Netherlee is in East Renfrewshire. Originally a rural village with mills as Glasgow expanded Netherlee became a suburb of the city.

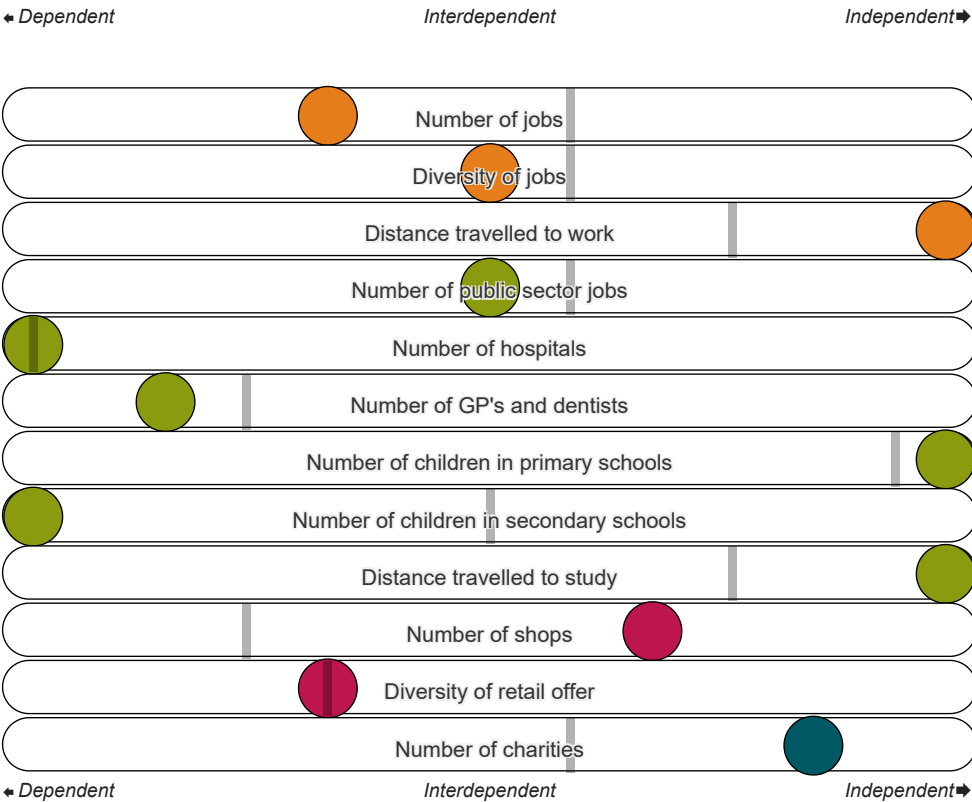
In affluent medium towns, population is characterised by older working age families with teenagers. They are more highly educated and have higher social grades than some other groups. 2 car ownership is higher than in other groups.

Netherlee is an interdependent town.

Netherlee is an **interdependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Netherlee is grouped with 2 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of hospitals, children in primary schools, public sector jobs, GP's and dentists, and diversity of retail offer. It also has similarities in the diversity of jobs.

It differs in terms of the number of charities, and shops. It also differs in the distance travelled to work, and the distance travelled to study. Netherlee differs most from its group in the number of children in secondary schools.

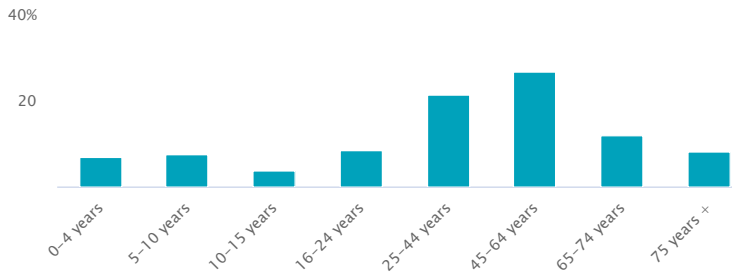

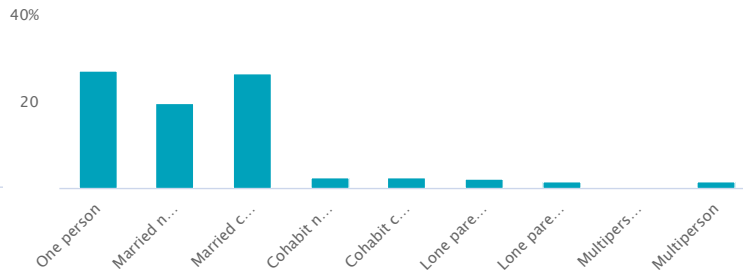

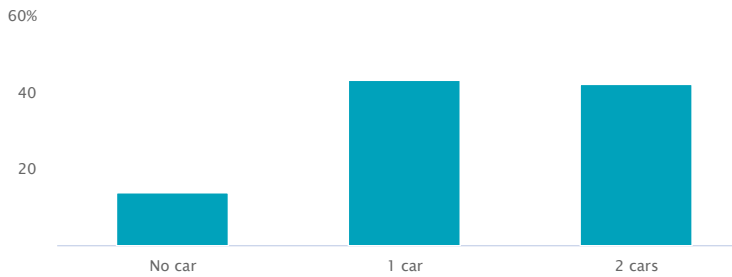

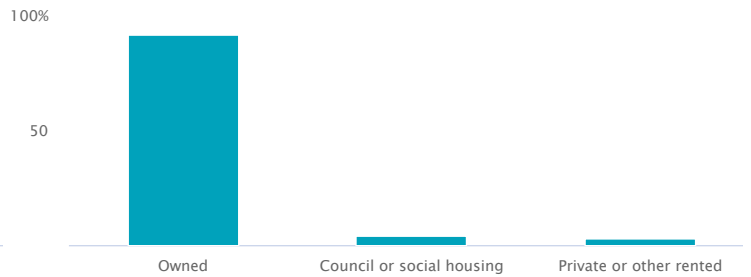
Household composition

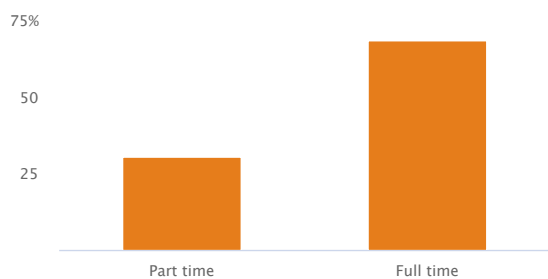

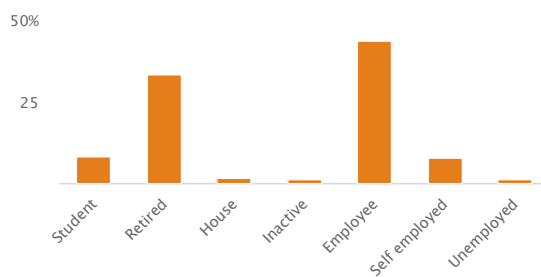
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



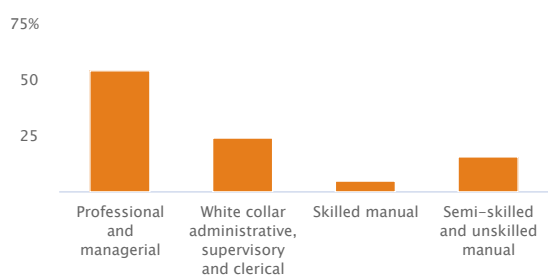
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

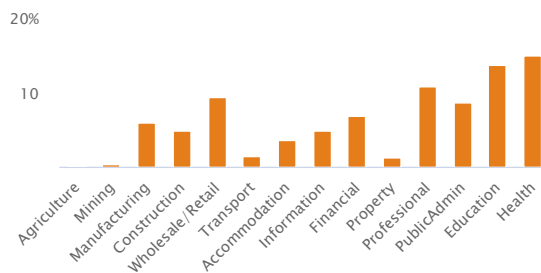

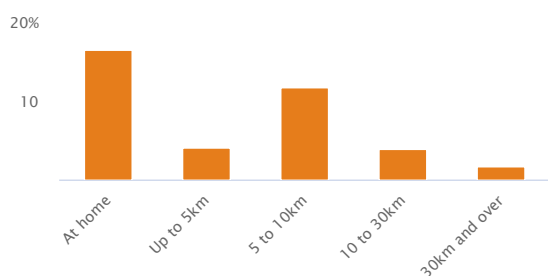
(% households aged 16-64)



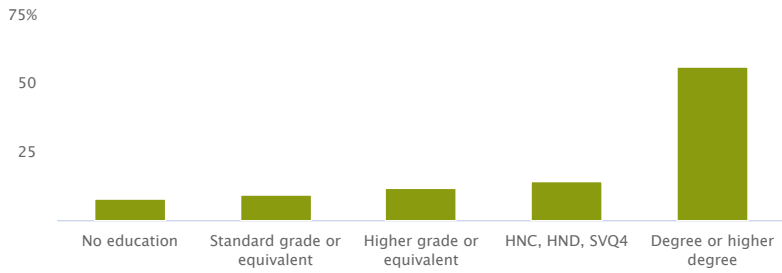
Sector Diversity

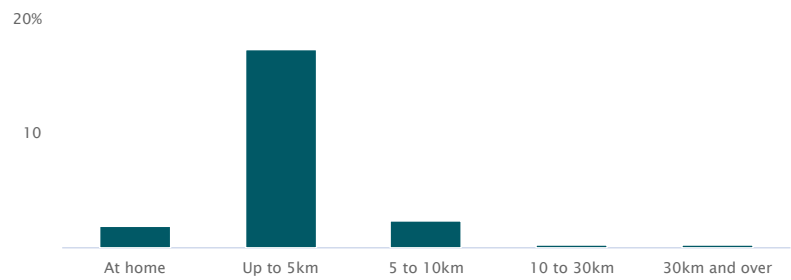
