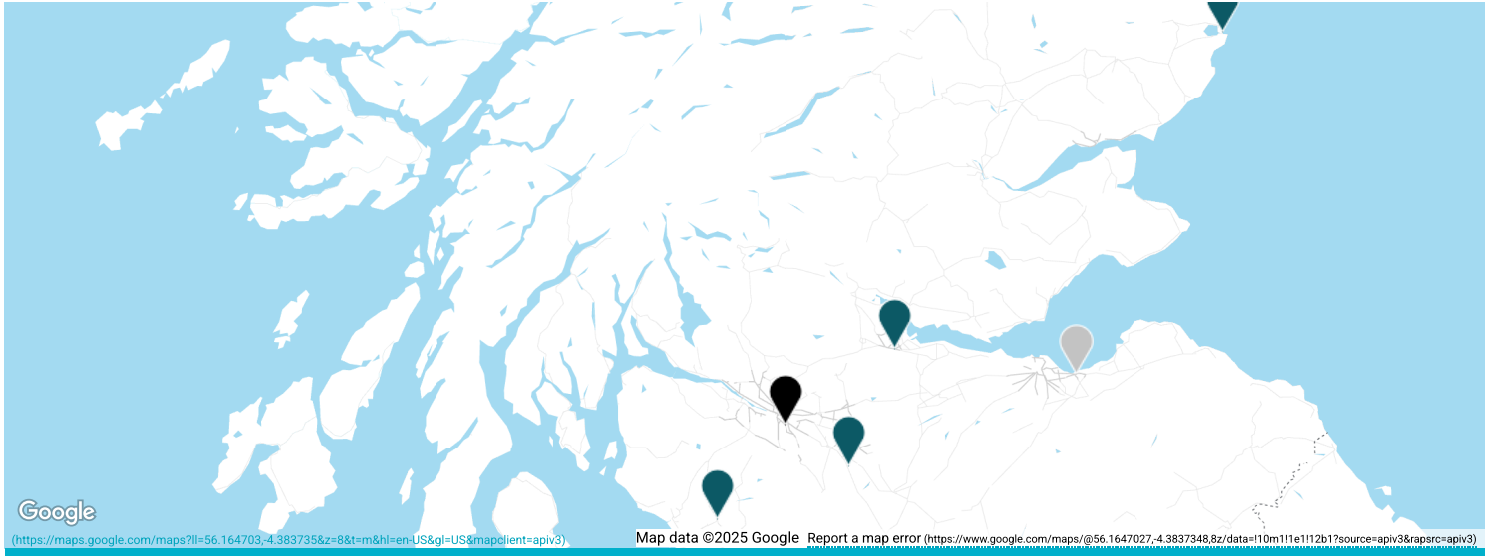




Rutherglen

SOUTH LANARKSHIRE

POPULATION **31,195**

Rutherglen is located in South Lanarkshire. It was in historic times a burgh and trading centre with horse fairs and an industrial profile. It has now been drawn into the greater Glasgow conurbation and is a suburb of the city. The town retains an industrial profile with a number of industrial estates with small manufacturers, construction sector plants and haulage companies (including Clydemill Industrial Estate) and also Muller Milk and Ingredients.

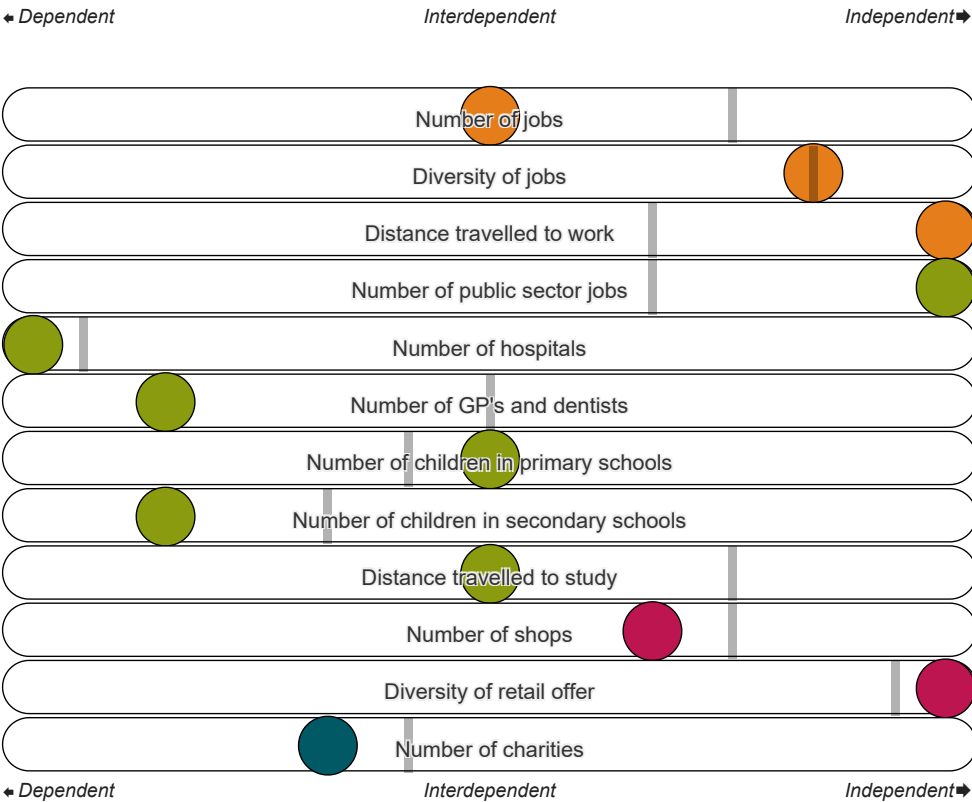
In large towns such as this, this population includes older people, some still in work often in less well paid sectors. It also includes a significant inactive population, some in poorer health. There is a higher proportion of single households and car ownership is lower.

Rutherglen is an interdependent to independent town.

Rutherglen is an **interdependent to independent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Rutherglen is grouped with 5 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of charities, hospitals, children in primary schools, children in secondary schools, shops, and diversity of retail offer. It also has similarities in the diversity of jobs.

It differs in terms of the number of jobs, and public sector jobs. It also differs in the distance travelled to work, and the distance travelled to study. Rutherglen differs most from its group in the number of GP's and dentists.

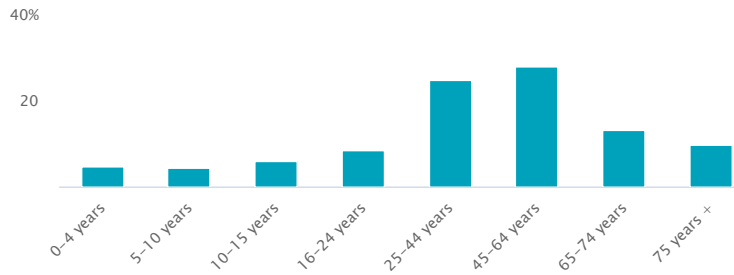

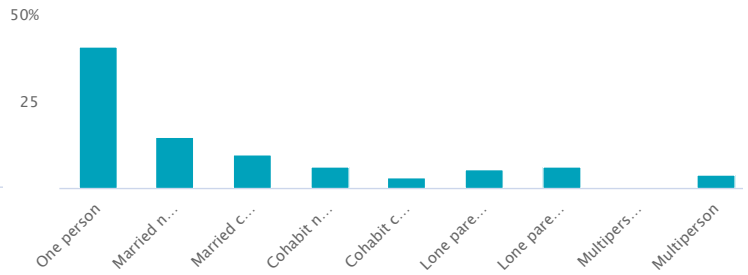

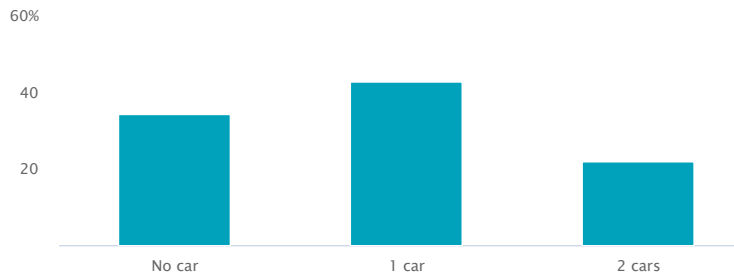

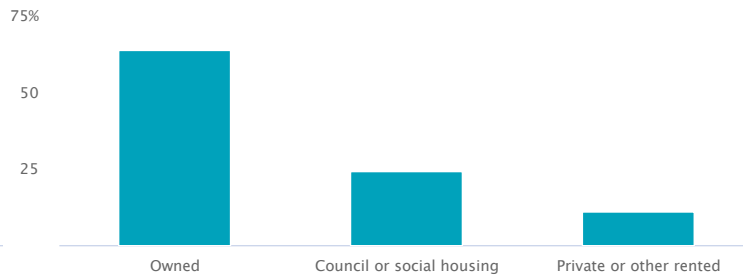

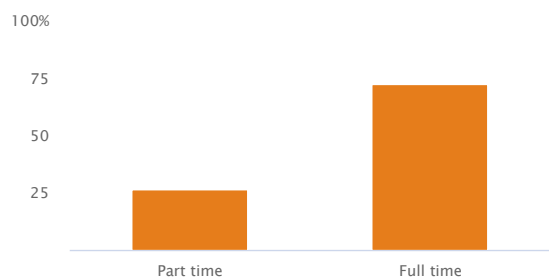

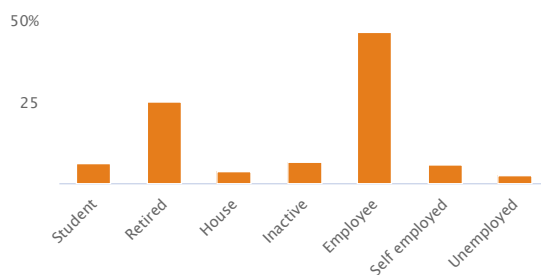
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



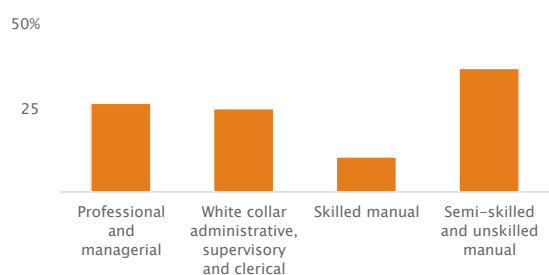
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

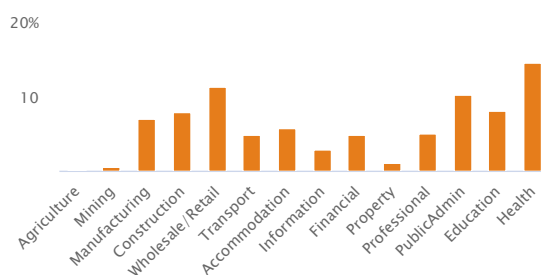

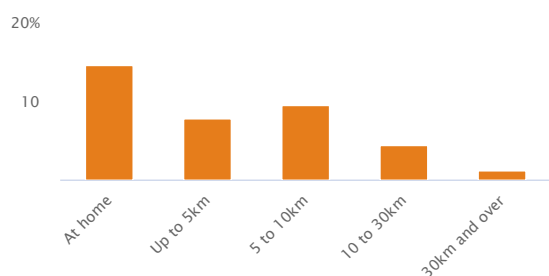
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

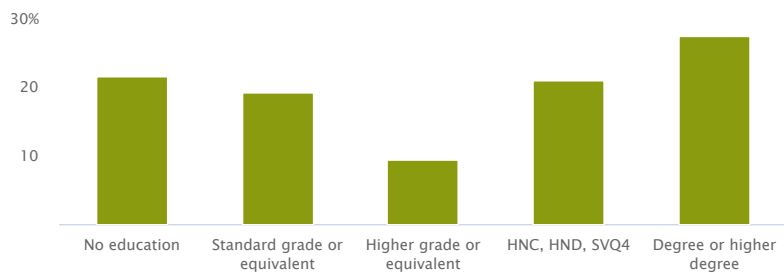


Distance travelled to work

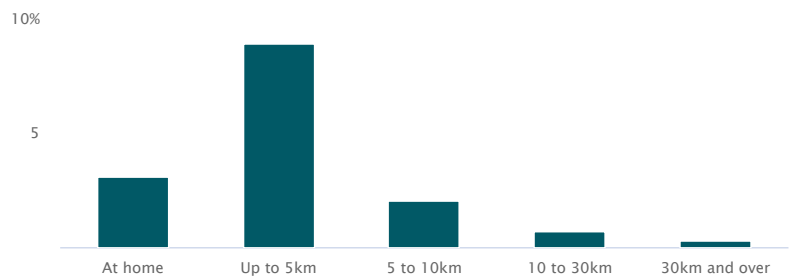
