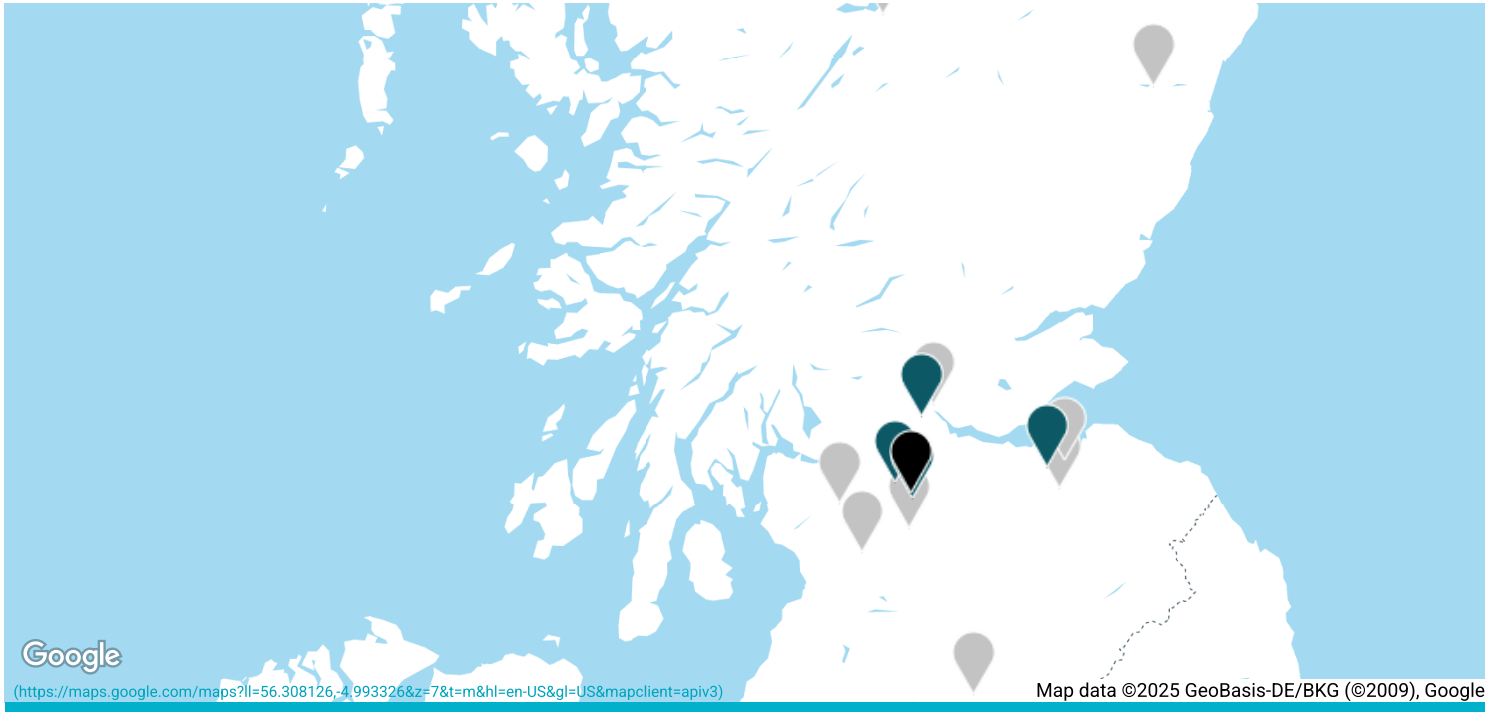




New Stevenston

NORTH LANARKSHIRE

New Stevenston is located in North Lanarkshire. In the 19th century mining led to the development of the town. The Ravenscraig steelworks became an important local employer as the mines fell into disuse. In the 1960s older housing was demolished and new public housing built. Small engineering and service industry activities are present.

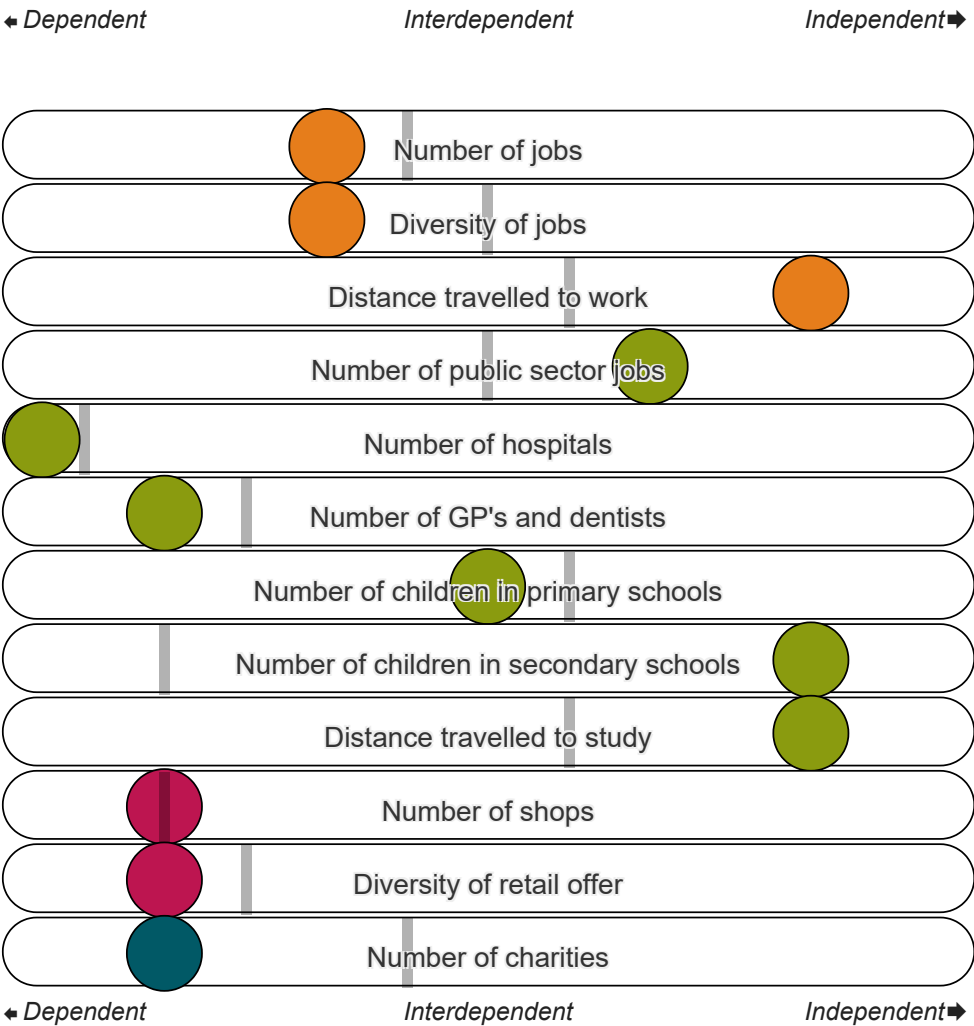
In this and similar medium towns, this population comprises families with a higher proportion of adults in the 25–44 age grouping. Higher rates of full time employment are found.

New Stevenston is an **interdependent to dependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, New Stevenston is grouped with 14 other towns. It also has similarities in the diversity of jobs.

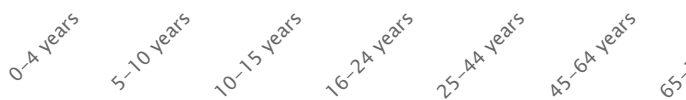

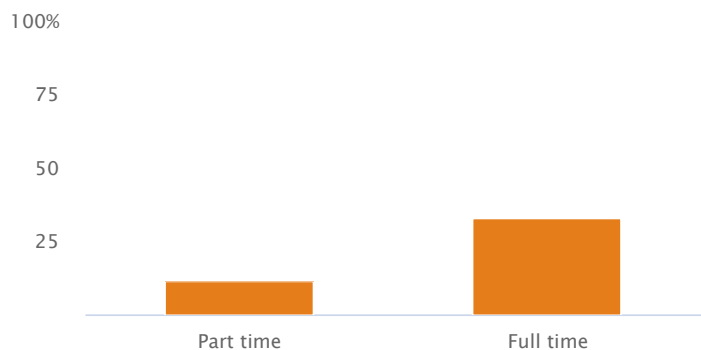

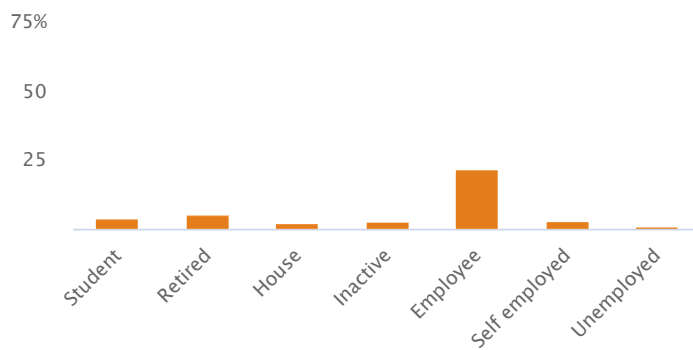
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



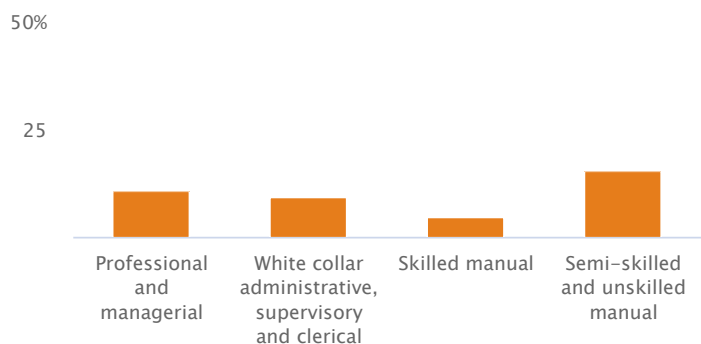
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

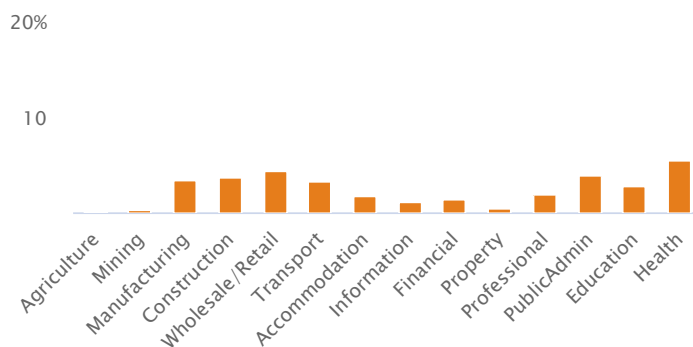

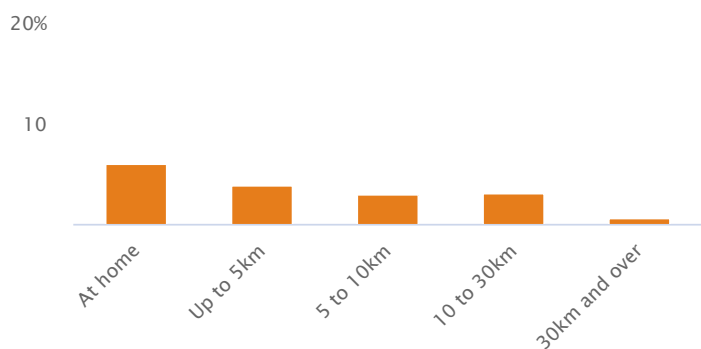
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

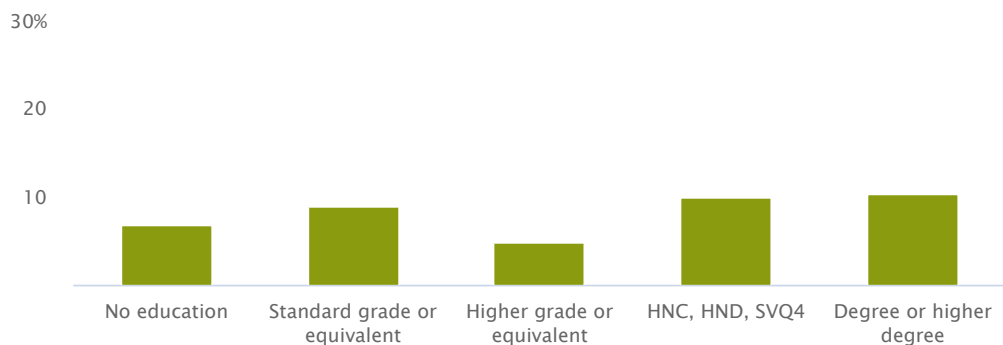


Distance travelled to work

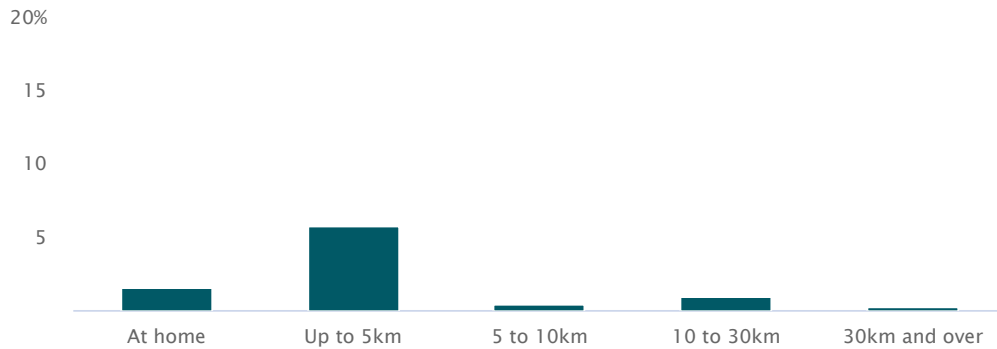
