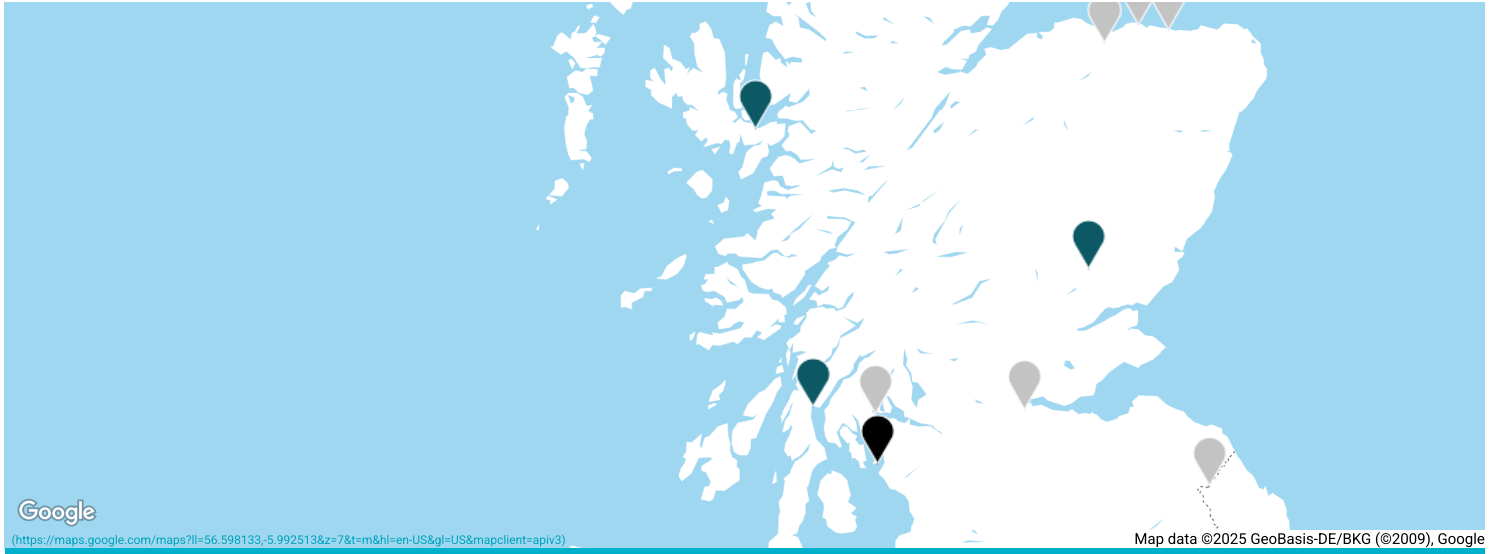




Millport

NORTH AYRSHIRE

POPULATION **1,173**

Millport is on Great Cumbrae and is in North Ayrshire. It was established as a barracks by the Earl of Glasgow in 1745. Its strategic position made it important in controlling smuggling as the Clyde traffic increased. It developed as a resort and continues to be popular with day trippers from Glasgow.

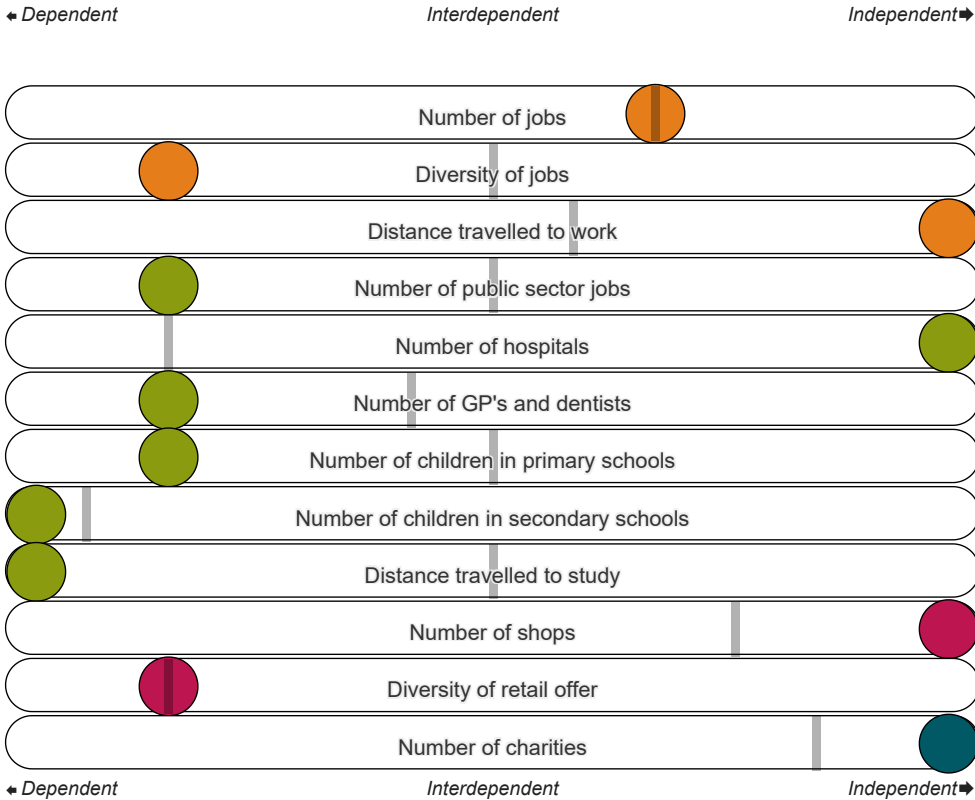
In small towns like this one, and similar, this population includes older people, some still in work often in less well paid sectors. It also includes a significant inactive population, some in poorer health. There is a higher proportion of single households and car ownership is lower.

Millport is an interdependent town.

Inter-relationships



Millport is an **interdependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Millport is grouped with 11 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of charities, children in secondary schools, jobs, and diversity of retail offer.

It differs in terms of the number of hospitals, children in primary schools, public sector jobs, and GP's and dentists. It also differs in the diversity of jobs, and the distance travelled to work. Millport differs most from its group in the distance travelled to study.

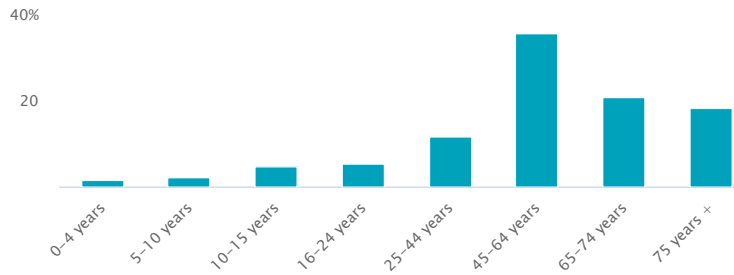

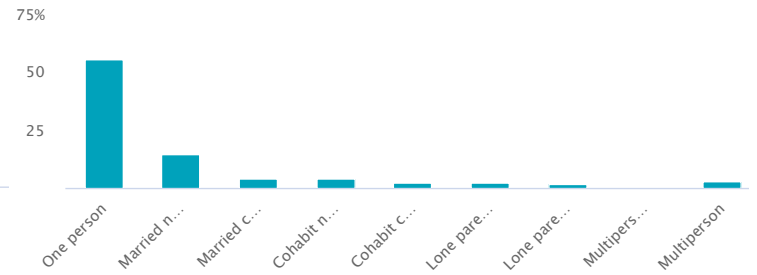

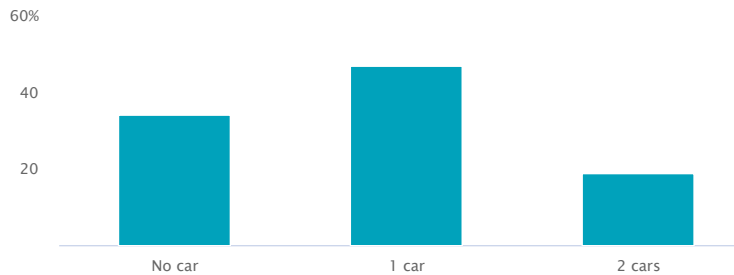

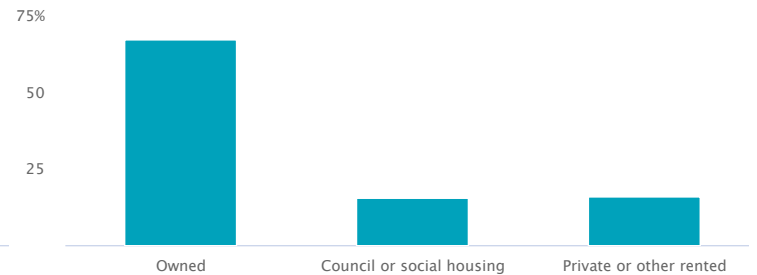
Household composition

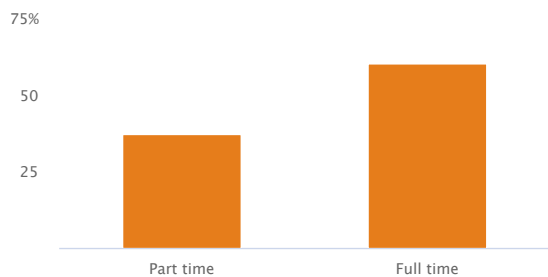

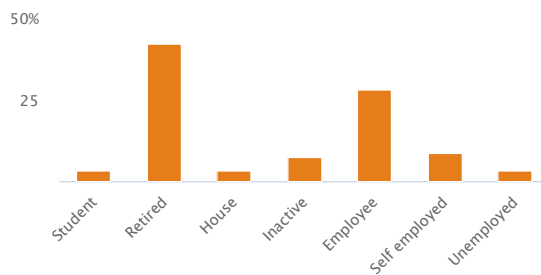
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



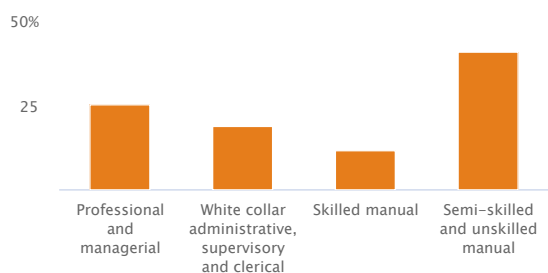
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

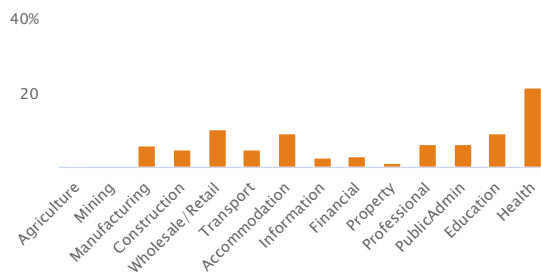

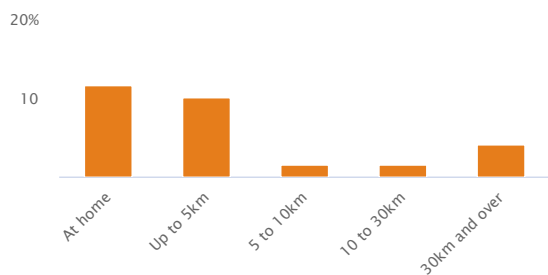
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

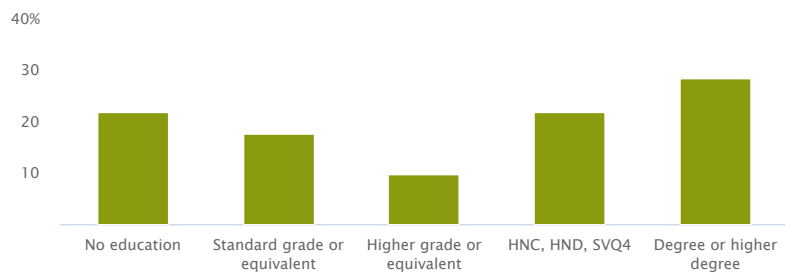


Distance travelled to work

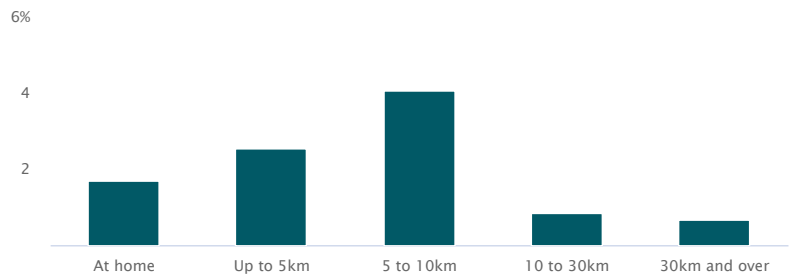
