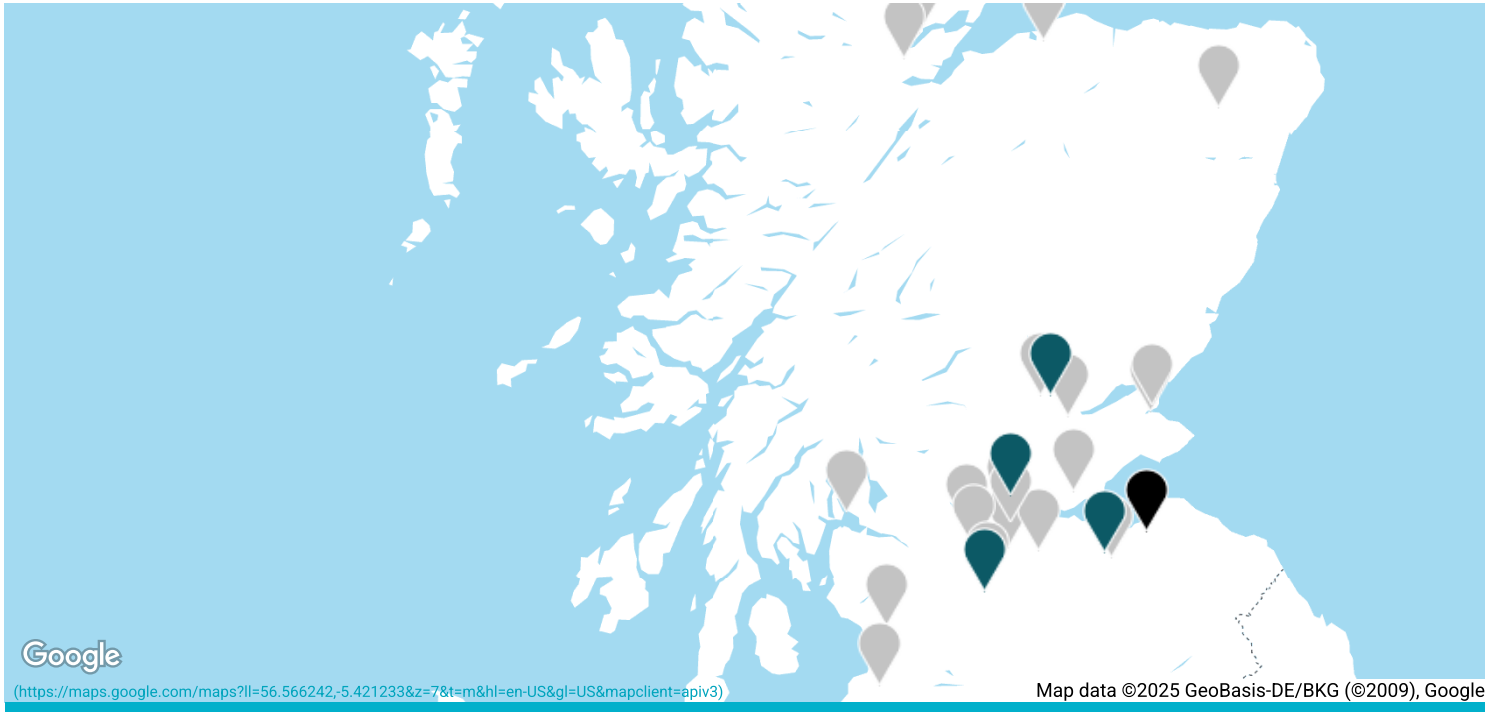

Macmerry in East Lothian was largely built by NCB to house miners.

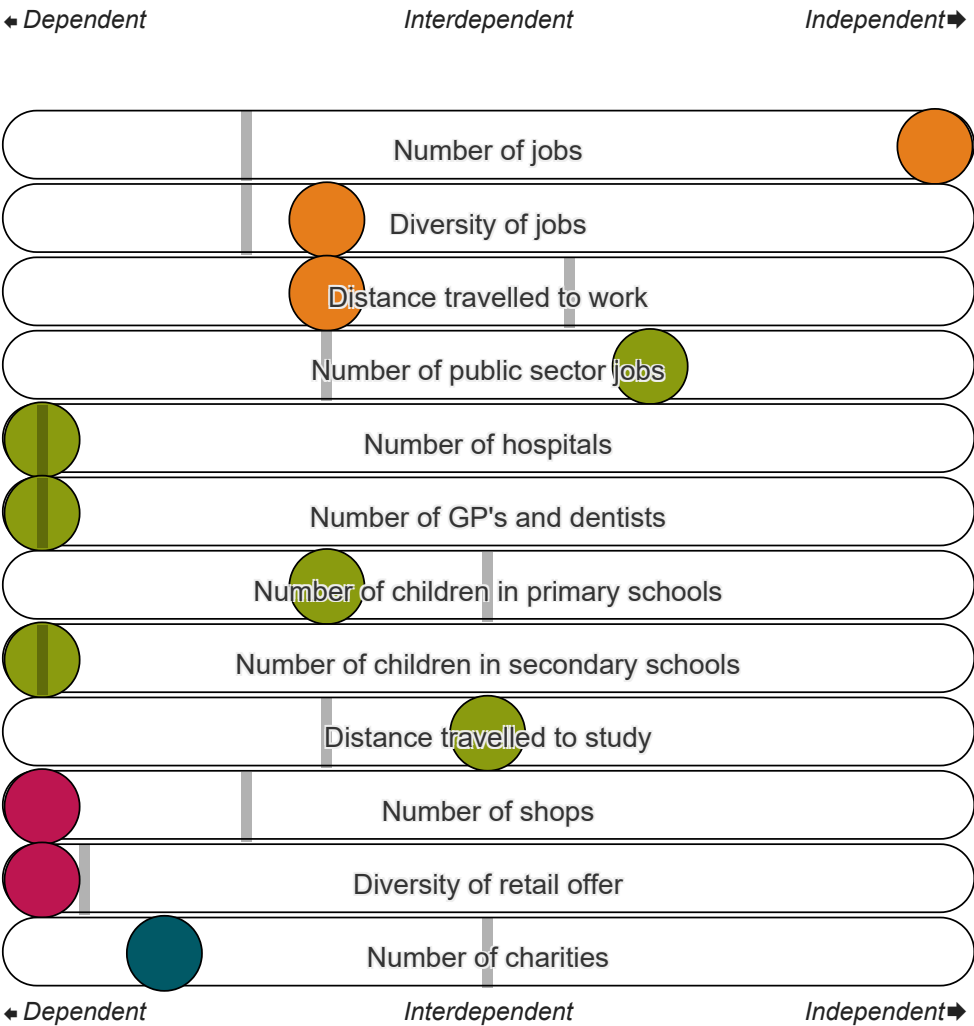
In this type of small town, the population comprises families with a higher proportion of adults in the 25–44 age grouping. Higher rates of full time employment are found.

Inter-relationships



Macmerry is a **dependent to interdependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Macmerry is grouped with 25 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of hospitals, children in primary schools, children in secondary schools, GP's and dentists, and diversity of retail offer. It also has similarities in the diversity of jobs, and the distance travelled to study.

It differs in terms of the number of jobs, and public sector jobs. Macmerry differs most from its group in the number of charities.

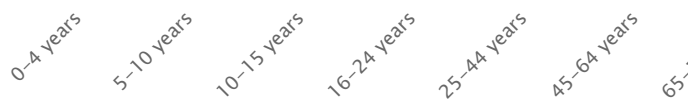

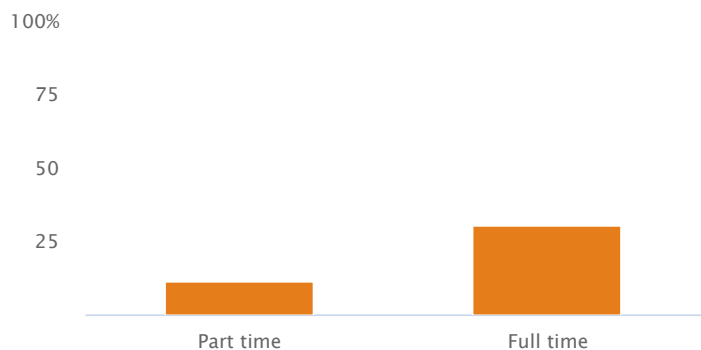

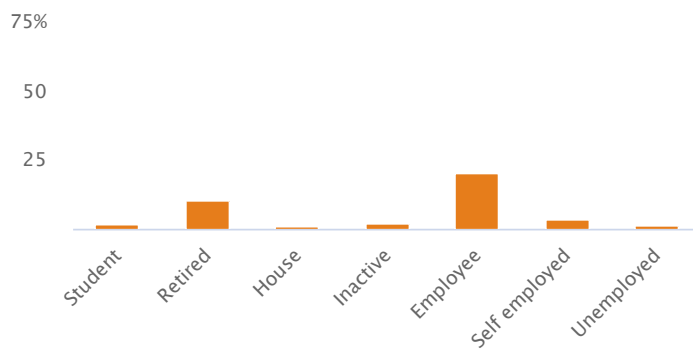
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



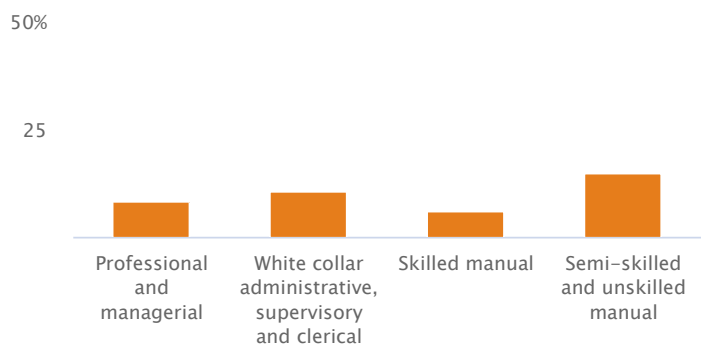
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

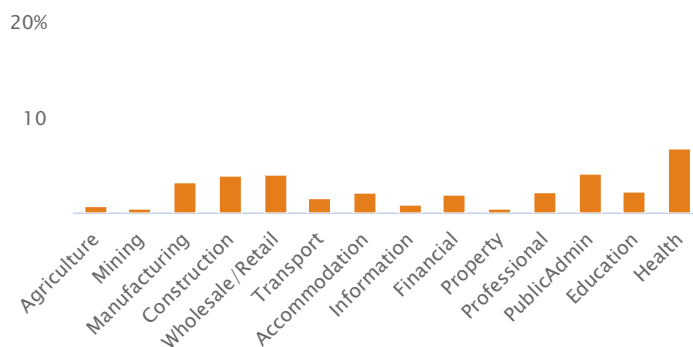


Social Grade

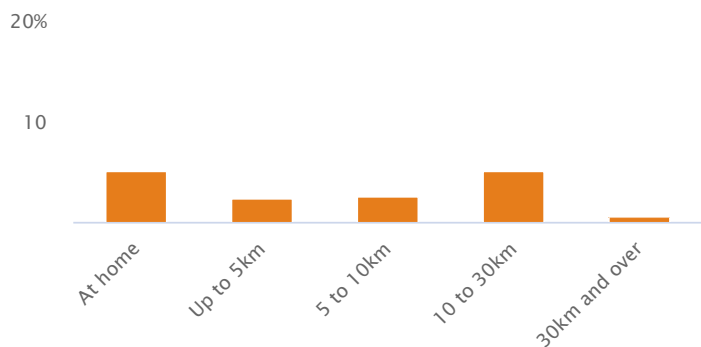
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

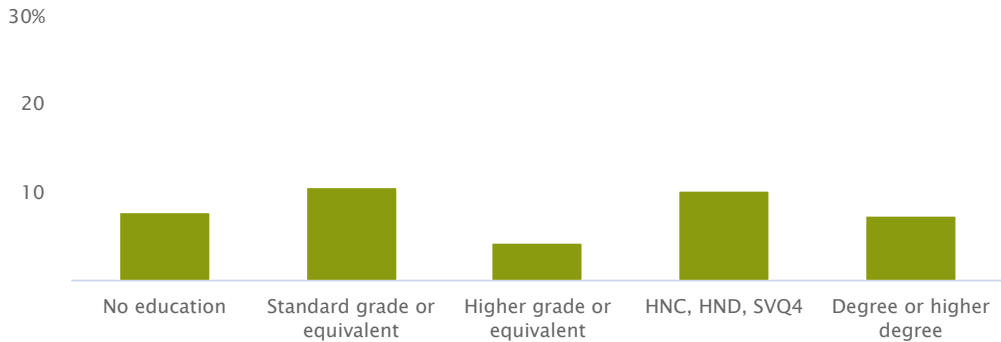


Distance travelled to work

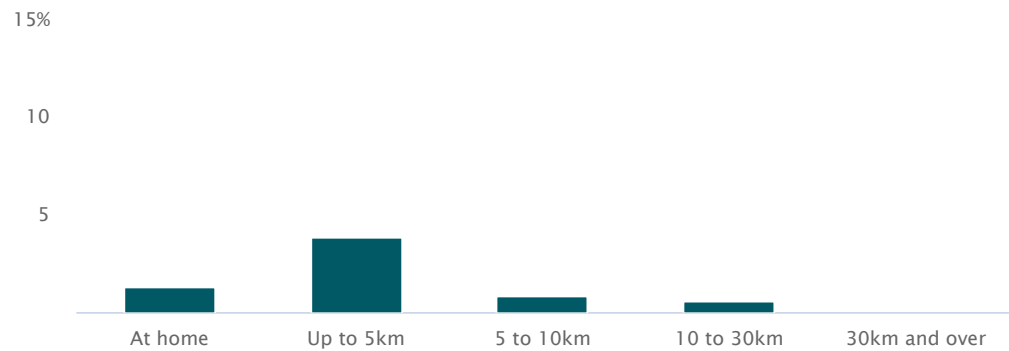
