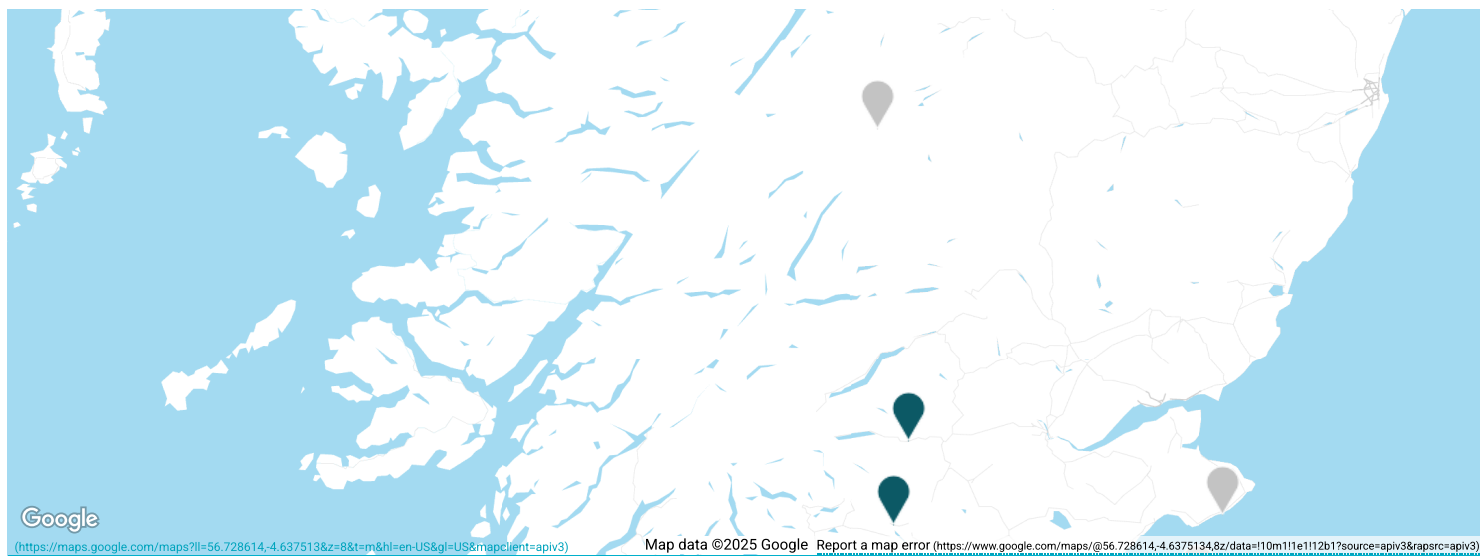




Roslin

Roslin in Midlothian is an ecclesiastical settlement associated with Rosslyn Chapel. It became a mining settlement with the Moat Colliery. The colliery closed in 1969. The Roslin Institute (genetics research) and Roslin Bio Centre are located on the edge of the town. Substantial housing development is taking place.

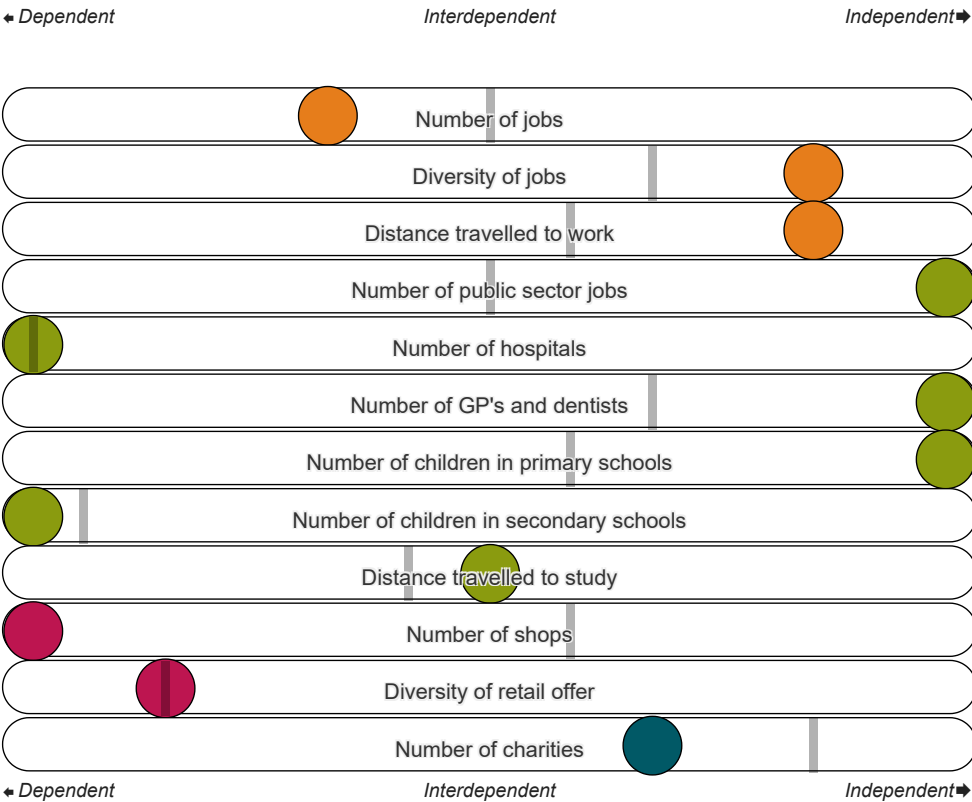
In this and similar small towns, the population is commonly older. The group has higher social grade status than other groups, a higher proportion are owner occupiers and car ownership is also higher.

Roslin is an interdependent town.

Inter-relationships



Roslin is an **interdependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Roslin is grouped with 8 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of hospitals, children in secondary schools, and diversity of retail offer. It also has similarities in the diversity of jobs, and the distance travelled to study.

It differs in terms of the number of children in primary schools, public sector jobs, and GP's and dentists. It also differs in the distance travelled to work. Roslin differs most from its group in the number of shops.

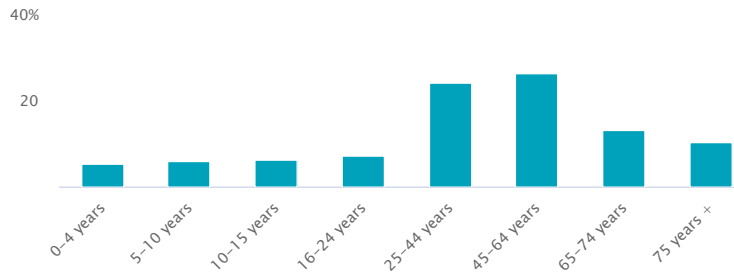

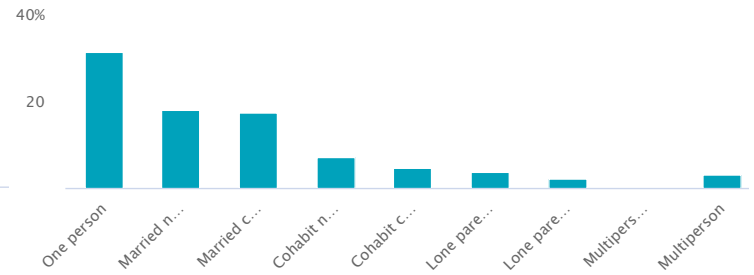

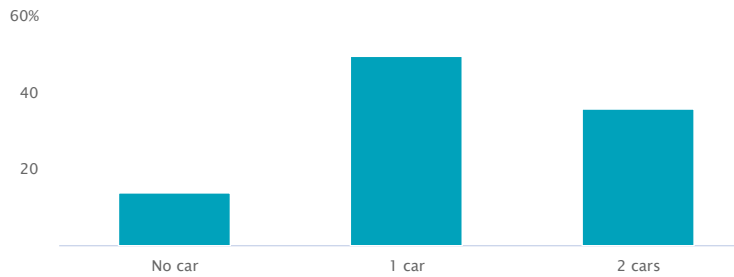

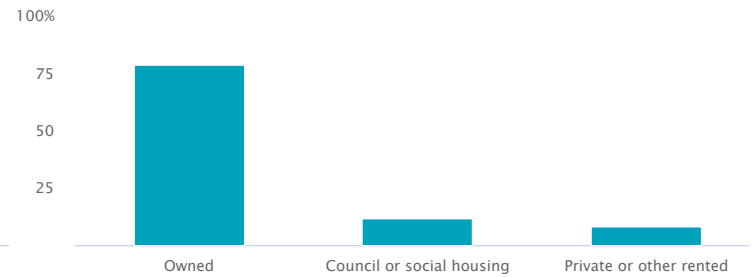
Household composition

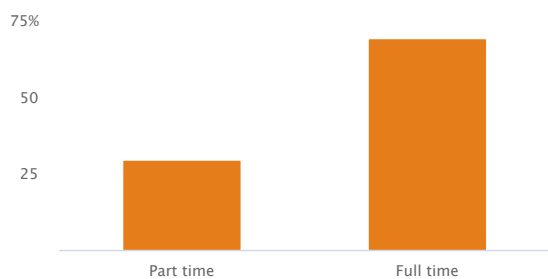

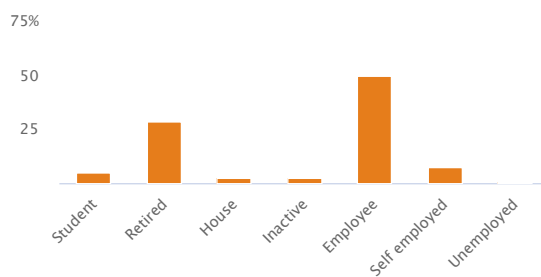
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



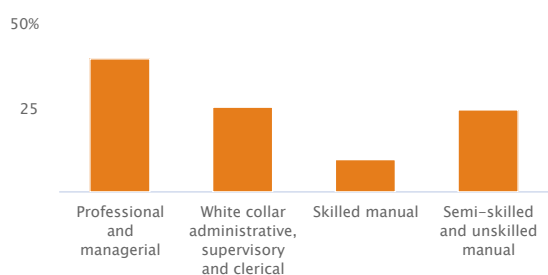
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

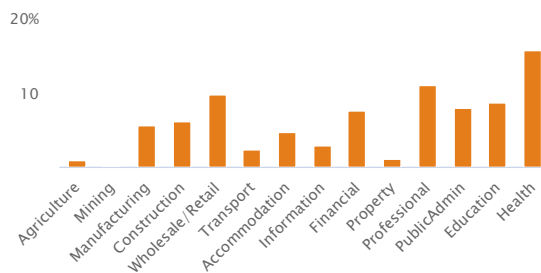


Social Grade

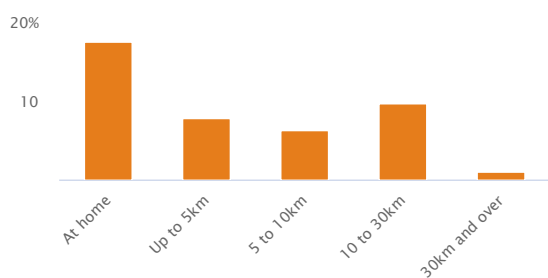
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

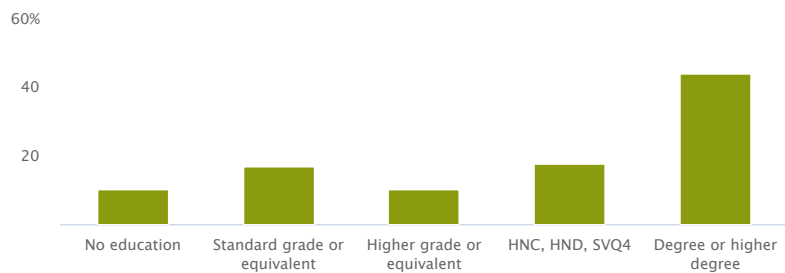


Distance travelled to work

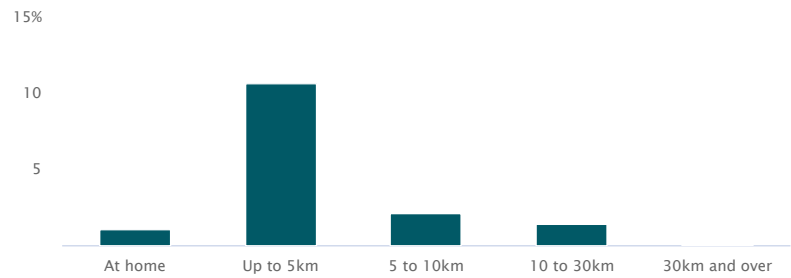
