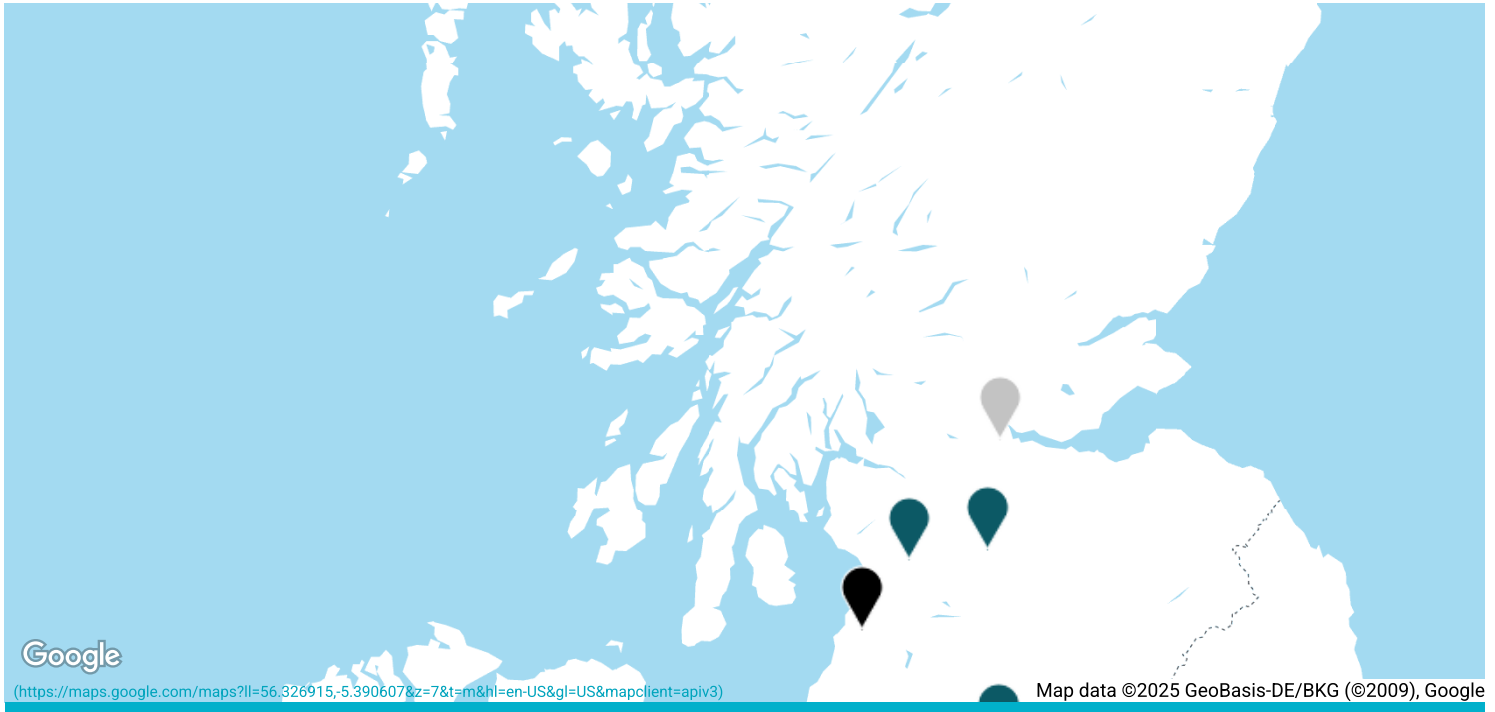




Maybole

Maybole is in South Ayrshire. Once the capital of Carrick it was known as Miniboll and inhabited by influential families in the area. They later moved to Ayr. The town continues as an agricultural service centre although many residents commute to Ayr.

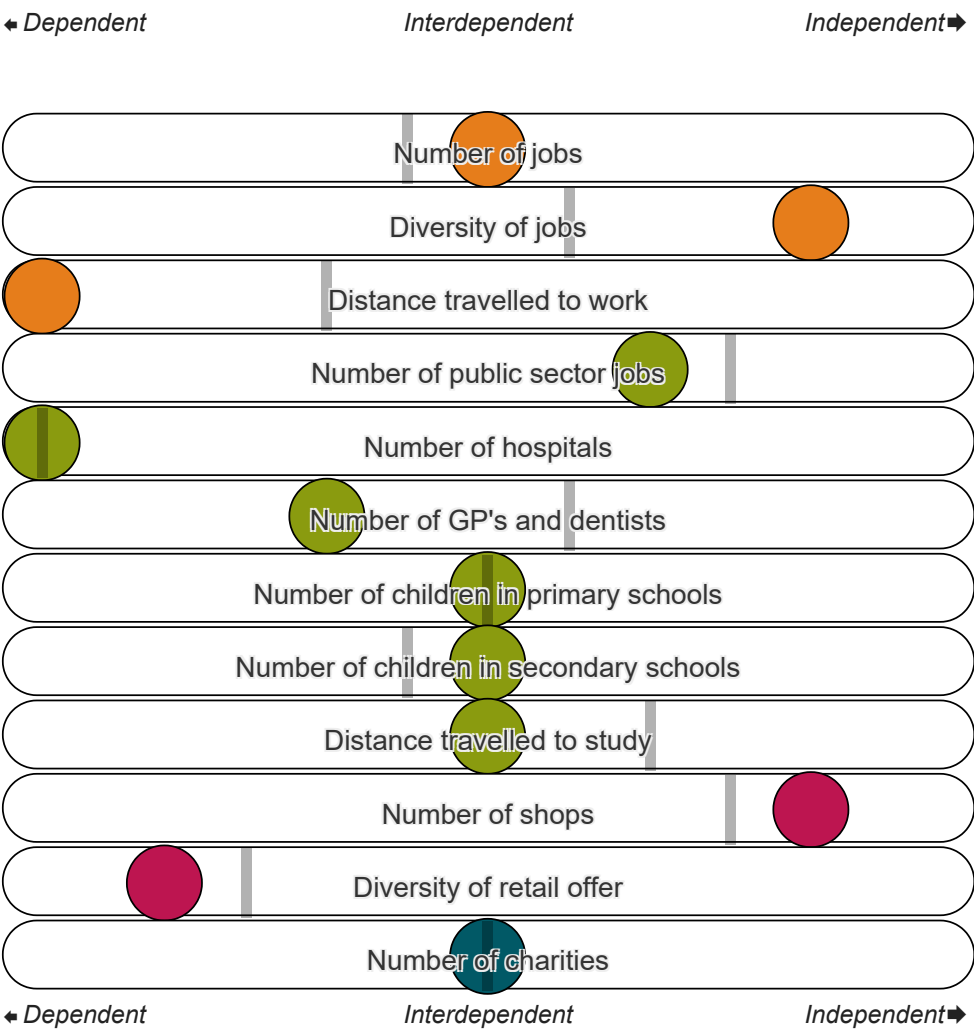
In this medium town, population includes older people, some still in work often in less well paid sectors. It also includes a significant inactive population, some in poorer health. There is a higher proportion of single households and car ownership is lower.

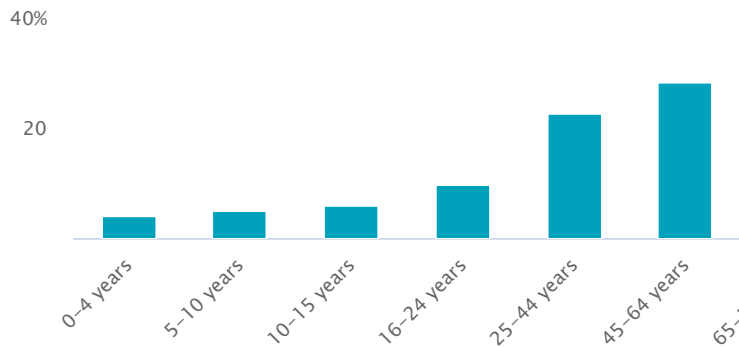

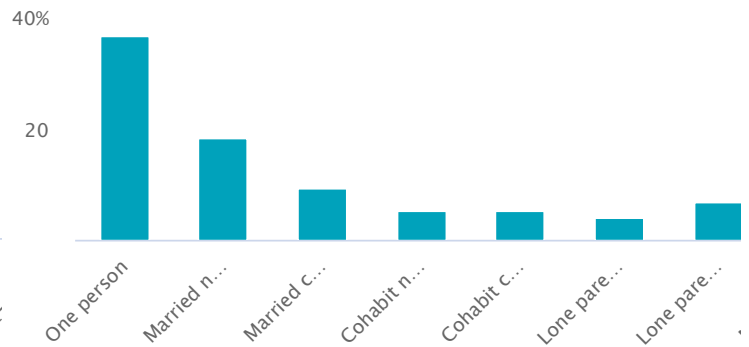

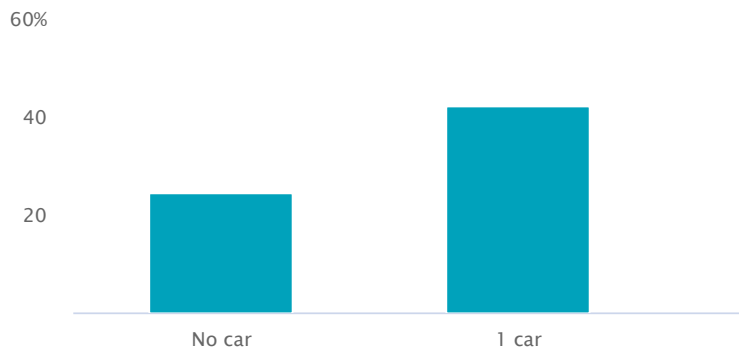

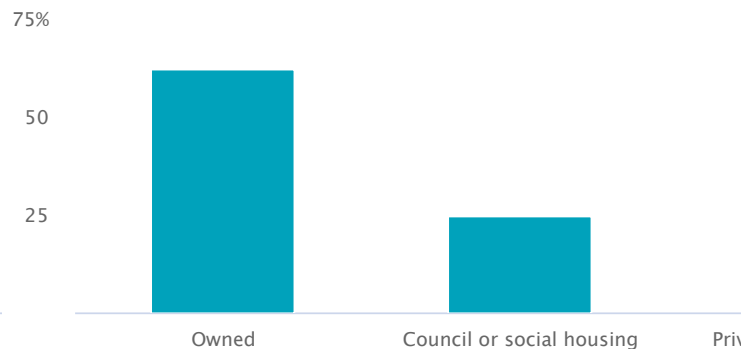
Household composition

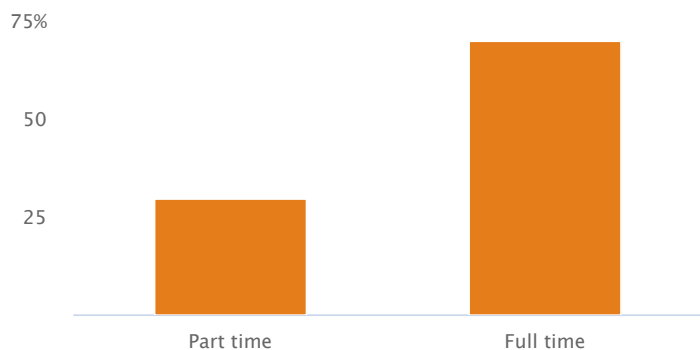

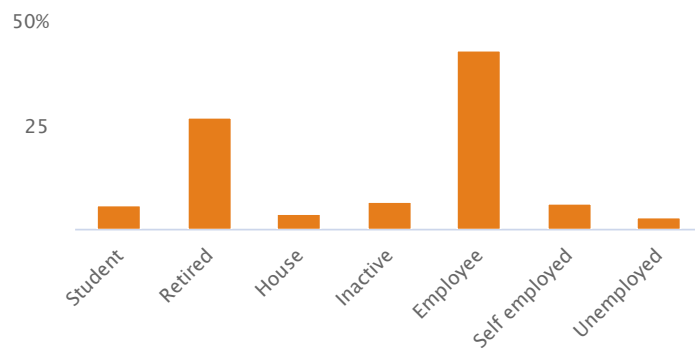
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



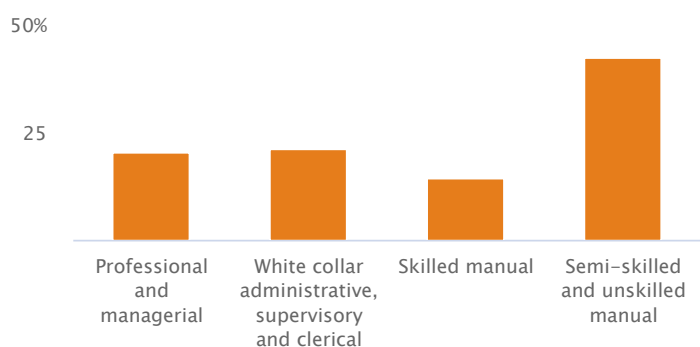
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

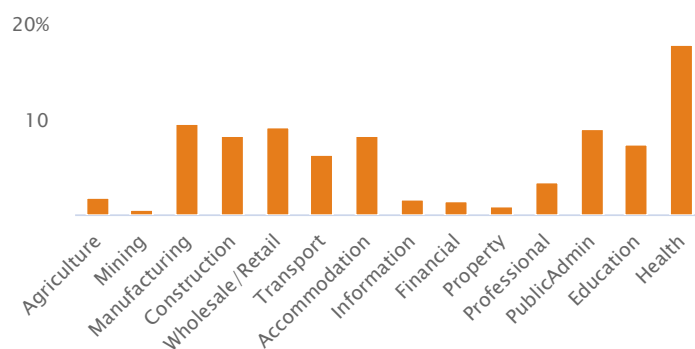

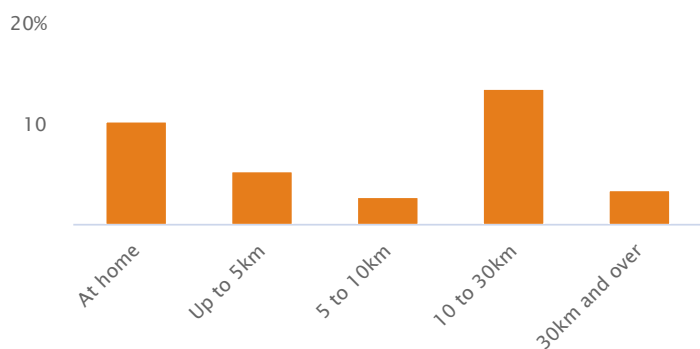
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

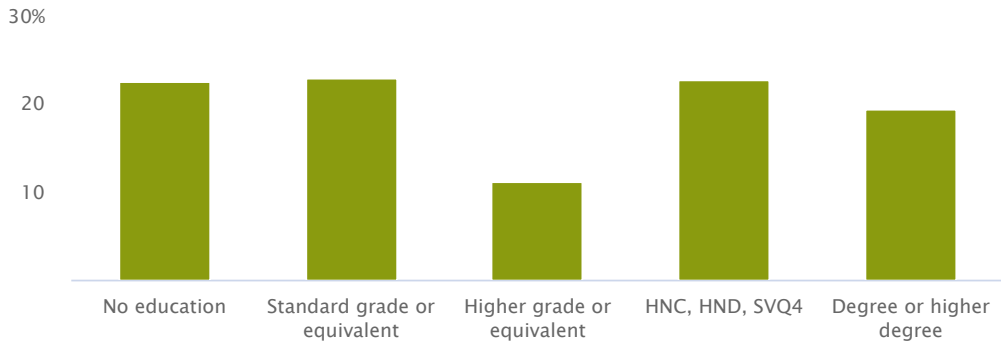


Distance travelled to work

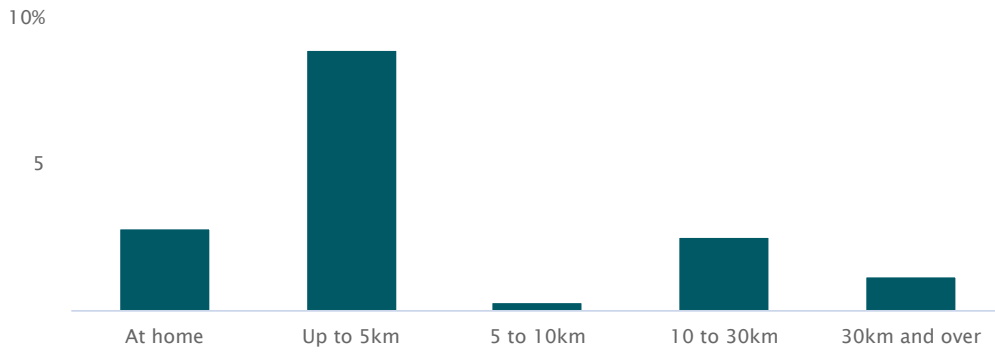
