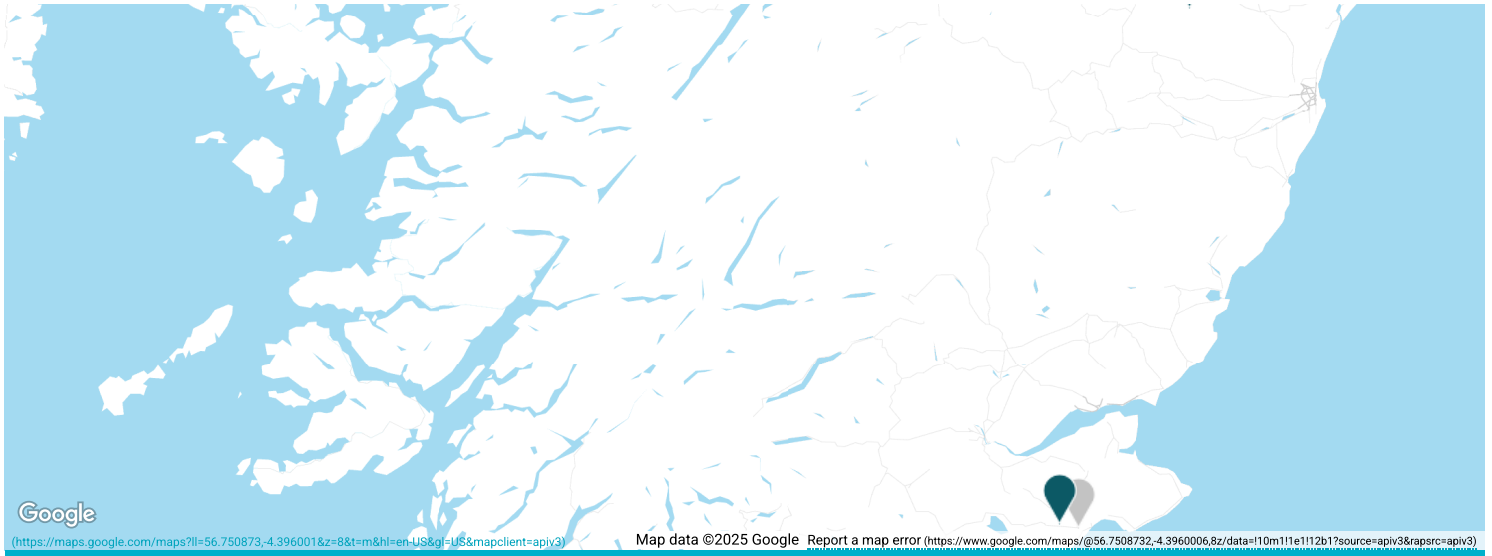




Mintlaw

Mintlaw is located in Aberdeenshire. It is a prehistoric site. A planned village forms the heart of the town dating from 1813. It expanded with the arrival of the railway (now closed). Mintlaw is an important local service centre for the surrounding rural area and since the oil boom has become popular with commuters.

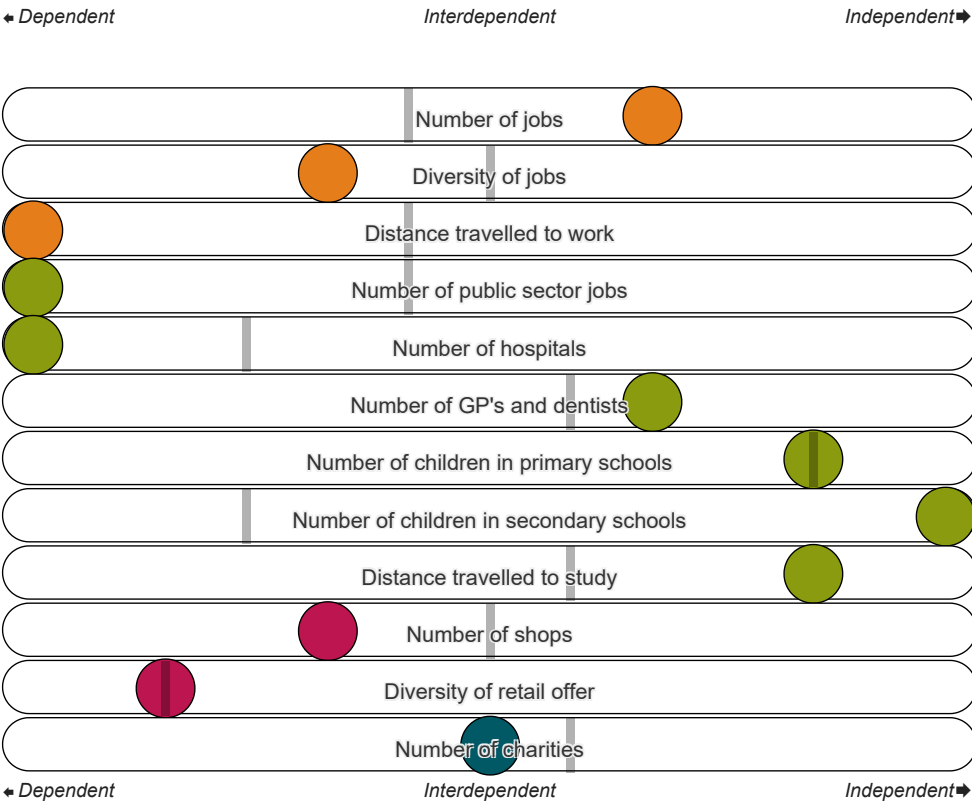
In this type of small town, the population comprises families with a higher proportion of adults in the 25–44 age grouping. Higher rates of full time employment are found.

Mintlaw is an interdependent town.

Inter-relationships



Mintlaw is an **interdependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Mintlaw is grouped with 6 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of charities, children in primary schools, shops, GP's and dentists, and diversity of retail offer.

It differs in terms of the number of children in secondary schools. Mintlaw differs most from its group in the number of hospitals, and public sector jobs; and the distance travelled to work.

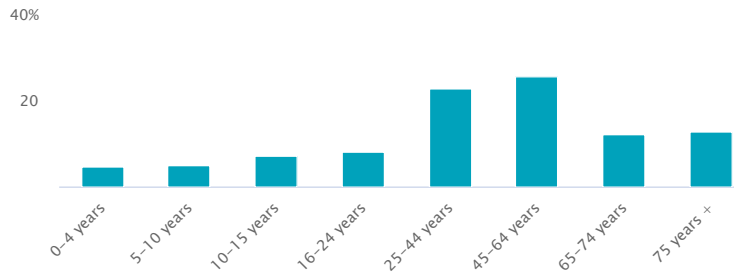

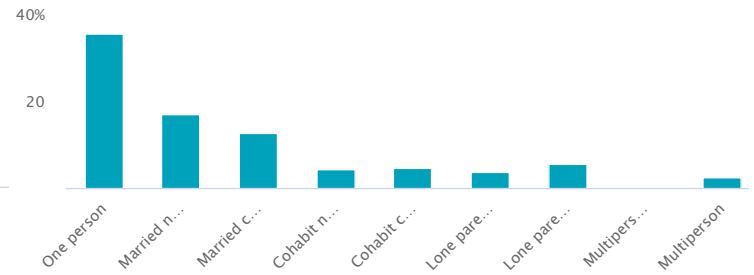

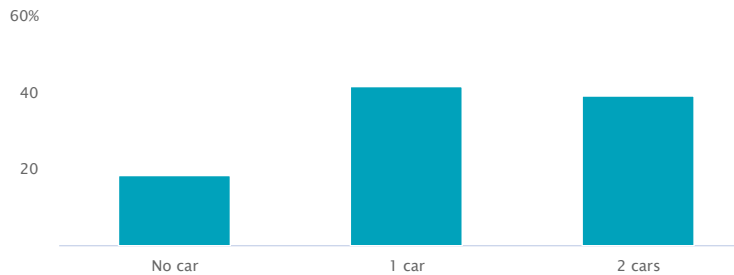

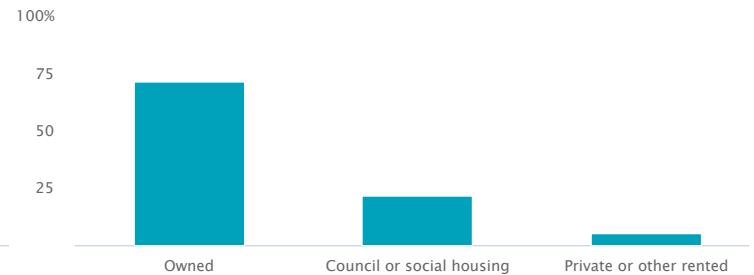
Household composition

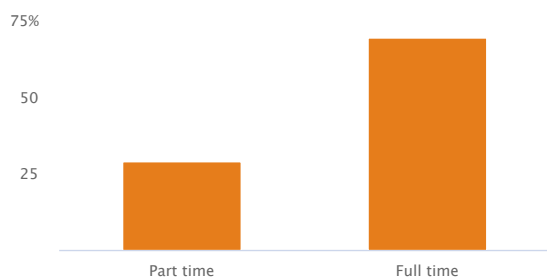

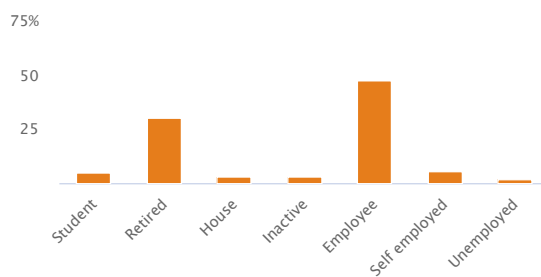
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



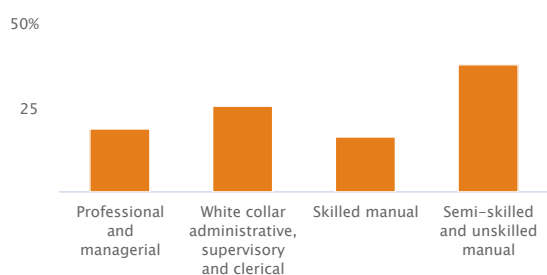
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

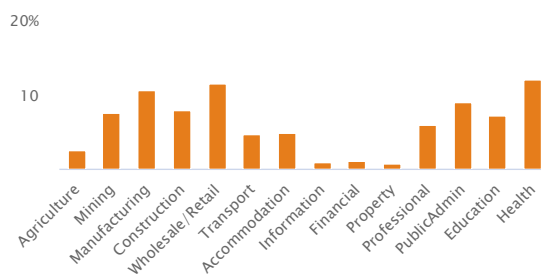


Social Grade

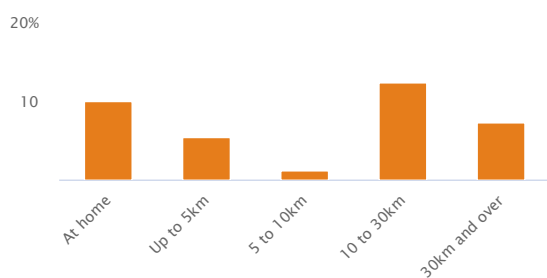
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

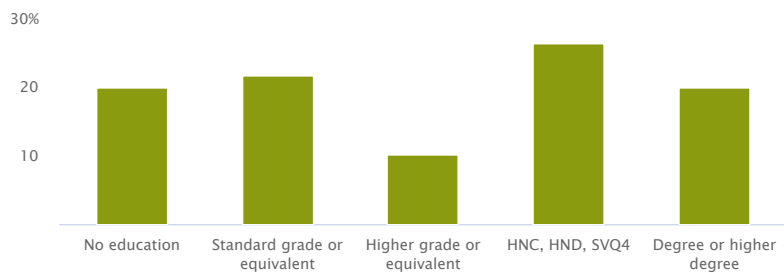


Distance travelled to work

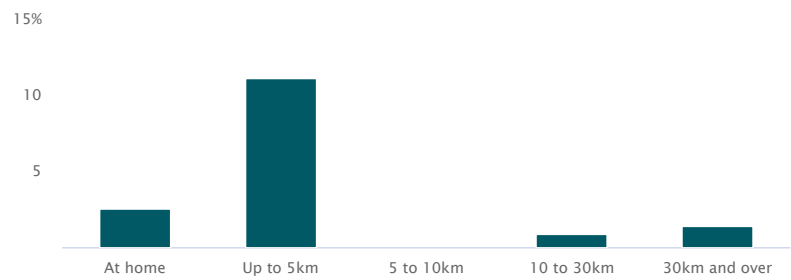
