POPULATION **2,694**

Pitlochry is in Perth and Kinross. The railway reached the town in 1853 and it became a tourist resort. Its economy continues to depend on tourism and its theatre is a particular attraction. There is also local employment in hydro electricity.

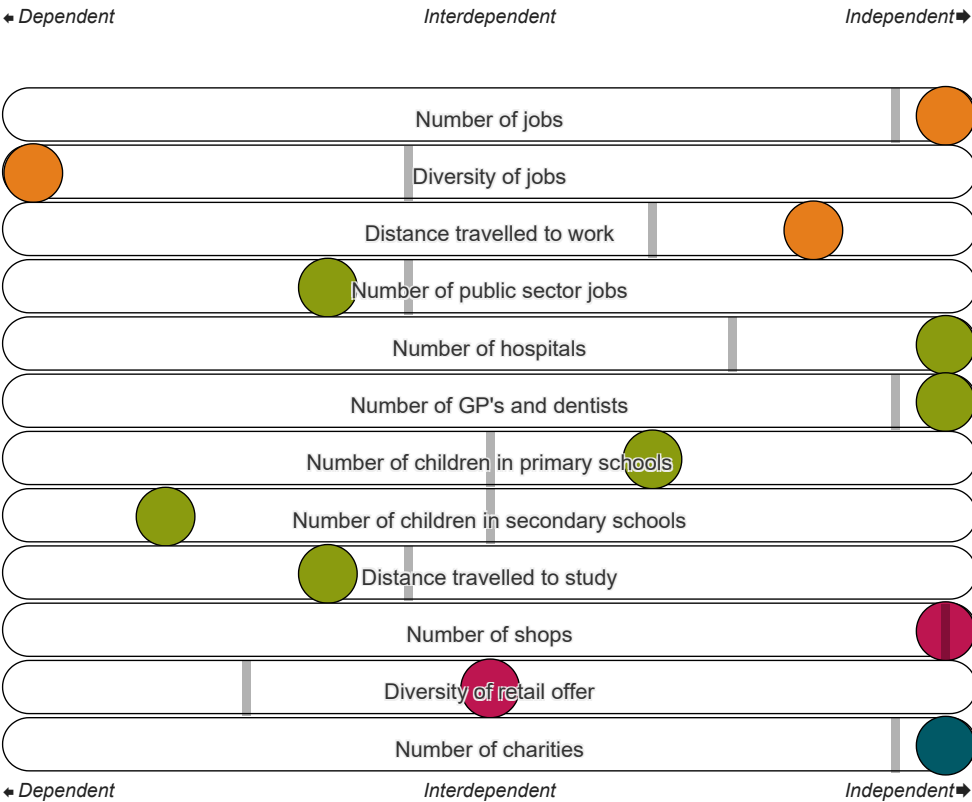
In small towns like this one, and similar, this population includes older people, some still in work often in less well paid sectors. It also includes a significant inactive population, some in poorer health. There is a higher proportion of single households and car ownership is lower.

Pitlochry is an interdependent to independent town.

Inter-relationships



Pitlochry is an **interdependent to independent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Pitlochry is grouped with 6 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of charities, children in primary schools, jobs, public sector jobs, shops, and GP's and dentists. It also has similarities in the distance travelled to work, and the distance travelled to study.

It differs in terms of the number of hospitals, and children in secondary schools. Pitlochry differs most from its group in the diversity of jobs.

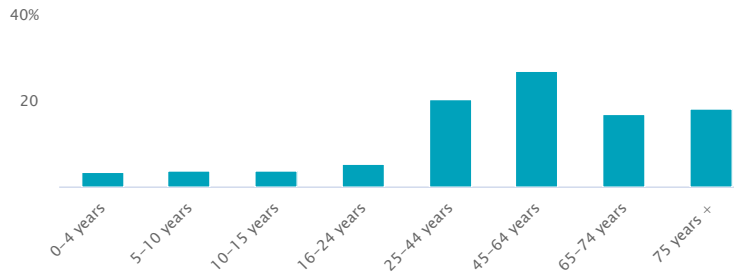

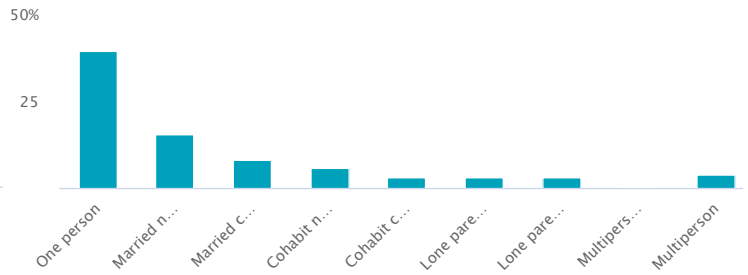

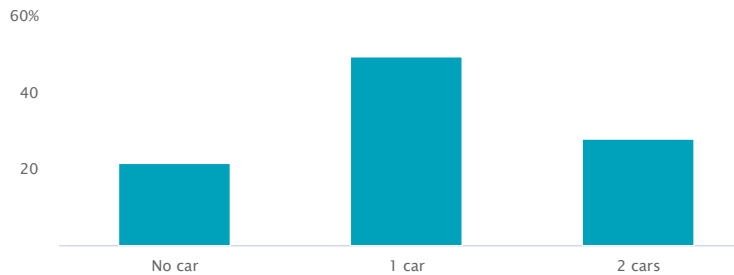

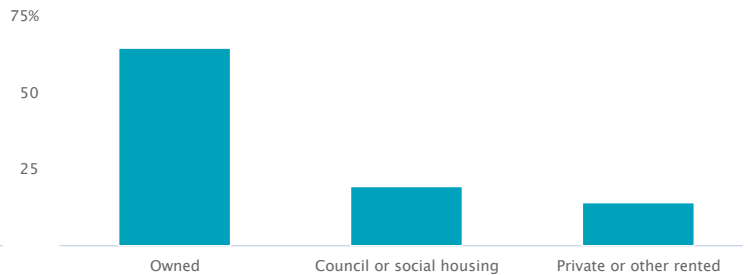

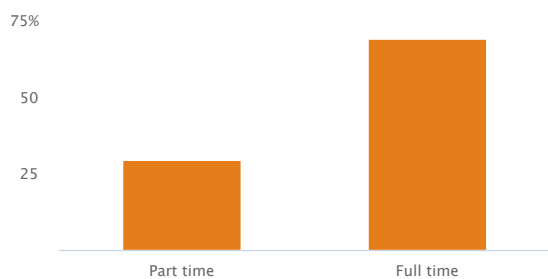

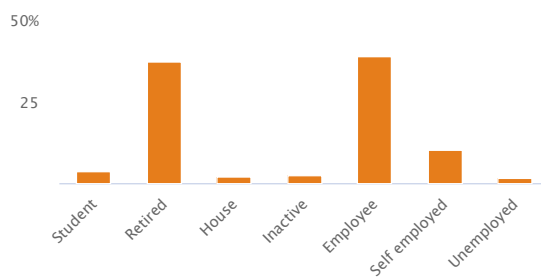
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



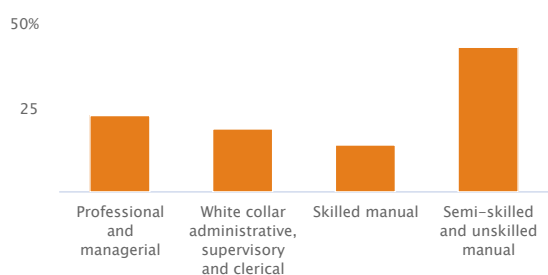
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

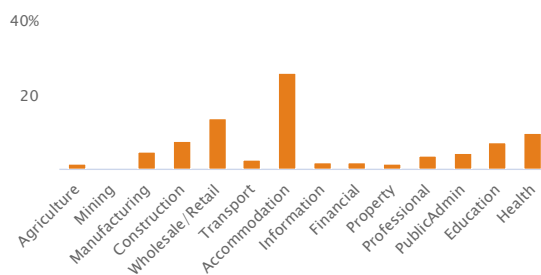


Social Grade

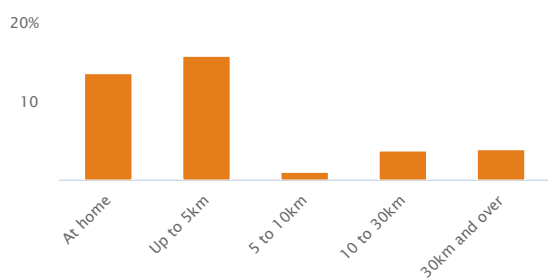
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

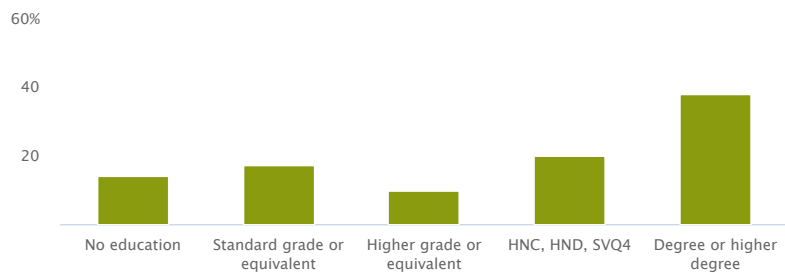


Distance travelled to work

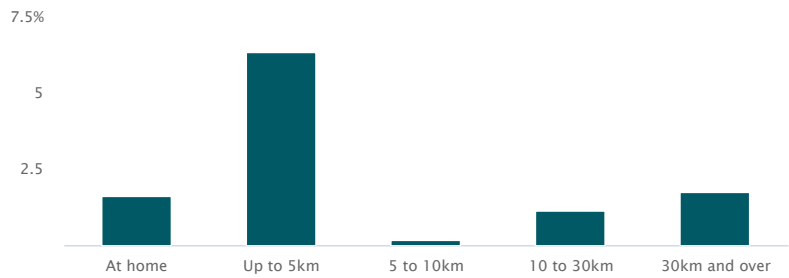
