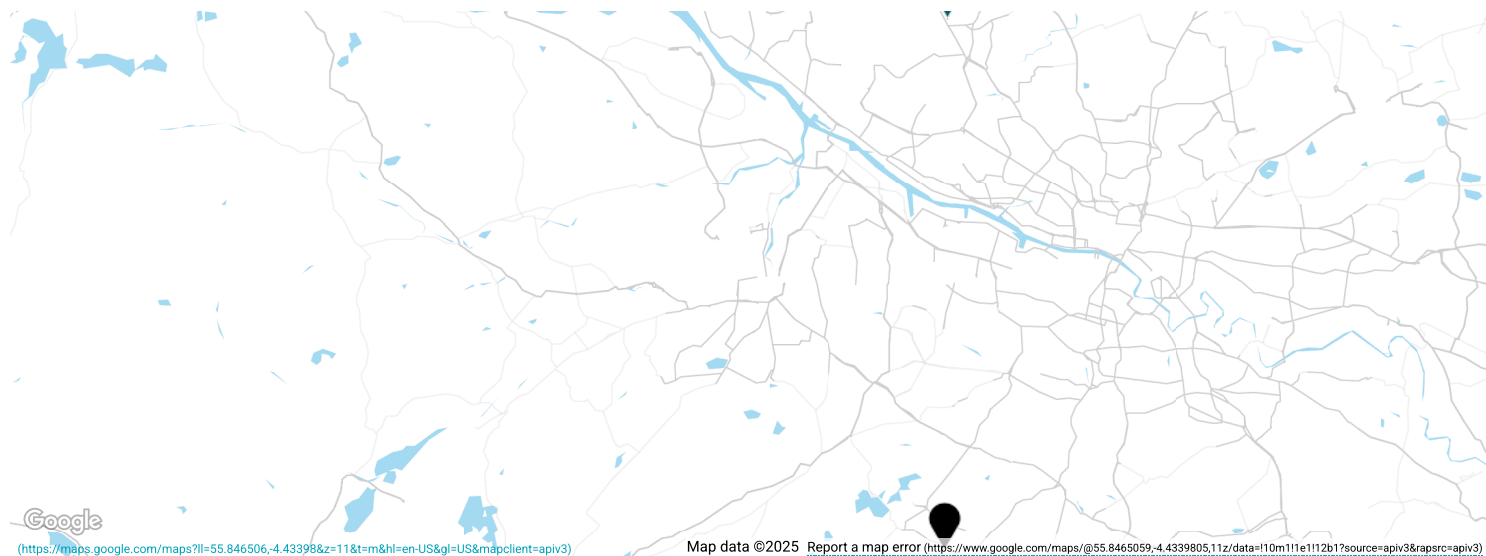




Newton Mearns

Newton Mearns is in East Renfrewshire. An early market town it developed textile industries. As communications improved it gradually became a suburb of Glasgow. In the late 20th century Coats Paton/Viyella continued the textile traditions with a plant at Newton Mearns until company reorganisation.

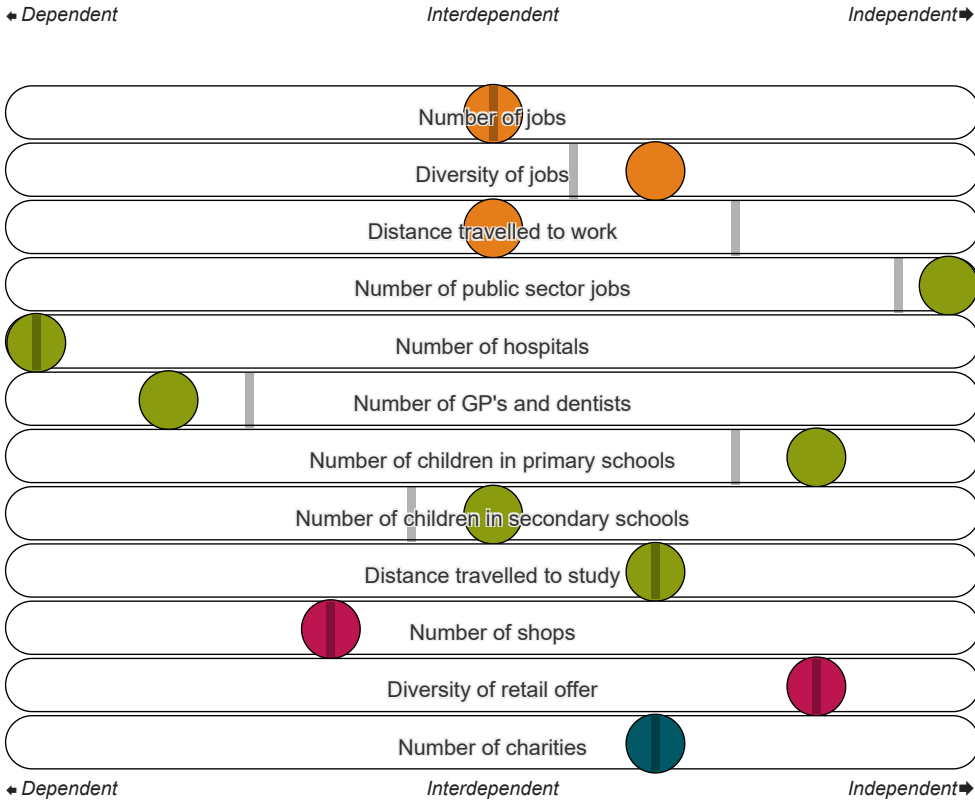
In large, affluent towns, this population is characterised by older working age families with teenagers. They are more highly educated and have higher social grades than some other groups. 2 car ownership is higher than in other groups.

Newton Mearns is an **interdependent to independent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Newton Means is grouped with 1 other town. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of charities, hospitals, children in primary schools, children in secondary schools, jobs, public sector jobs, shops, GP's and dentists, and diversity of retail offer. It also has similarities in the diversity of jobs, and the distance travelled to study.

Newton Mearns differs most from its group in the distance travelled to work.

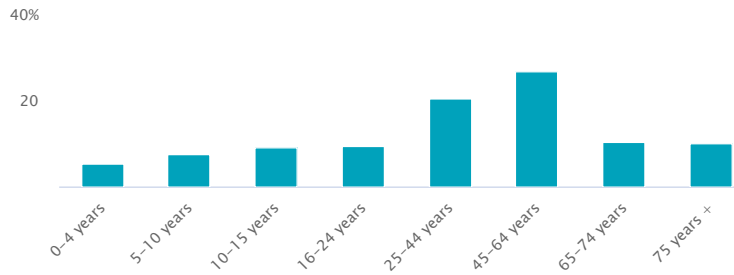

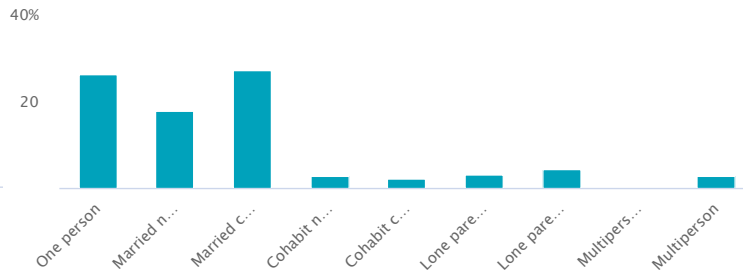

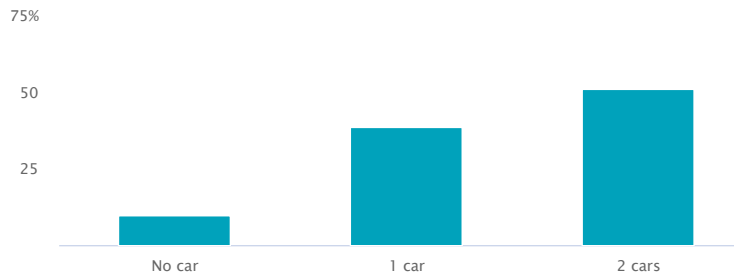

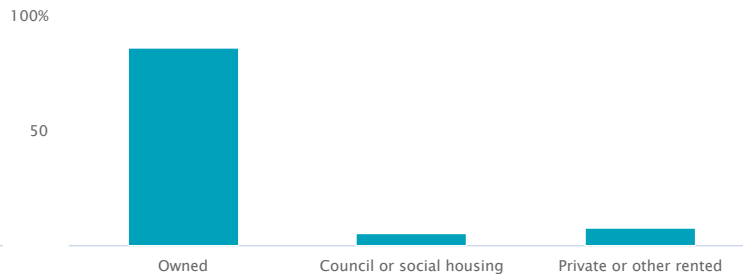
Household composition

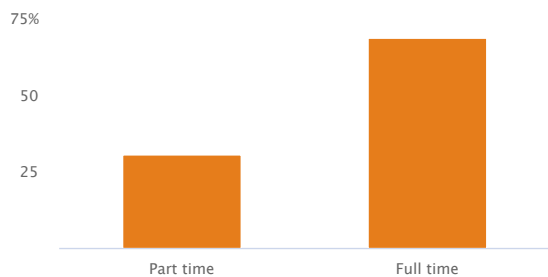

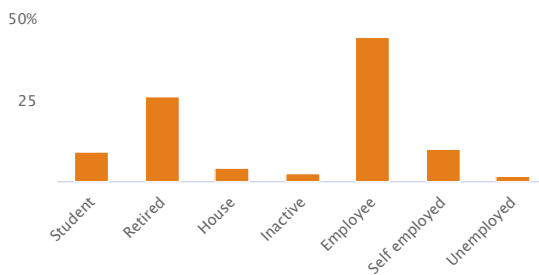
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



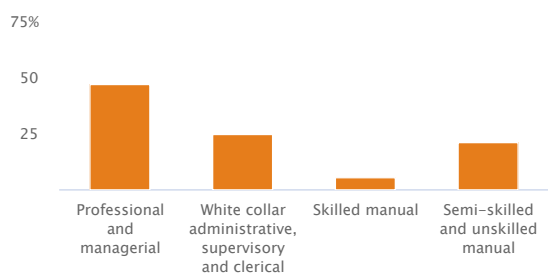
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

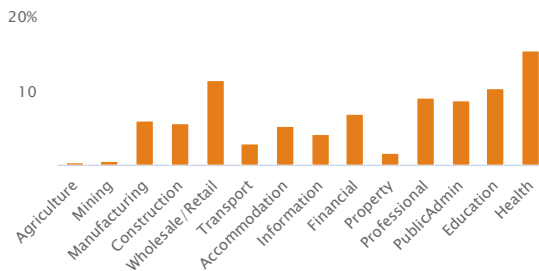


Social Grade

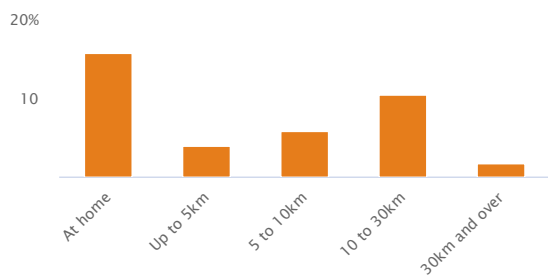
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

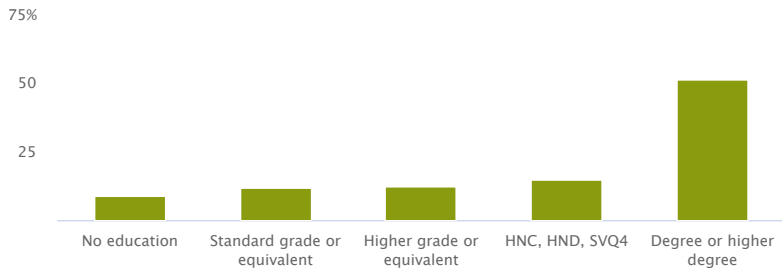


Distance travelled to work

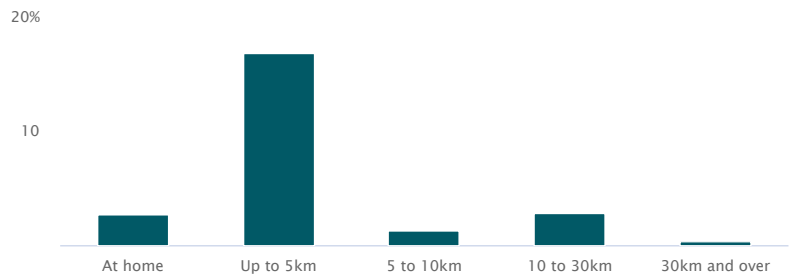
