Moffat is in Dumfries and Galloway. It is the ancestral home of Clan Moffat. In the 16th century it was a spa town and relied on tourists. Tourism remains important. Located on the main route north to Scotland it attracted travellers. Historically it was a notable wool trading town and continues today to be a market town and service centre for the surrounding agricultural area.

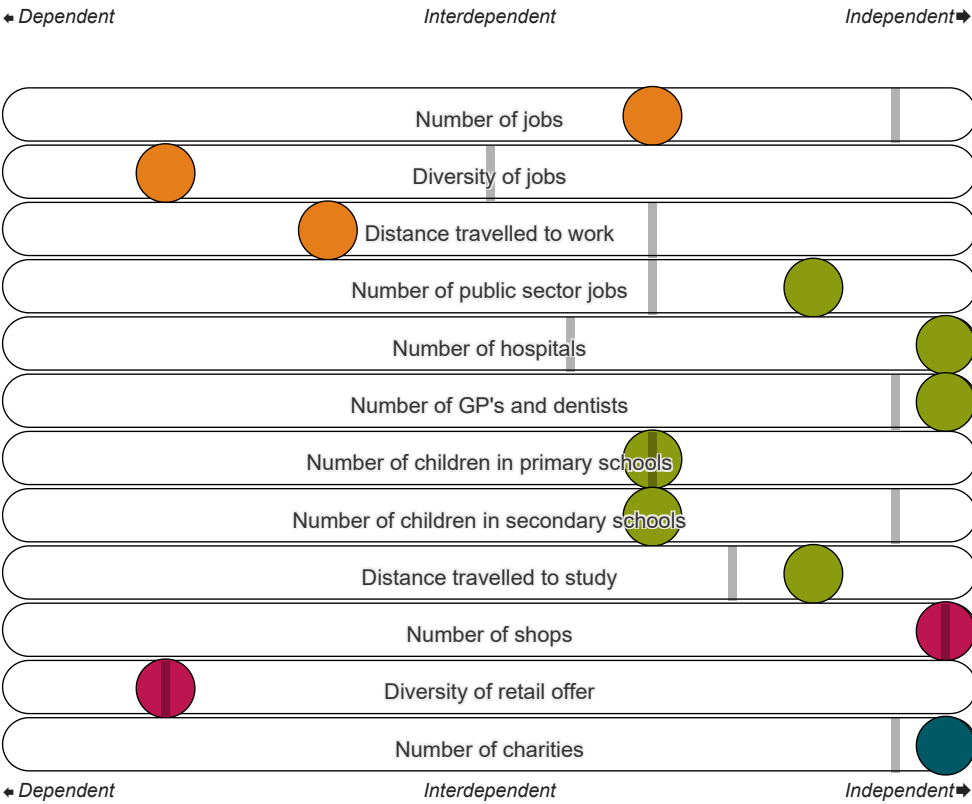
In small towns like this one, and similar, this population includes older people, some still in work often in less well paid sectors. It also includes a significant inactive population, some in poorer health. There is a higher proportion of single households and car ownership is lower.

Moffat is an independent to interdependent town.

Moffat is an **independent to interdependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Moffat is grouped with 8 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of charities, children in primary schools, public sector jobs, shops, GP's and dentists, and diversity of retail offer. It also has similarities in the distance travelled to study.

It differs in terms of the number of hospitals, and jobs. It also differs in the distance travelled to work. Moffat differs most from its group in the diversity of jobs.

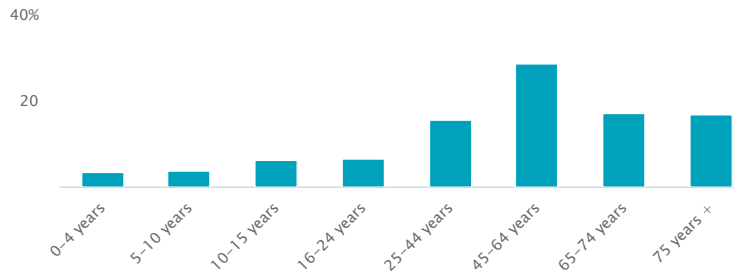

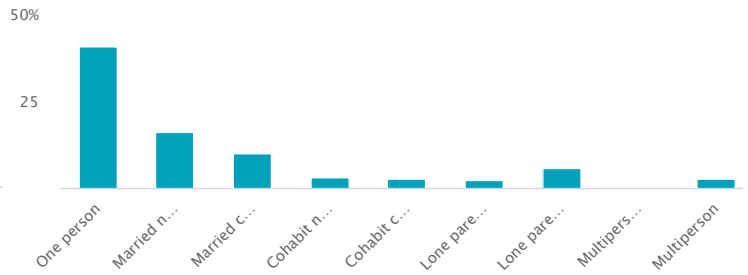

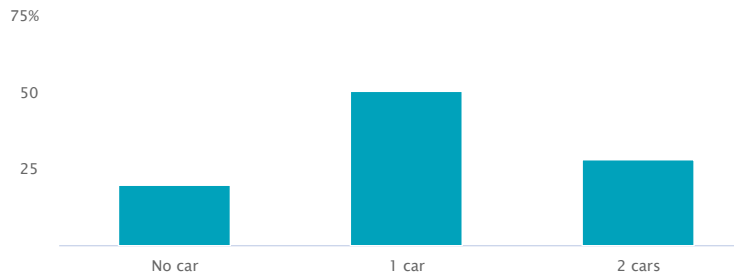

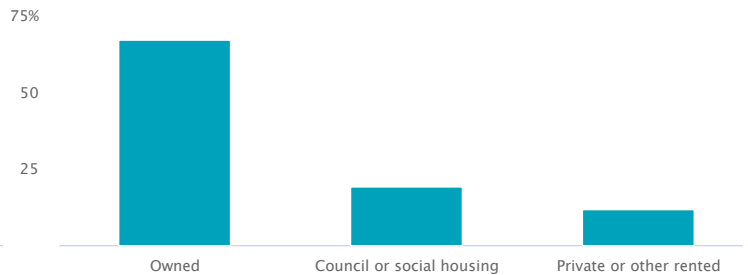

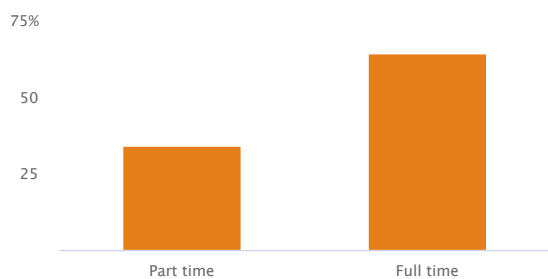

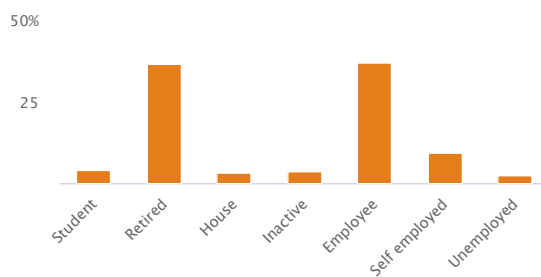
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



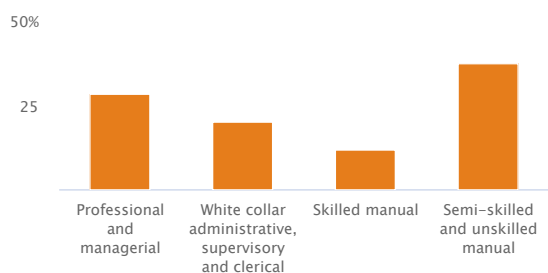
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

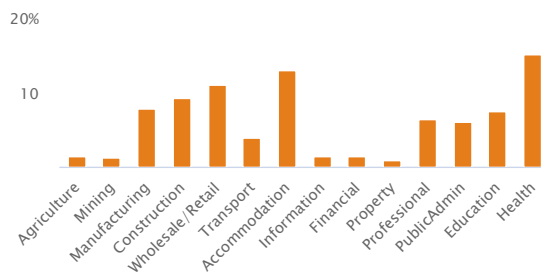

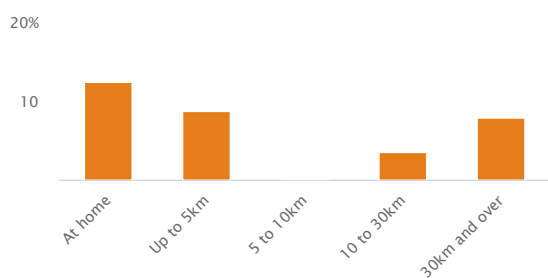
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

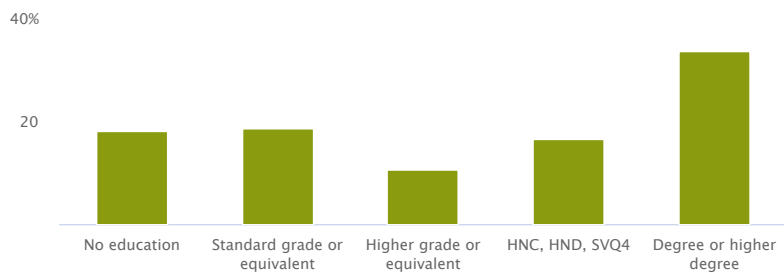


Distance travelled to work

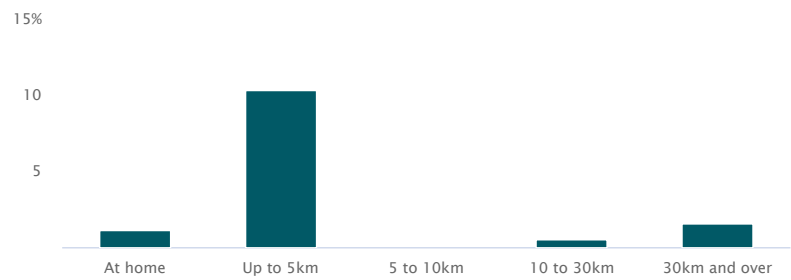
