Port Bannatyne is located in Argyll and Bute. The Bannatynes of Kames set it up as a planned village. In WWII submarines were based at Port Bannatyne. It is now a retirement and second home settlement.

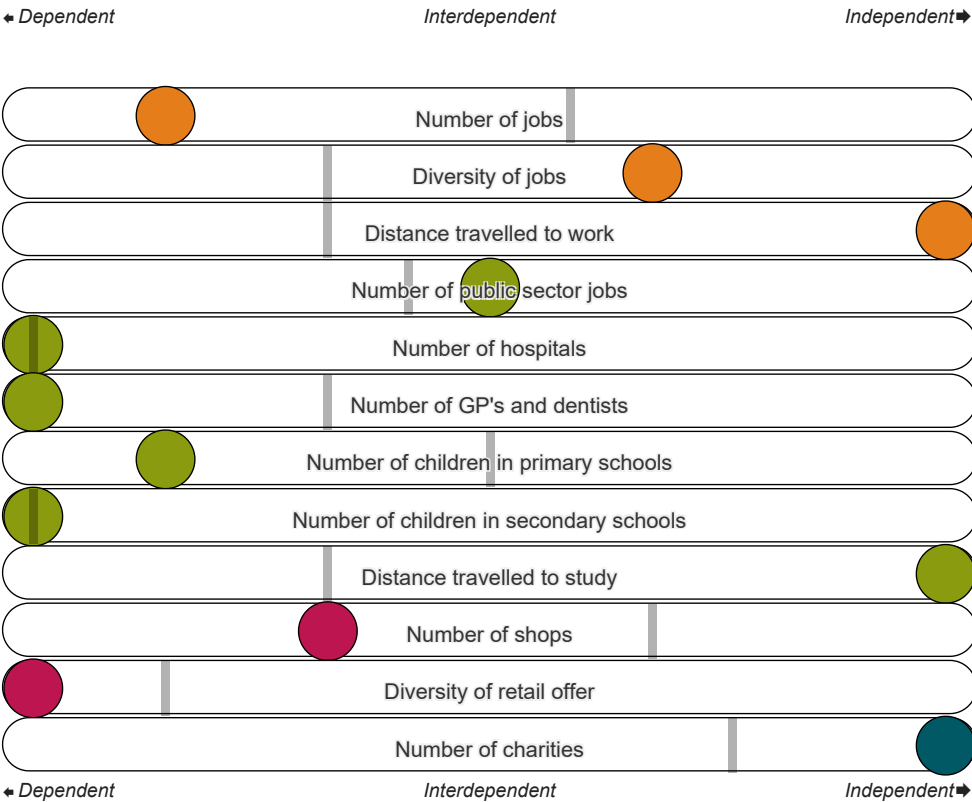
In small towns like this one, and similar, this population includes older people, some still in work often in less well paid sectors. It also includes a significant inactive population, some in poorer health. There is a higher proportion of single households and car ownership is lower.

Port Bannatyne is an interdependent to dependent town.

Port Bannatyne is an **interdependent to dependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Port Bannatyne is grouped with 15 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of hospitals, children in secondary schools, public sector jobs, and diversity of retail offer.

It differs in terms of the number of children in primary schools, jobs, and shops. It also differs in the diversity of jobs, the distance travelled to work, and the distance travelled to study. Port Bannatyne differs most from its group in the number of GP's and dentists.

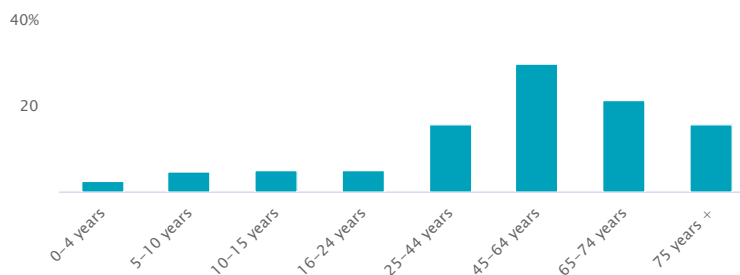

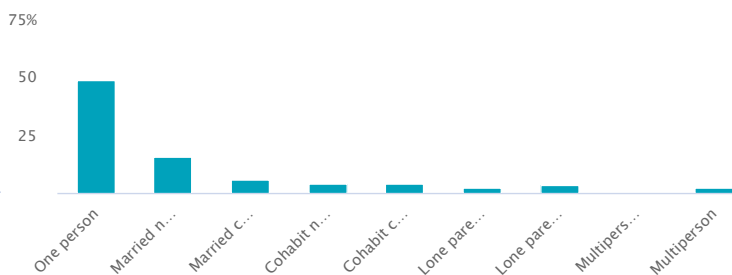

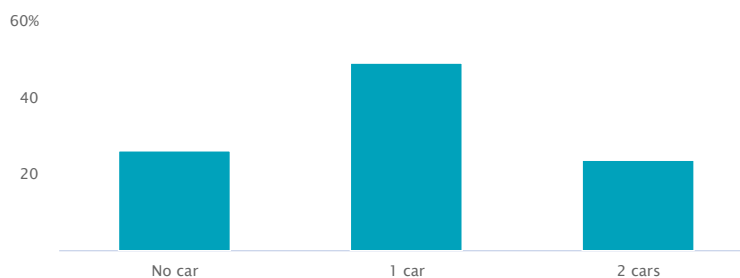

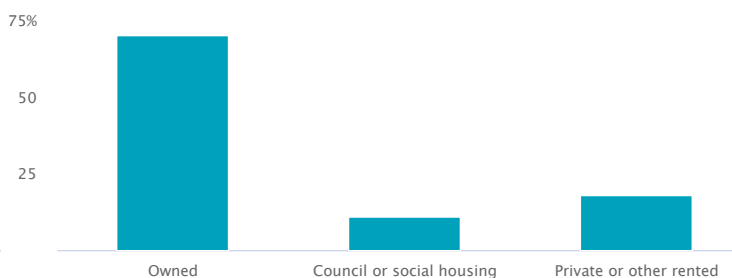
Household composition

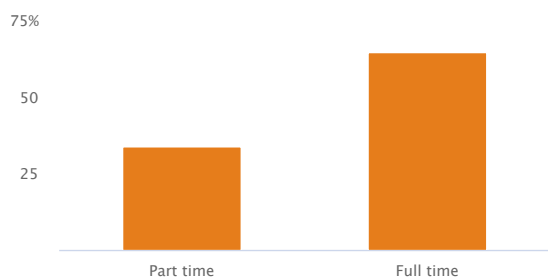

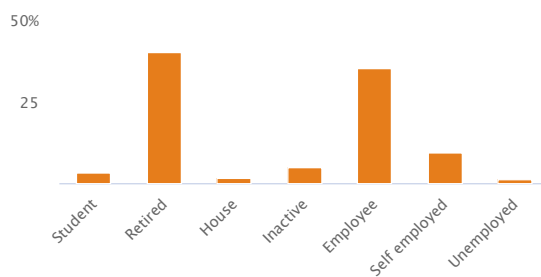
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



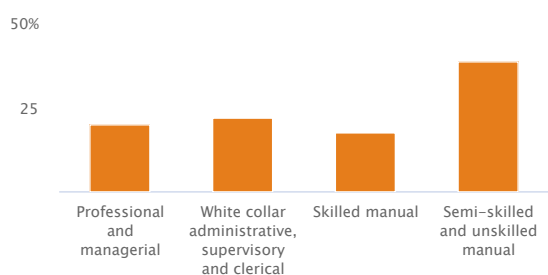
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

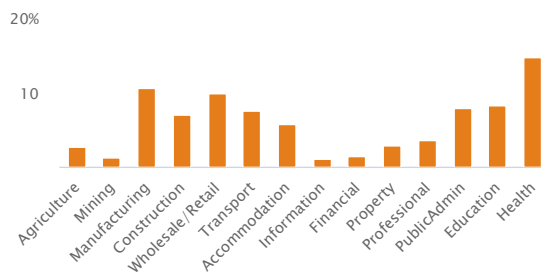

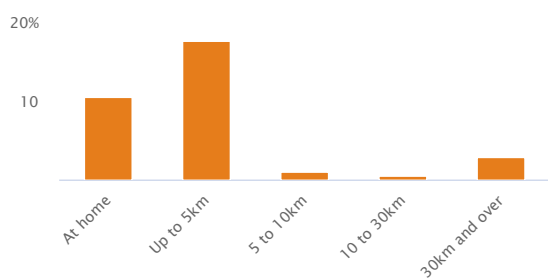
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

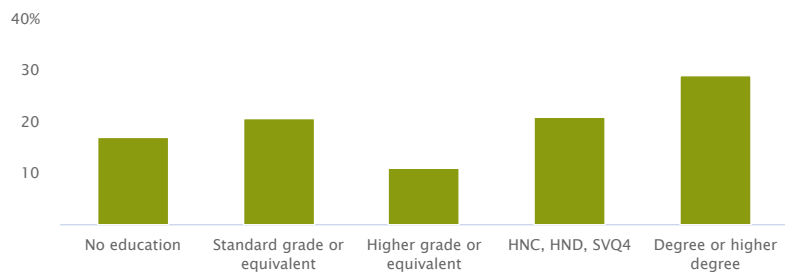


Distance travelled to work

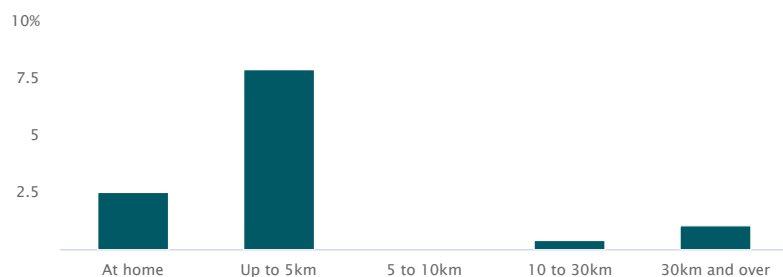
