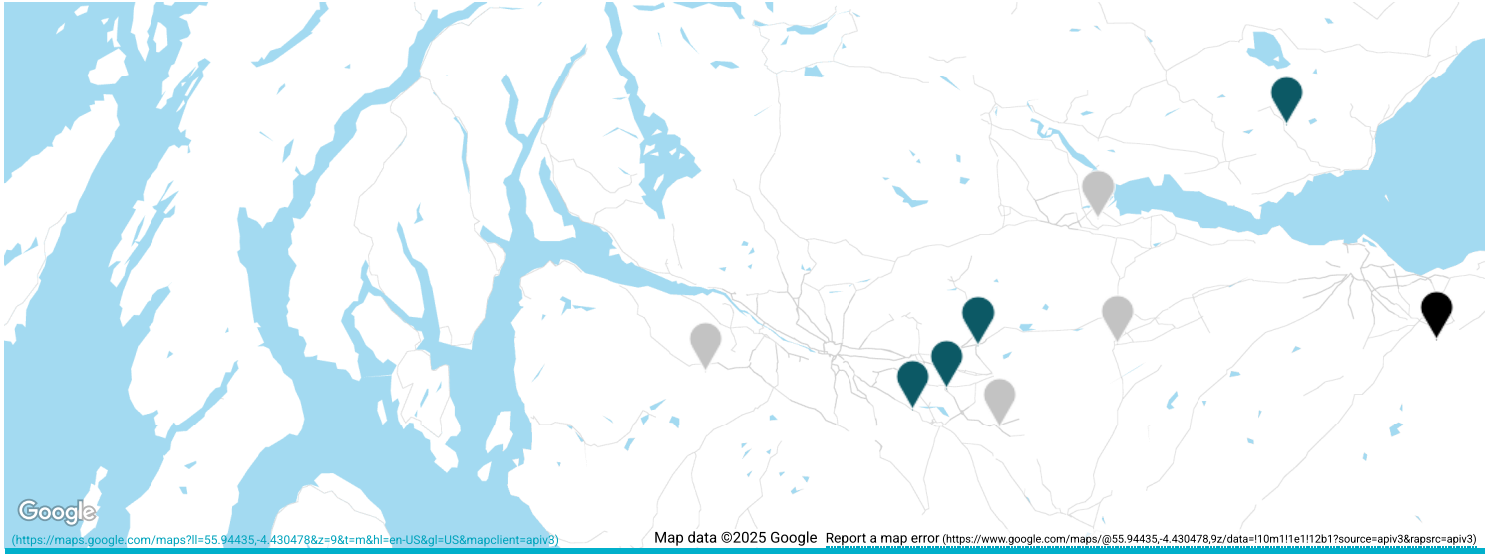




# Mayfield

Mayfield in Midlothian. In the 1950s the settlement expanded as public housing for miners was built. Today it is a commuting town.

Social and council housing are the norm in large towns like Mayfield. Manufacturing and construction are the dominant forms of employment. Health and social work services are particularly active. There is a relatively high level of unemployment. Educational attainment and car ownership are low.

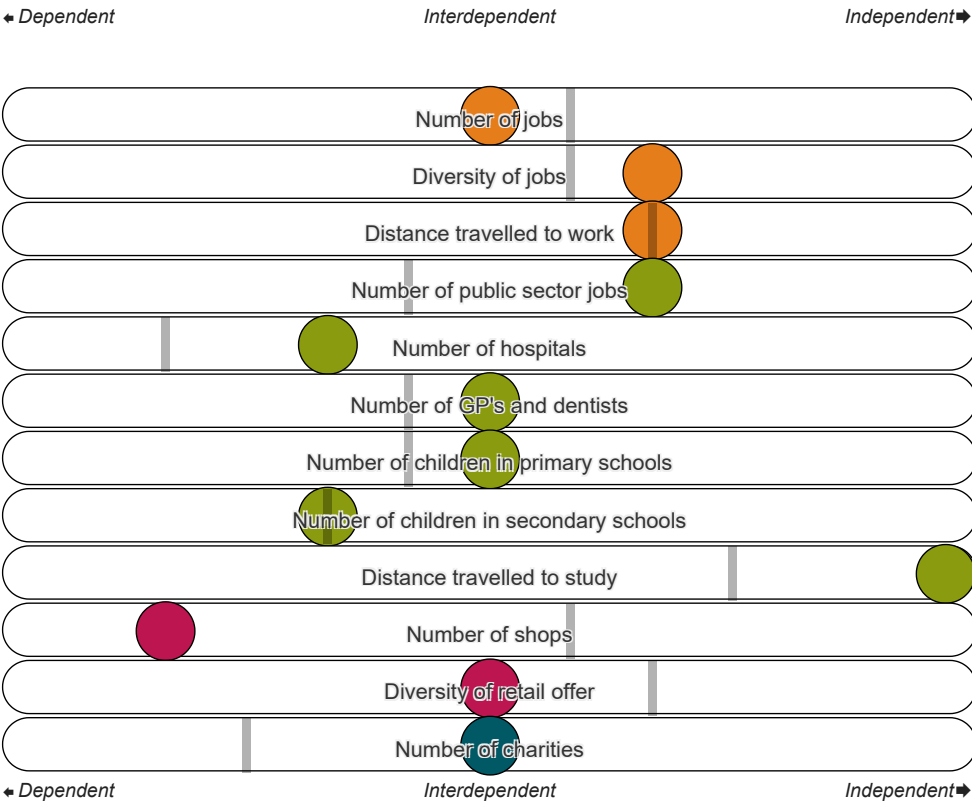
Mayfield is an interdependent town.

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# Inter-relationships



Mayfield is an **interdependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Mayfield is grouped with 8 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of hospitals, children in primary schools, children in secondary schools, jobs, and GP's and dentists. It also has similarities in the diversity of jobs, and the distance travelled to work.

It differs in terms of the number of public sector jobs. It also differs in the distance travelled to study. Mayfield differs most from its group in the number of shops.

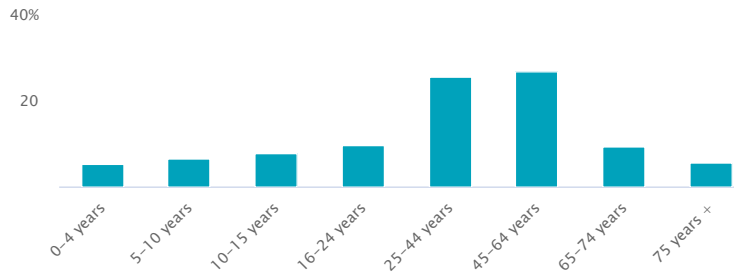

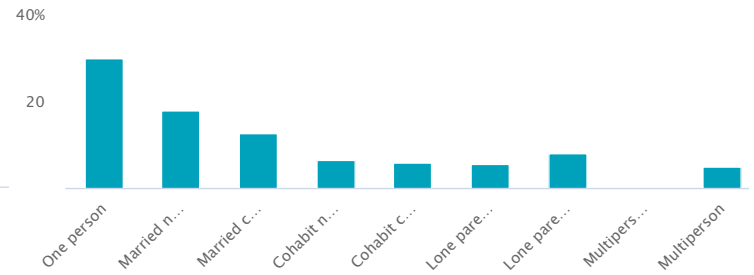

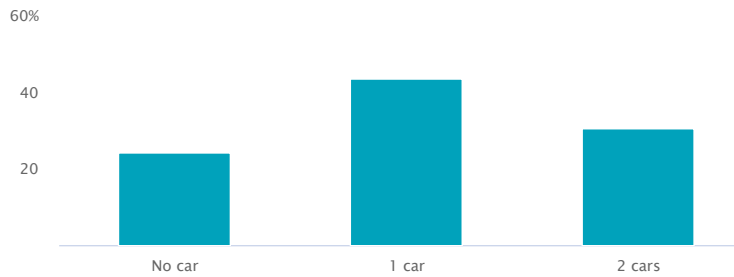

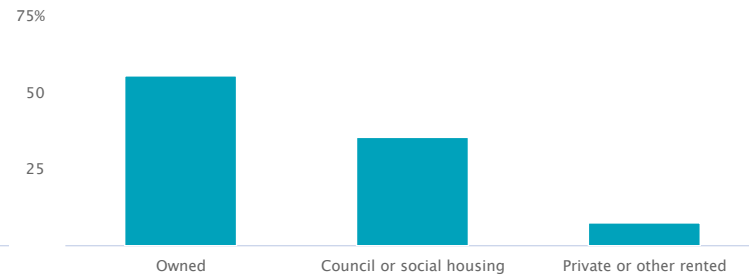

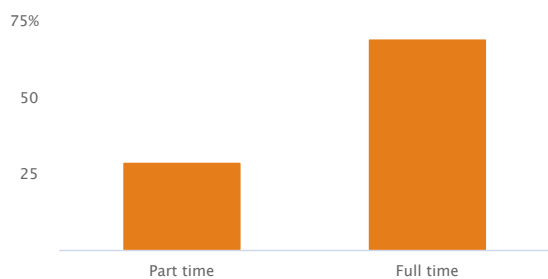

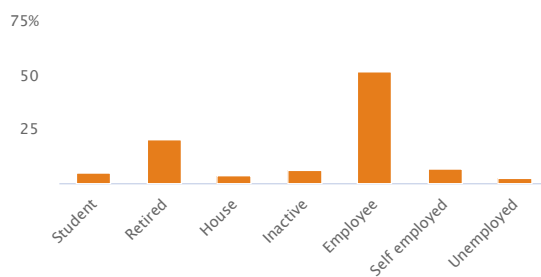
## Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



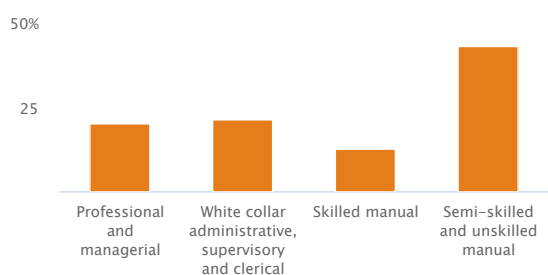
## Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

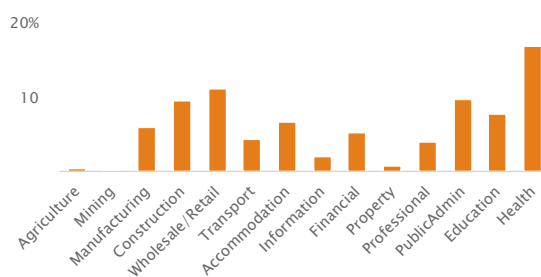


## Social Grade

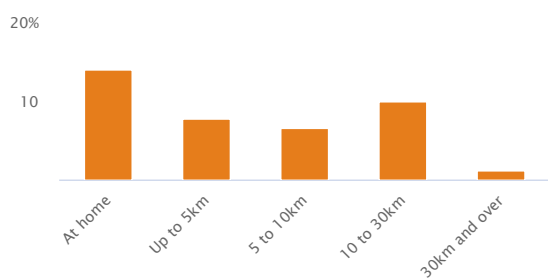
(% households aged 16-64)



## Sector Diversity

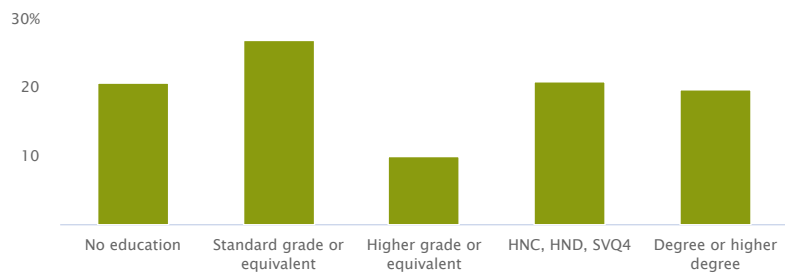


## Distance travelled to work

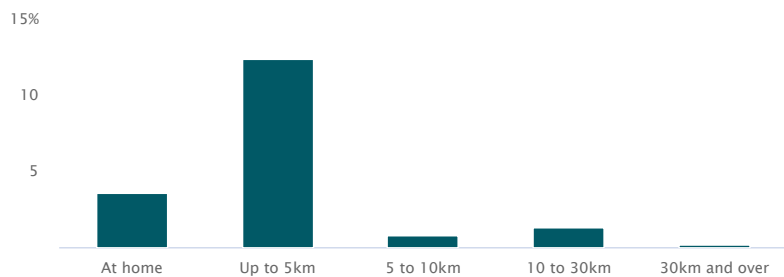
