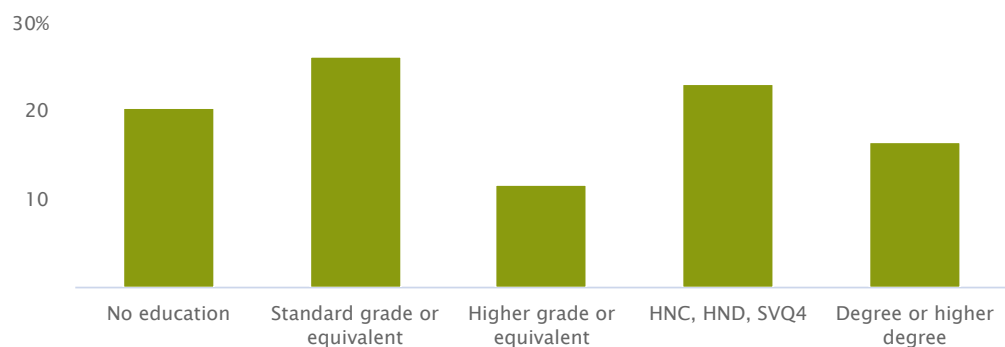


Distance travelled to work

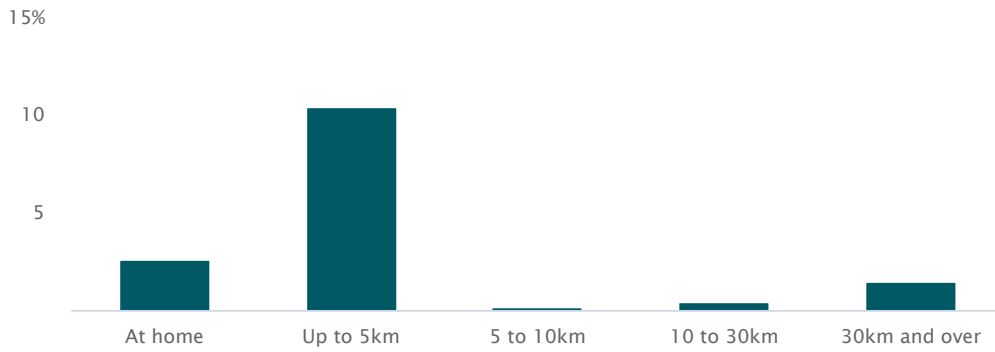
