New Cumnock is in east Ayrshire. From the 17th century coal, lime and lead were worked. In the 1970s the coal mines closed open cast mining continued for a time. The town lacks new employment opportunities and remains a local service centre.

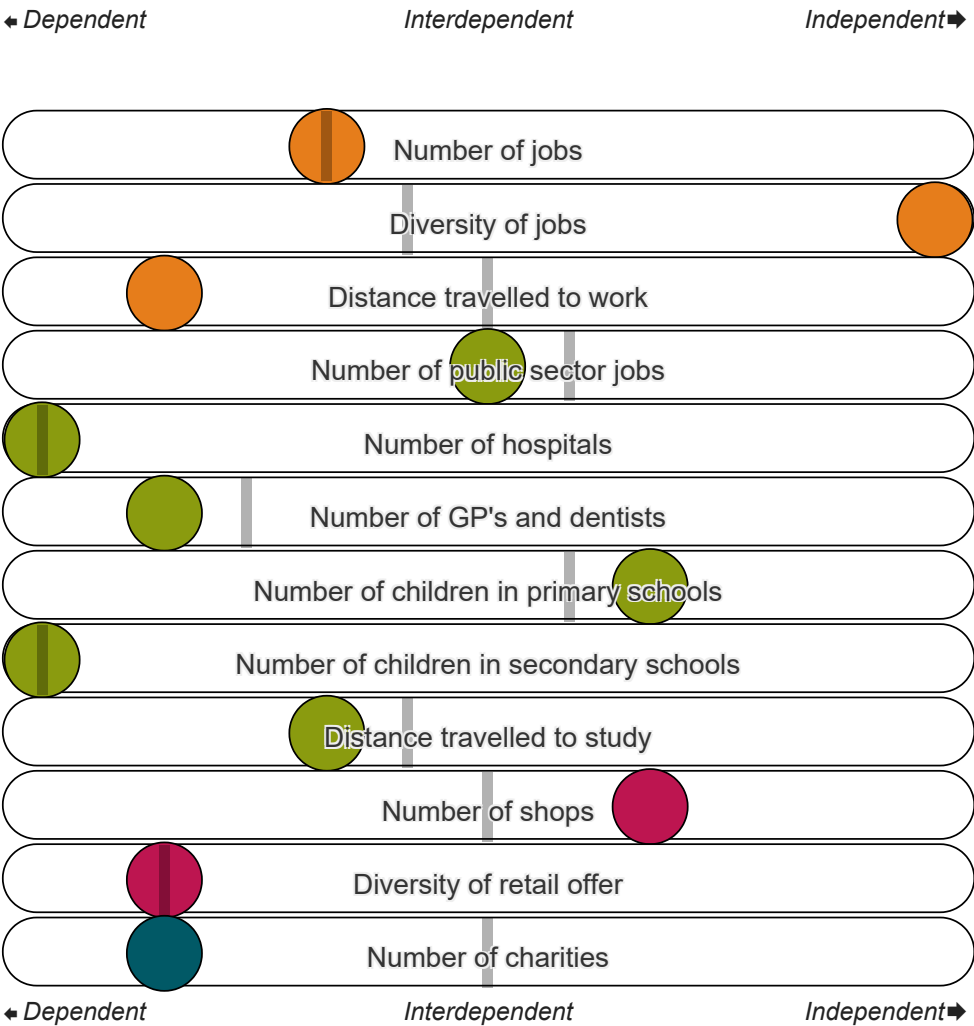
In this, and similar small towns, people experience more challenging circumstances with higher rates of unemployment, poorer health, lack of a car, lower levels of education and lower social grades than other groups. A higher proportion live in social rented housing. There is a higher proportion of single person households and lone parents.

New Cumnock is an interdependent to dependent town.

Inter-relationships



New Cumnock is an **interdependent to dependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, New Cumnock is grouped with 13 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of hospitals, children in primary schools, children in secondary schools, jobs, public sector jobs, GP's and dentists, and diversity of retail offer. It also has similarities in the distance travelled to study.

It differs in terms of the diversity of jobs. New Cumnock differs most from its group in the number of charities; and the distance travelled to work.

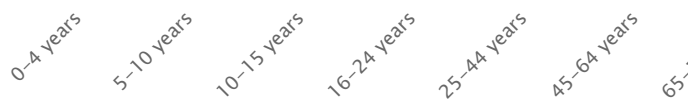

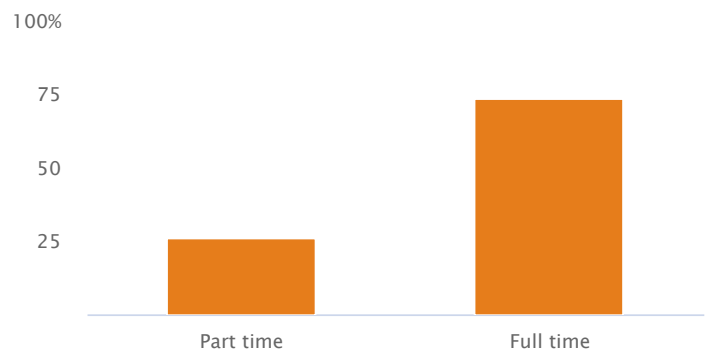

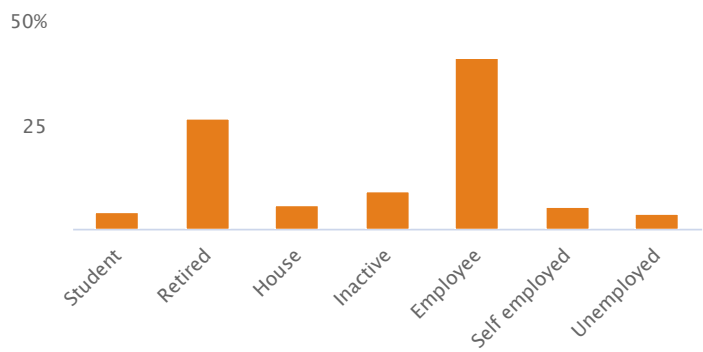
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



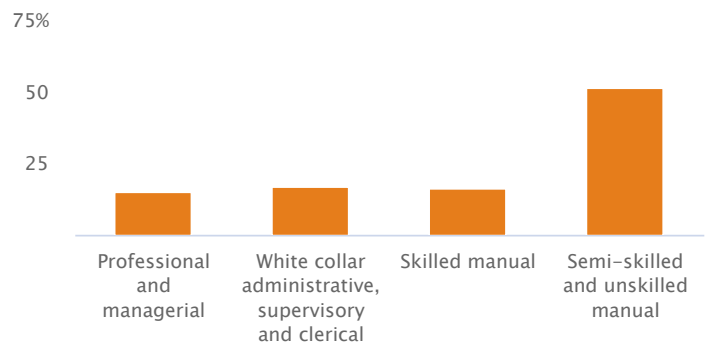
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

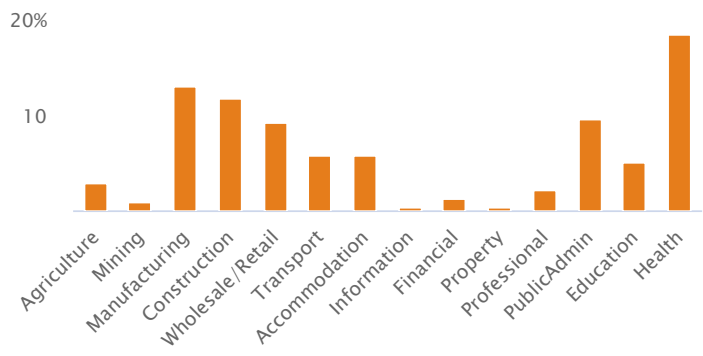

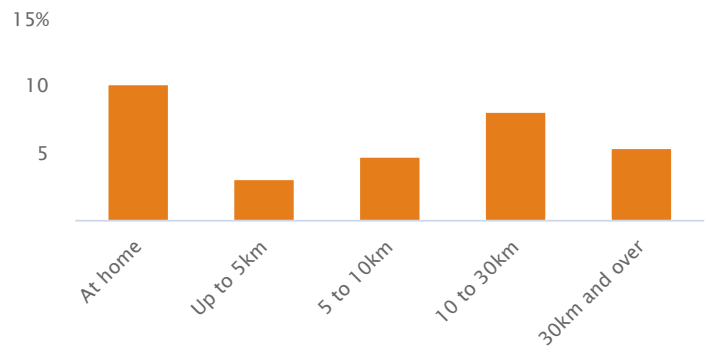
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

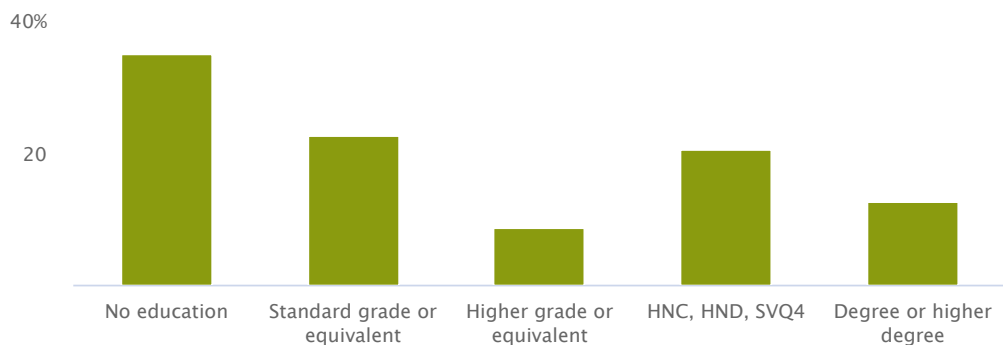


Distance travelled to work

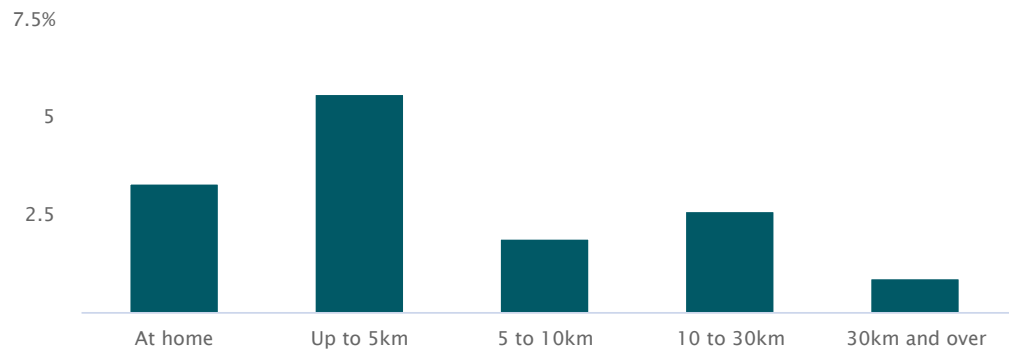
