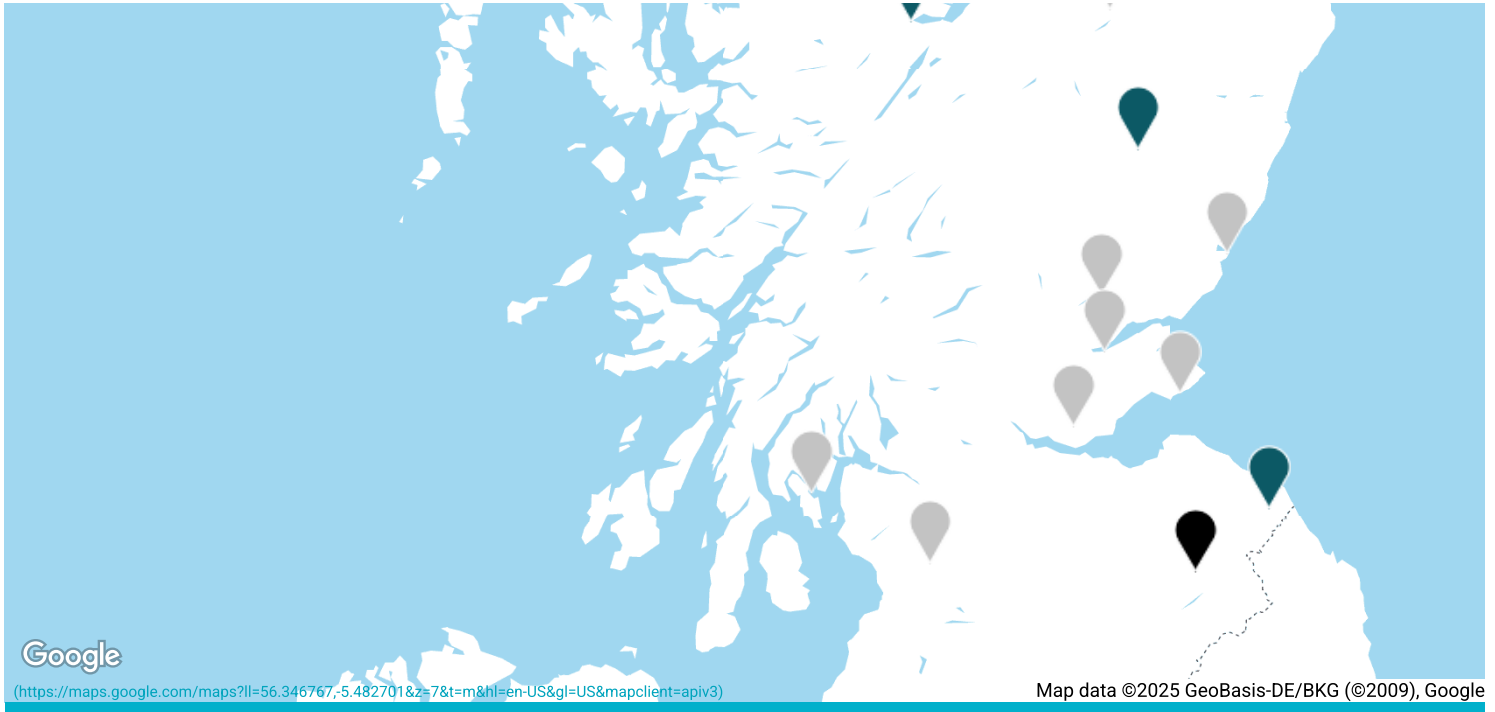




Newtown St Boswells

Newton St Boswells is located in Scottish Borders. It is the administrative headquarters for Scottish Borders. The name dates from the coming of the railway and the location of the station. Historically it was linked to the agricultural sector with grain mills. The coming of the railway made it a railhead for transporting agricultural produce. It has a large slate depot.

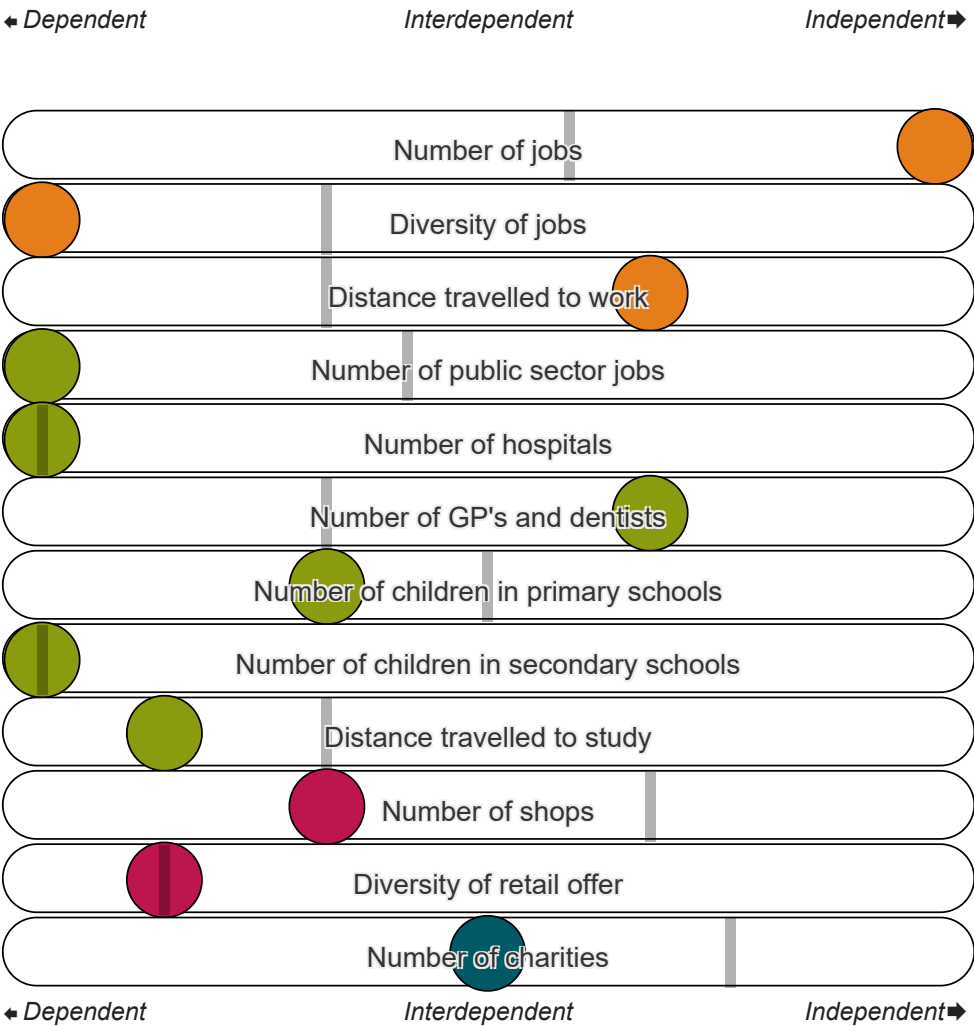
In small towns like this one, and similar, this population includes older people, some still in work often in less well paid sectors. It also includes a significant inactive population, some in poorer health. There is a higher proportion of single households and car ownership is lower.

Newtown St Boswells is an interdependent to dependent town.

Newtown St Boswells is an **interdependent to dependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Newtown St Boswells is grouped with 15 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of hospitals, children in primary schools, children in secondary schools, and diversity of retail offer. It also has similarities in the distance travelled to study.

It differs in terms of the number of charities, jobs, shops, and GP's and dentists. It also differs in the distance travelled to work. Newtown St Boswells differs most from its group in the number of public sector jobs; and the diversity of jobs.

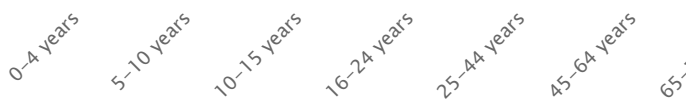

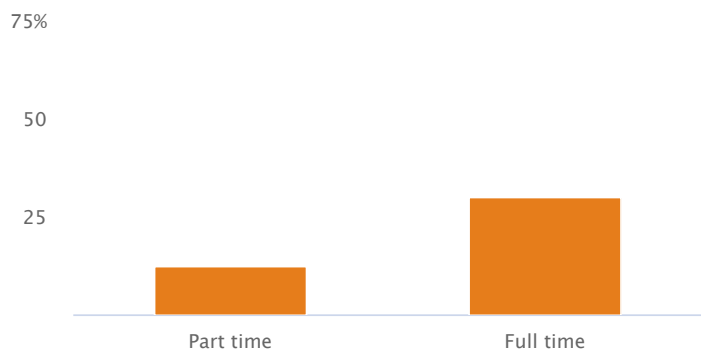

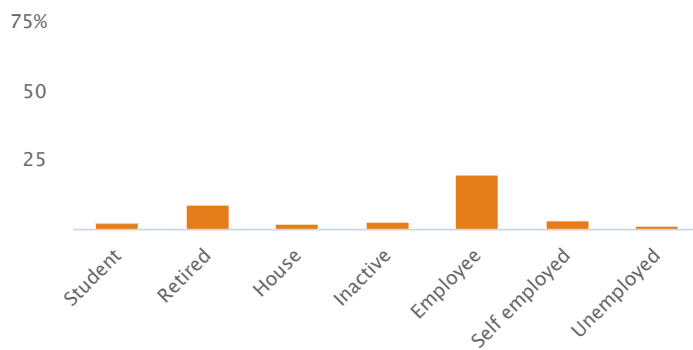
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



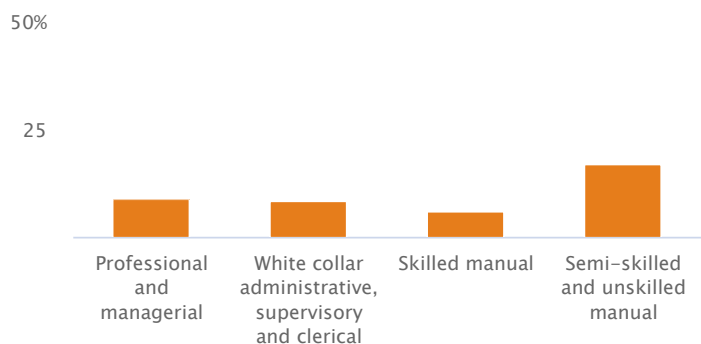
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

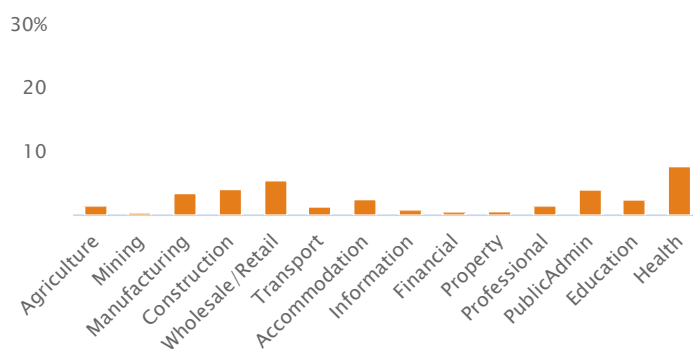


Social Grade

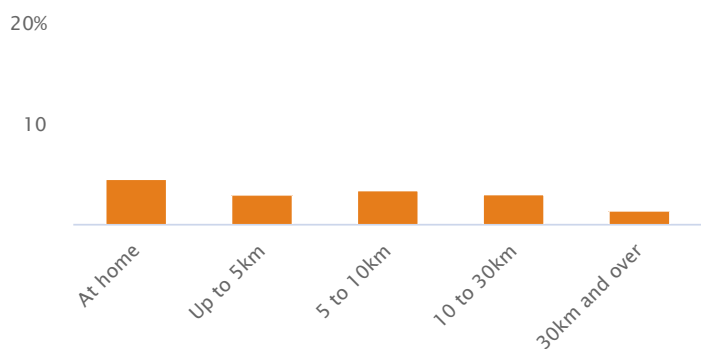
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

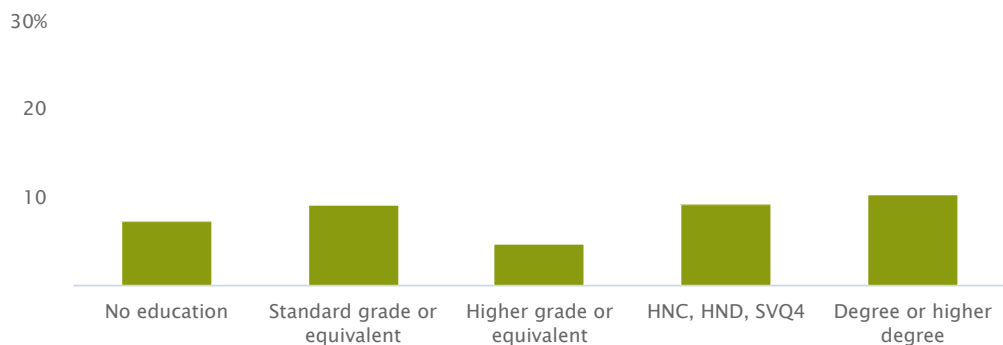


Distance travelled to work

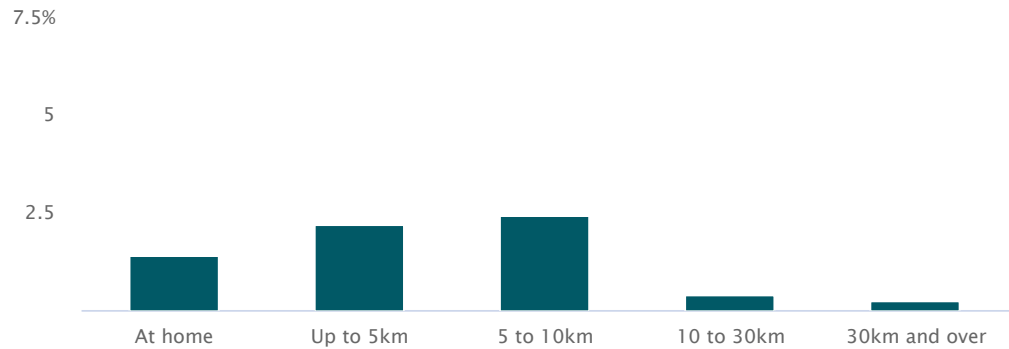
