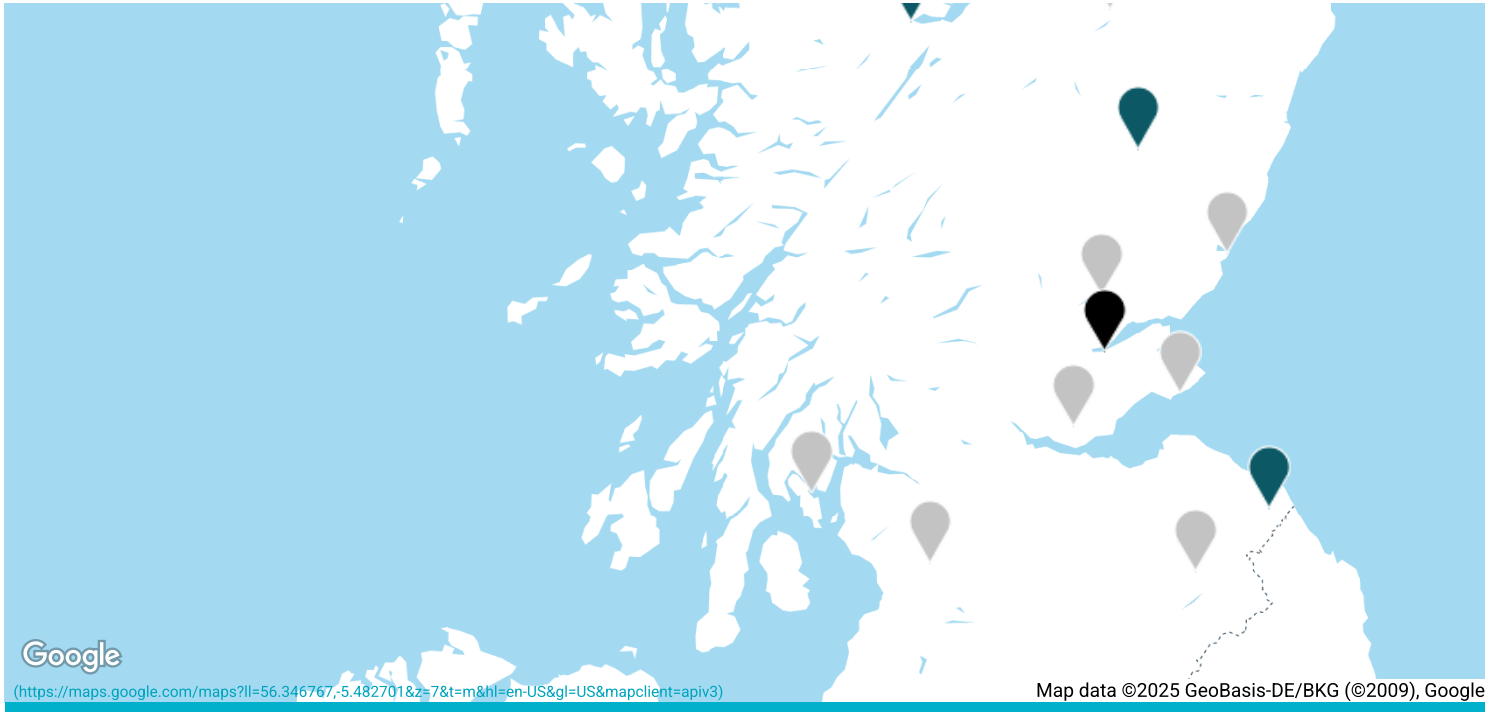




Newburgh (Fife)

Newburgh and Burnside is in Fife. It was a port and market town whose origins were associated with abbey at nearby Lindores. linen, flax, malting and quarrying were important historically. Linoleum was manufactured in Newburgh until the 1980s. Quarrying continues today but for the many residents are commuters and the town is a local service centre. A new distillery has been opened.

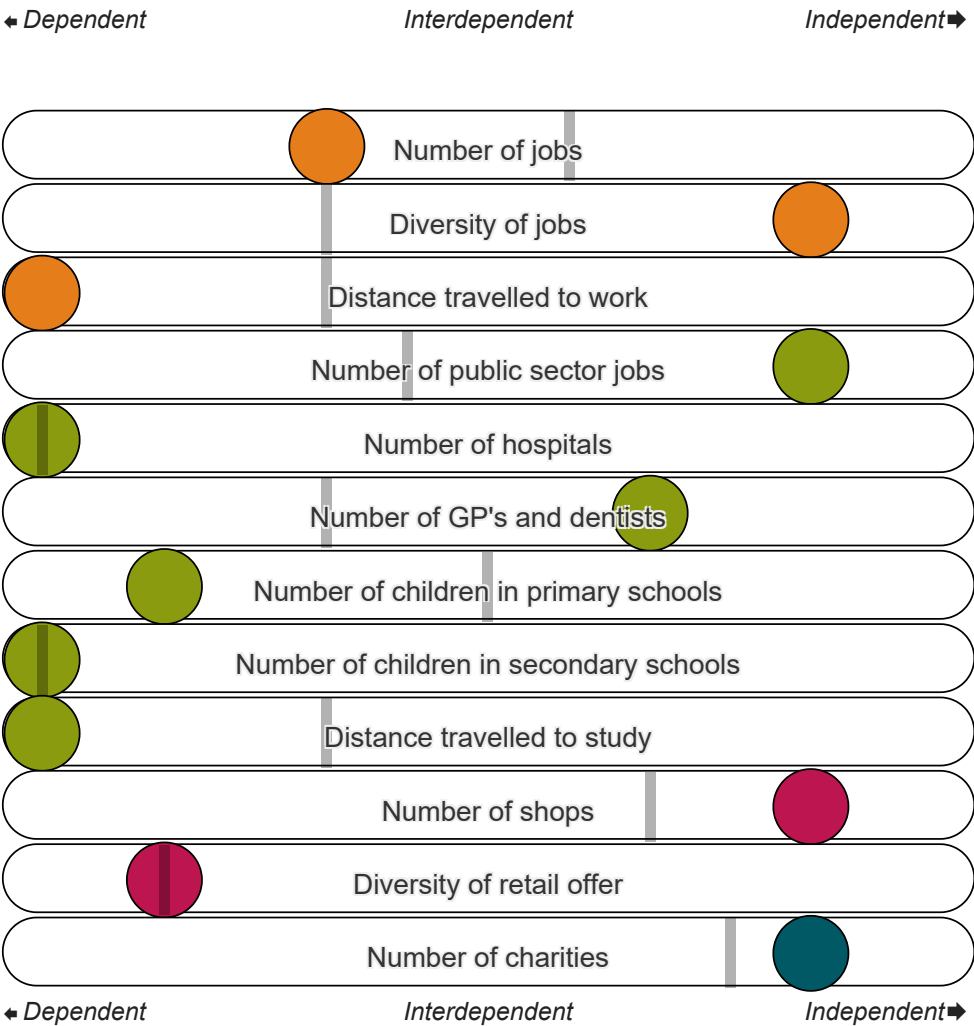
In small towns like this one, and similar, this population includes older people, some still in work often in less well paid sectors. It also includes a significant inactive population, some in poorer health. There is a higher proportion of single households and car ownership is lower.

Newburgh (Fife) is an interdependent to dependent town.

Newburgh (Fife) is an **interdependent to dependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Newburgh (Fife) is grouped with 15 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of charities, hospitals, children in secondary schools, and diversity of retail offer.

It differs in terms of the number of children in primary schools, public sector jobs, and GP's and dentists. It also differs in the diversity of jobs. Newburgh (Fife) differs most from its group in the distance travelled to work, and the distance travelled to study.

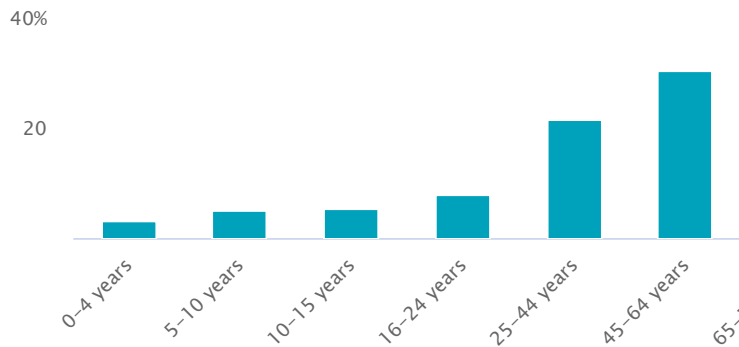

Population change 2011 to 2022**-6%**

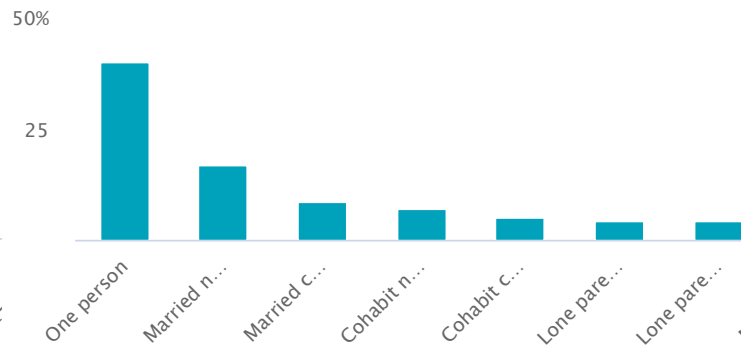

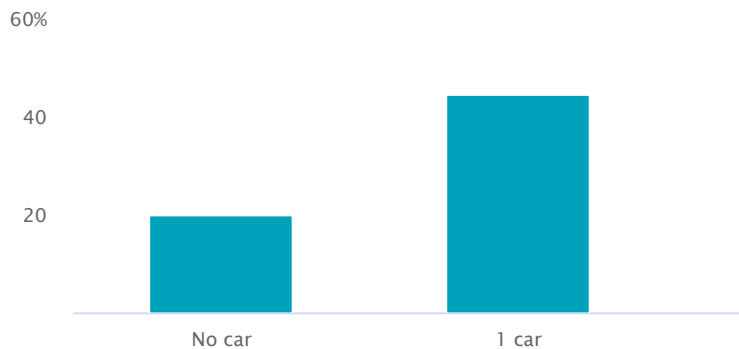

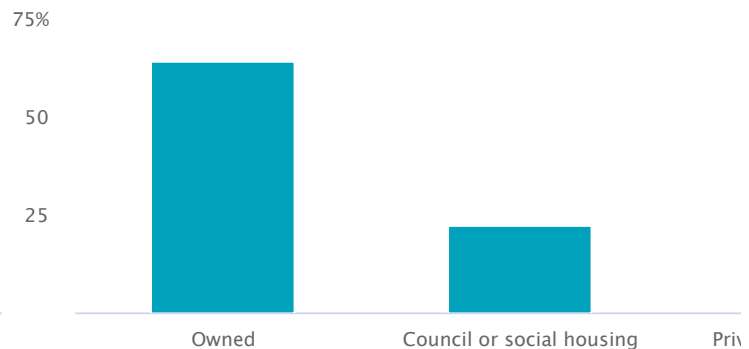
Household composition

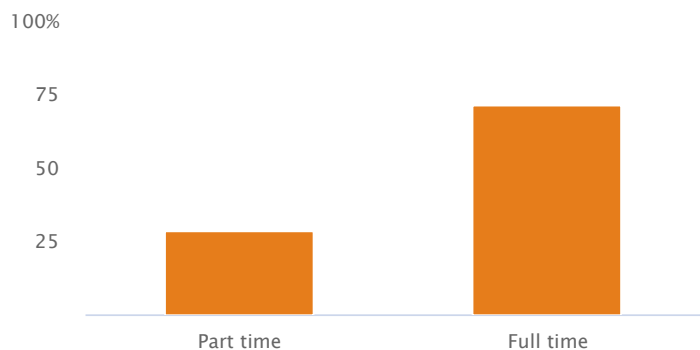

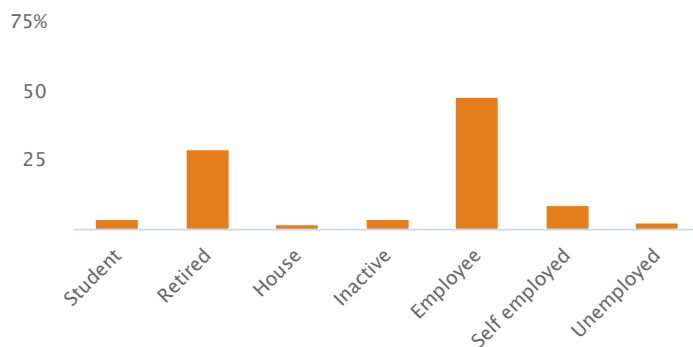
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



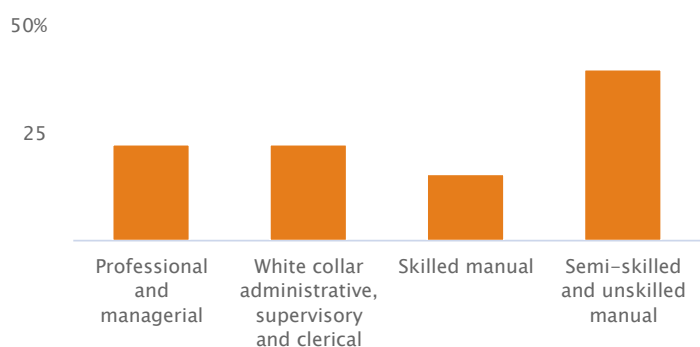
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

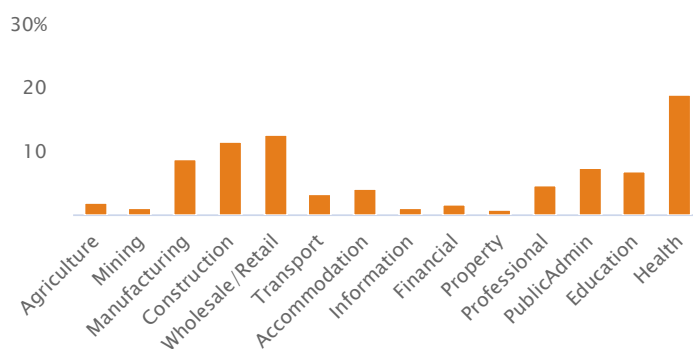

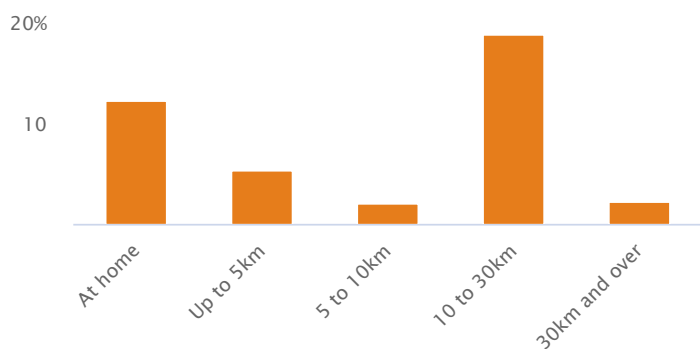
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

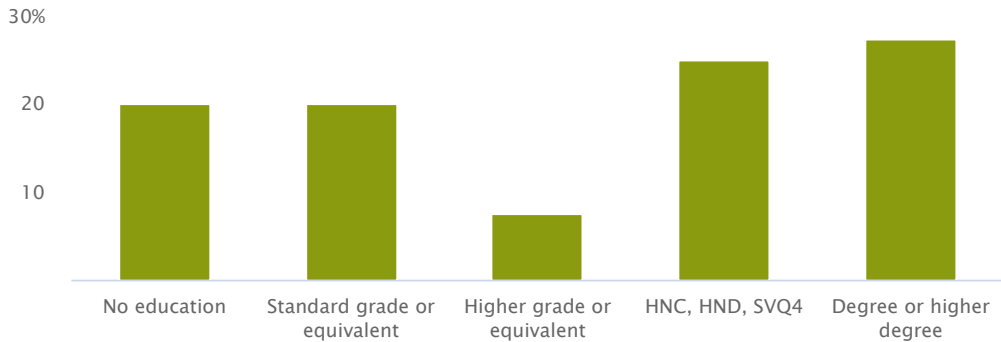


Distance travelled to work

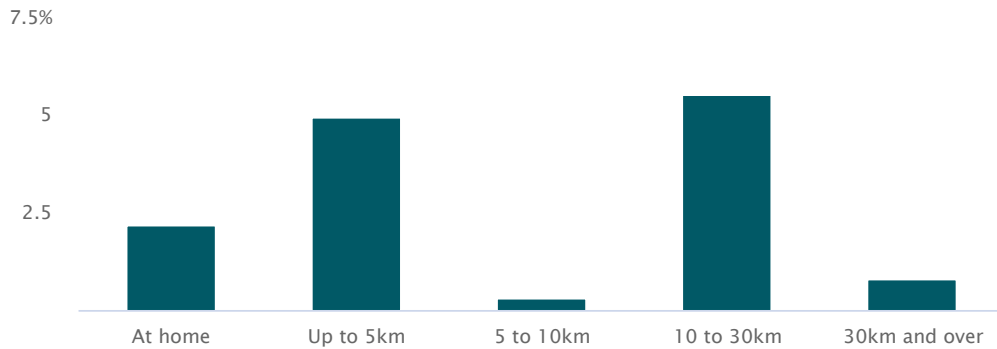
