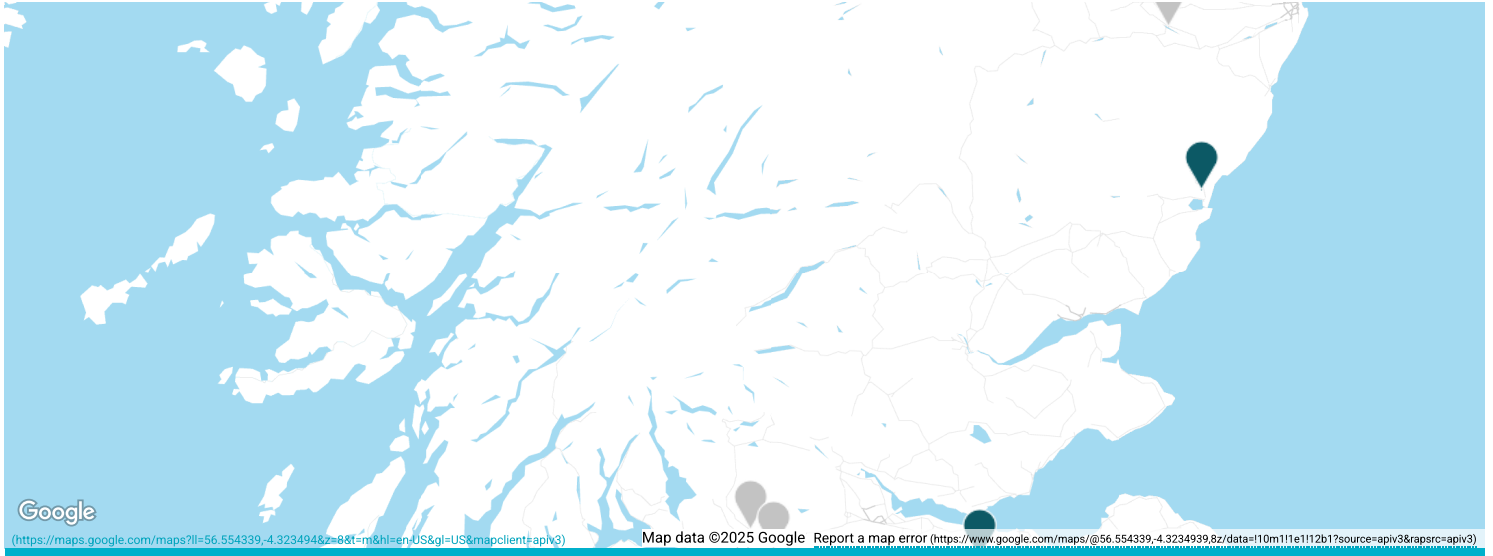




Newmachar

Newmachar is in Aberdeenshire. It was originally known as Summerhill. It has some oil related service activities. Highly accessible to Aberdeen it is a commuter settlement with new private housing.

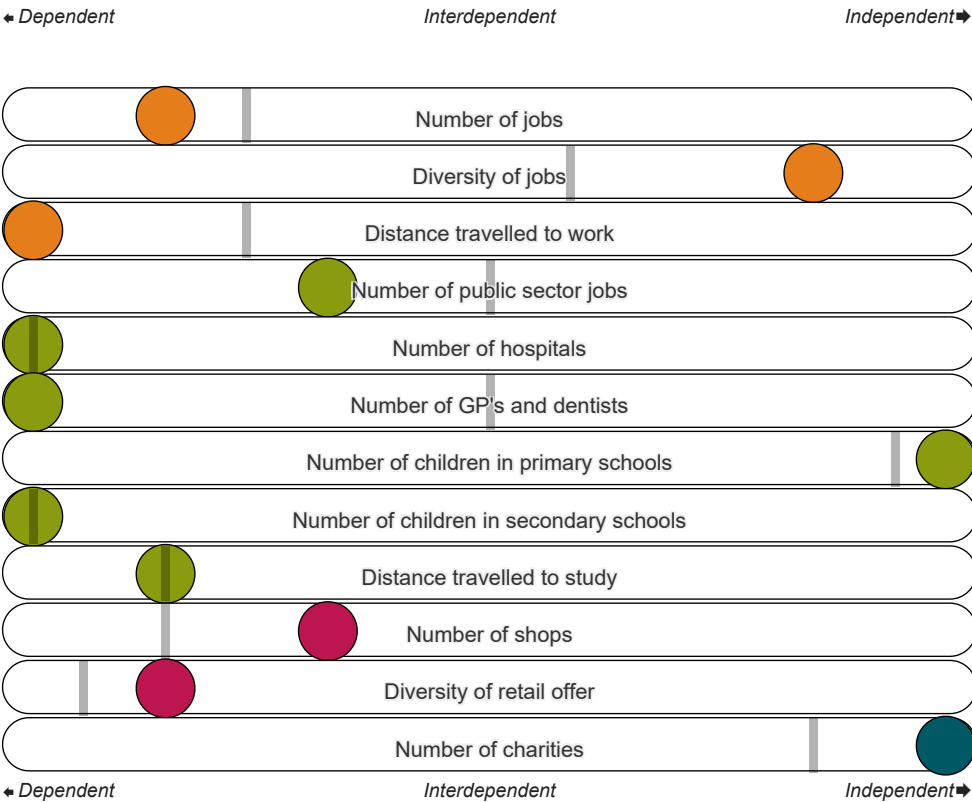
In this small town, this population is characterised by older working age families with teenagers. They are more highly educated and have higher social grades than some other groups. 2 car ownership is higher than in other groups.

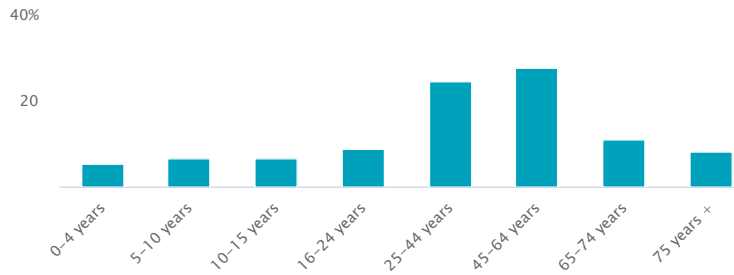

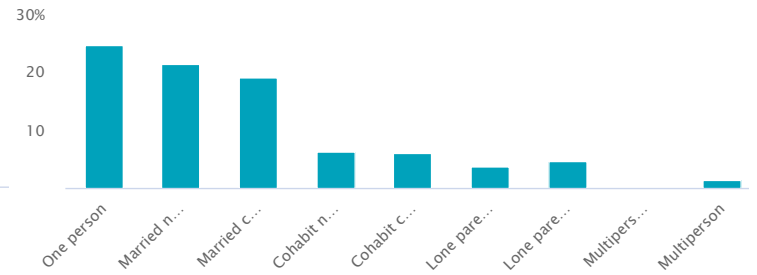

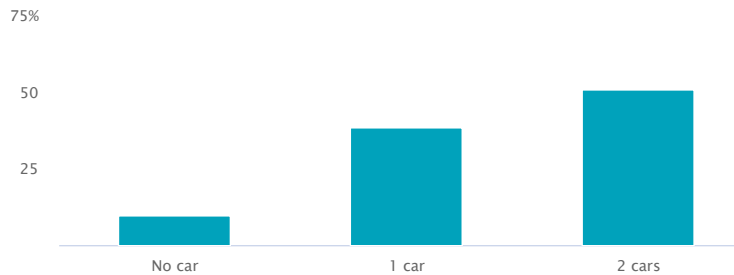

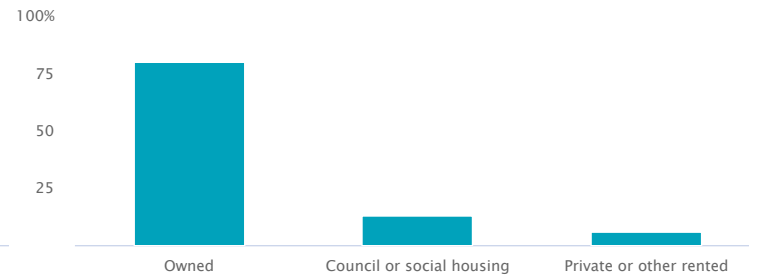
Household composition

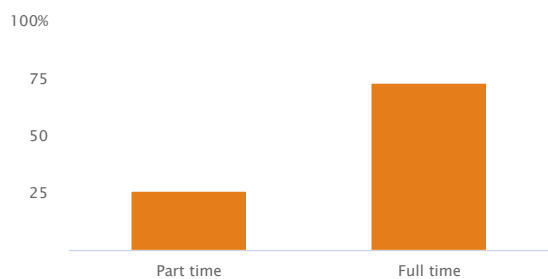

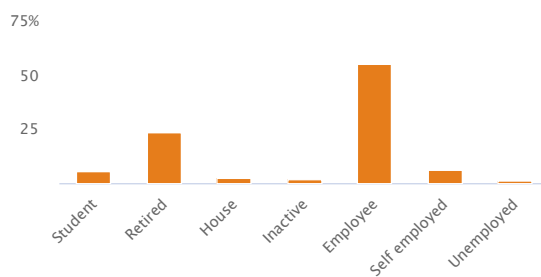
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



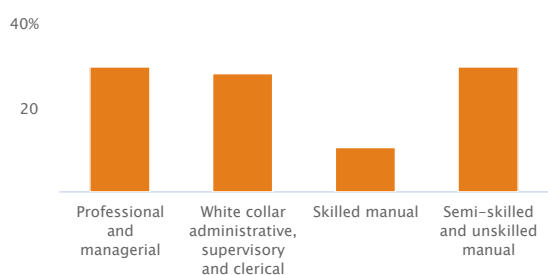
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

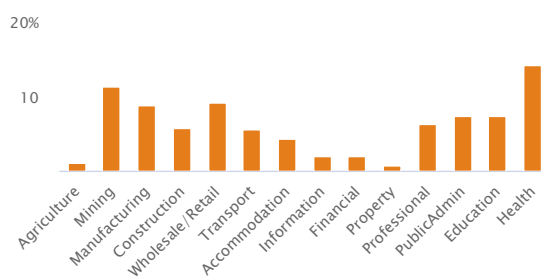


Social Grade

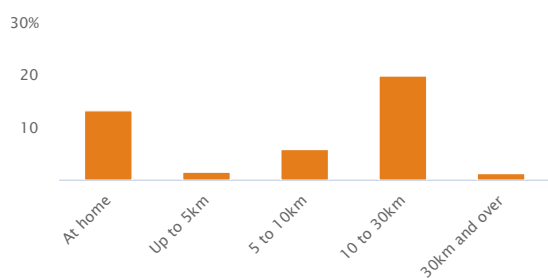
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

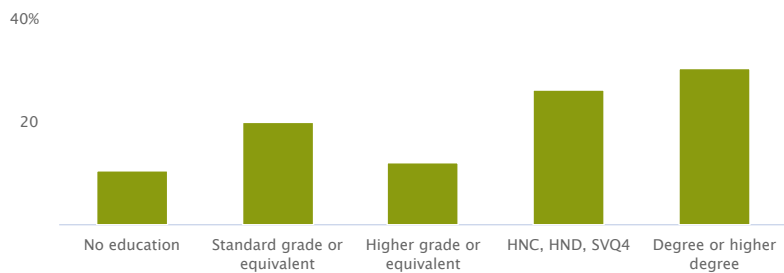


Distance travelled to work

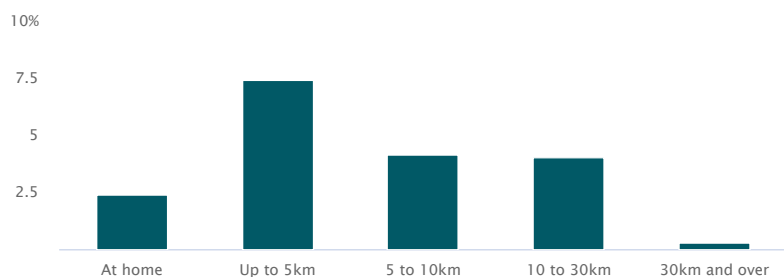
