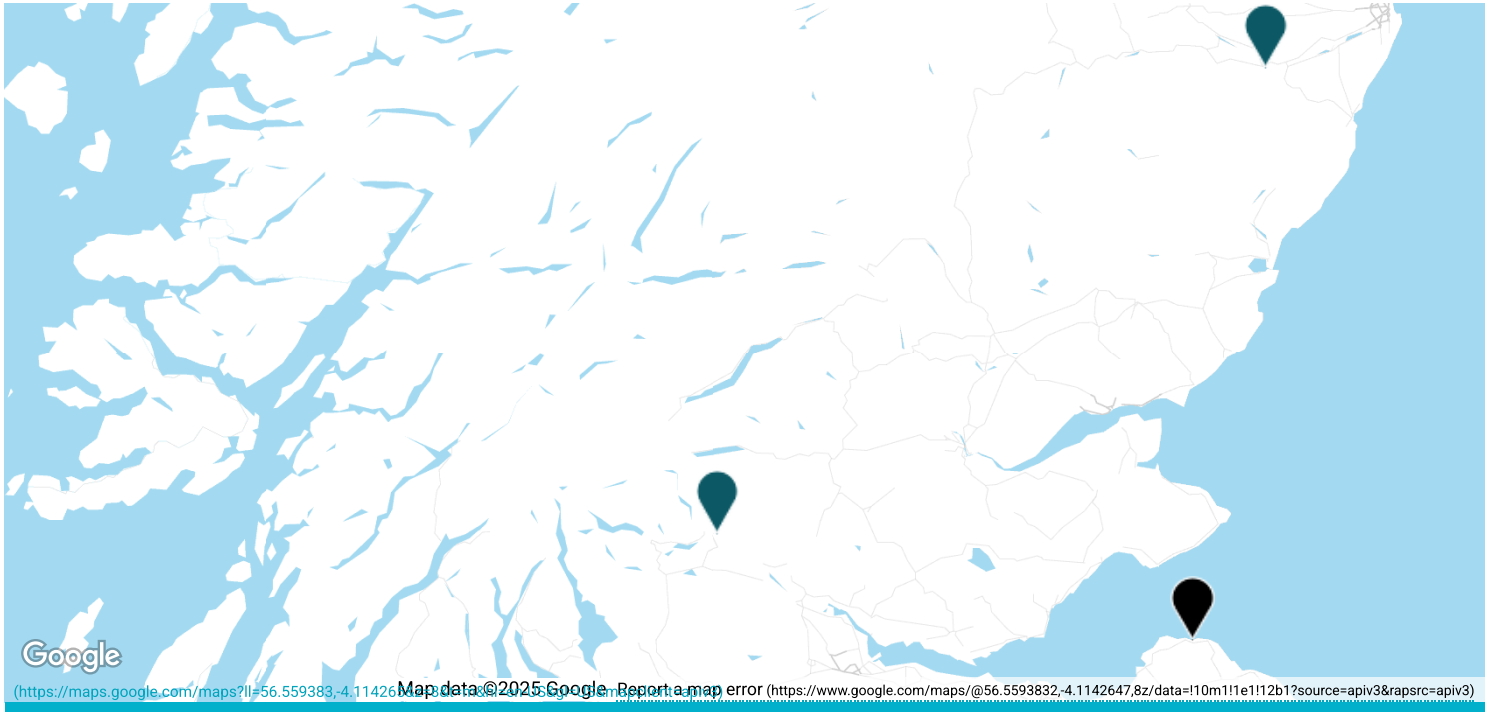




North Berwick

North Berwick is located in East Lothian. It was a staging post on the pilgrim route from Lindisfarne to St Andrews. In the 19th century fishing was its main economy. In the 20th century it was known as the Biarritz of the North attracting holiday makers from Edinburgh. Today it is a residential and commuter town although still popular with summer visitors.

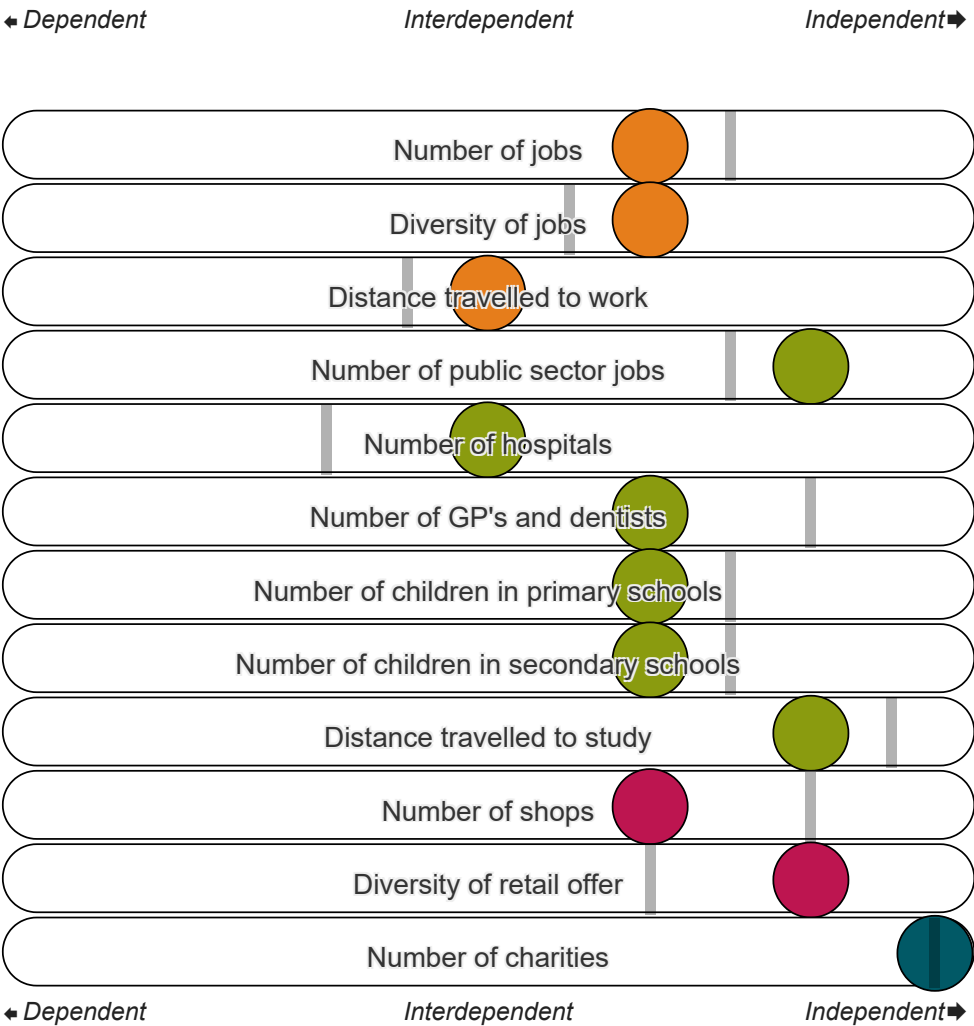
In medium towns such as this, the population is typically older. The group has higher social grade status than other groups, a higher proportion are owner occupiers and car ownership is also higher.

North Berwick is an **independent to interdependent** town.

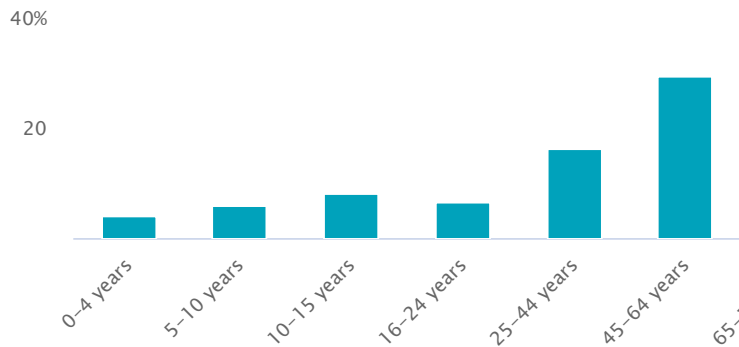

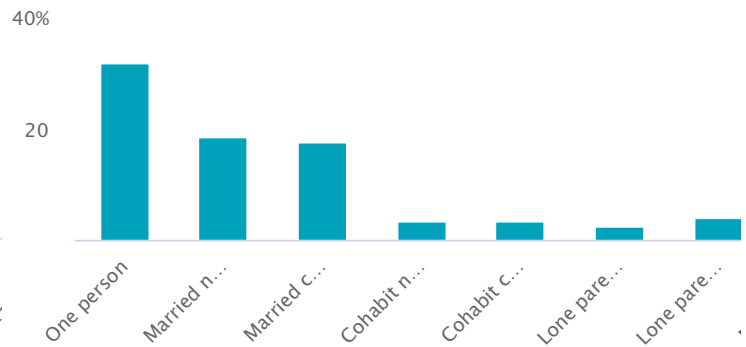

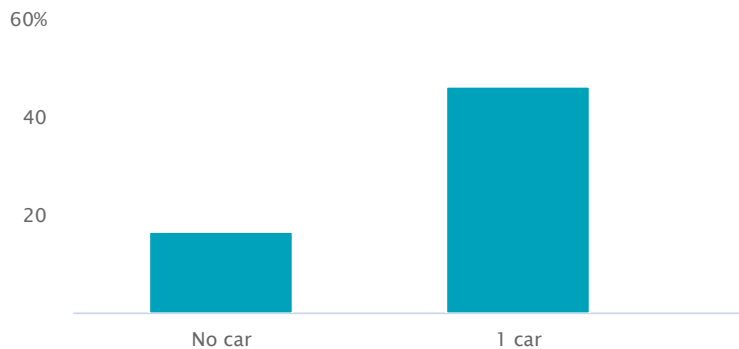

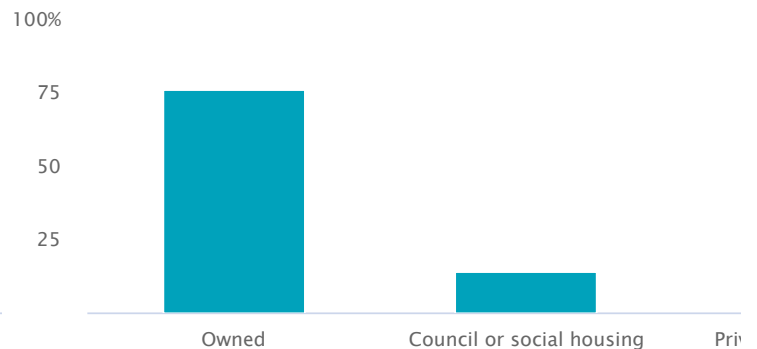

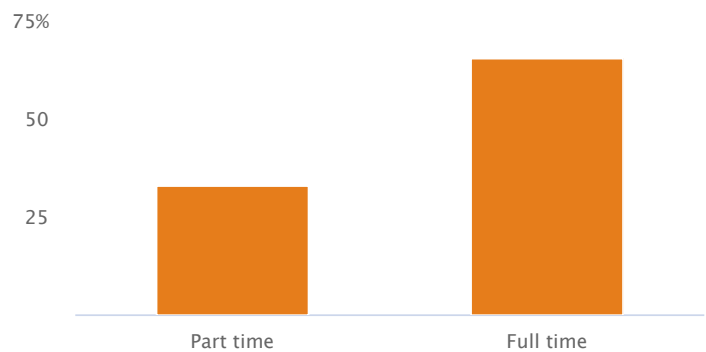

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



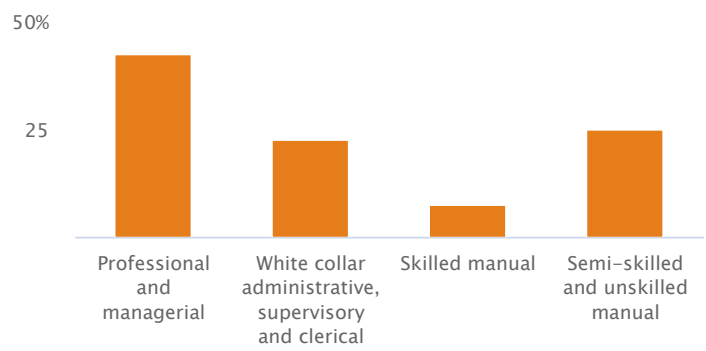
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

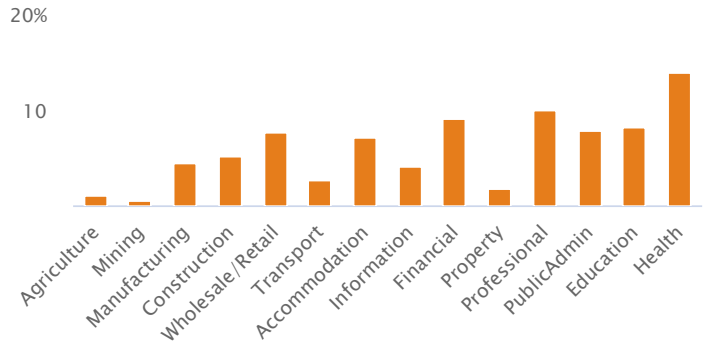


Social Grade

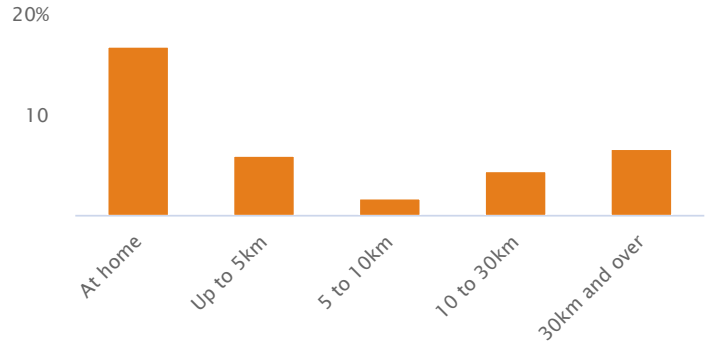
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

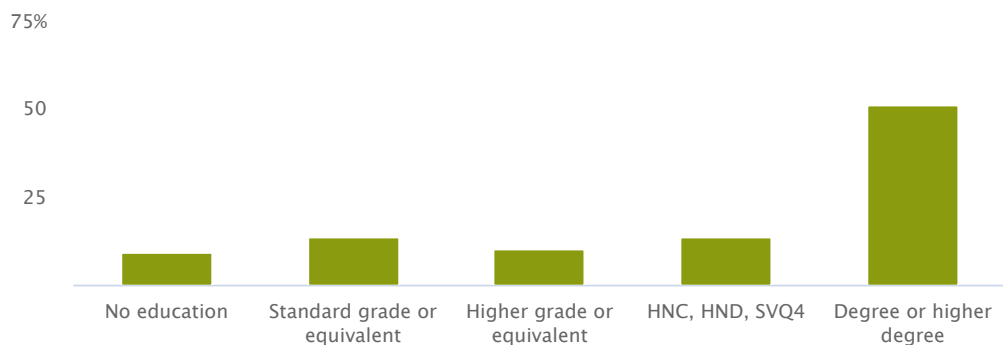


Distance travelled to work

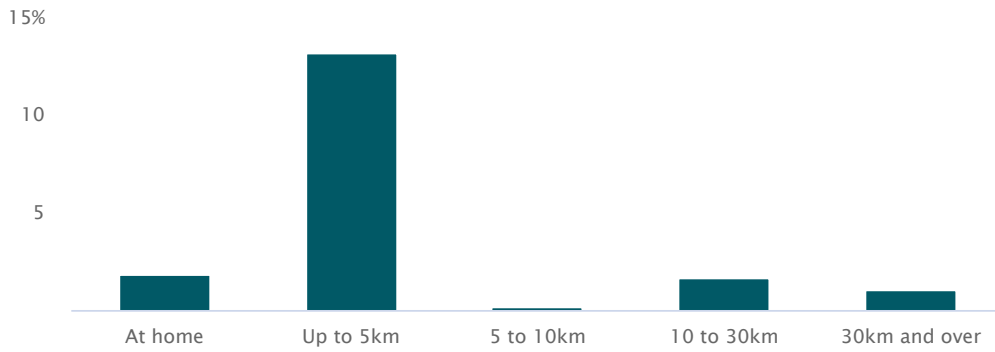
