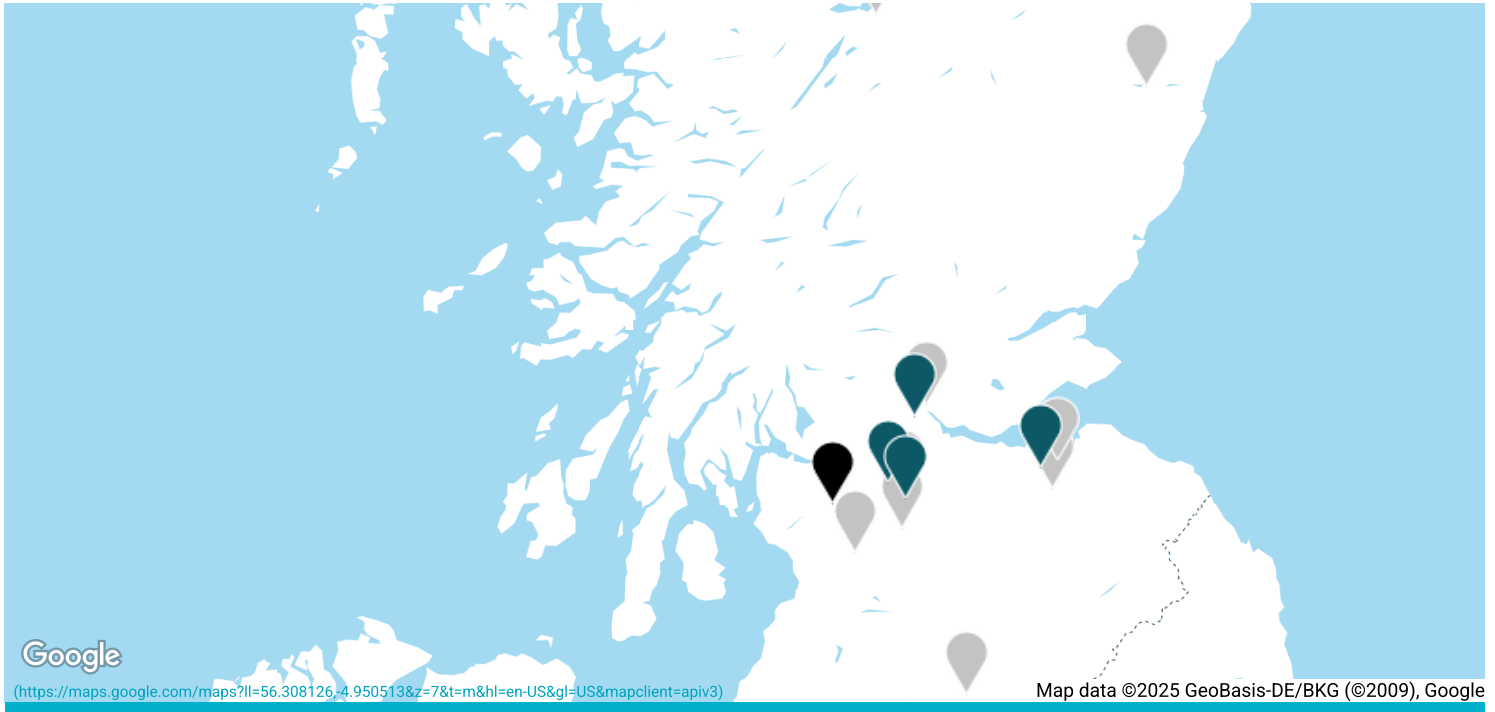




Neilston

Neilston is in East Renfrewshire. In early times Neilston was a rural agricultural village. A textile town historically it was associated with linen and calico printing following the industrial revolution. This led to the expansion of the town. Indeed the last textile mill only closed in 1997. Today it is a commuter town. A community owned windfarm has been established.

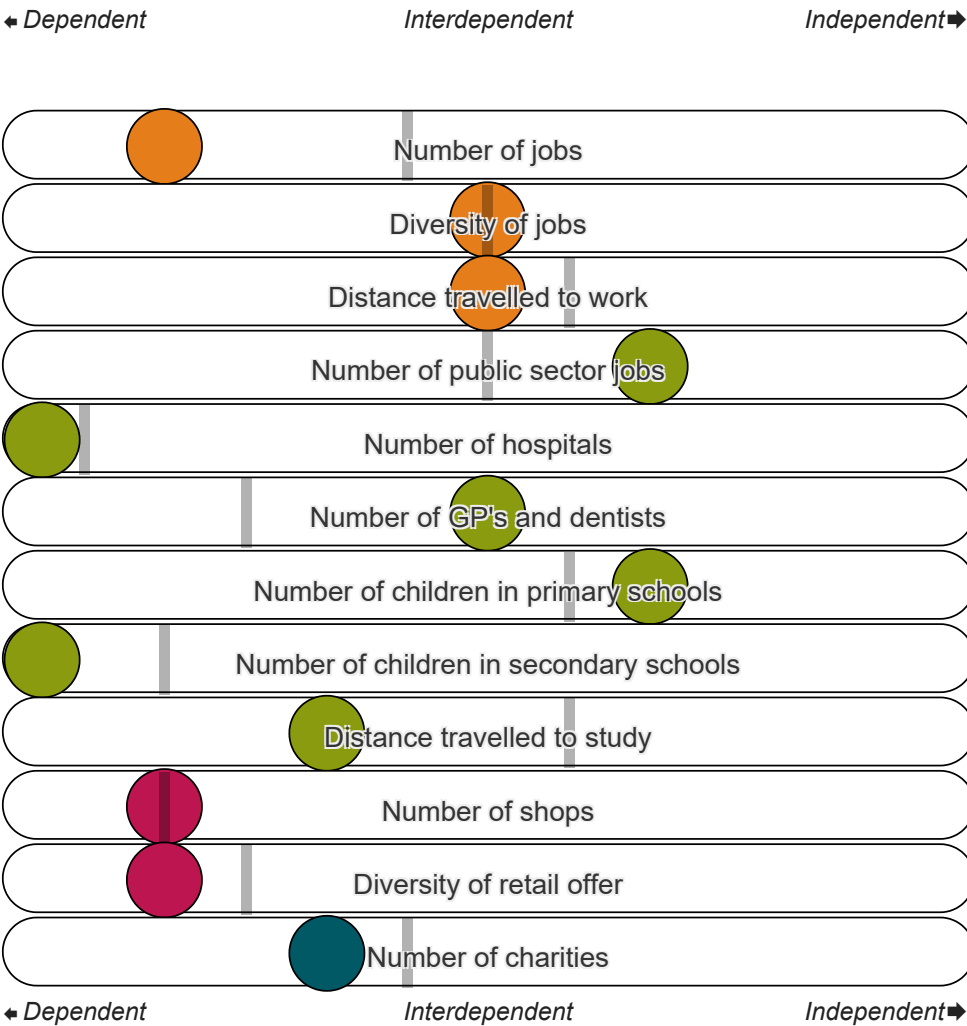
In this and similar medium towns, this population comprises families with a higher proportion of adults in the 25–44 age grouping. Higher rates of full time employment are found.

Neilston is an **interdependent to dependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Neilston is grouped with 14 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of charities, hospitals, children in primary schools, children in secondary schools, shops, and diversity of retail offer. It also has similarities in the diversity of jobs, and the distance travelled to work.

It differs in terms of the distance travelled to study. Neilston differs most from its group in the number of jobs.

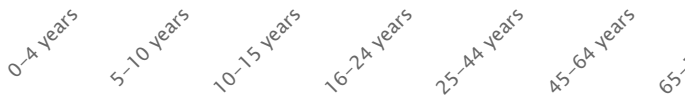

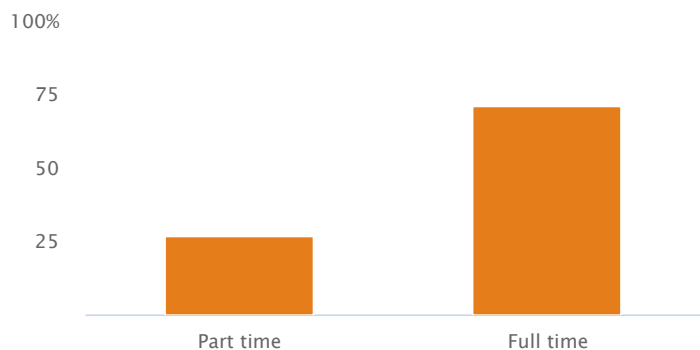

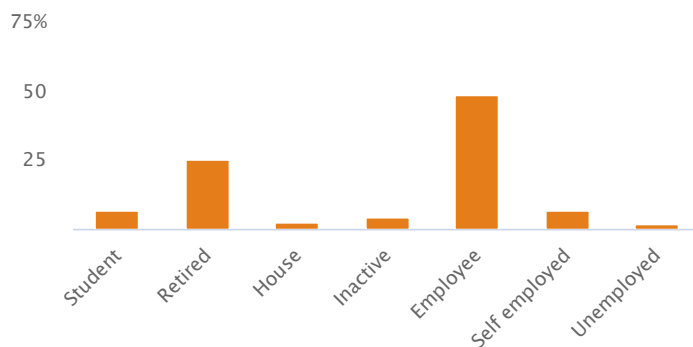
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



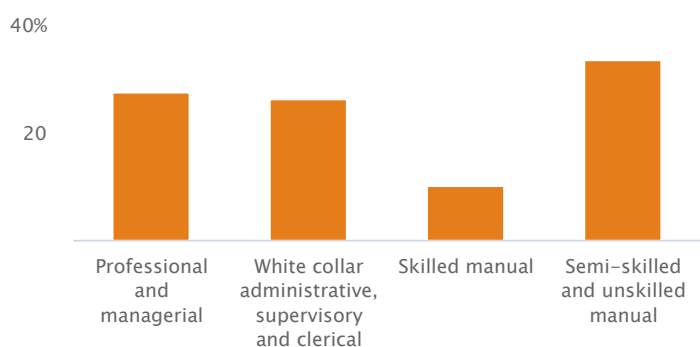
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

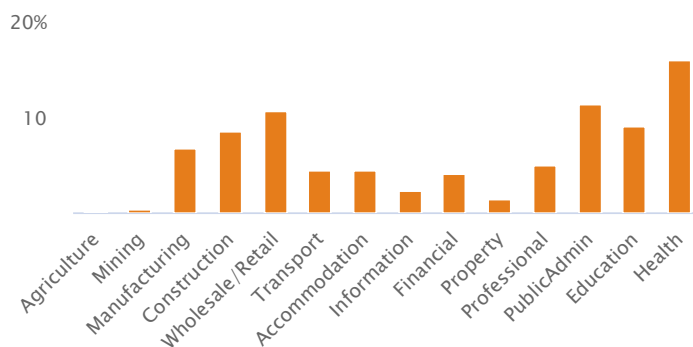


Social Grade

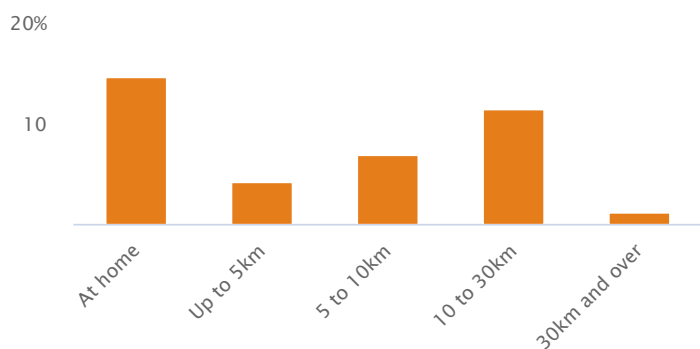
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

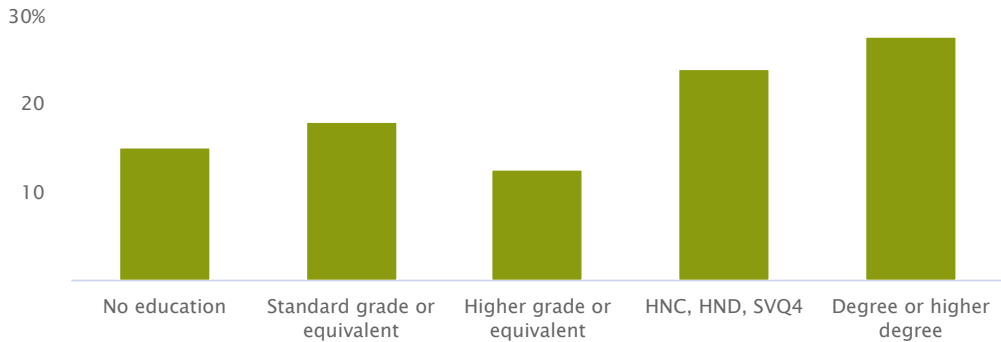


Distance travelled to work

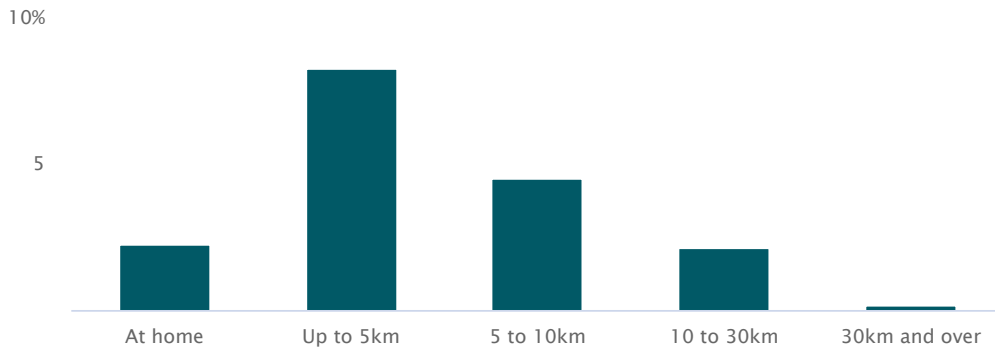
