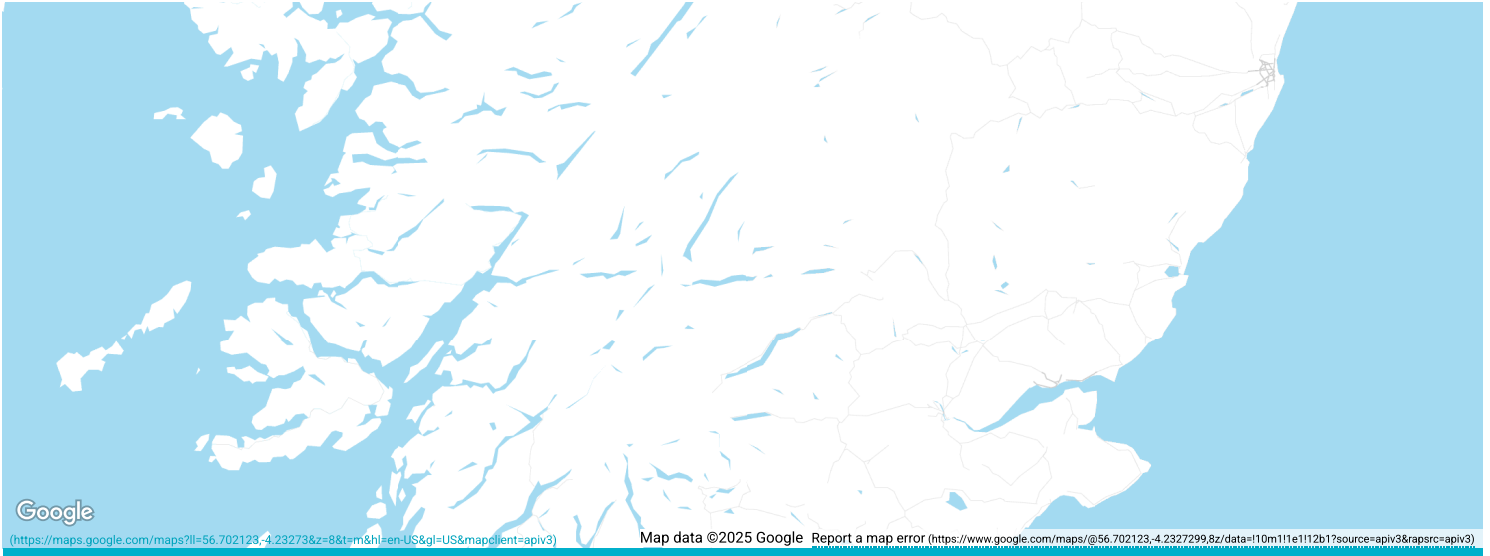




Milton of Campsie

Milton of Campsie is in East Dunbartonshire. As the name suggests it was a mill town. It also had a printworks and a hospital for infectious diseases, these are long gone and the town is a commuter settlement with few local services.

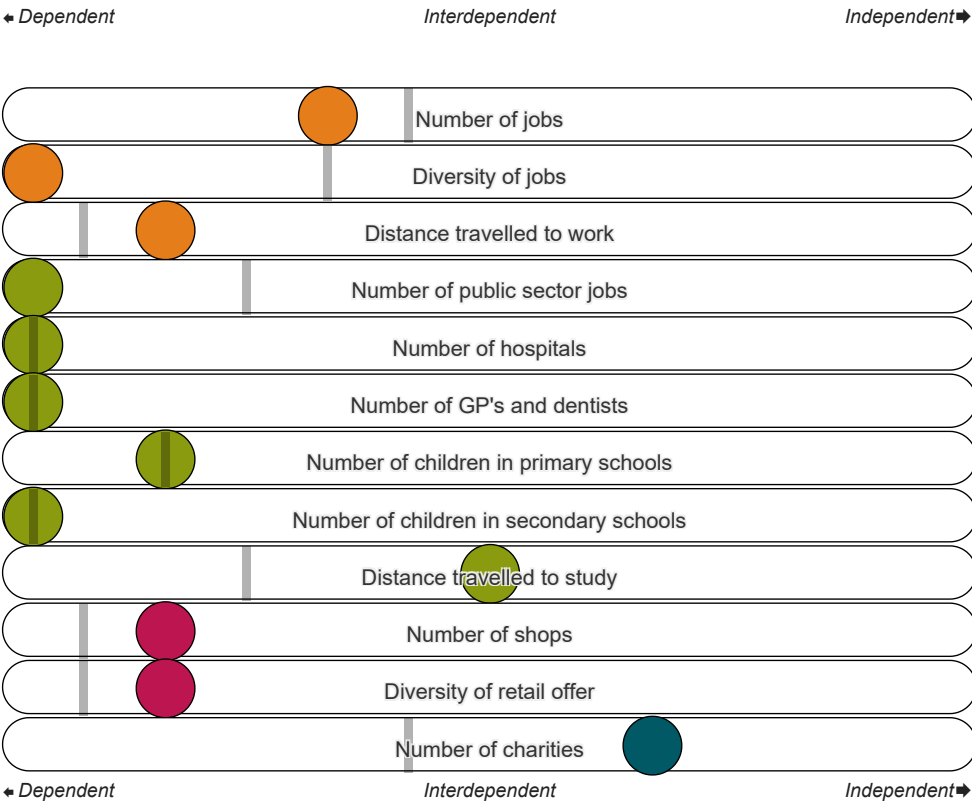
In medium towns such as this, the population is typically older. The group has higher social grade status than other groups, a higher proportion are owner occupiers and car ownership is also higher.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Milton of Campsie is grouped with 1 other town. It also has similarities in the distance travelled to work.

It differs in terms of the number of charities. It also differs in the distance travelled to study. Milton of Campsie differs most from its group in the number of public sector jobs; and the diversity of jobs.

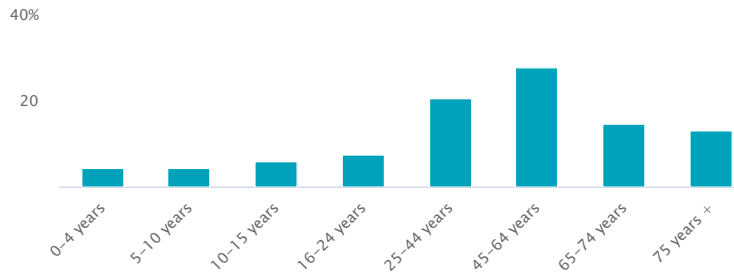

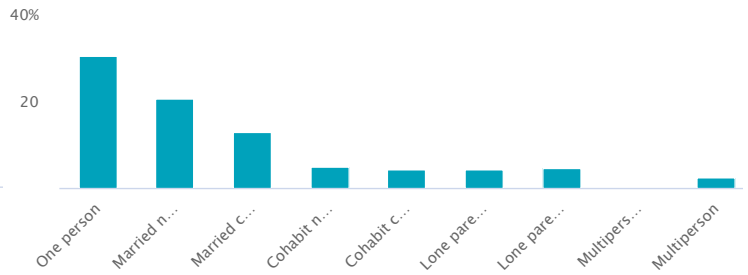

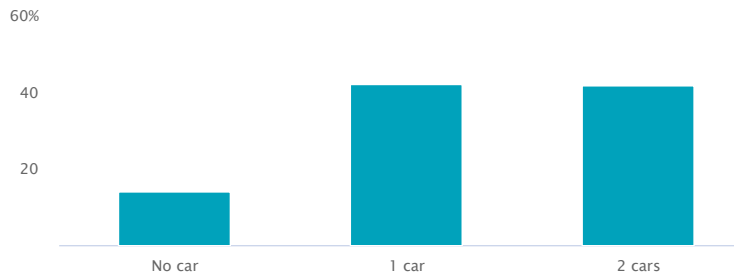

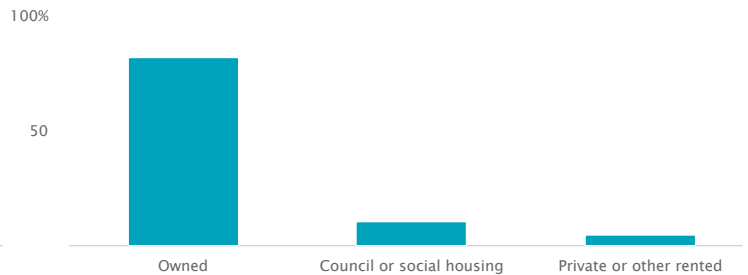

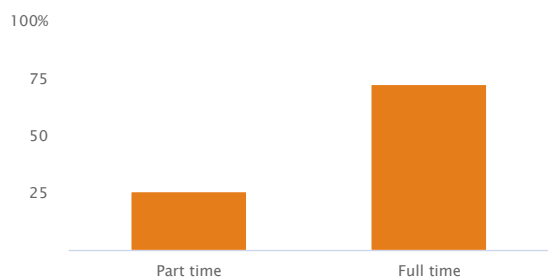

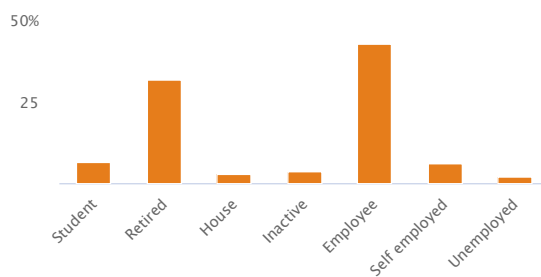
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



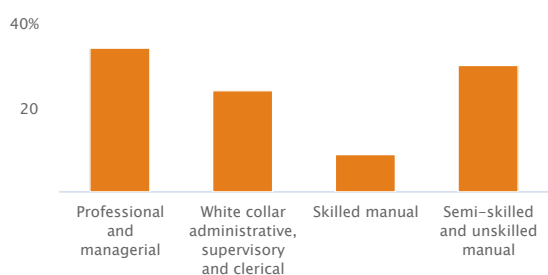
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

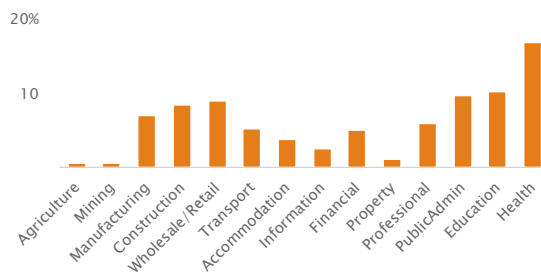

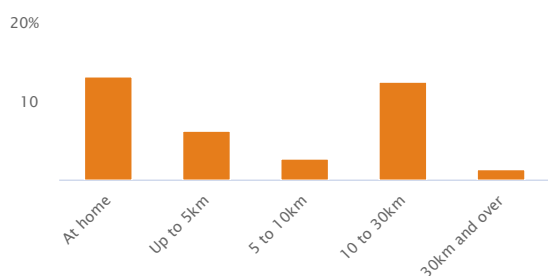
(% households aged 16-64)



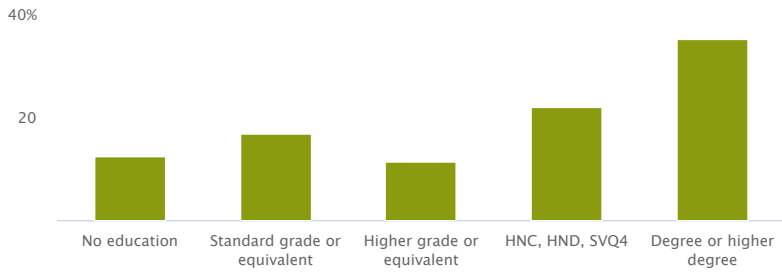
Sector Diversity

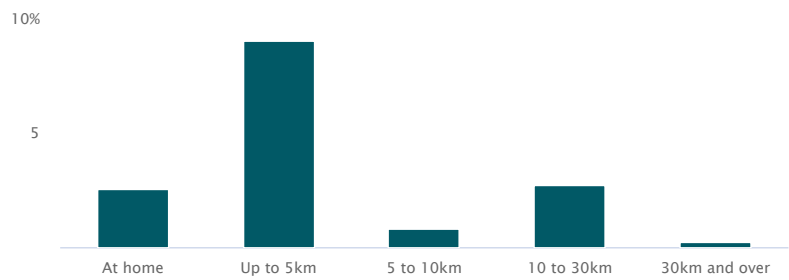
