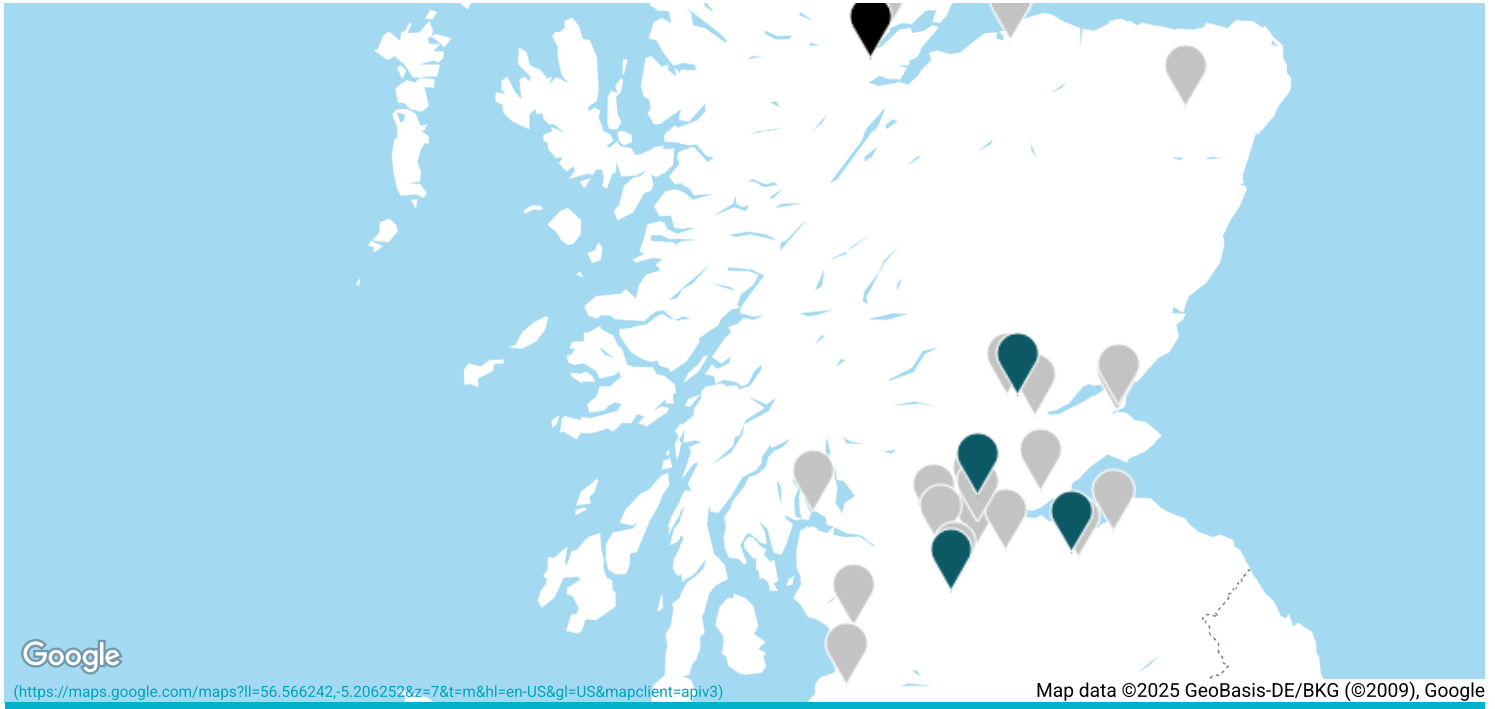

Maryburgh is in Easter Ross in . It dates from 1815 when the village was established as an estate village by the local landowner, who also gave it its name. The village remained undeveloped until the coming of the Hydro electric expansion, the aluminium smelter and then oil developments. Much of the housing dates from that era.

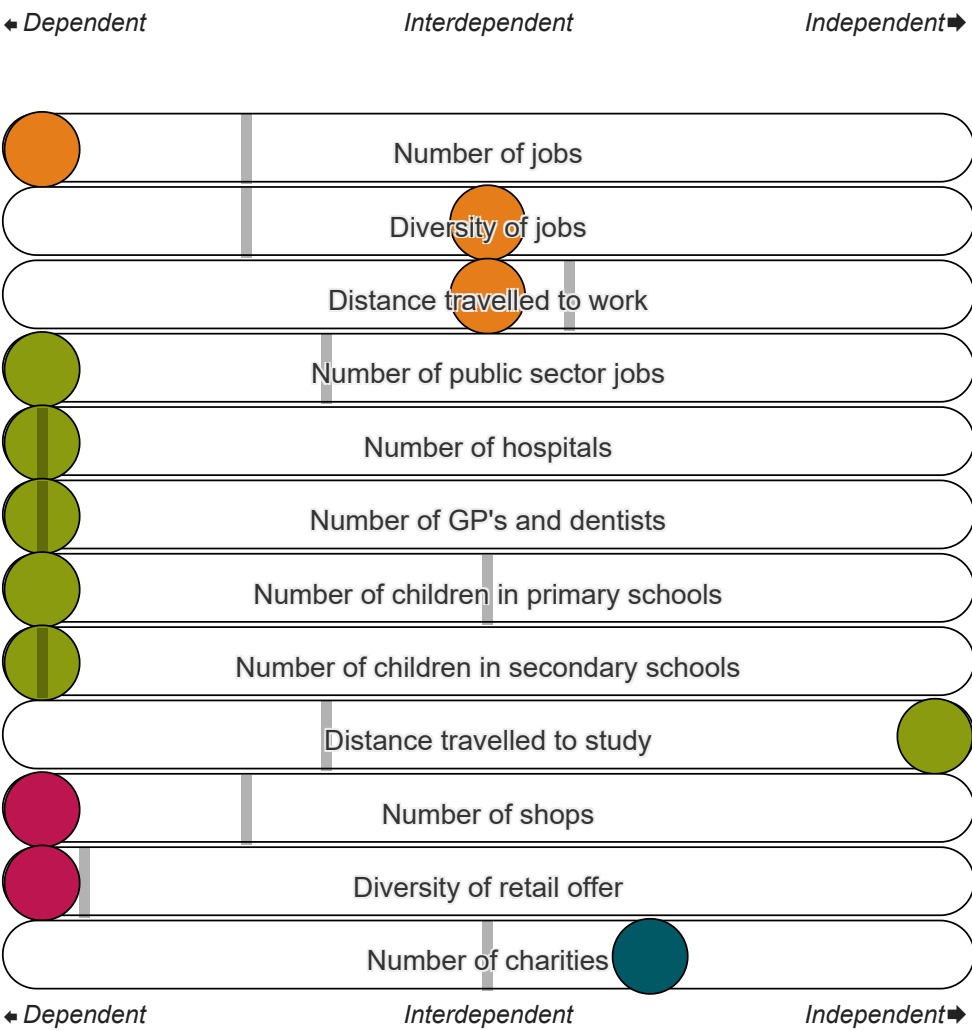
In this type of small town, the population comprises families with a higher proportion of adults in the 25–44 age grouping. Higher rates of full time employment are found.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Maryburgh is grouped with 25 other towns. It also has similarities in the distance travelled to work.

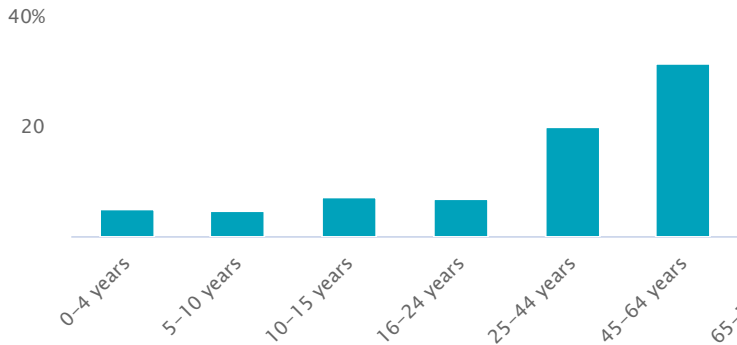
It differs in terms of the distance travelled to study. Maryburgh differs most from its group in the number of children in primary schools, jobs, and public sector jobs.

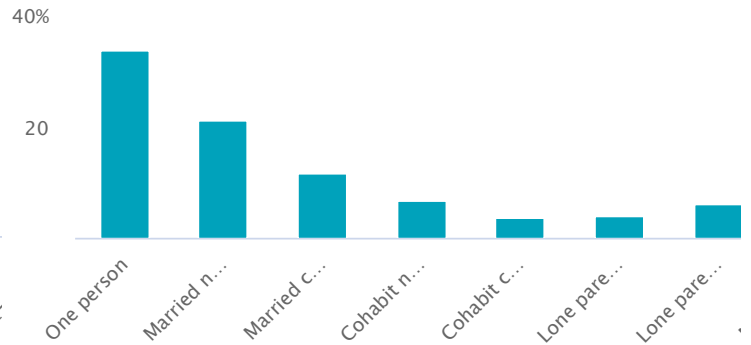

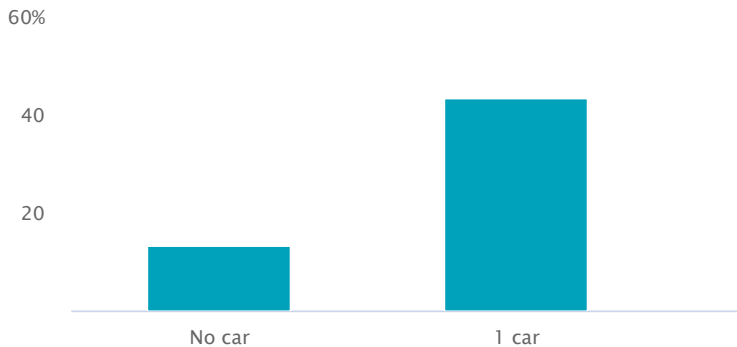

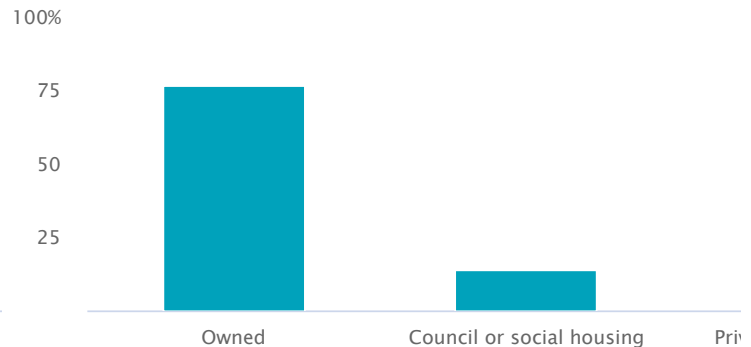
Household composition

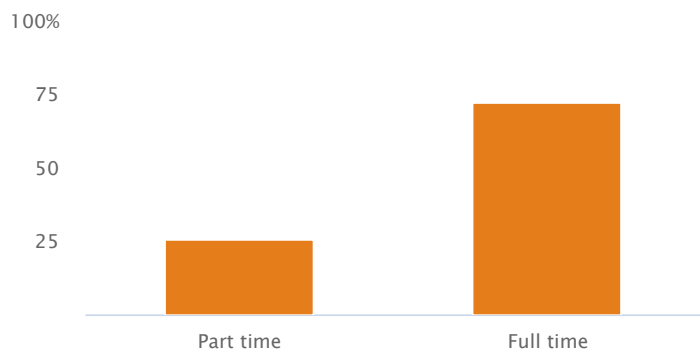

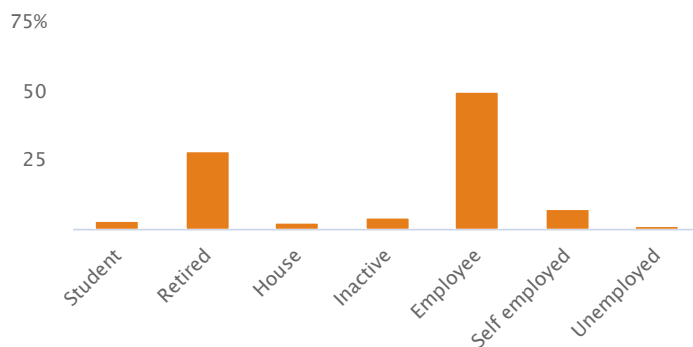
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



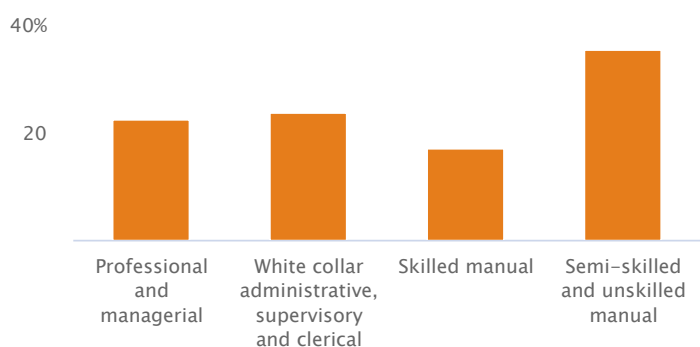
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

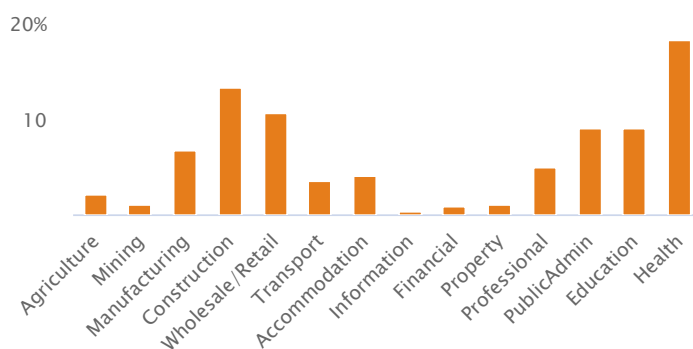

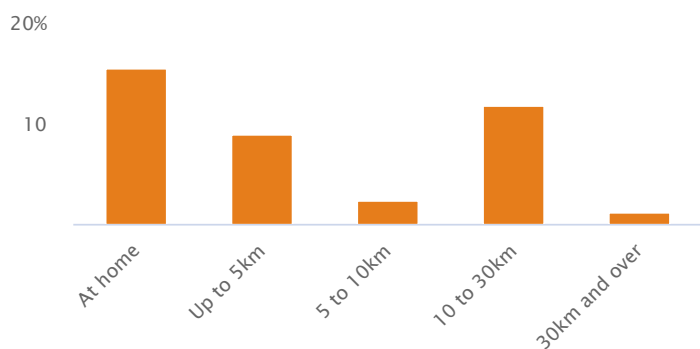
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

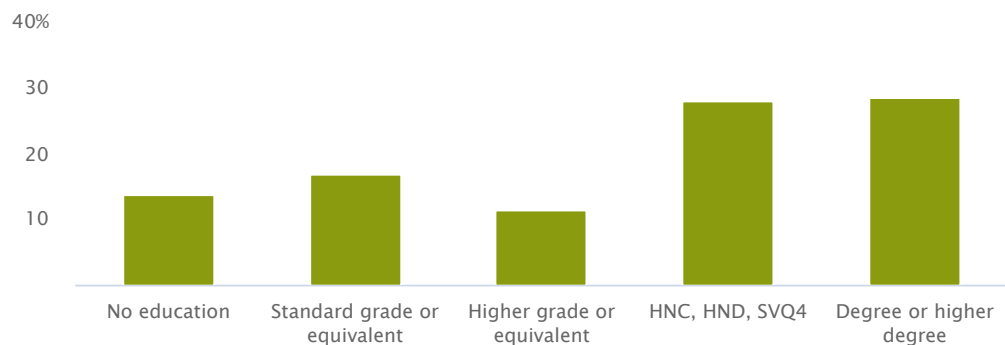


Distance travelled to work

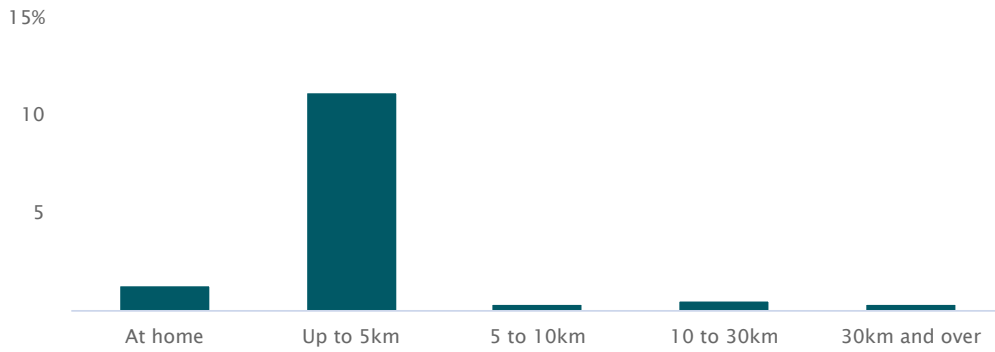
