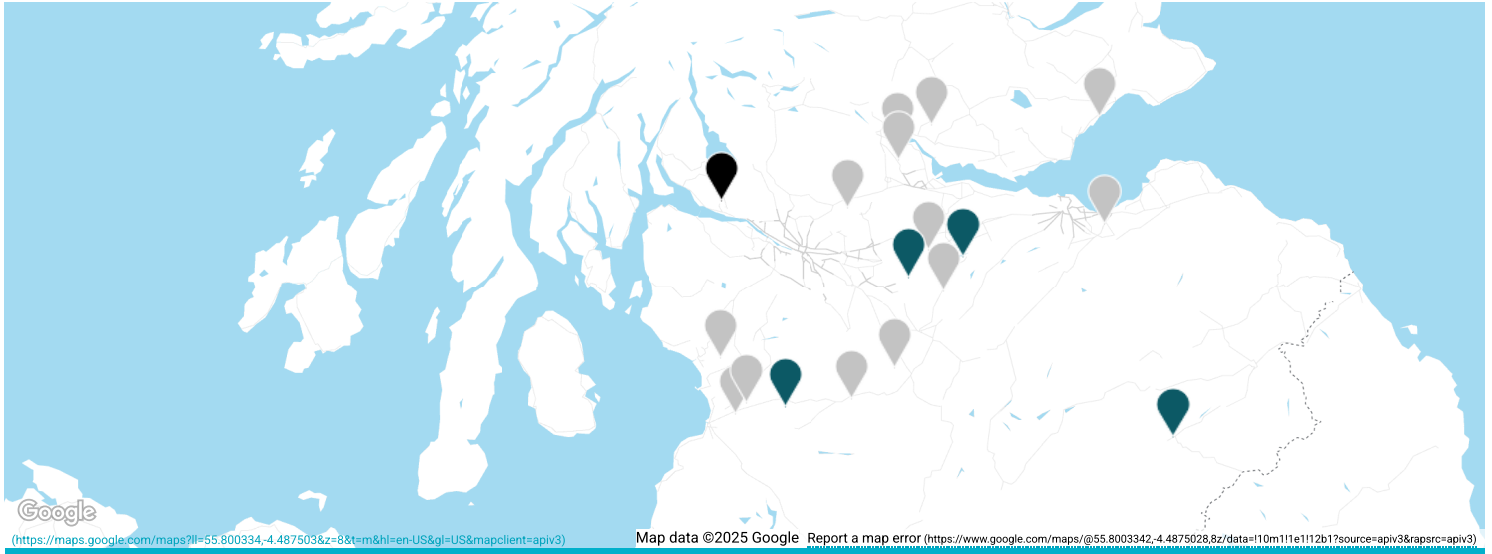




Renton

WEST DUNBARTONSHIRE

POPULATION **2,415**

Renton in the Vale of Leven is in West Dunbartonshire. It was important for textiles, bleaching and printing in the 18th century (Dalquhurn Works, Cordale Printworks). It was designed as a model village named after a relative of the landowner. In the 1950s it was rebuilt with public housing. Industrial decline has blighted the area. Nearby towns retain some employment and an engineering works is to be found in Renton.

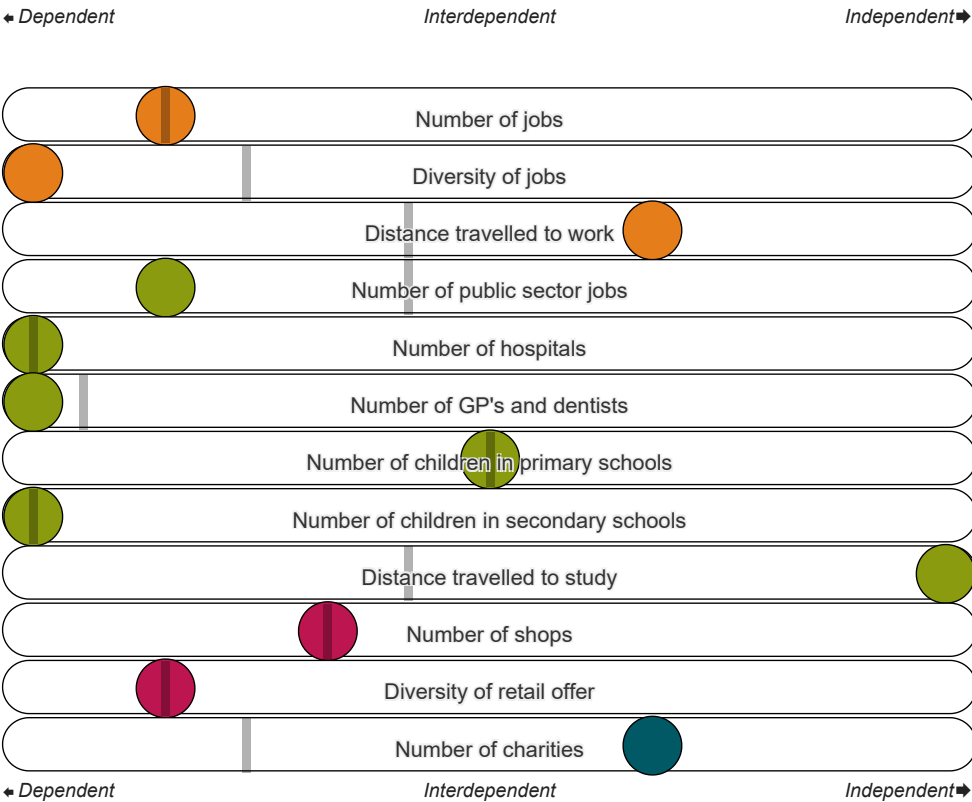
In this, and similar small towns, people experience more challenging circumstances with higher rates of unemployment, poorer health, lack of a car, lower levels of education and lower social grades than other groups. A higher proportion live in social rented housing. There is a higher proportion of single person households and lone parents.

Renton is a dependent to interdependent town.

Inter-relationships



Renton is a **dependent to interdependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Renton is grouped with 17 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of hospitals, children in primary schools, children in secondary schools, jobs, shops, GP's and dentists, and diversity of retail offer.

It differs in terms of the number of charities. It also differs in the distance travelled to study. Renton differs most from its group in the number of public sector jobs.

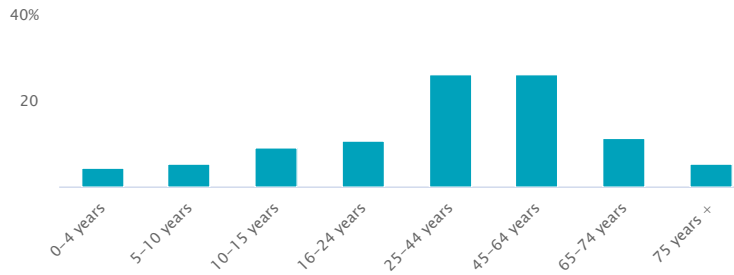

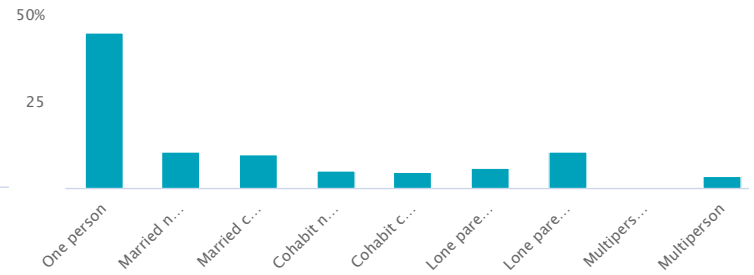

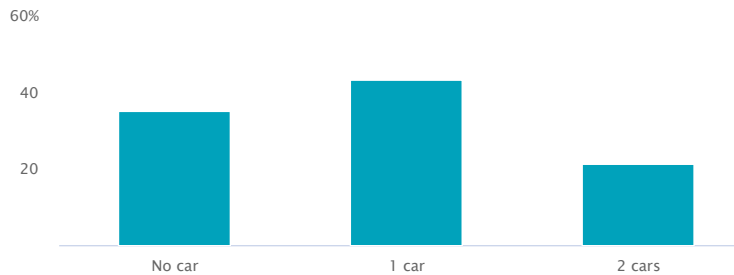

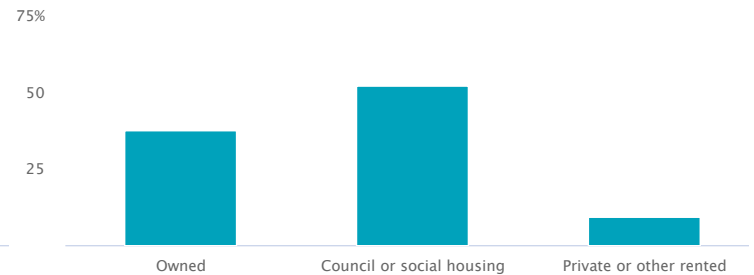
Household composition

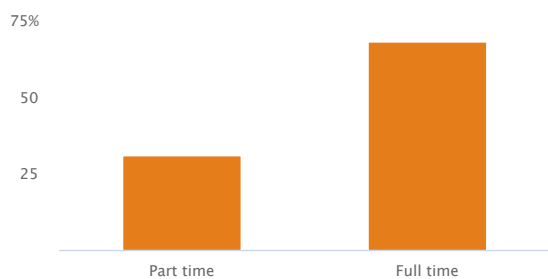

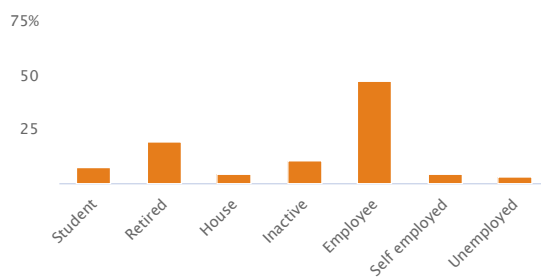
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



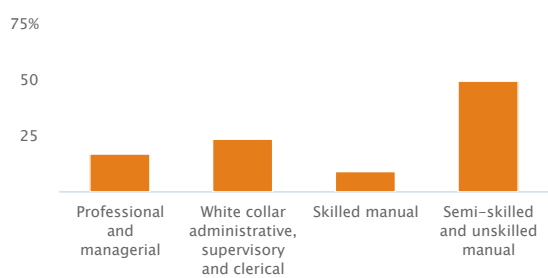
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

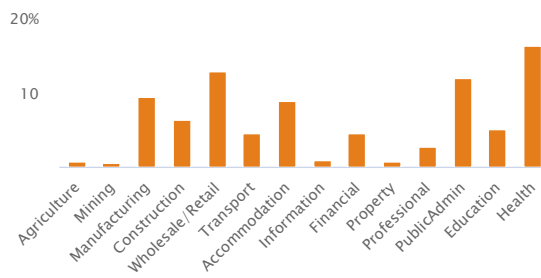


Social Grade

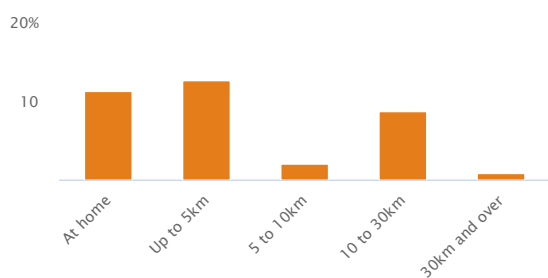
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

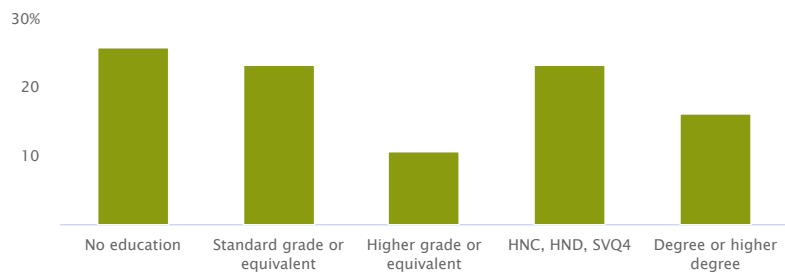


Distance travelled to work

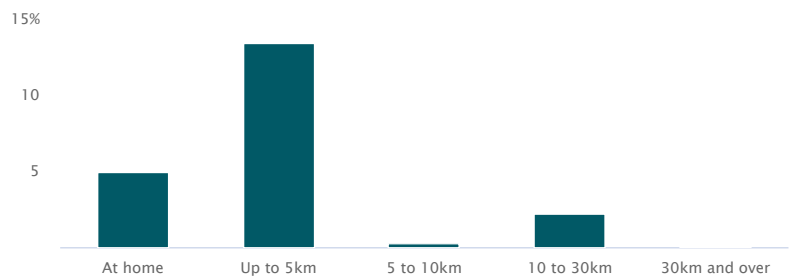
