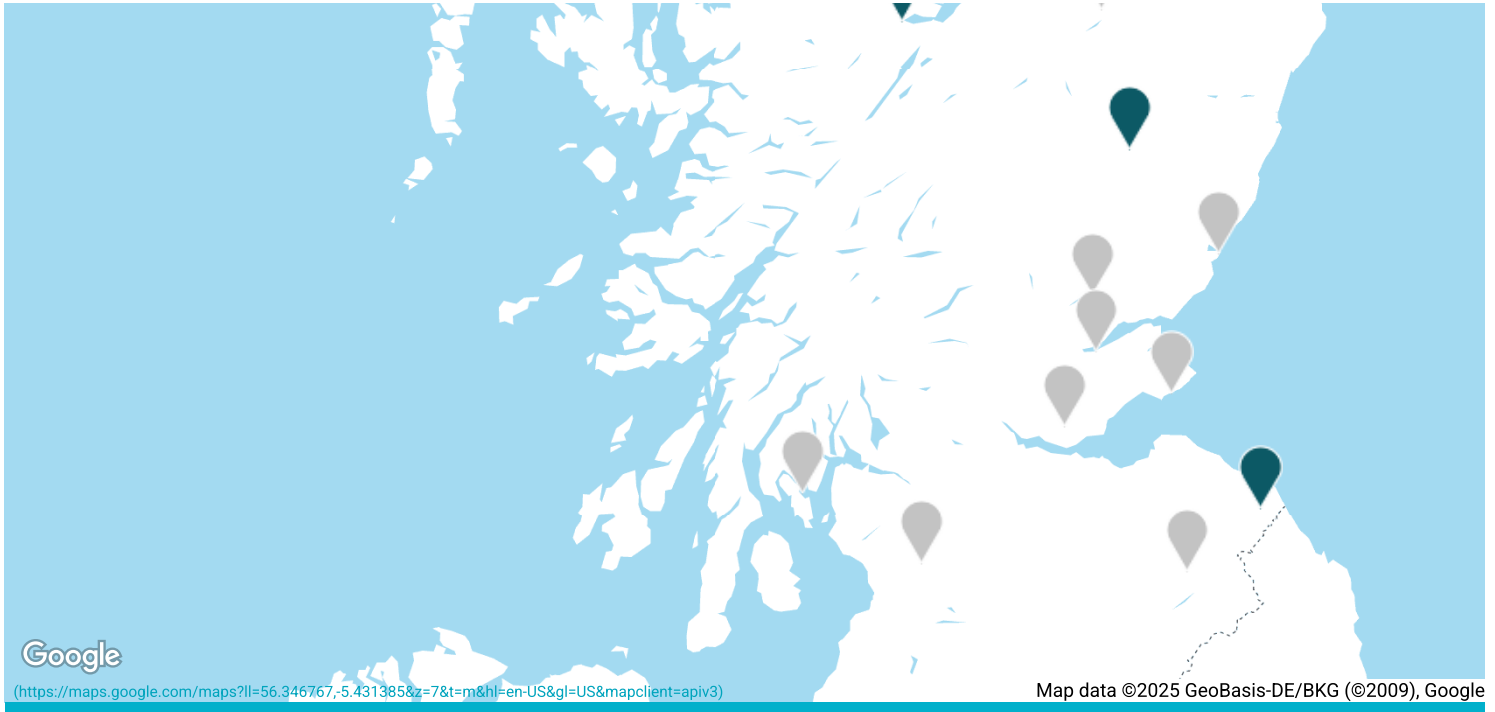




New Pitsligo

New Pitsligo (also known as Cavoch) is in Buchan in Aberdeenshire. The land and fermtoun of Cyaak were forfeited after 1745. It was developed on a as a planned village by the Monymusk Estate in 1787 by new owner William Forbes. Local granite quarries used to be an important employer. Peat was also a local industry and the town was known for lace making. Light industries include off-shoots from businesses based in Fraserburgh.

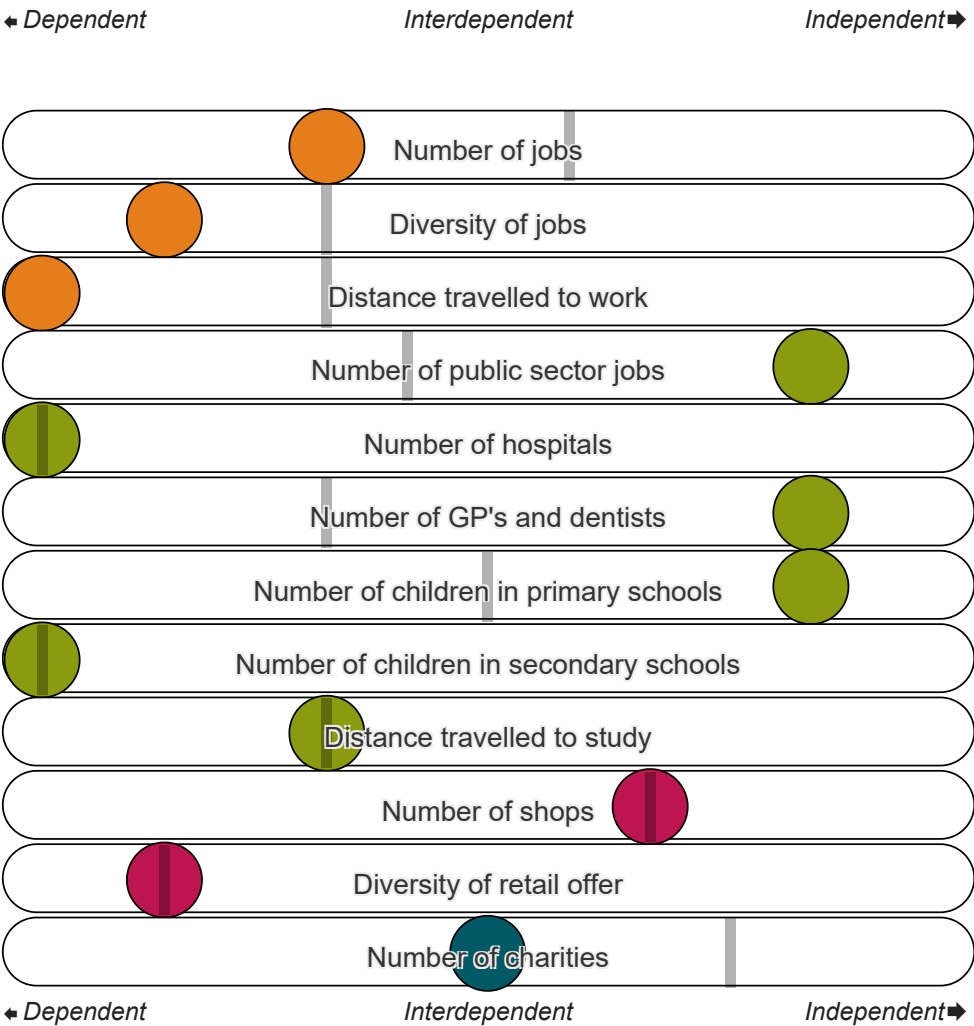
In small towns like this one, and similar, this population includes older people, some still in work often in less well paid sectors. It also includes a significant inactive population, some in poorer health. There is a higher proportion of single households and car ownership is lower.

New Pitsligo is an interdependent to dependent town.

Inter-relationships



New Pitsligo is an **interdependent to dependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, New Pitsligo is grouped with 15 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of hospitals, children in secondary schools, shops, and diversity of retail offer. It also has similarities in the distance travelled to study.

It differs in terms of the number of charities, children in primary schools, public sector jobs, and GP's and dentists. New Pitsligo differs most from its group in the distance travelled to work.

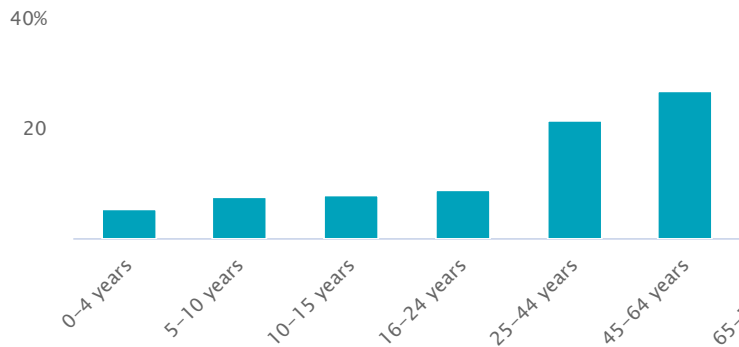

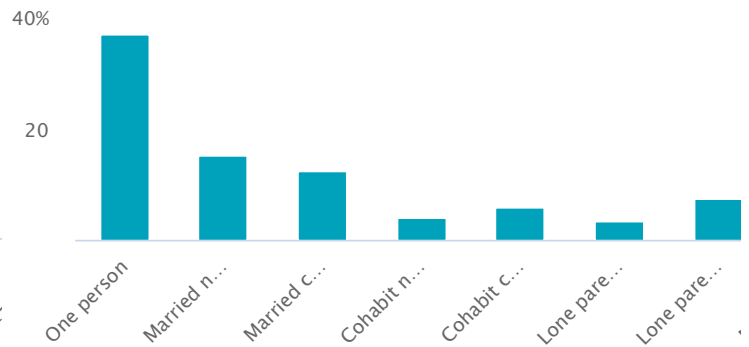

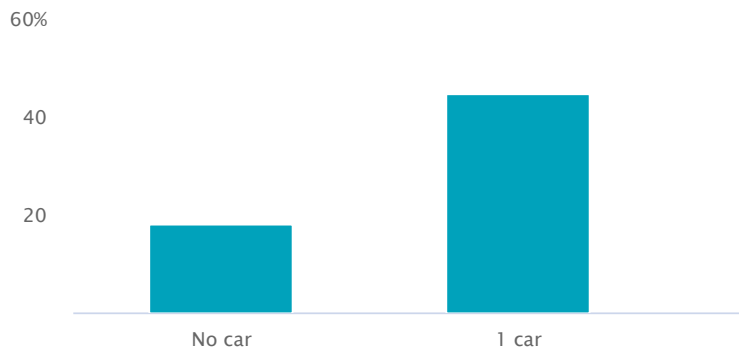

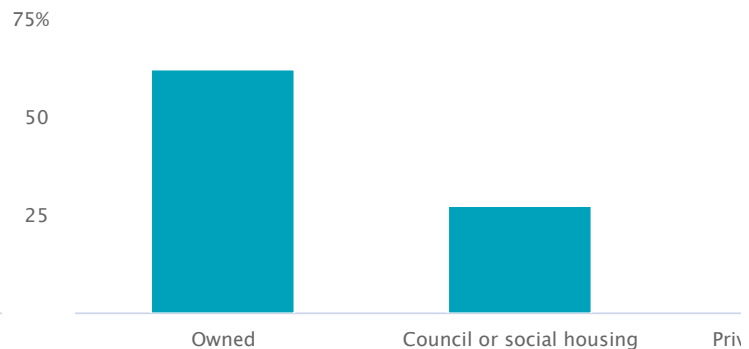

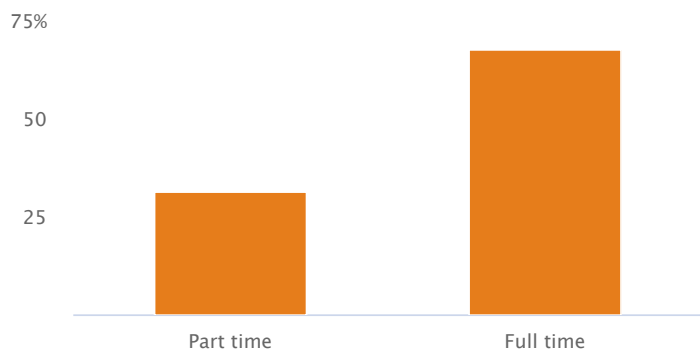

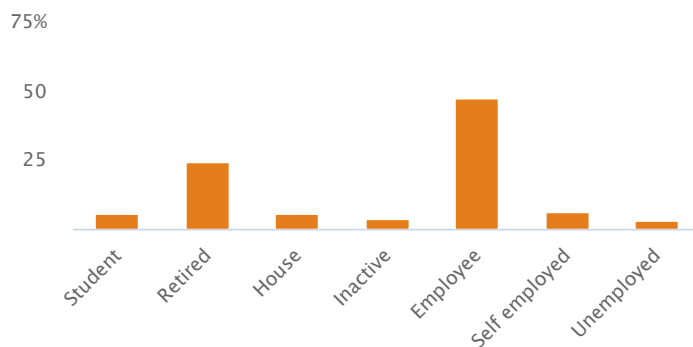
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



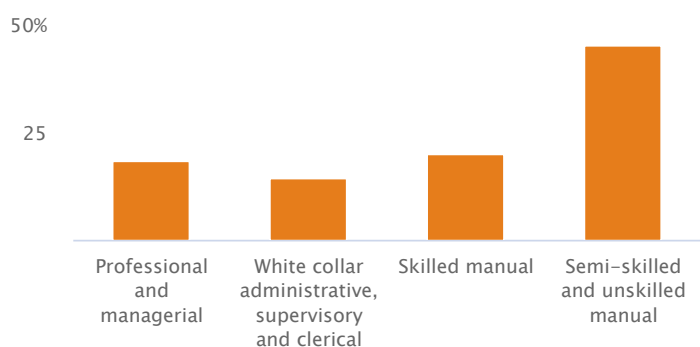
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

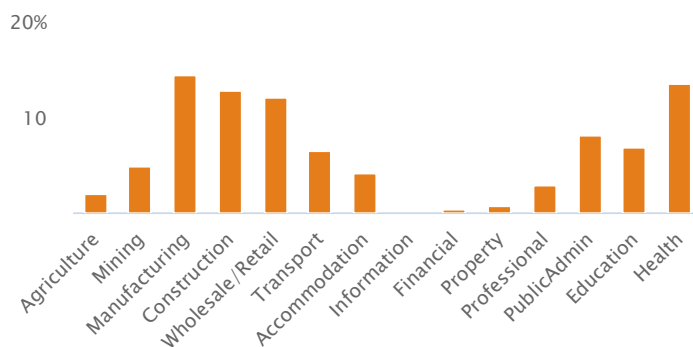

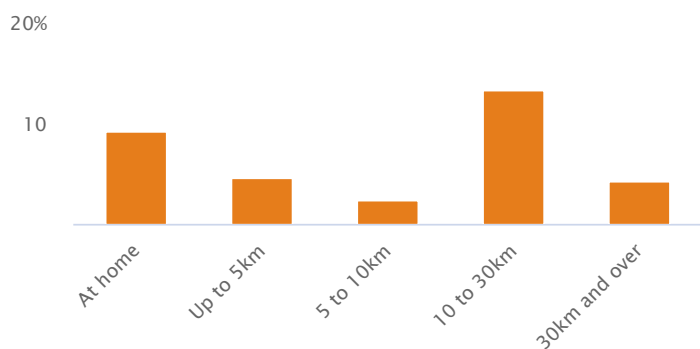
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

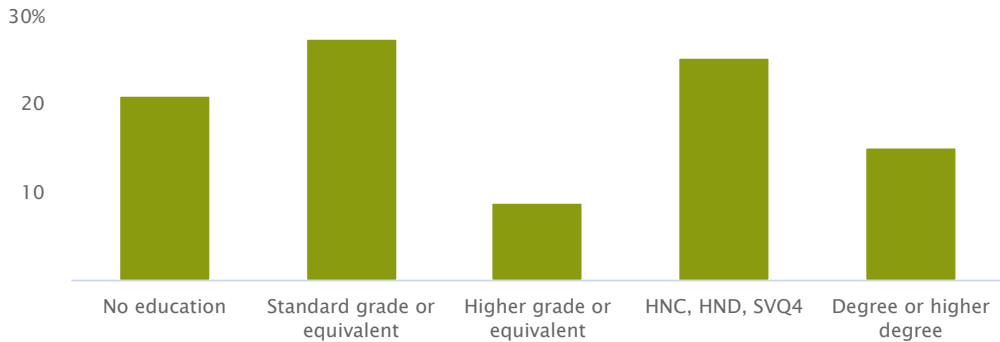


Distance travelled to work

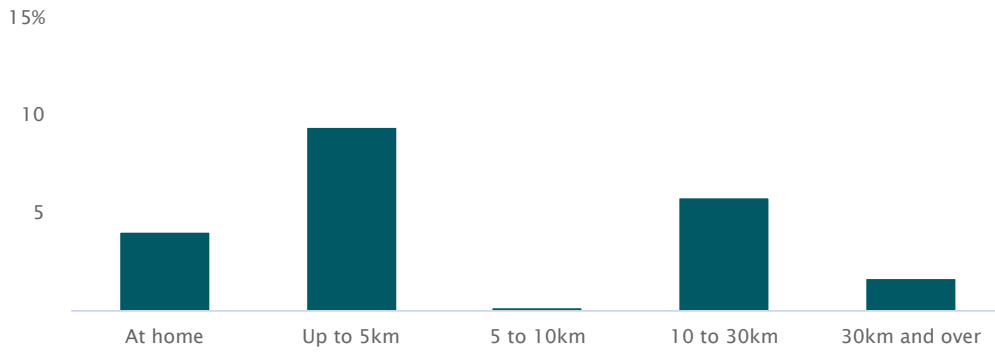
