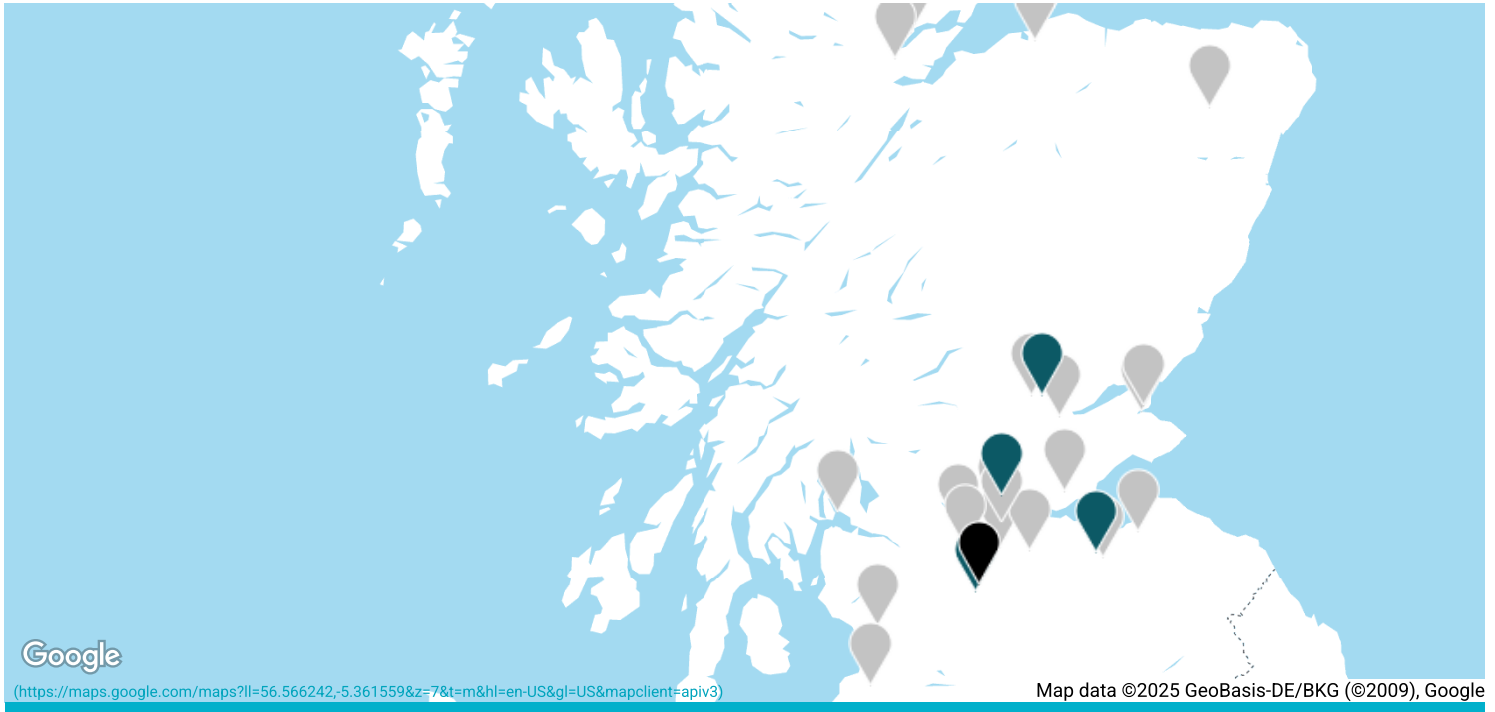




Overtown

Overtown is in North Lanarkshire. It owes its existence to coal mining. The pits closed in the 1950s. It is mainly residential.

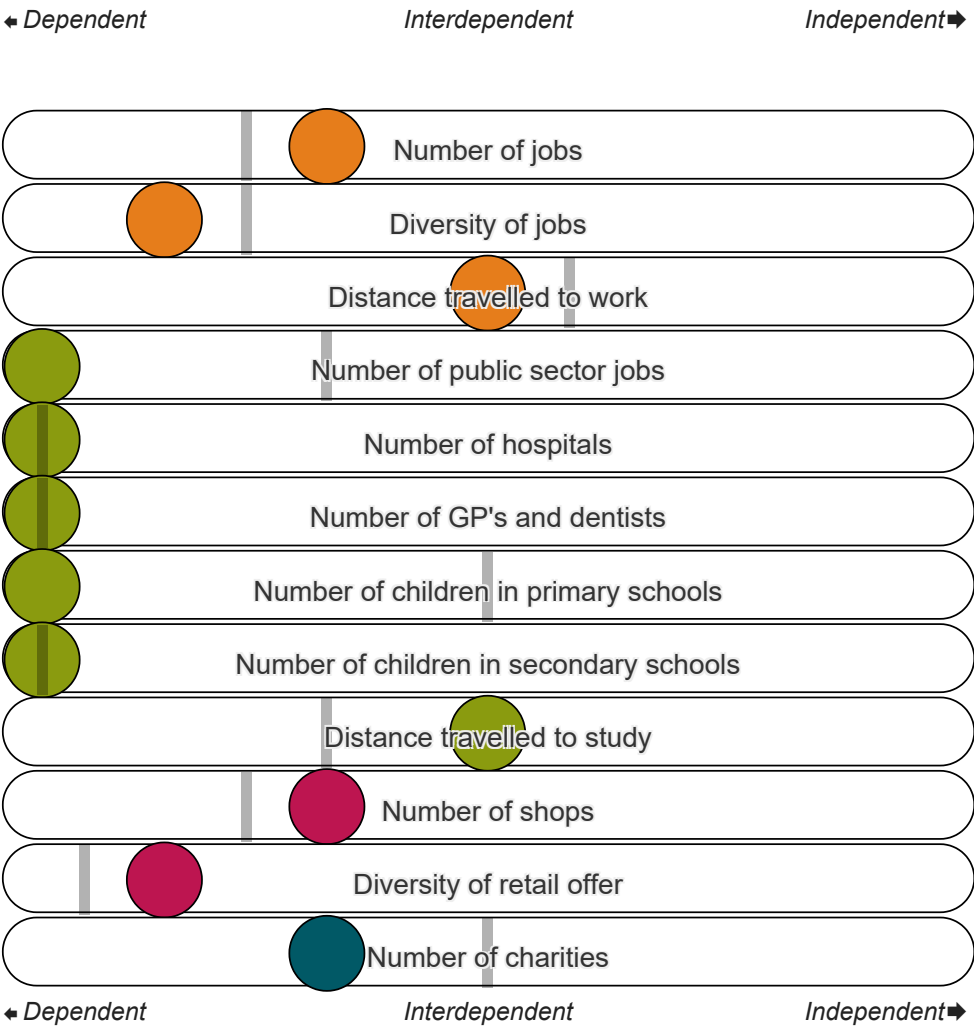
In this type of small town, the population comprises families with a higher proportion of adults in the 25–44 age grouping. Higher rates of full time employment are found.

Overtown is a dependent to interdependent town.

Inter-relationships



Overtown is a **dependent to interdependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Overtown is grouped with 25 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of charities, hospitals, children in secondary schools, jobs, shops, GP's and dentists, and diversity of retail offer. It also has similarities in the diversity of jobs, the distance travelled to work, and the distance travelled to study.

Overtown differs most from its group in the number of children in primary schools, and public sector jobs.

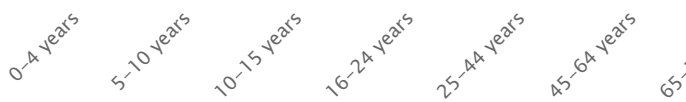

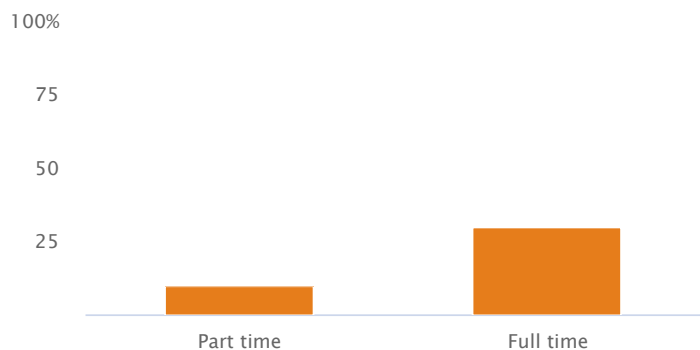

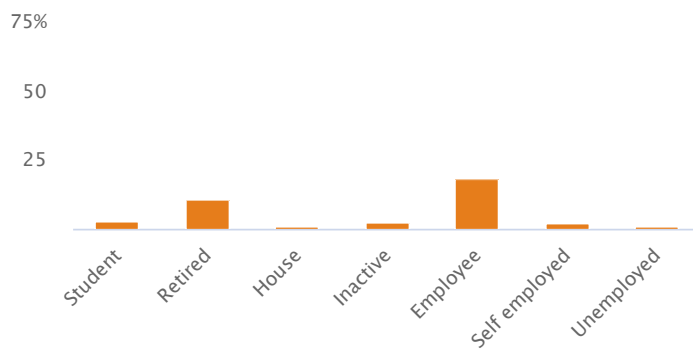
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



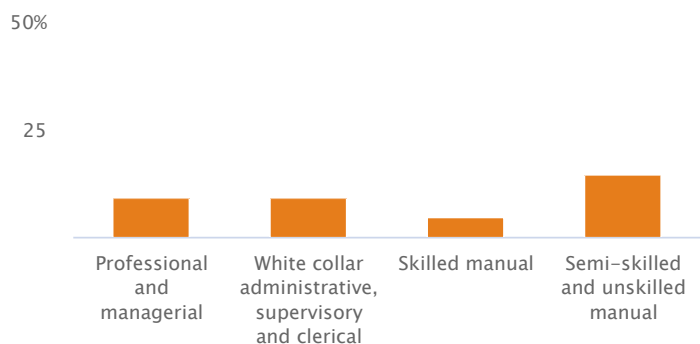
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

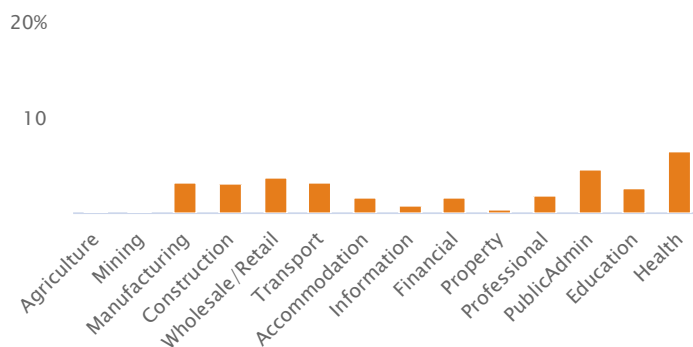

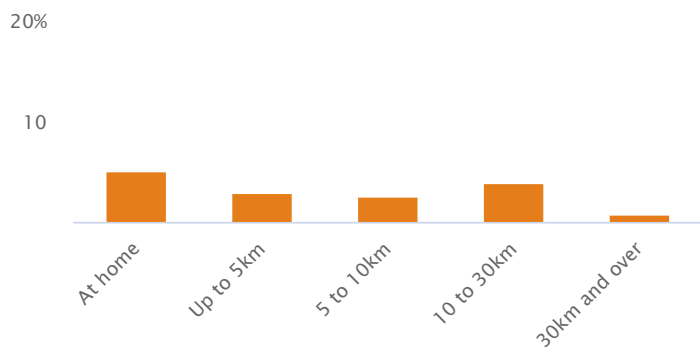
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

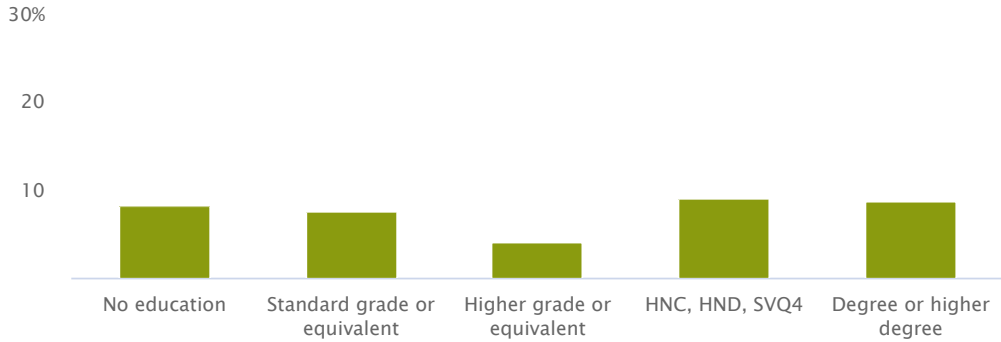


Distance travelled to work

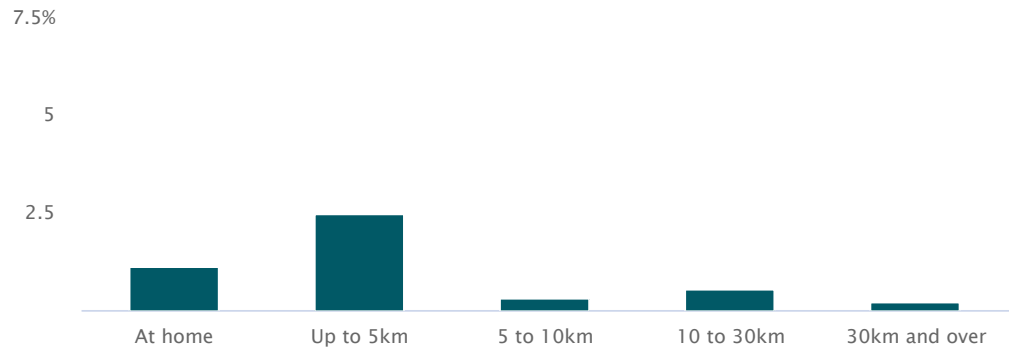
