Rosewell is in Midlothian. Arhibald Hood created the village as a mining settlement in the 19th century when he bought the colliery and expanded mining also creating an oil works. Bricks were also made and the houses are of brick. Whitehill Coilliery closed in 1961. The town is primarily residential although small engineering and metal work industry remains.


In this type of small town, the population comprises families with a higher proportion of adults in the 25–44 age grouping. Higher rates of full time employment are found.

Rosewell is a dependent to interdependent town.

Its most similar towns are Airth, Almondbank, Ashgill, and Bilston.

#### Rosewell is a dependent to interdependent town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Rosewell is grouped with 25 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of charities, hospitals, children in secondary schools, public sector jobs, GP's and dentists, and diversity of retail offer.It also has similarities in the distance travelled to work, and the distance travelled to study.

It differs in terms of the number of children in primary schools, and jobs. Rosewell differs most from its group in the diversity of jobs.















## **Sector Diversity**




