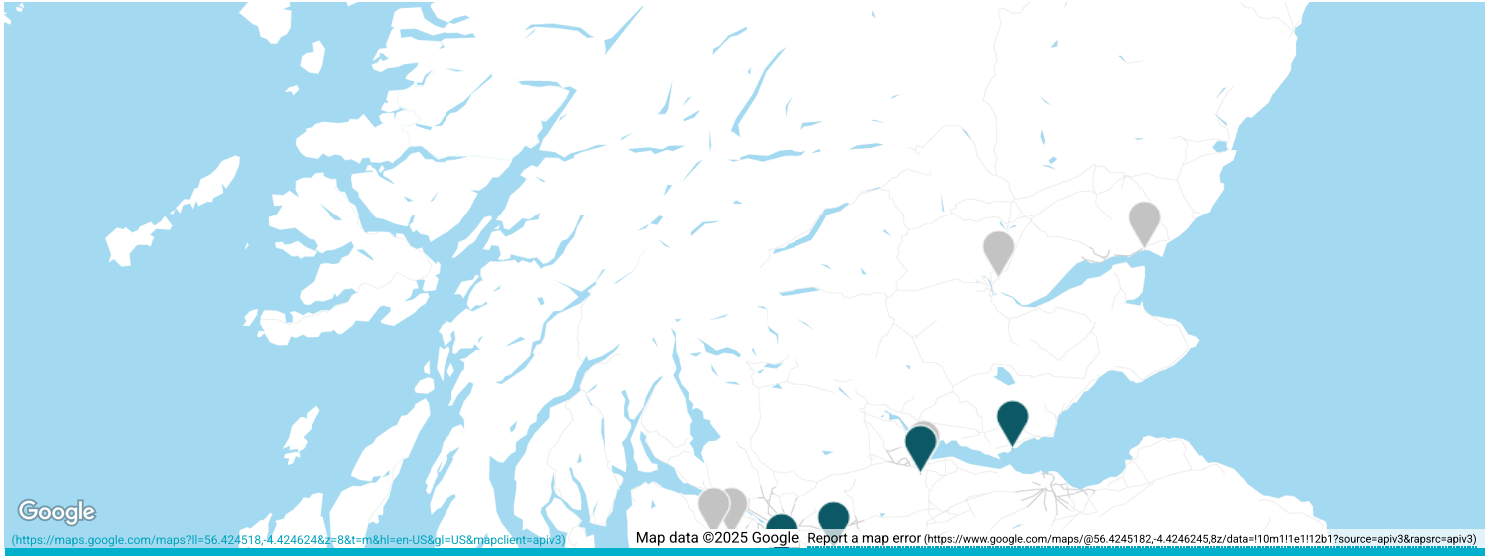




Peterculter

Peterculter is in Aberdeen City. Historically it was a paper mill. Today it is effectively a suburb of Aberdeen.

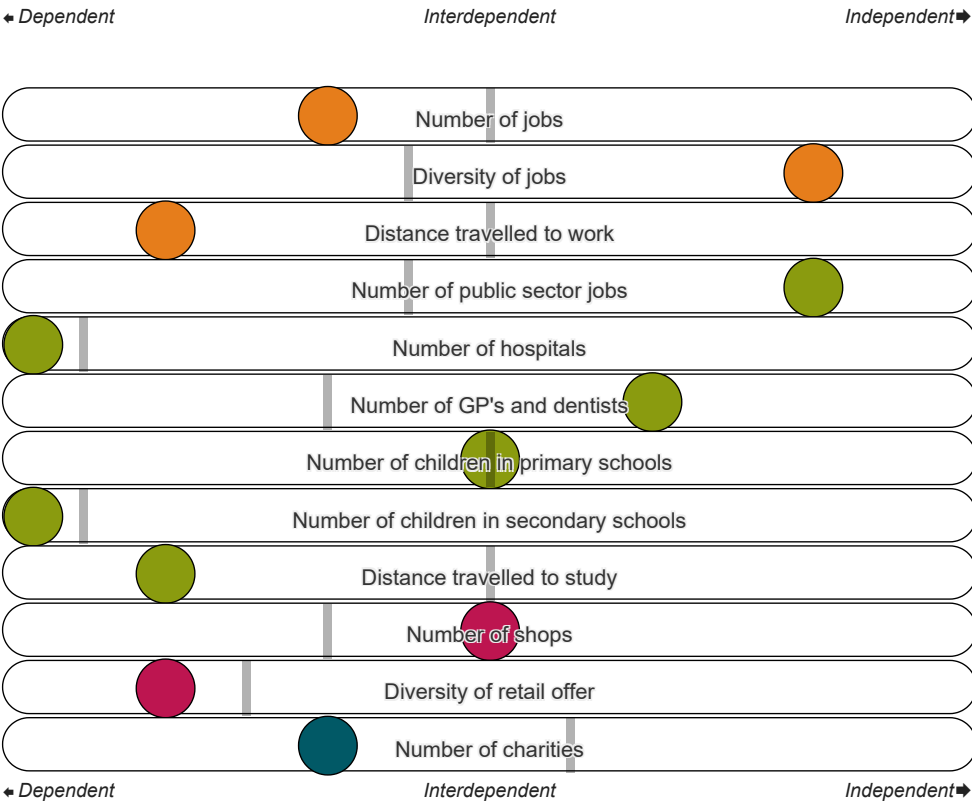
In medium towns such as this, the population is typically older. The group has higher social grade status than other groups, a higher proportion are owner occupiers and car ownership is also higher.

Peterculter is an interdependent to dependent town.

Inter-relationships



Peterculter is an **interdependent to dependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Peterculter is grouped with 10 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of hospitals, children in primary schools, children in secondary schools, jobs, and diversity of retail offer.

It differs in terms of the number of public sector jobs, and GP's and dentists. It also differs in the diversity of jobs. Peterculter differs most from its group in the distance travelled to work, and the distance travelled to study.

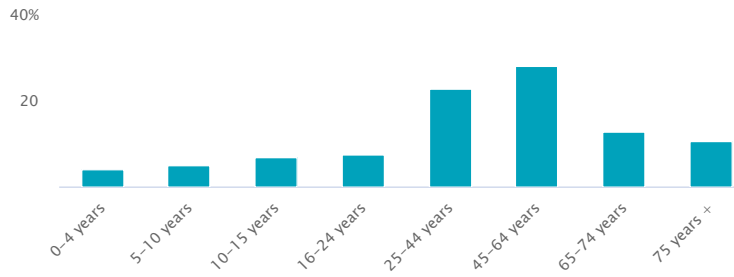

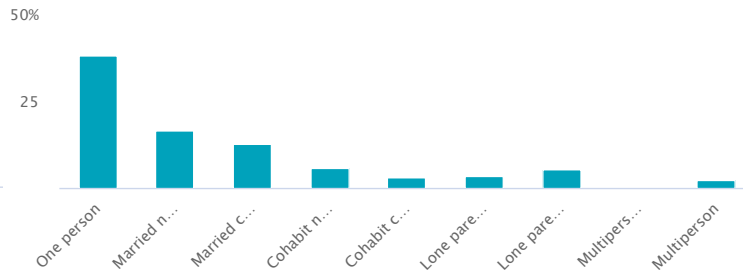

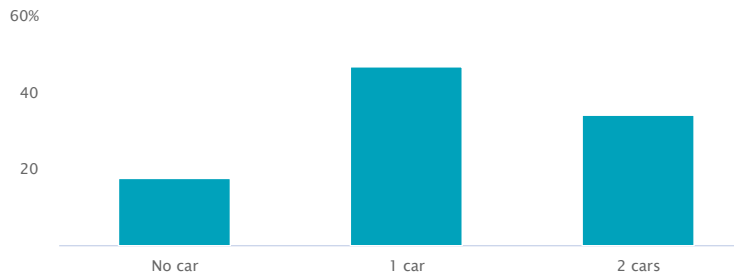

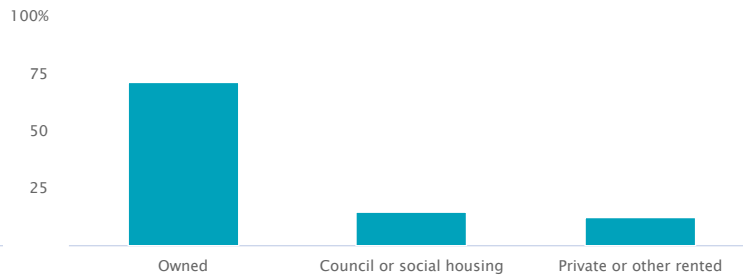

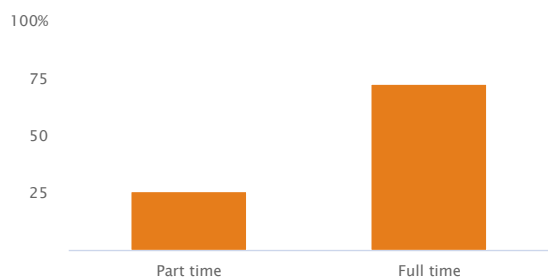

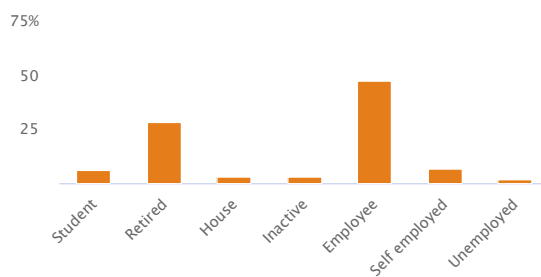
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



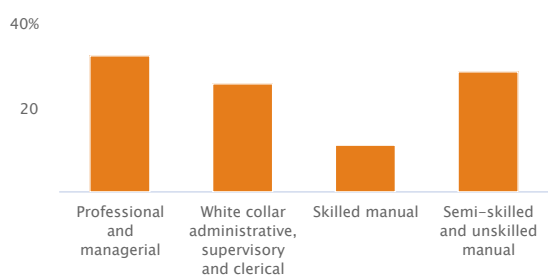
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

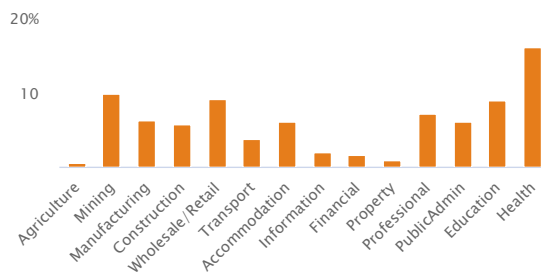


Social Grade

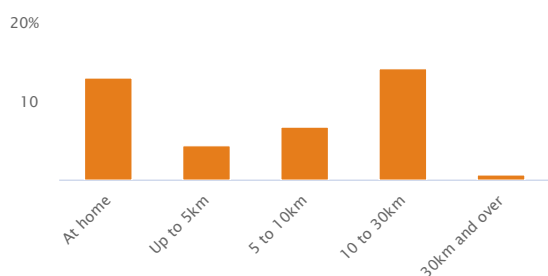
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

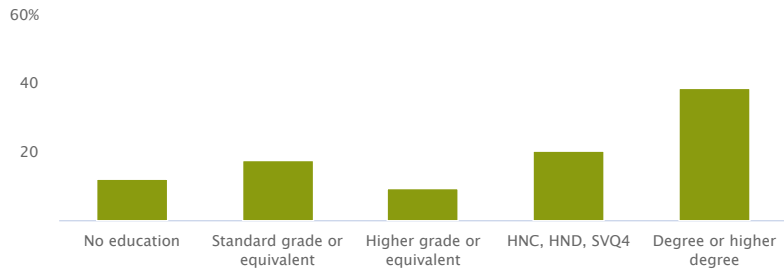


Distance travelled to work

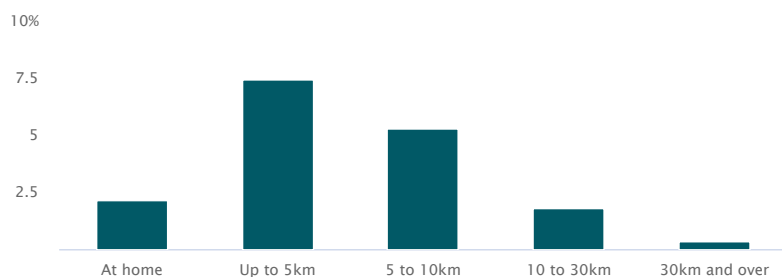
