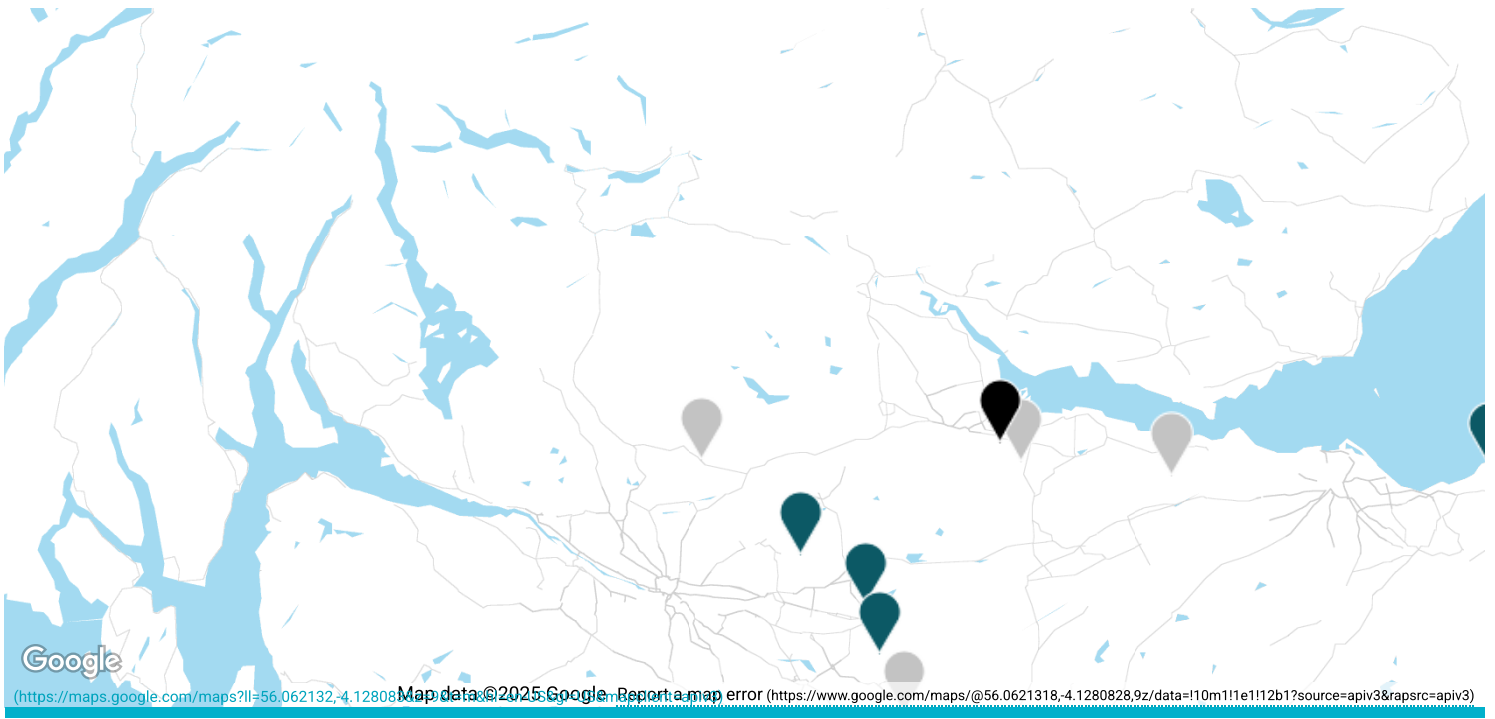




Redding

Redding is in Falkirk and is a suburb of Falkirk. It was a mining settlement but a major mining disaster occurred in 1923.. Local industries include metal fabrication.

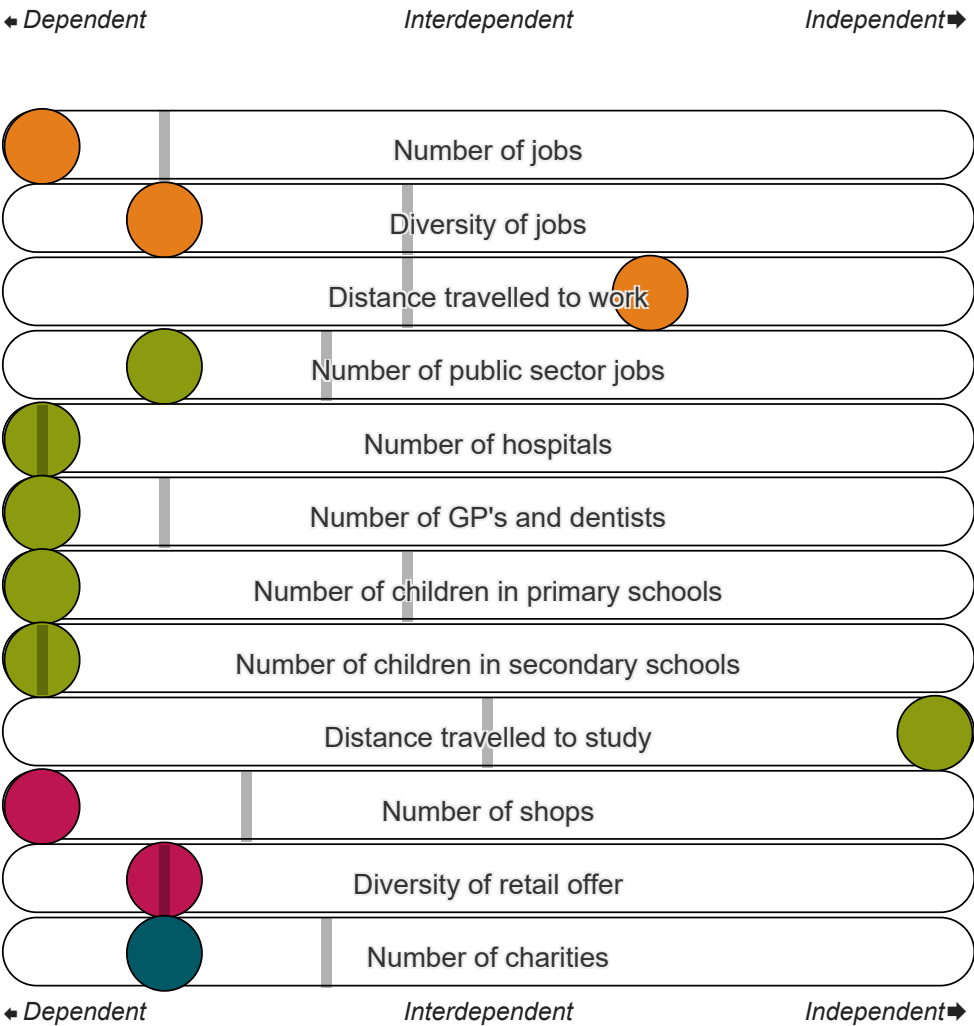
In this and similar medium towns, this population comprises families with a higher proportion of adults in the 25–44 age grouping. Higher rates of full time employment are found.

Redding is a dependent to interdependent town.

Redding is a **dependent to interdependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Redding is grouped with 10 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of charities, hospitals, children in secondary schools, public sector jobs, GP's and dentists, and diversity of retail offer.

It differs in terms of the distance travelled to work, and the distance travelled to study. Redding differs most from its group in the number of children in primary schools.

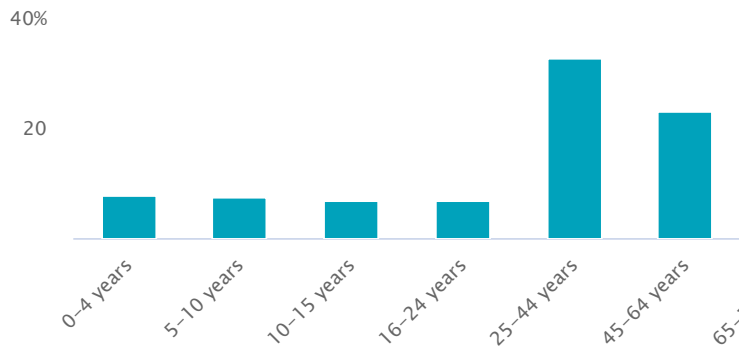

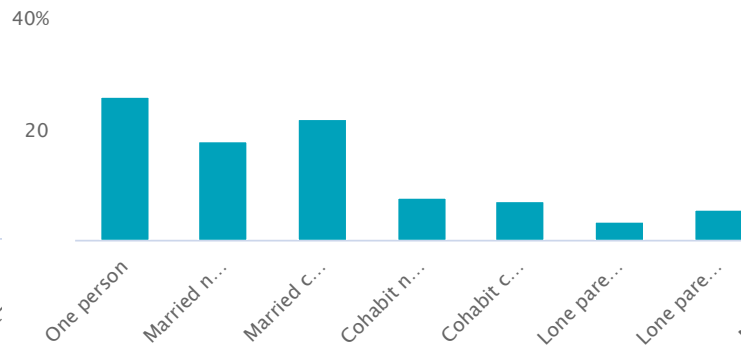

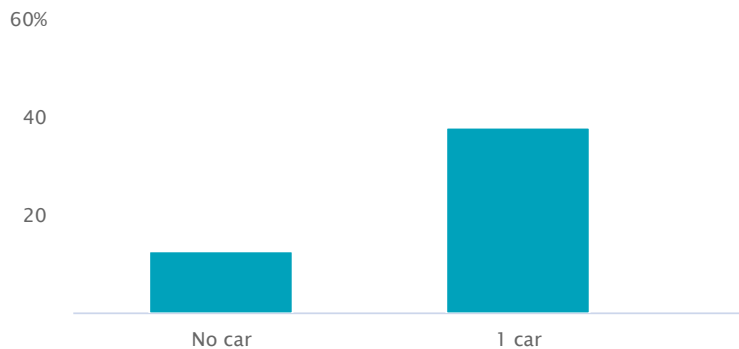

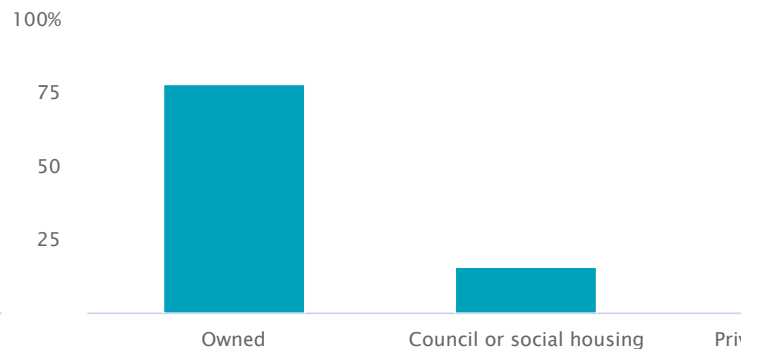

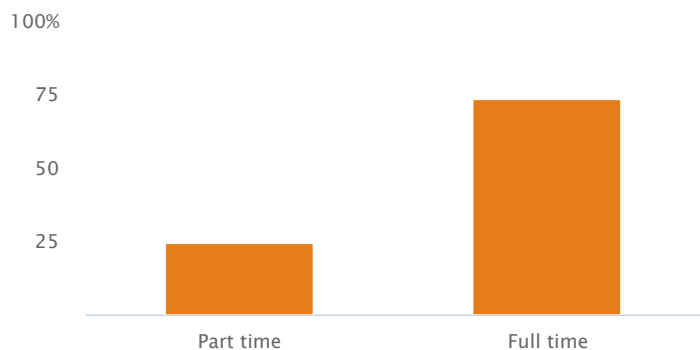

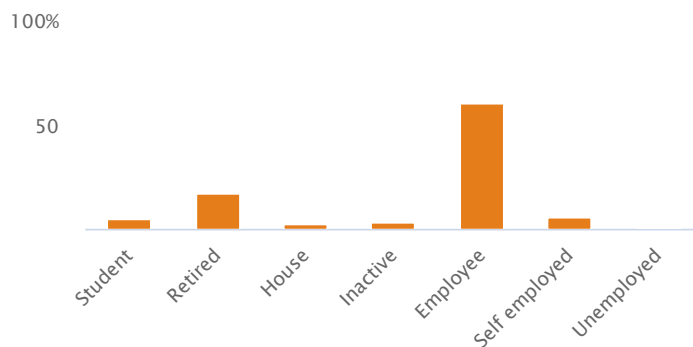
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



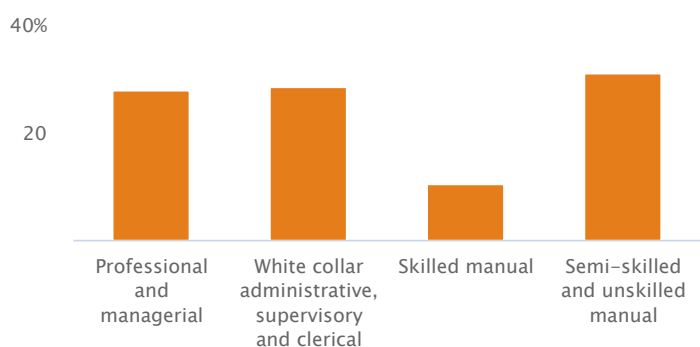
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

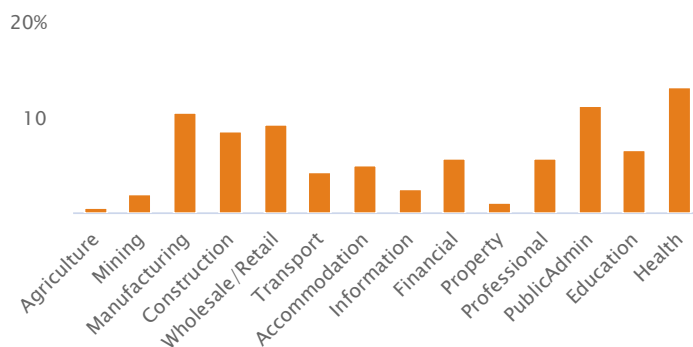

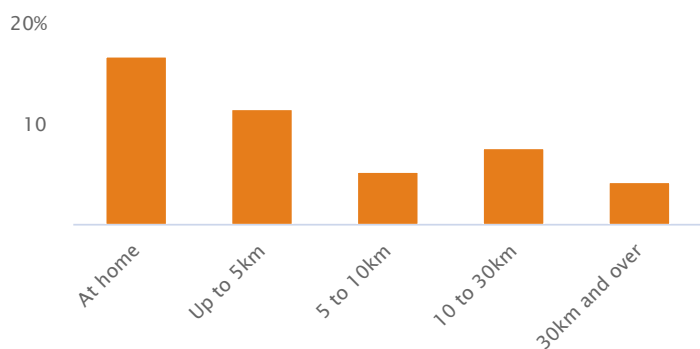
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

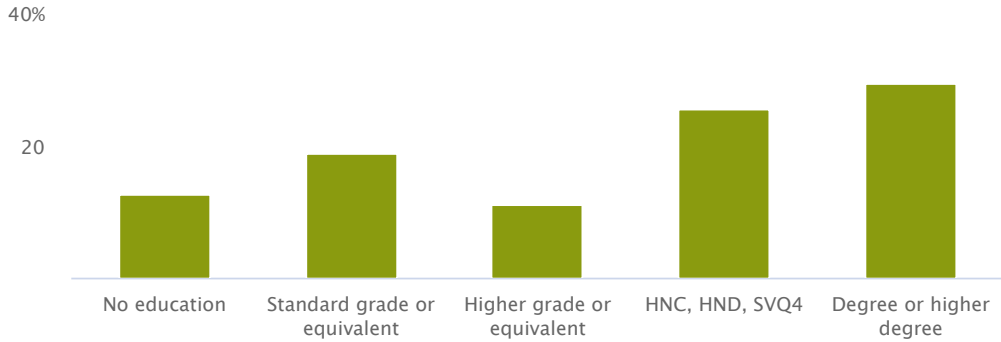


Distance travelled to work

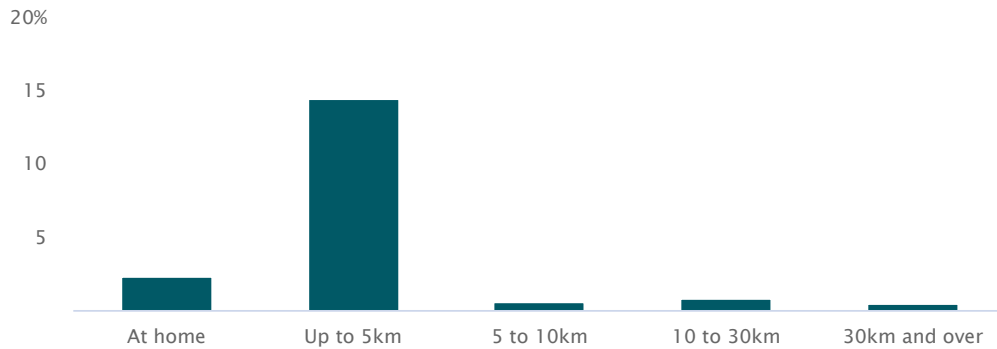
