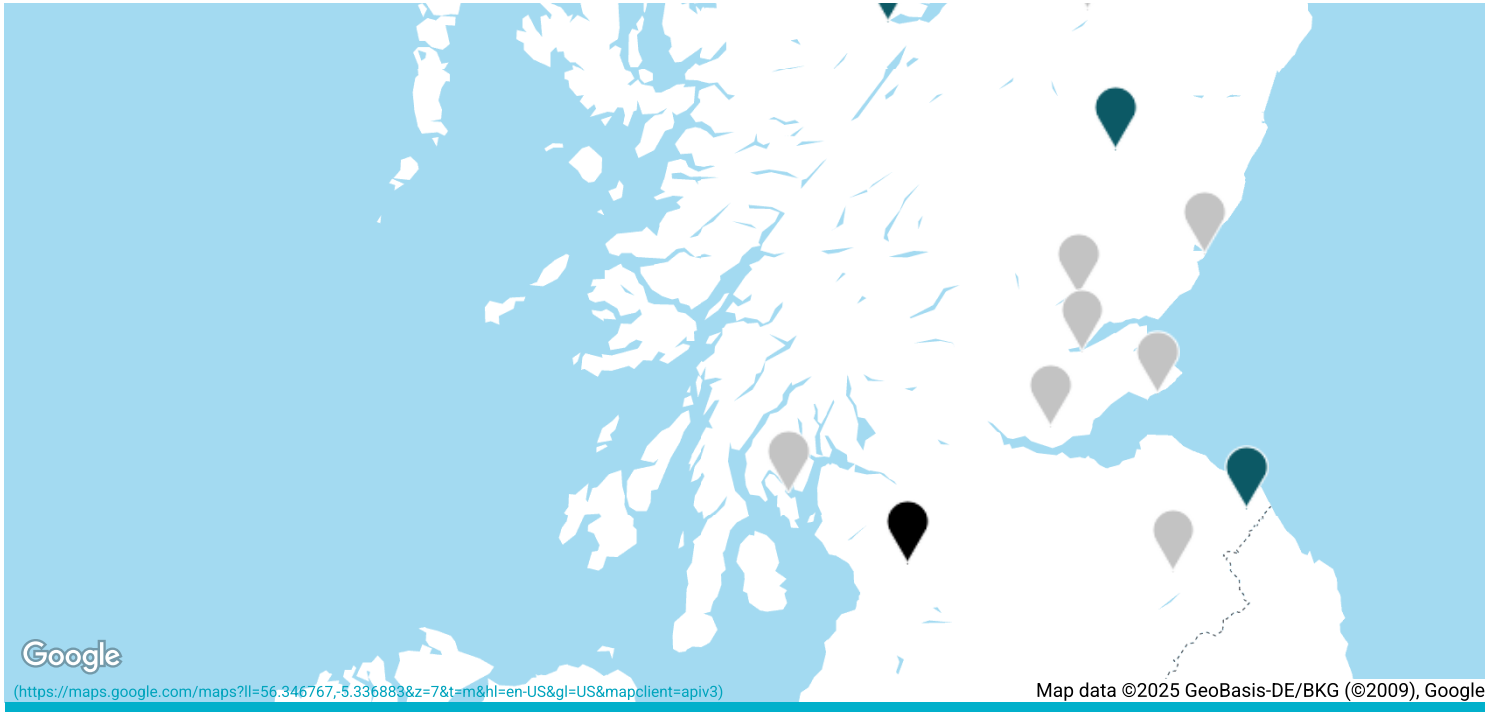




Newmilns

EAST AYRSHIRE

POPULATION **2,562**

Newmilns is in East Ayrshire. It was established in the 15th century by Campbell of Loudon. It was a covenanter stronghold. Textiles, muslin and lace were made. And before mechanisation was known for new weaving innovations including the jacquard loom for lace making. Lace curtain making saw the town boom in the late 19th century. The town expanded in the early 20th century but production declined although lace is still made in Newmilns. In 2009 the town's biggest employer Vesuvius (ceramics) closed. Nowadays many commute to work elsewhere.

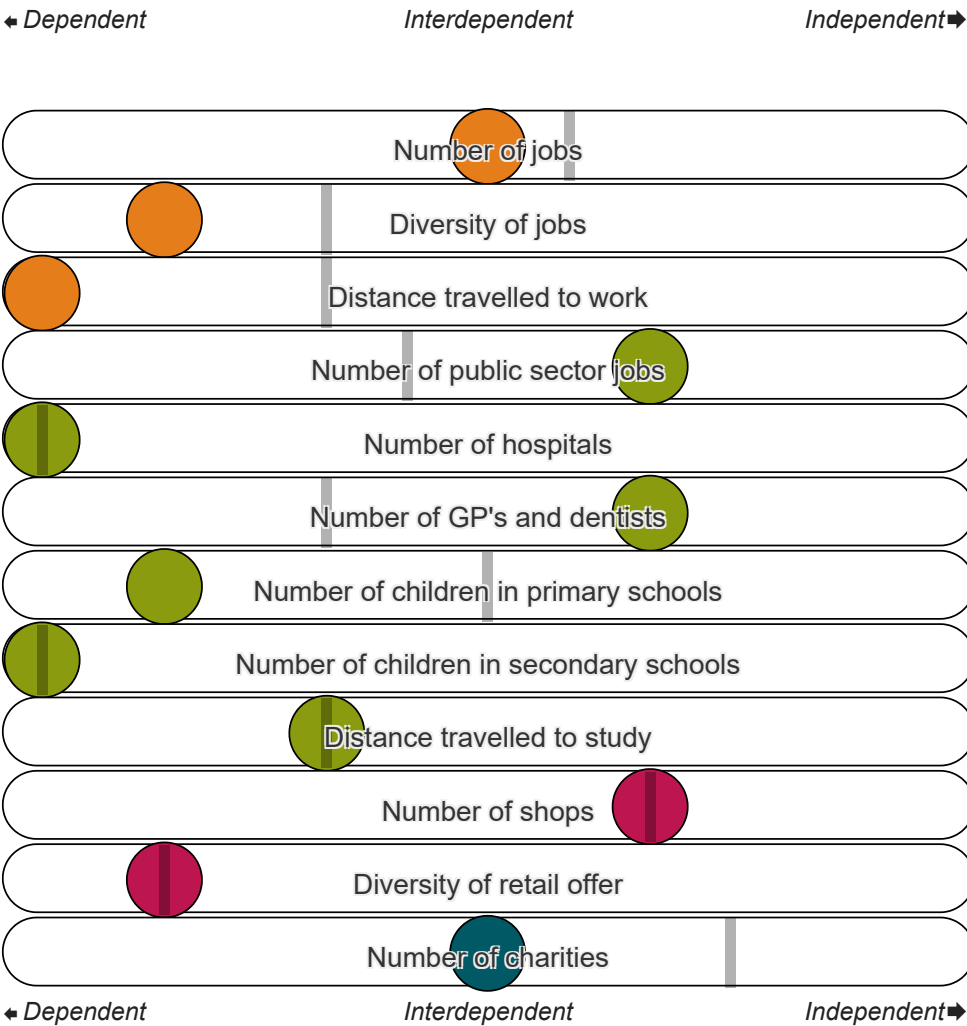
In small towns like this one, and similar, this population includes older people, some still in work often in less well paid sectors. It also includes a significant inactive population, some in poorer health. There is a higher proportion of single households and car ownership is lower.

Newmilns is an interdependent to dependent town.

Newmilns is an **interdependent to dependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Newmilns is grouped with 15 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of hospitals, children in secondary schools, jobs, shops, and diversity of retail offer. It also has similarities in the distance travelled to study.

It differs in terms of the number of charities, children in primary schools, and GP's and dentists. Newmilns differs most from its group in the distance travelled to work.

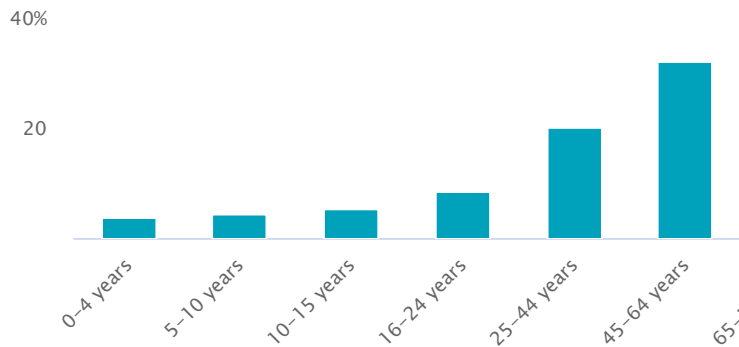

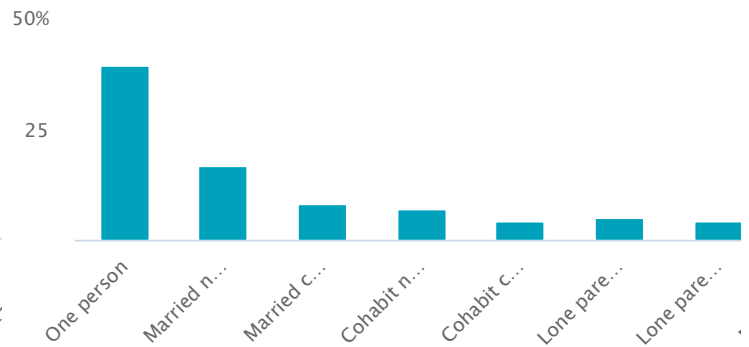

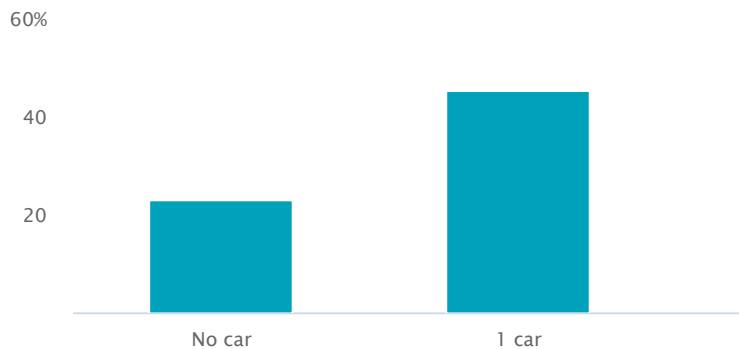

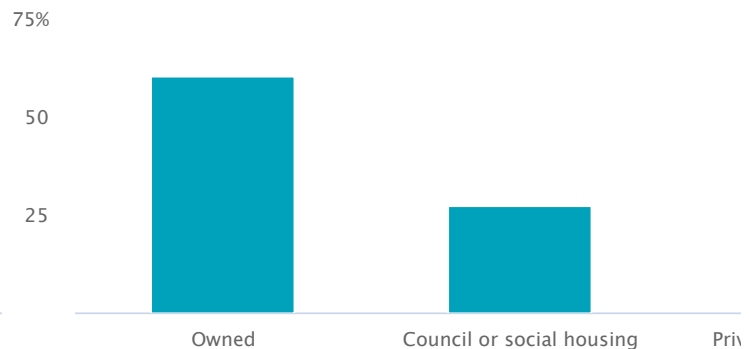
Household composition

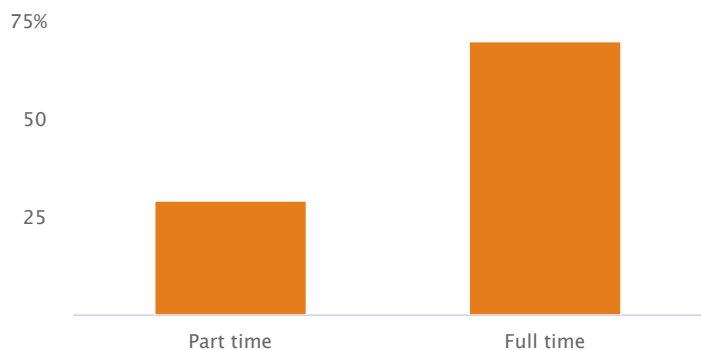

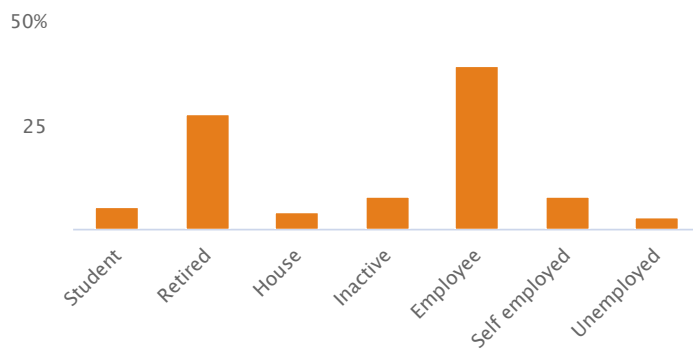
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



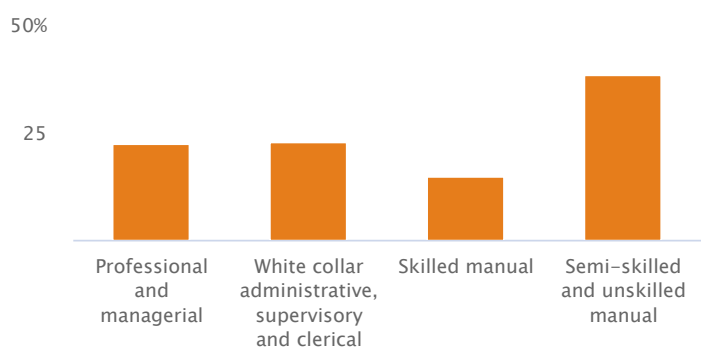
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

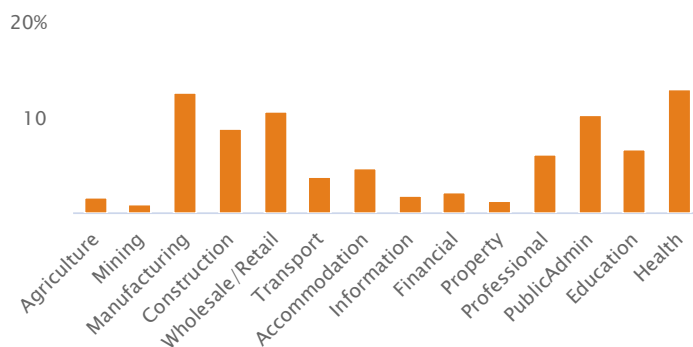


Social Grade

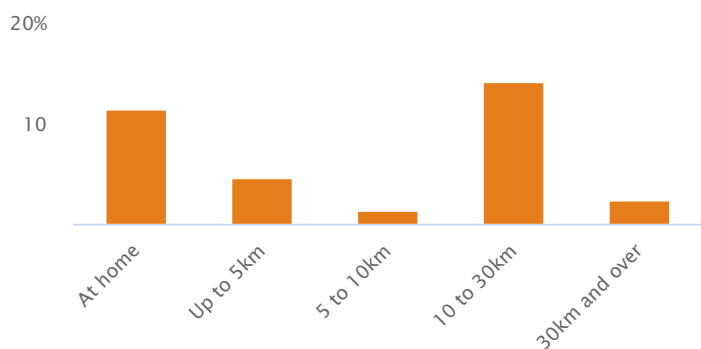
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

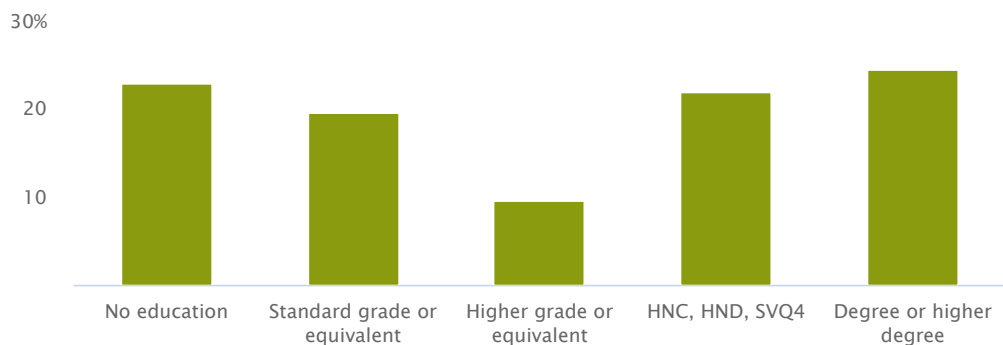


Distance travelled to work

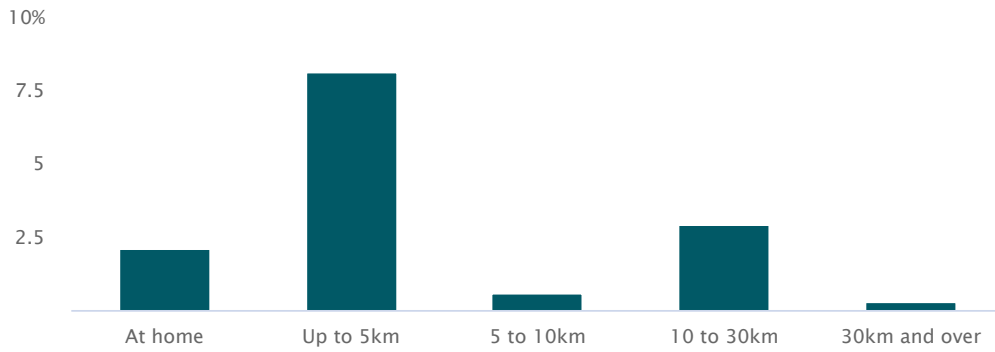
