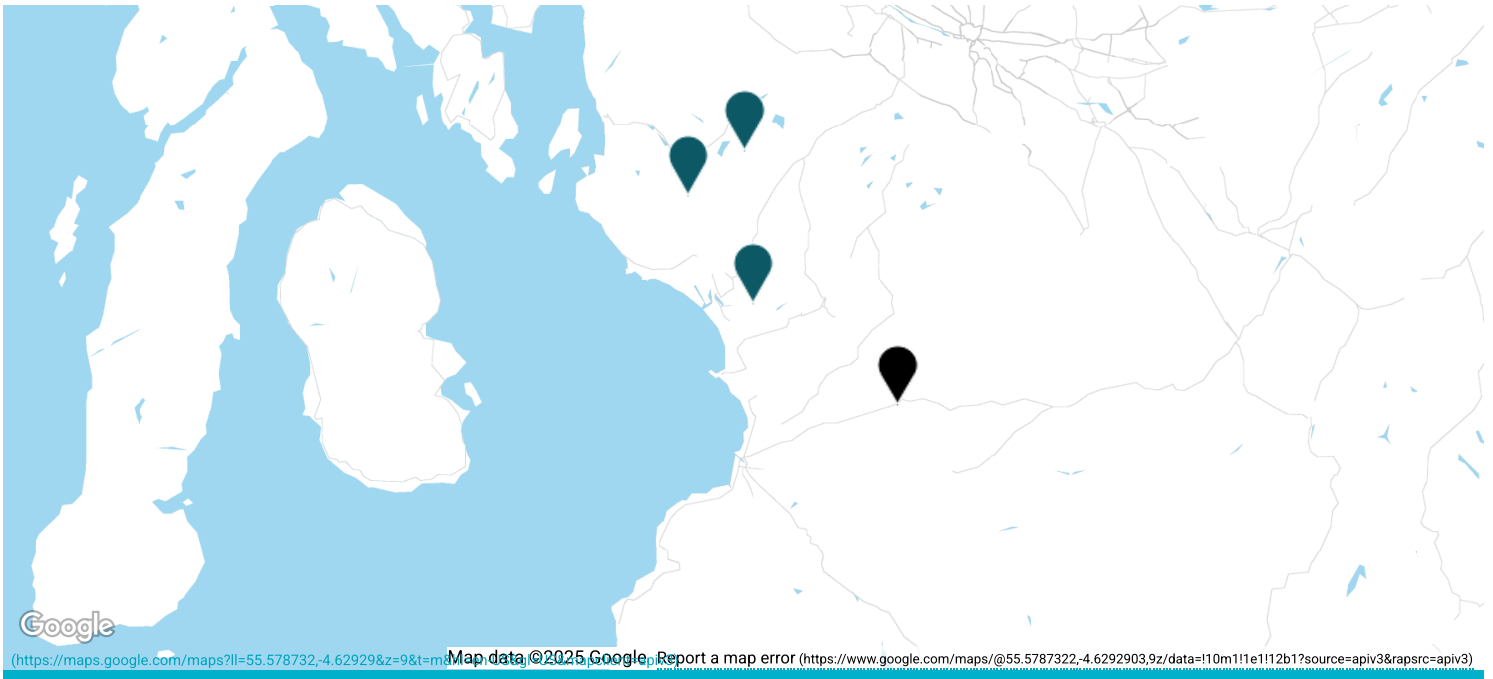




Mauchline

EAST AYRSHIRE

POPULATION **3,807**

Mauchline is in East Ayrshire. Its early history is monastic and later a covenanter stronghold. Trade developed as an agricultural service centre and the town had cattle and horse fairs. A sandstone quarry was an important employer in the 18th century lasting until the 1950s. Box working and fernware were produced for over a century until 1933. The curling stone factory dates from the 19th century and is still in production.

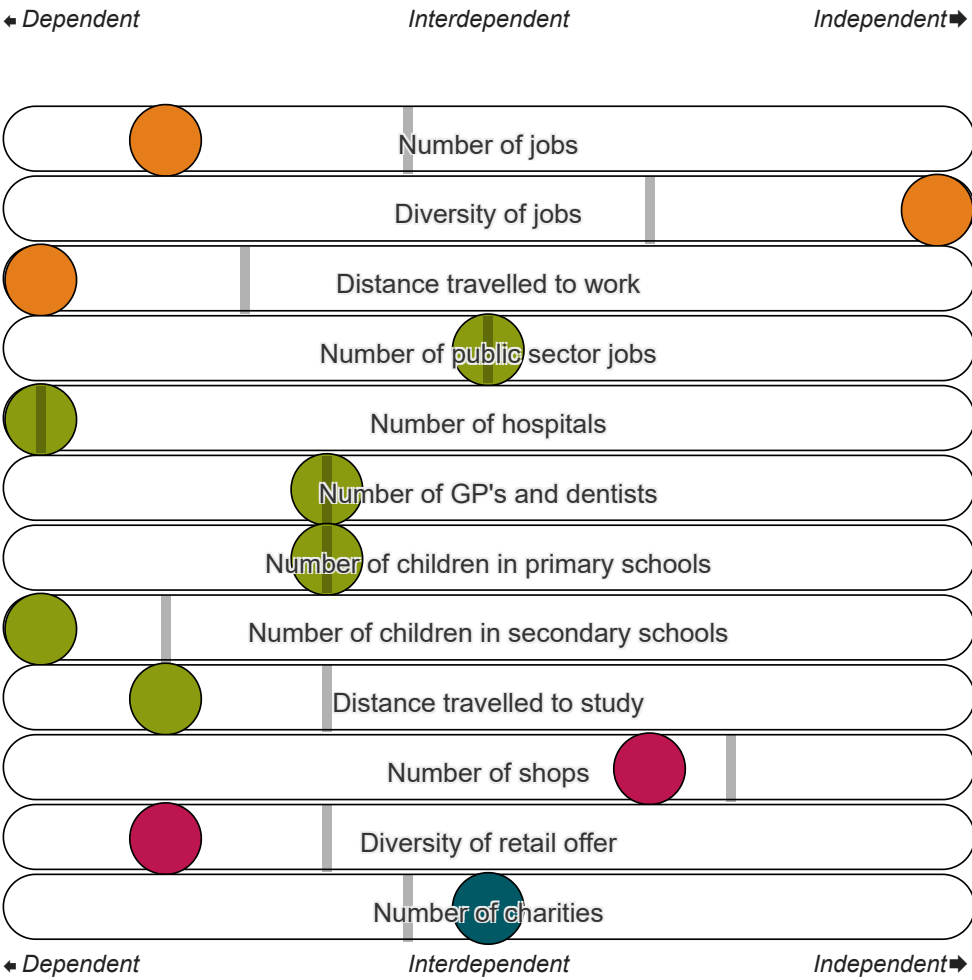
In this medium town, population includes older people, some still in work often in less well paid sectors. It also includes a significant inactive population, some in poorer health. There is a higher proportion of single households and car ownership is lower.

Mauchline is an **interdependent to dependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Mauchline is grouped with 7 other towns. 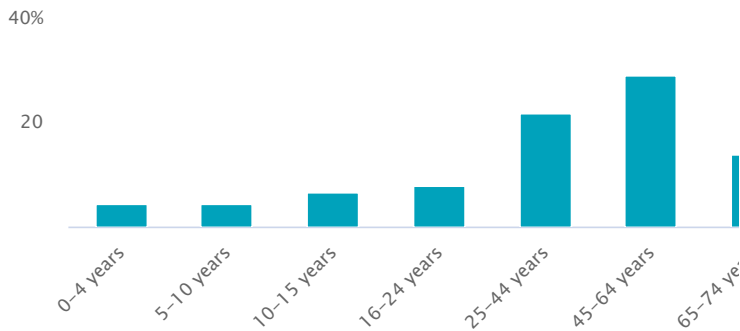

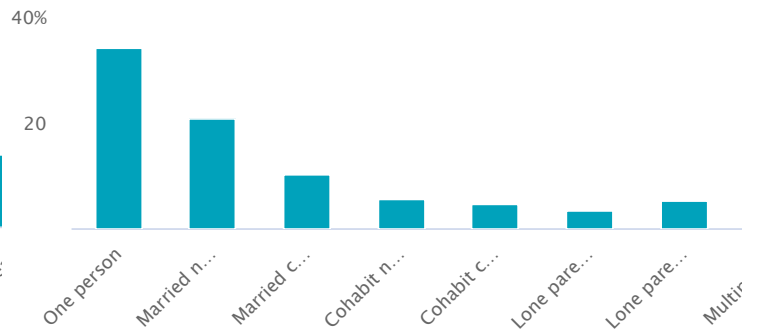

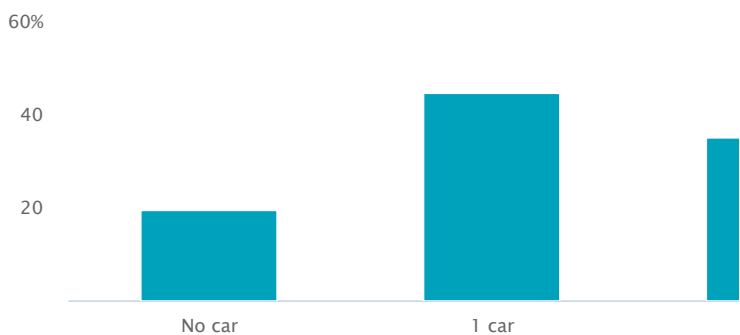

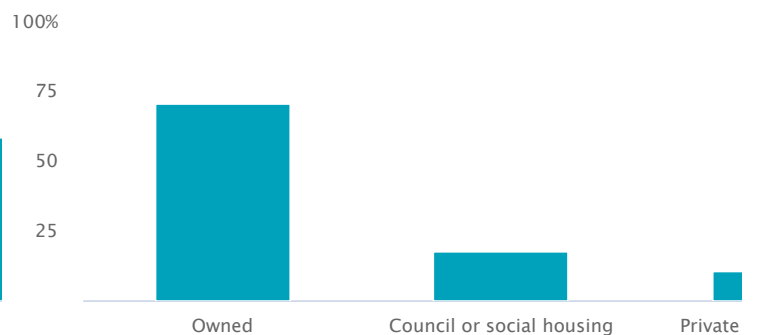

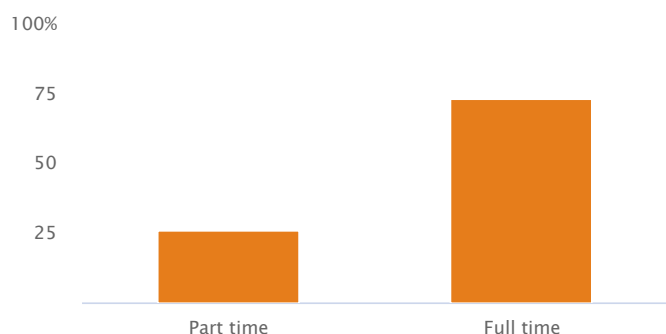

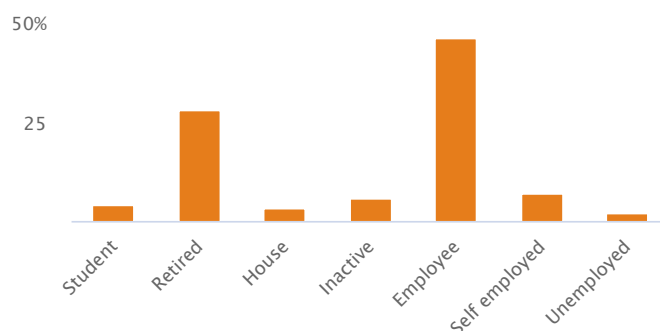
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



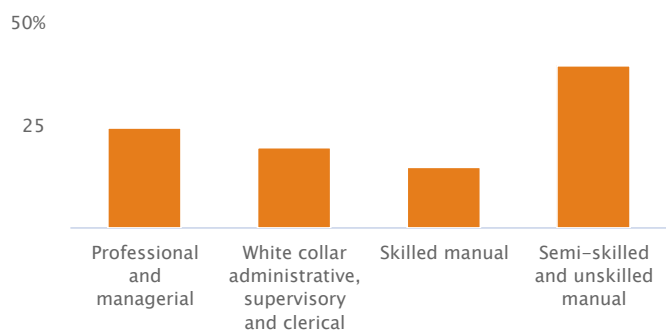
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

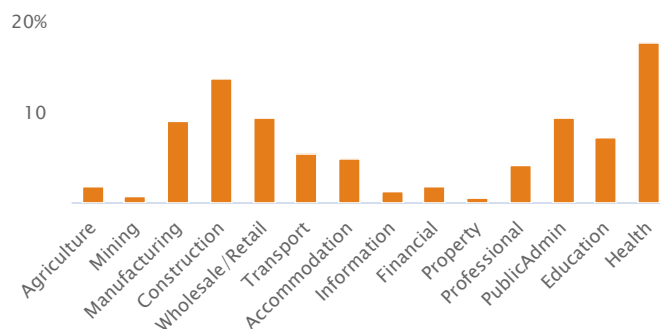

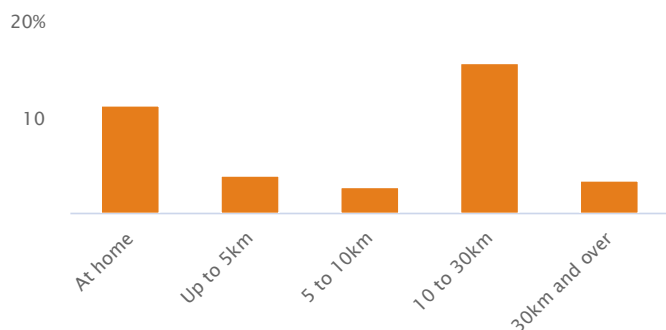
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

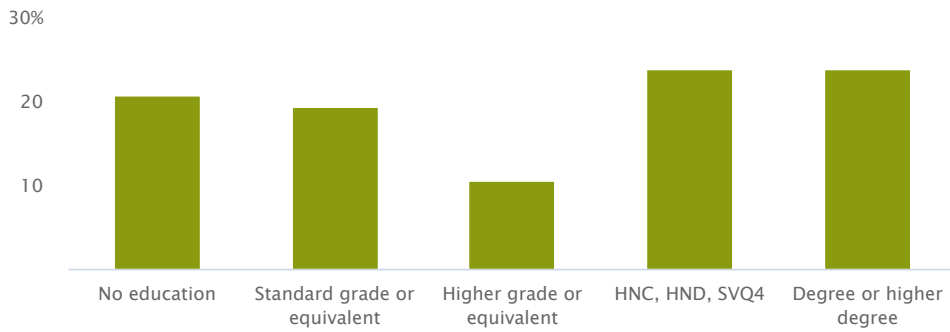


Distance travelled to work

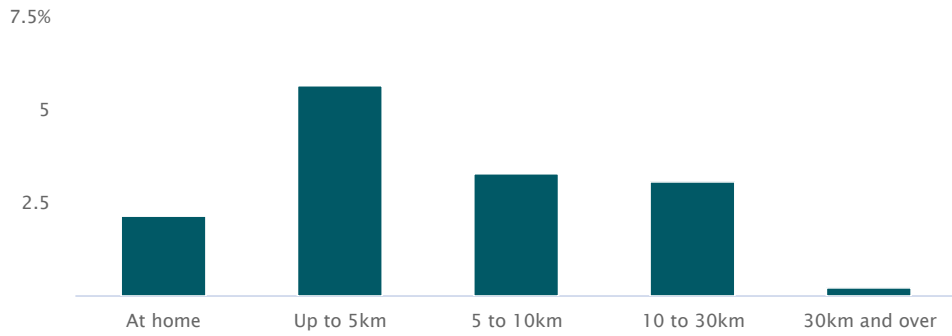
