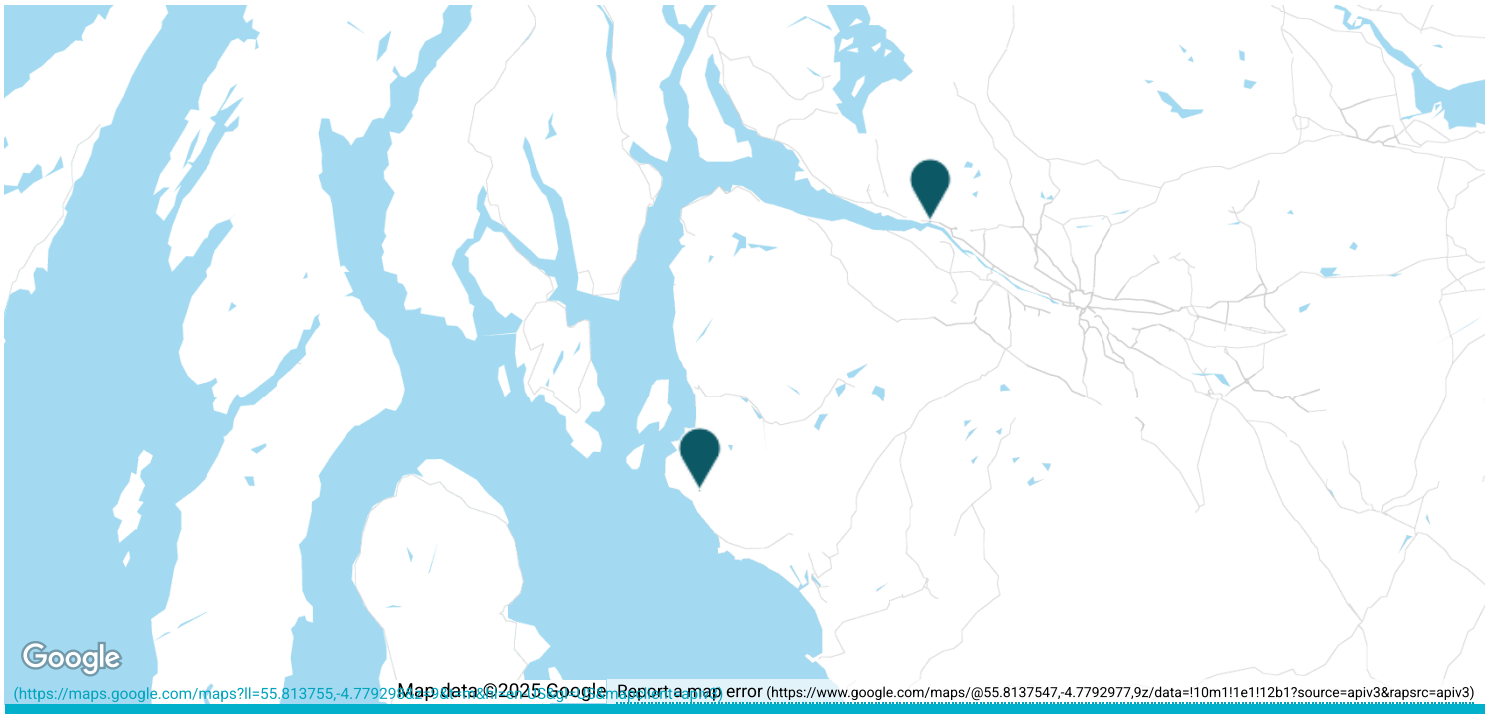




Mid Calder

Mid Calder is in West Lothian. Its was a coaching stop in the 18th century on the Edinburgh Glasgow road. Shale oil mining was developed and the town expanded. It has changed from a town of some repute for its inns to a conservation village.

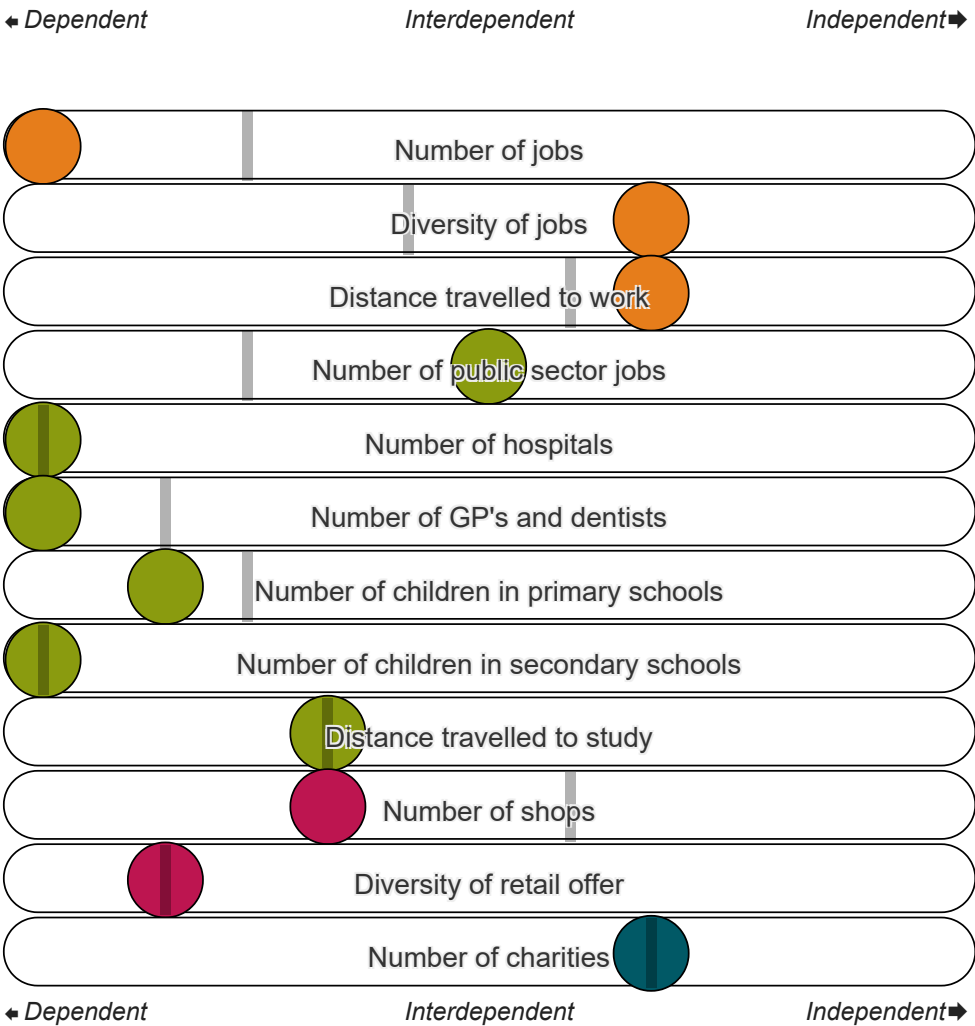
In medium towns such as this, the population is typically older. The group has higher social grade status than other groups, a higher proportion are owner occupiers and car ownership is also higher.

Mid Calder is a dependent to interdependent town.

Mid Calder is a **dependent to interdependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Mid Calder is grouped with 2 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of charities, hospitals, children in primary schools, children in secondary schools, GP's and dentists, and diversity of retail offer. It also has similarities in the distance travelled to work, and the distance travelled to study.

It differs in terms of the diversity of jobs. Mid Calder differs most from its group in the number of public sector jobs.

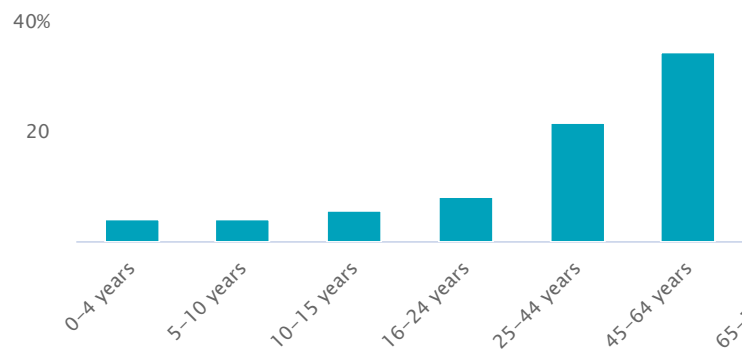

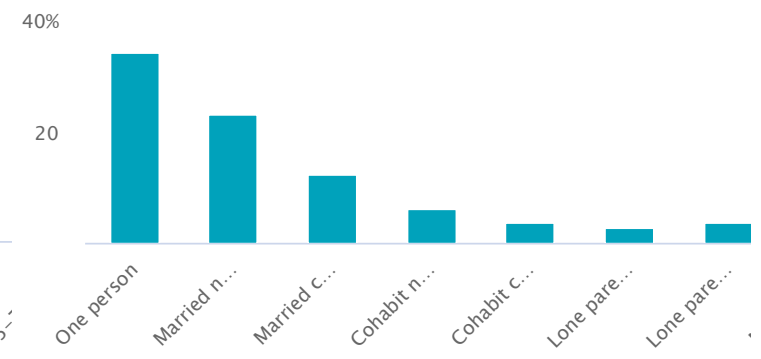

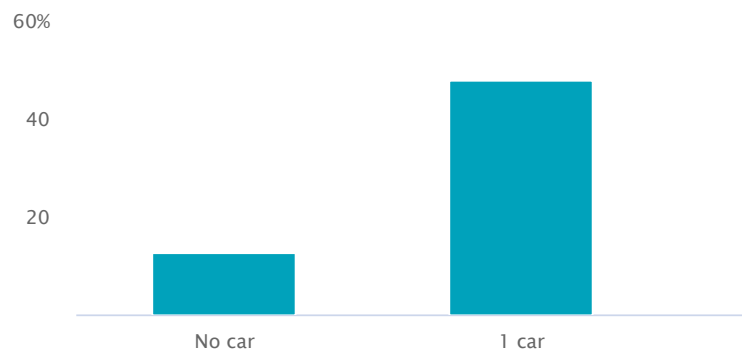

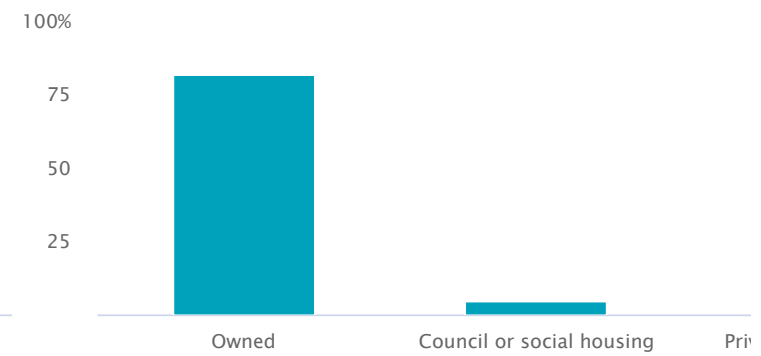
Household composition

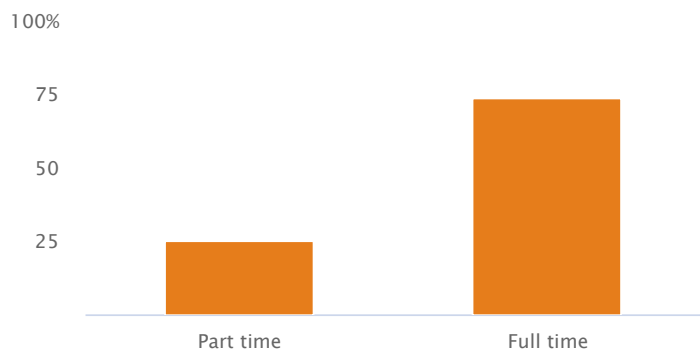

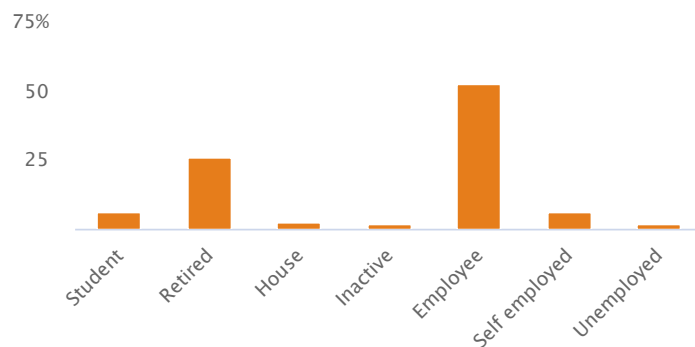
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



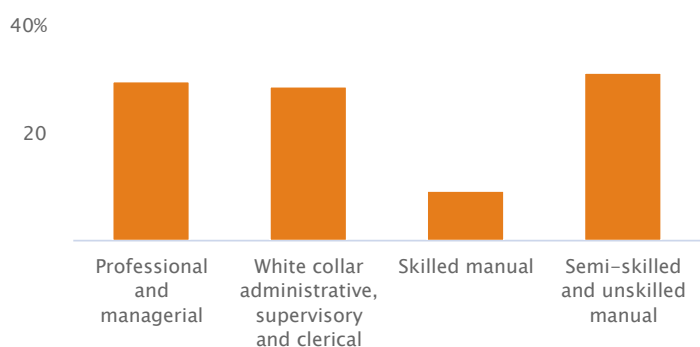
Occupation

Social Grade

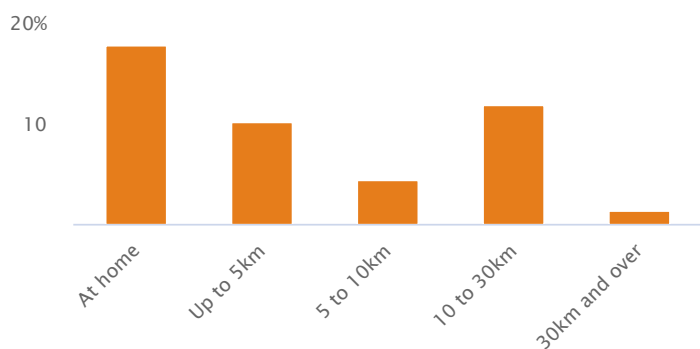
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

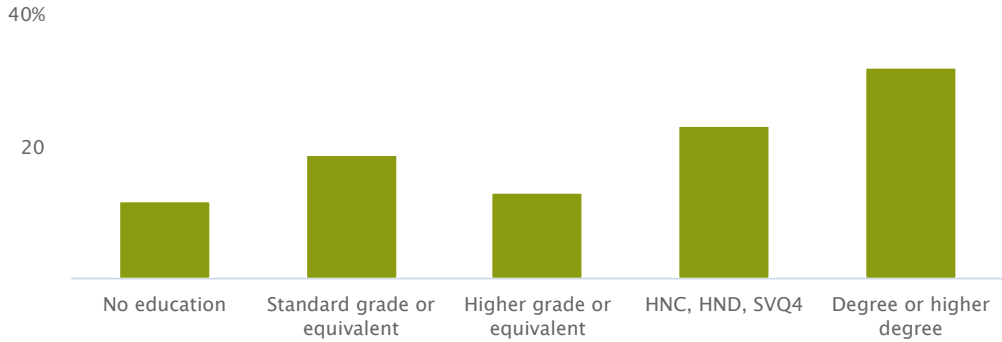


Distance travelled to work

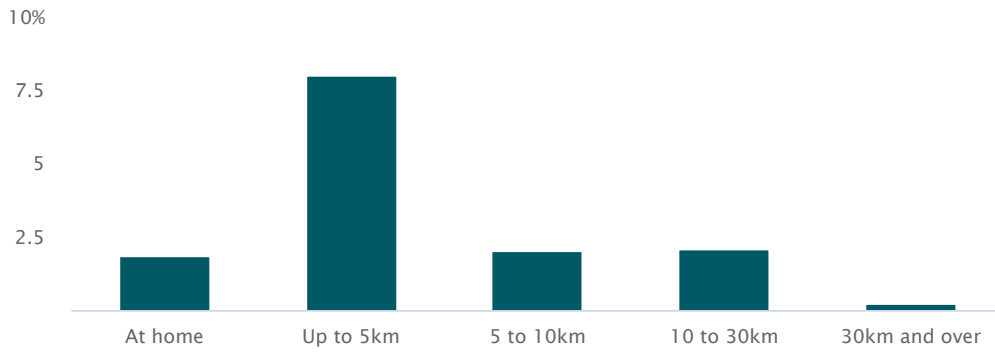
