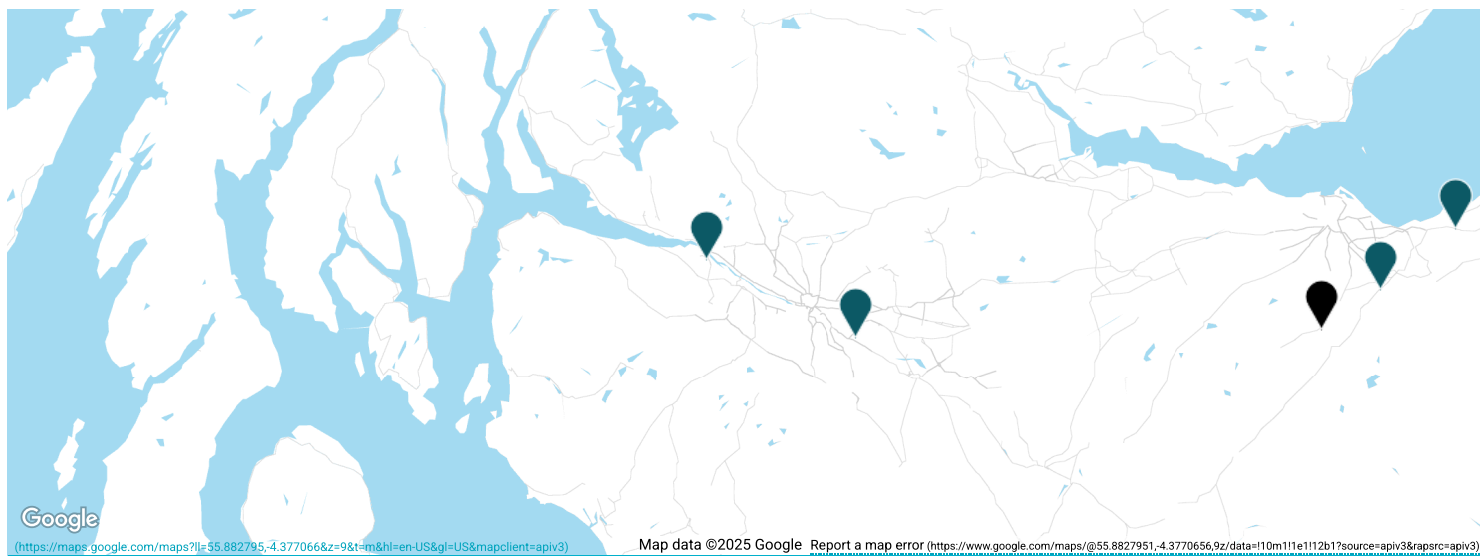




Penicuik

Penicuik is located in Midlothian. It began as a planned village in 1776. The Valleyfield paper mill (last mill closed in 2004) led to the expansion of the town. While many of the residents are commuters the town has local services and retains a base of small industries. Glencorse Barracks is to the east of the town.

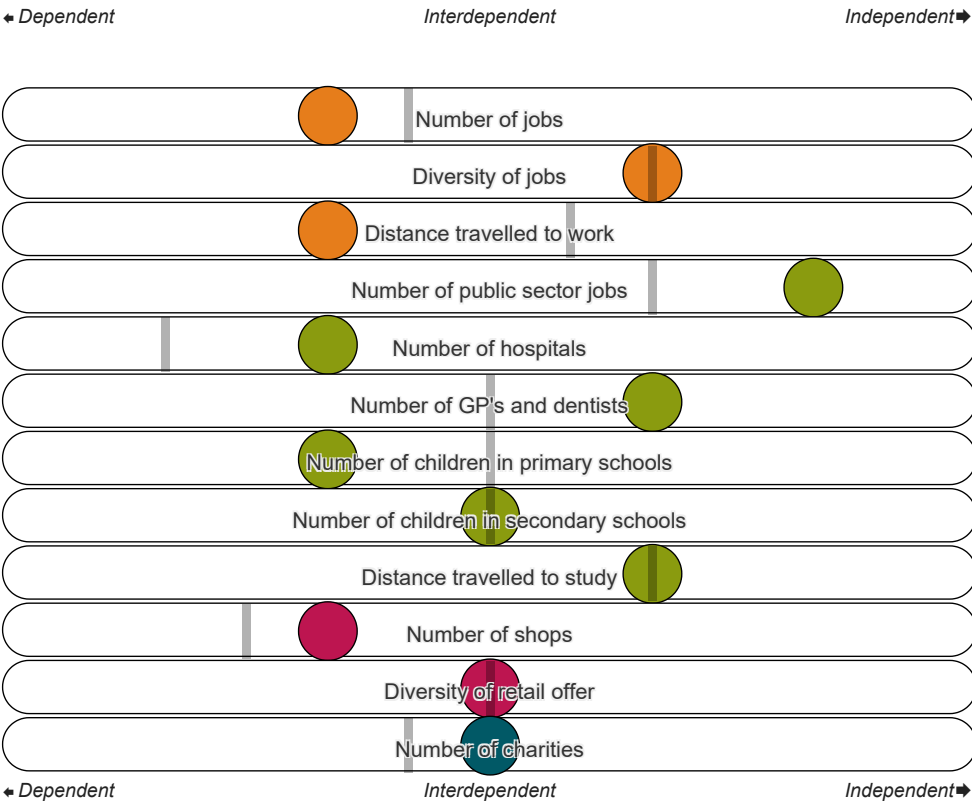
In large towns, this group comprises families with a higher proportion of adults in the 25–44 age grouping. Higher rates of full time employment are found.

Penicuik is an **interdependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Penicuik is grouped with 4 other towns. 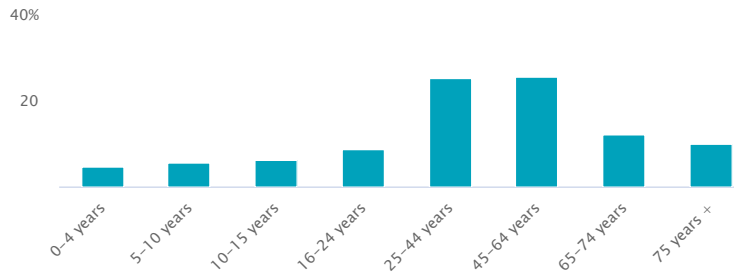

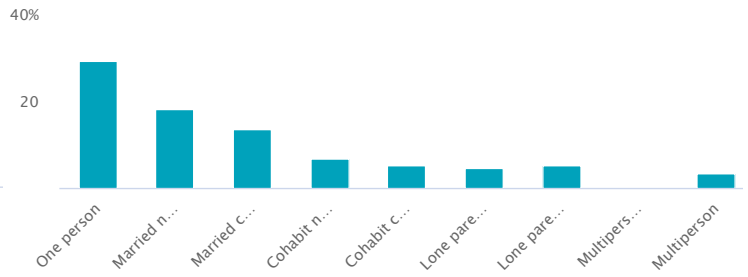

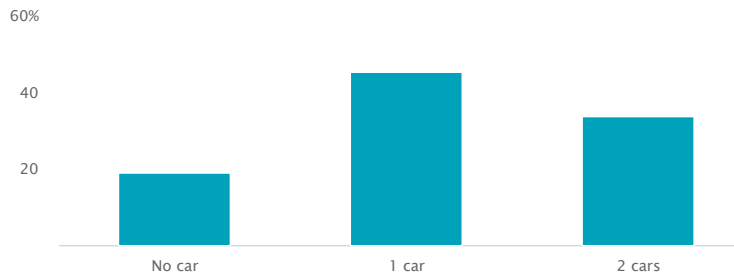

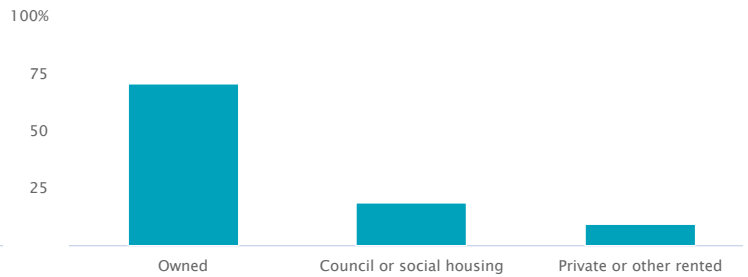

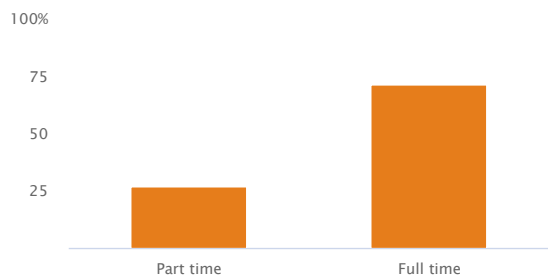

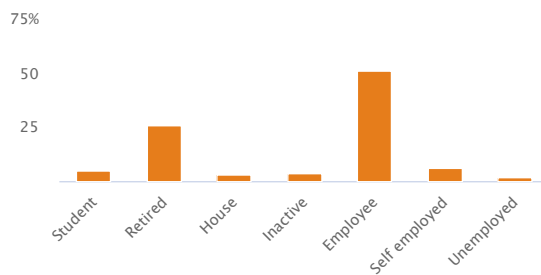
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



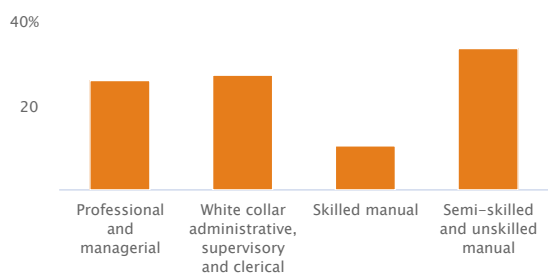
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

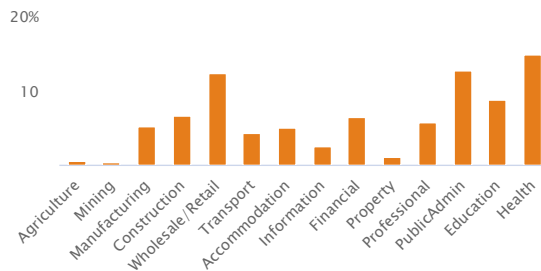

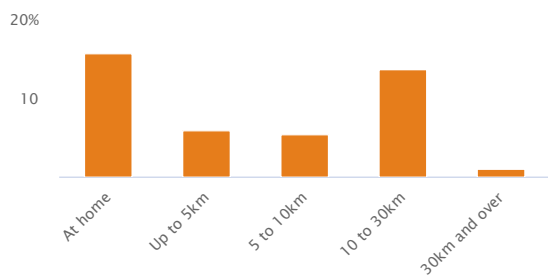
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

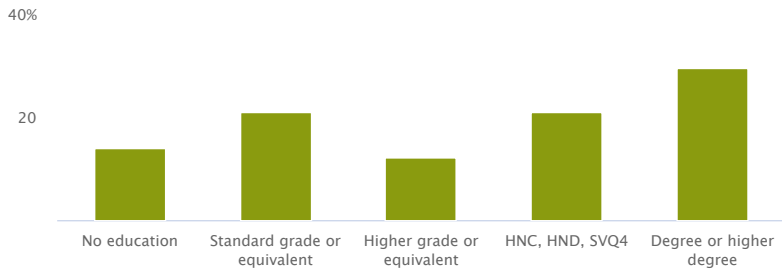


Distance travelled to work

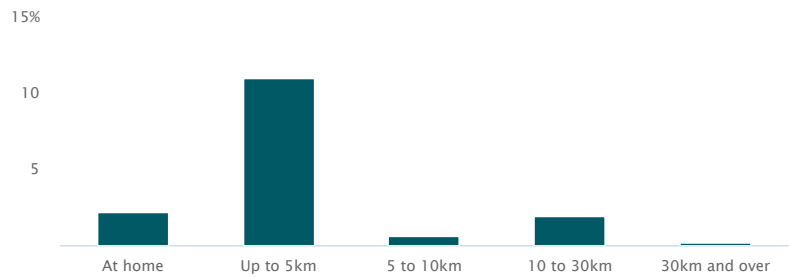
