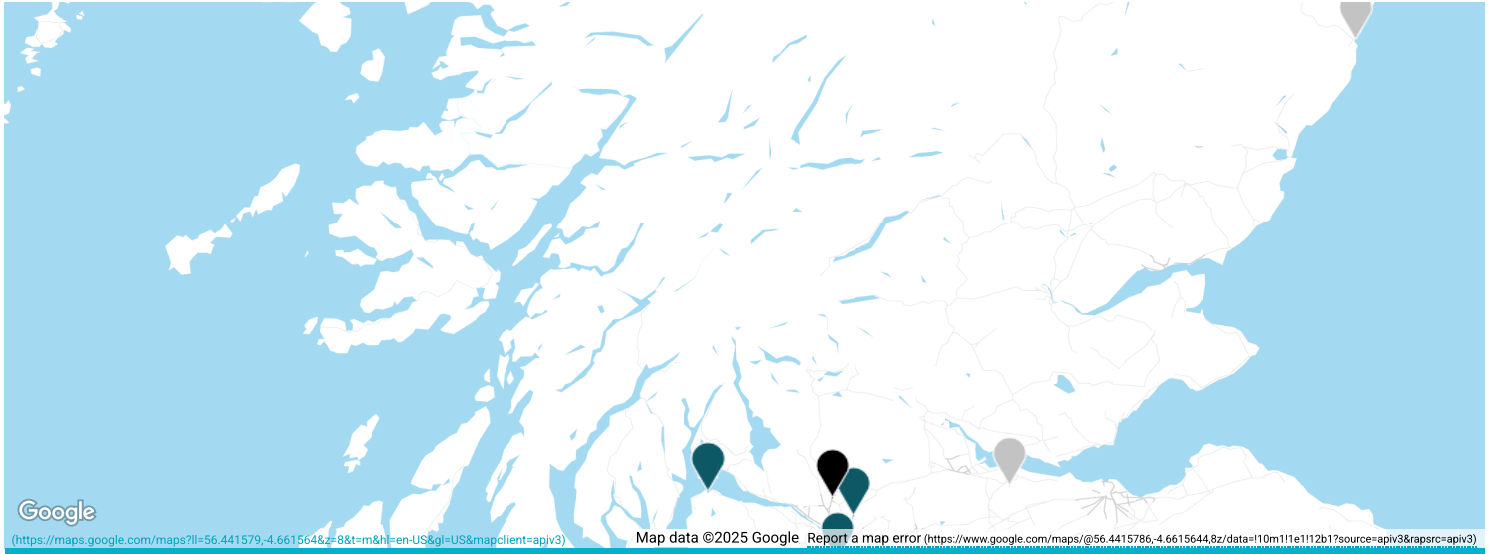




# Milngavie

EAST DUNBARTONSHIRE

POPULATION **12,765**

Milngavie is in East Dunbartonshire. In the 19th century it had a number of industries including mills for corn and textiles. The railway arrived in 1863 and since then it has continued to develop as a suburb for Glasgow. It is the start of the West Highland Way. It has significant local and community services and some light industry (including Scottoiler and Indespension).

In large towns such as this one, the population typically is older. The group has higher social grade status than other groups, a higher proportion are owner occupiers and car ownership is also higher.

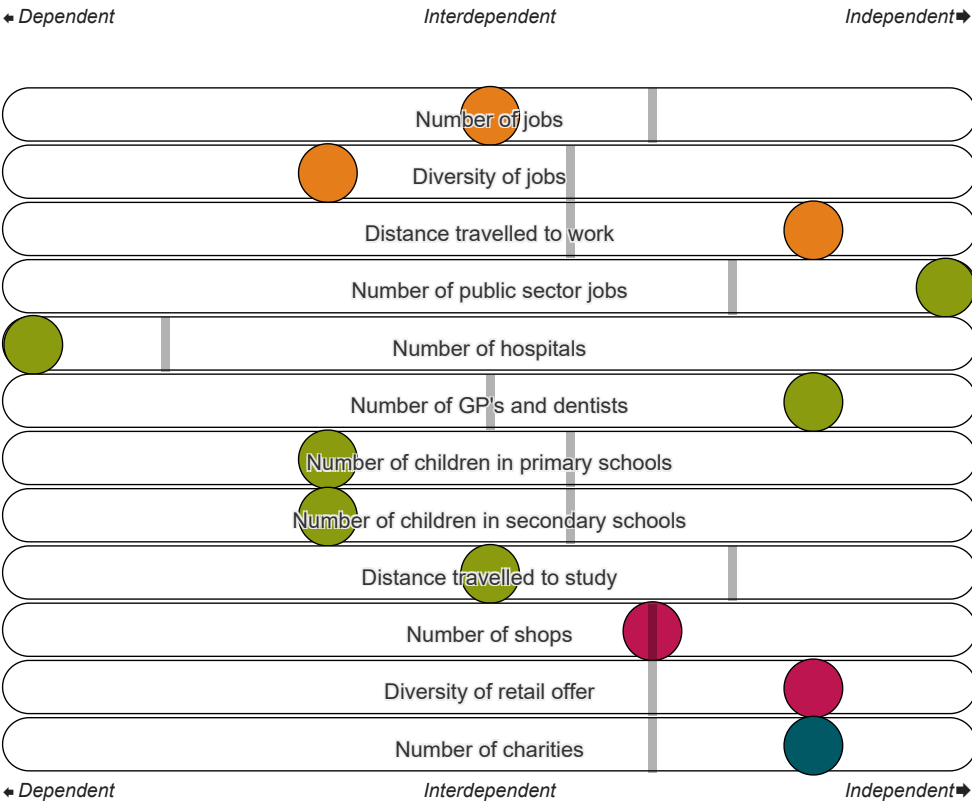
Milngavie is an interdependent to independent town.

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# Inter-relationships



Milngavie is an **interdependent to independent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Milngavie is grouped with 7 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of hospitals, shops, and diversity of retail offer.

It differs in terms of the number of GP's and dentists. It also differs in the distance travelled to work, and the distance travelled to study. Milngavie differs most from its group in the number of children in primary schools, and children in secondary schools; and the diversity of jobs.

**Population change 2011 to 2022****-2%**

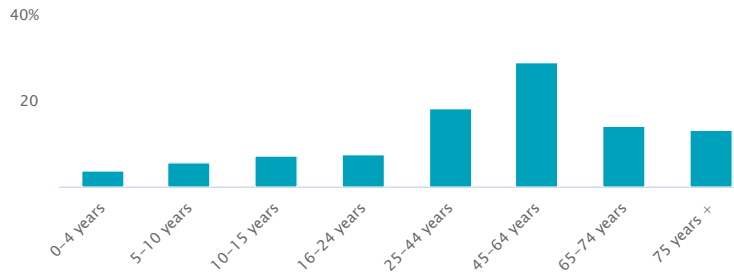

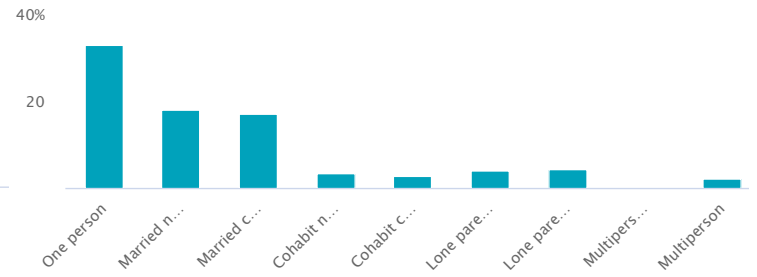

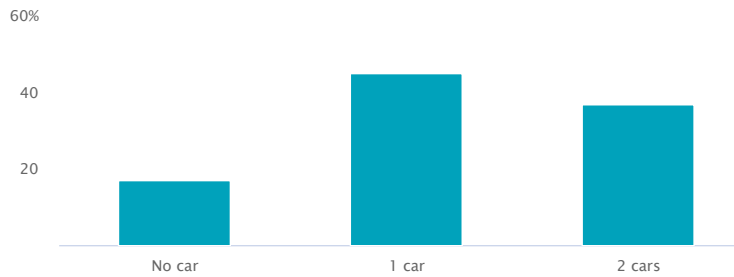

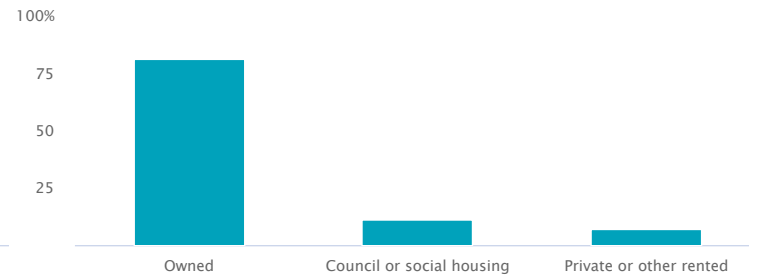

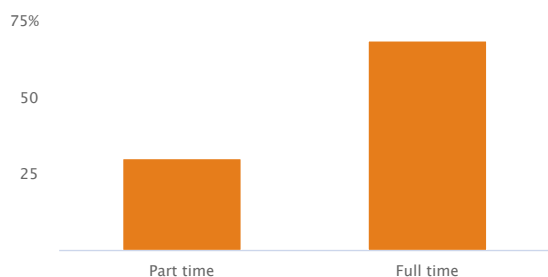

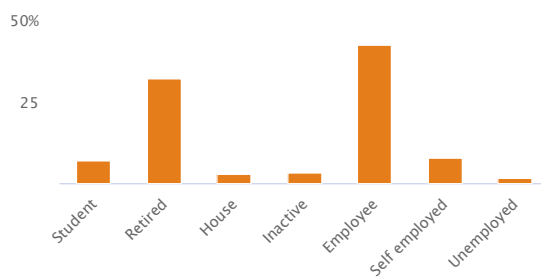
## Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



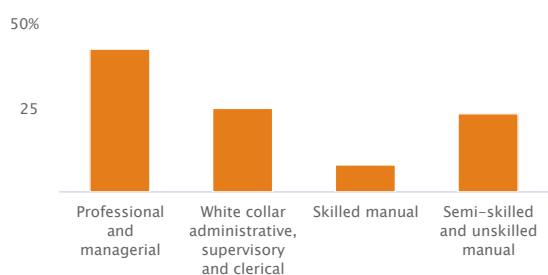
## Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

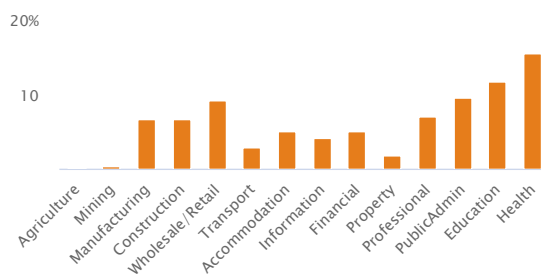

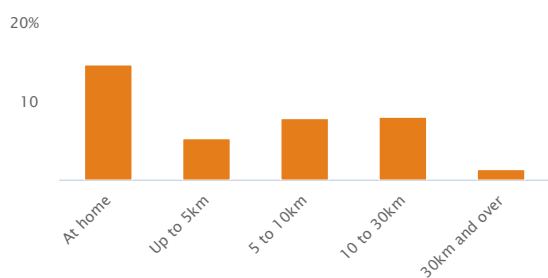
(% households aged 16-64)



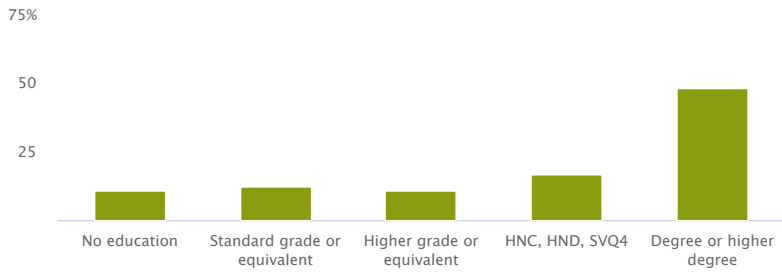

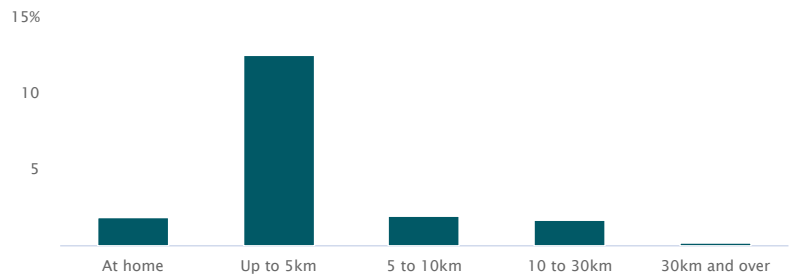
