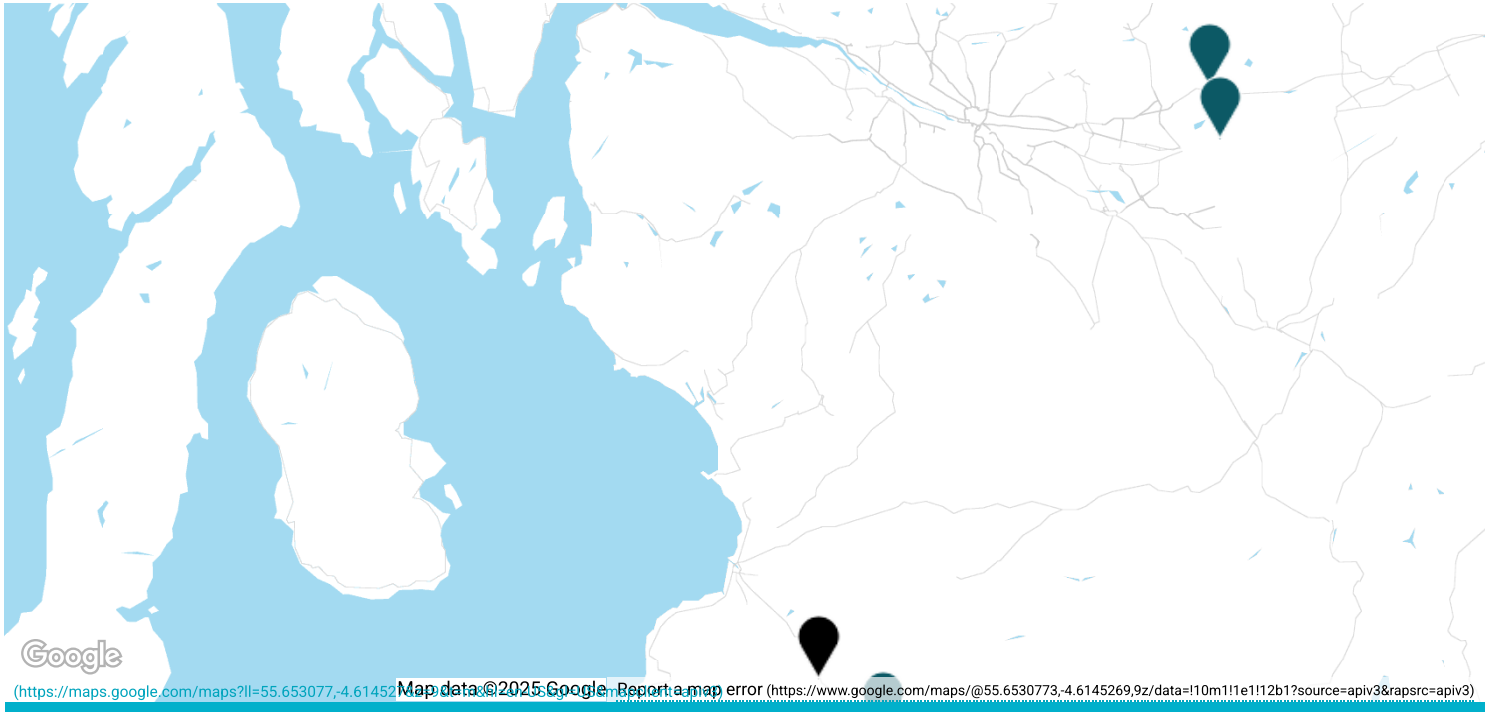




Patna

Patna is in East Ayrshire. William Fullerton founded the village for mine workers in the coal mines. His Indian connections led to the name. The mines closed in the 12980s. Local employment is limited to local service industries and the care sector.

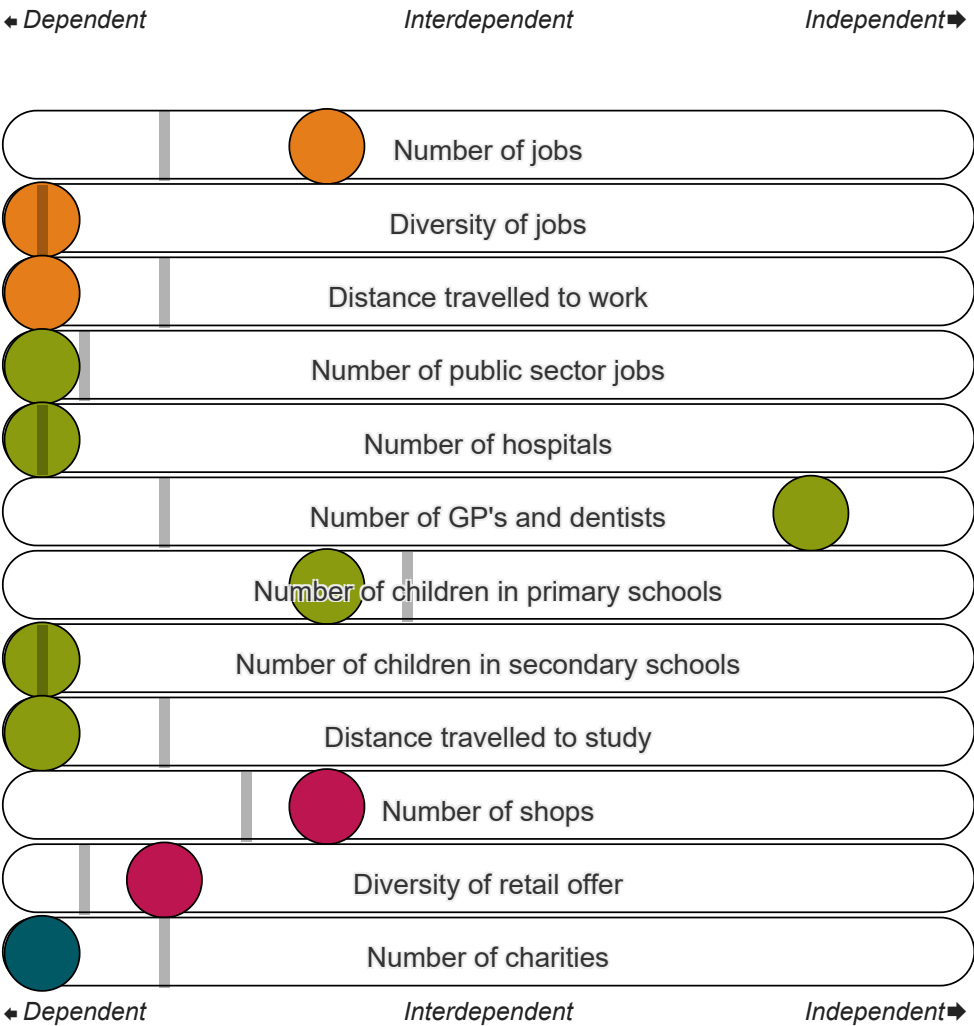
In this, and similar small towns, people experience more challenging circumstances with higher rates of unemployment, poorer health, lack of a car, lower levels of education and lower social grades than other groups. A higher proportion live in social rented housing. There is a higher proportion of single person households and lone parents.

Patna is a dependent town.

Patna is a **dependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Patna is grouped with 4 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of charities, hospitals, children in primary schools, children in secondary schools, public sector jobs, shops, and diversity of retail offer. It also has similarities in the diversity of jobs, the distance travelled to work, and the distance travelled to study.

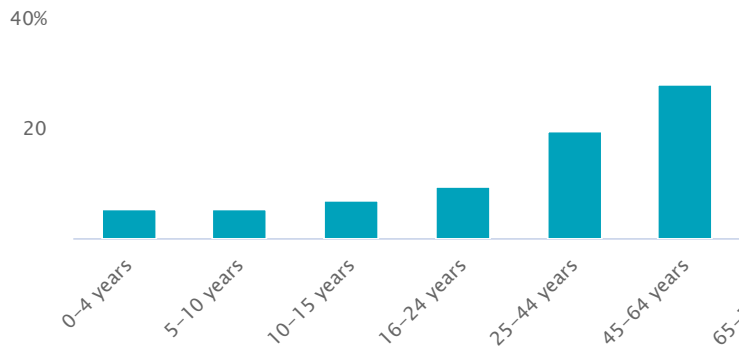

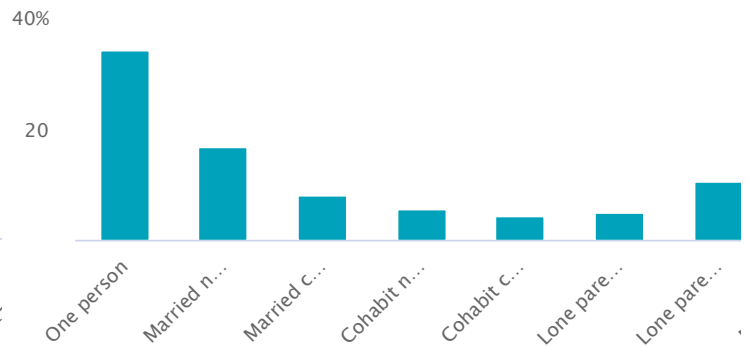

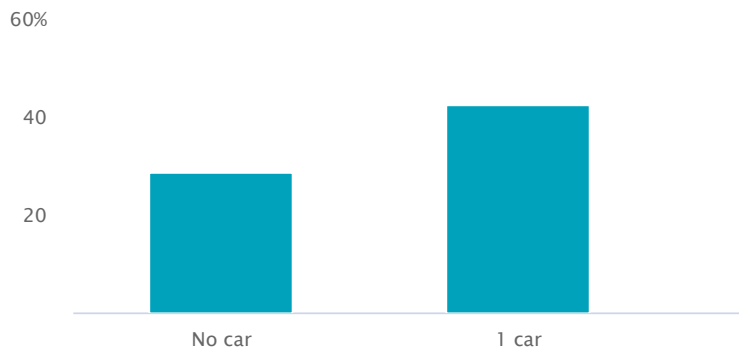

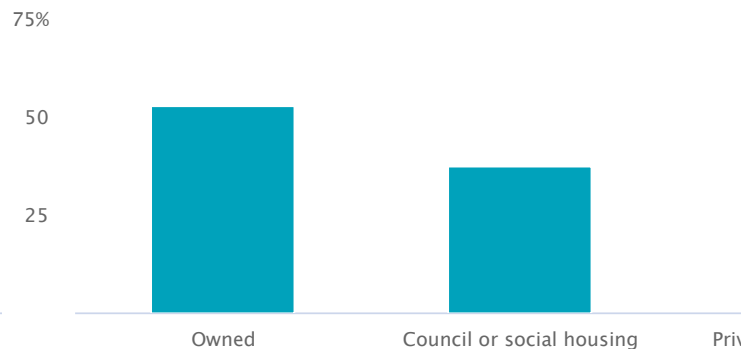
Household composition

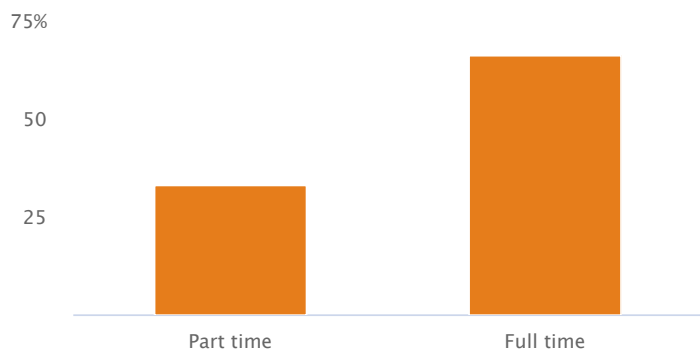

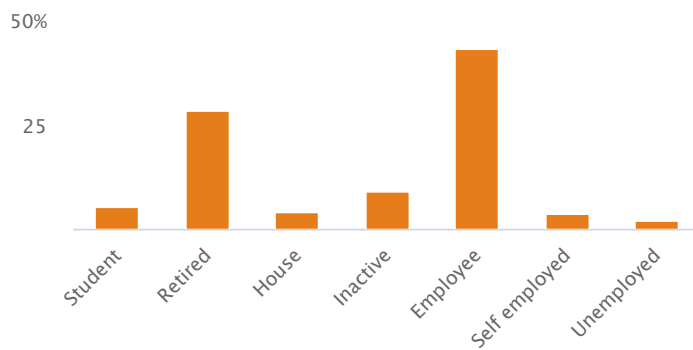
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



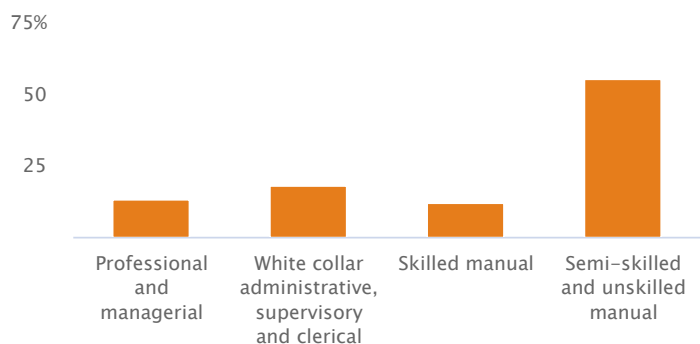
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

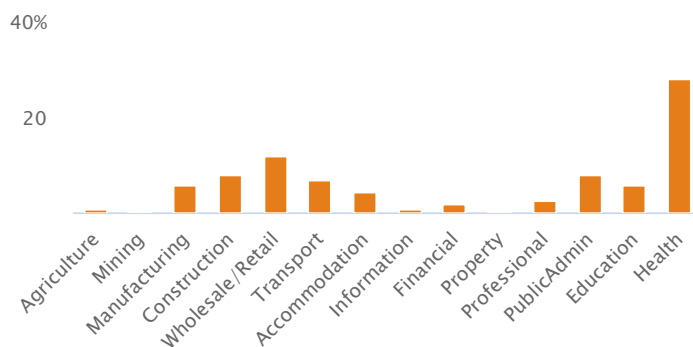


Social Grade

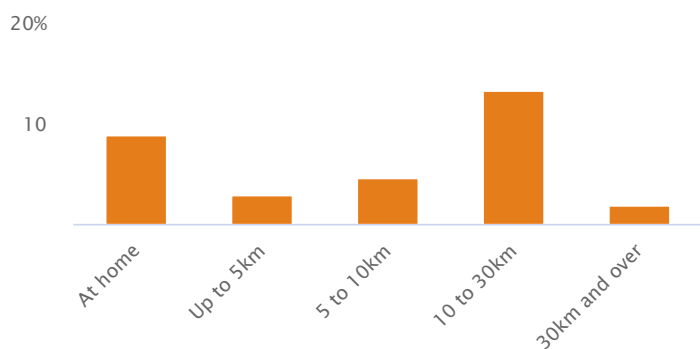
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

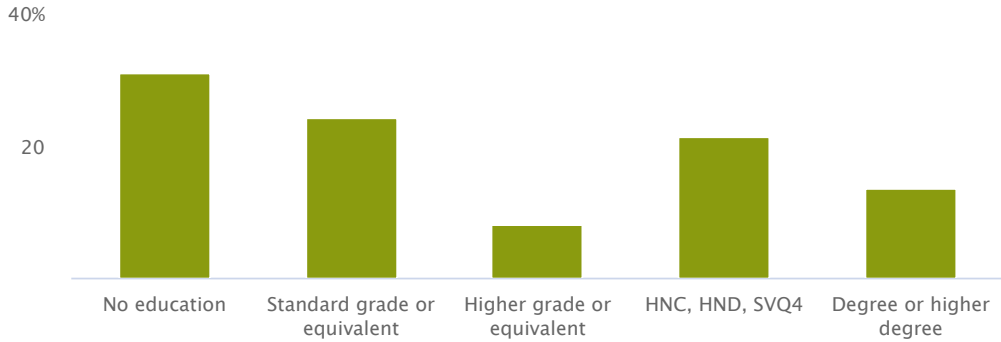


Distance travelled to work

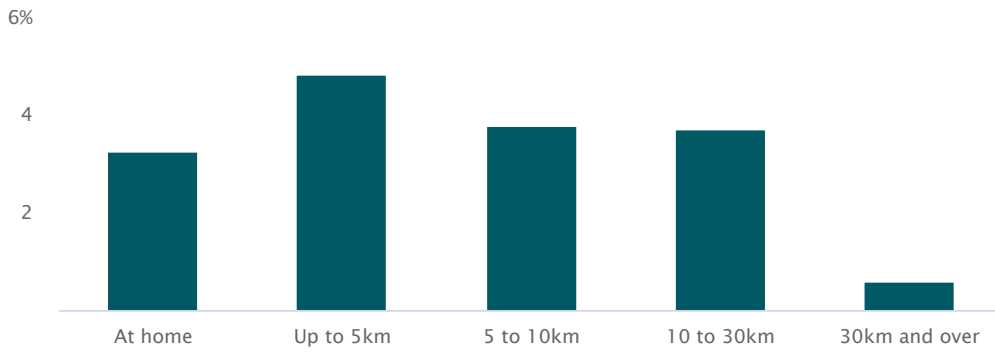
