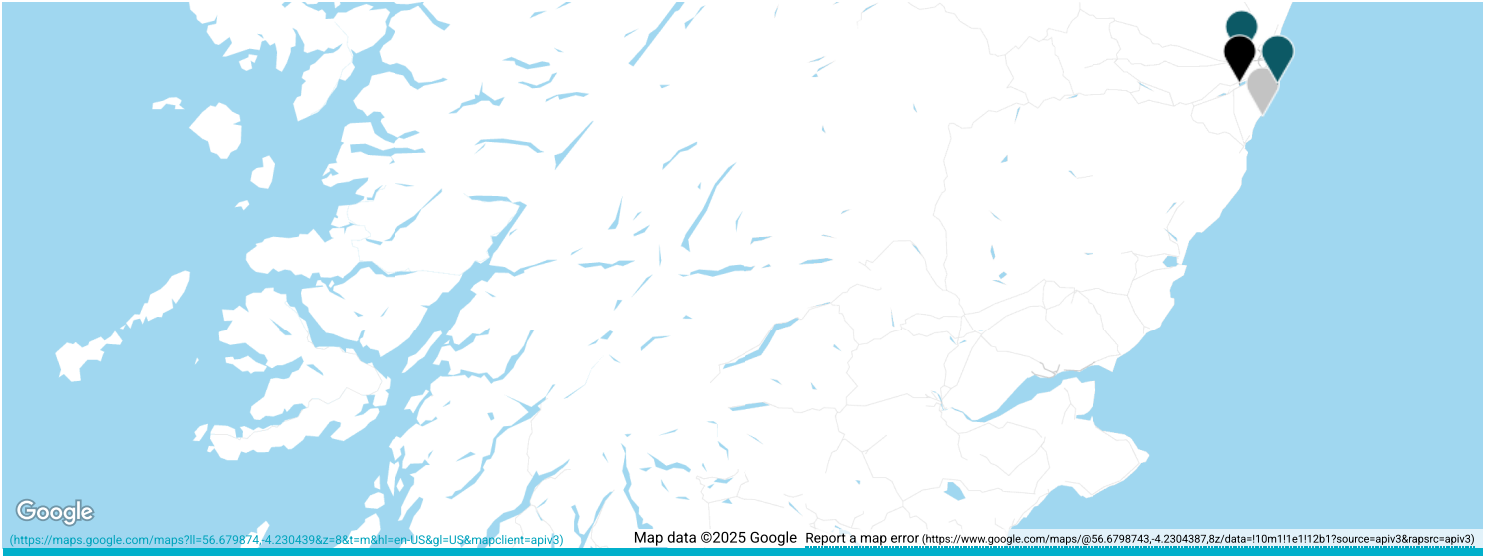




Milltimber

Milltimber is in Aberdeen City and developed after the building of the Deeside railway. It is now a suburb of Aberdeen.

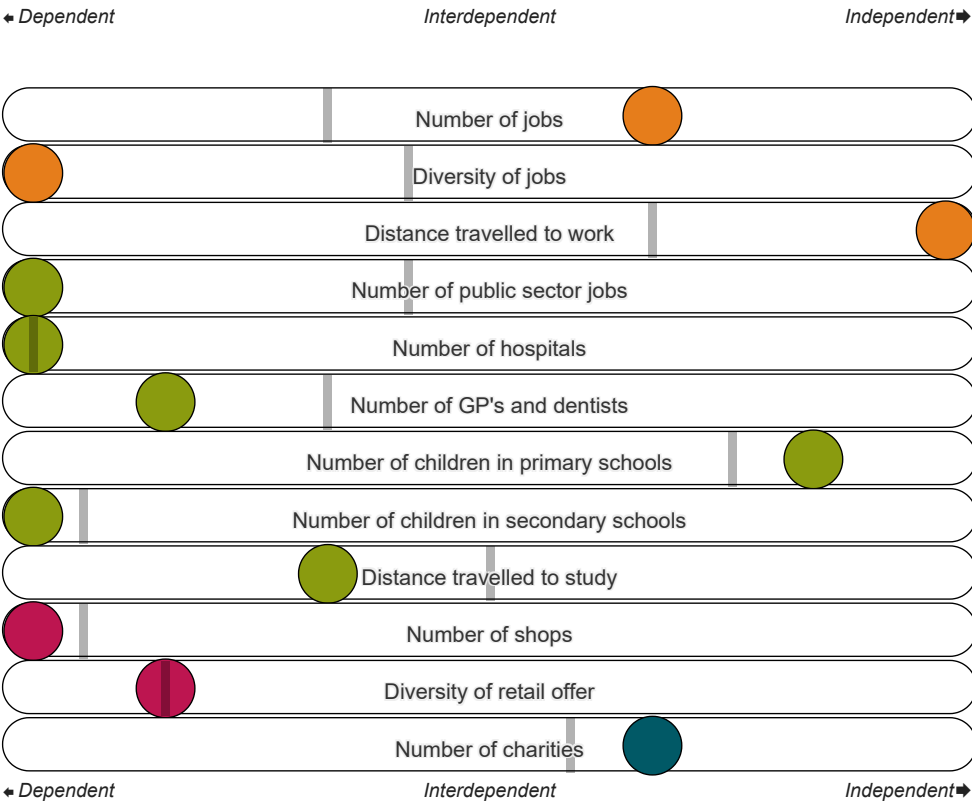
In affluent medium towns, population is characterised by older working age families with teenagers. They are more highly educated and have higher social grades than some other groups. 2 car ownership is higher than in other groups.

Inter-relationships



Milltimber is an **interdependent to dependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Milltimber is grouped with 8 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of charities, hospitals, children in primary schools, children in secondary schools, shops, GP's and dentists, and diversity of retail offer.

It differs in terms of the number of jobs. It also differs in the distance travelled to work. Milltimber differs most from its group in the number of public sector jobs; and the diversity of jobs.

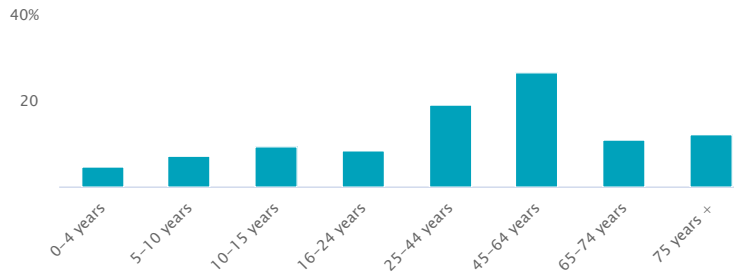

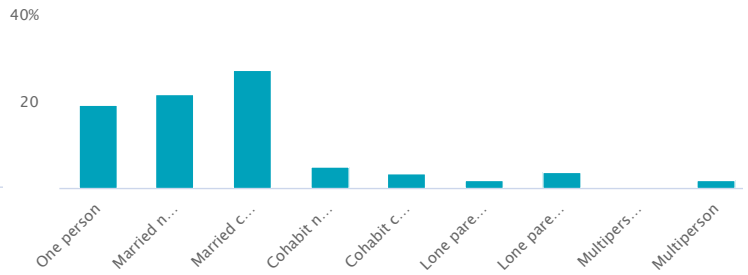

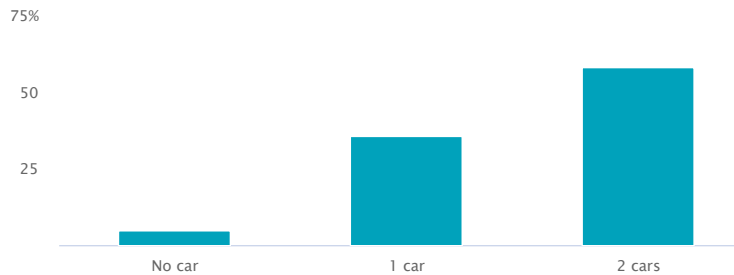

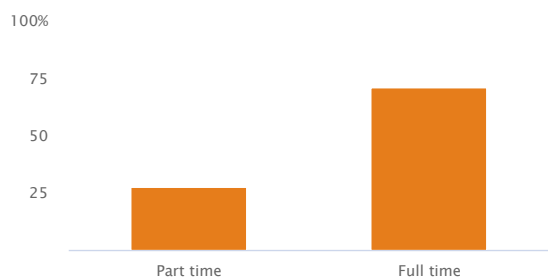

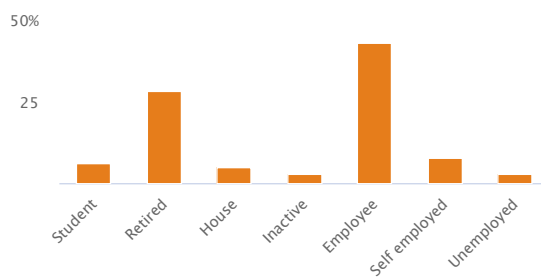
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



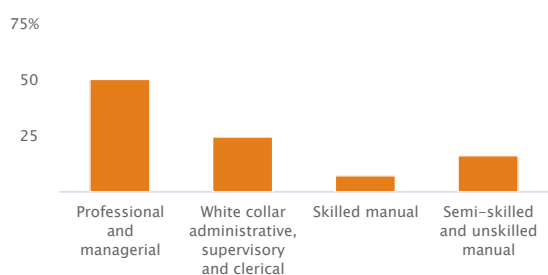
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

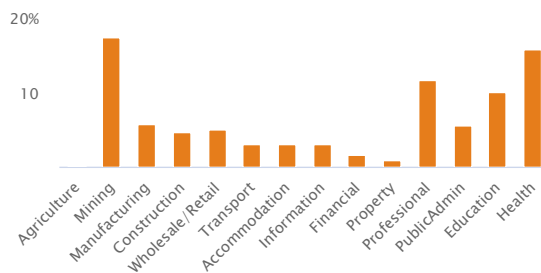


Social Grade

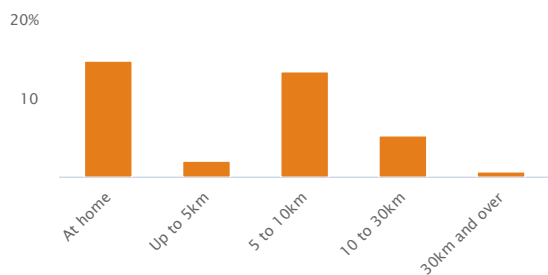
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

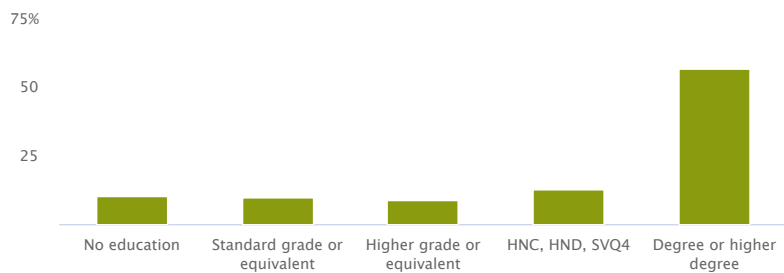


Distance travelled to work

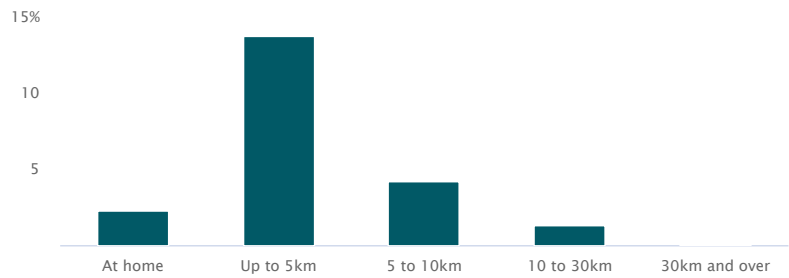
