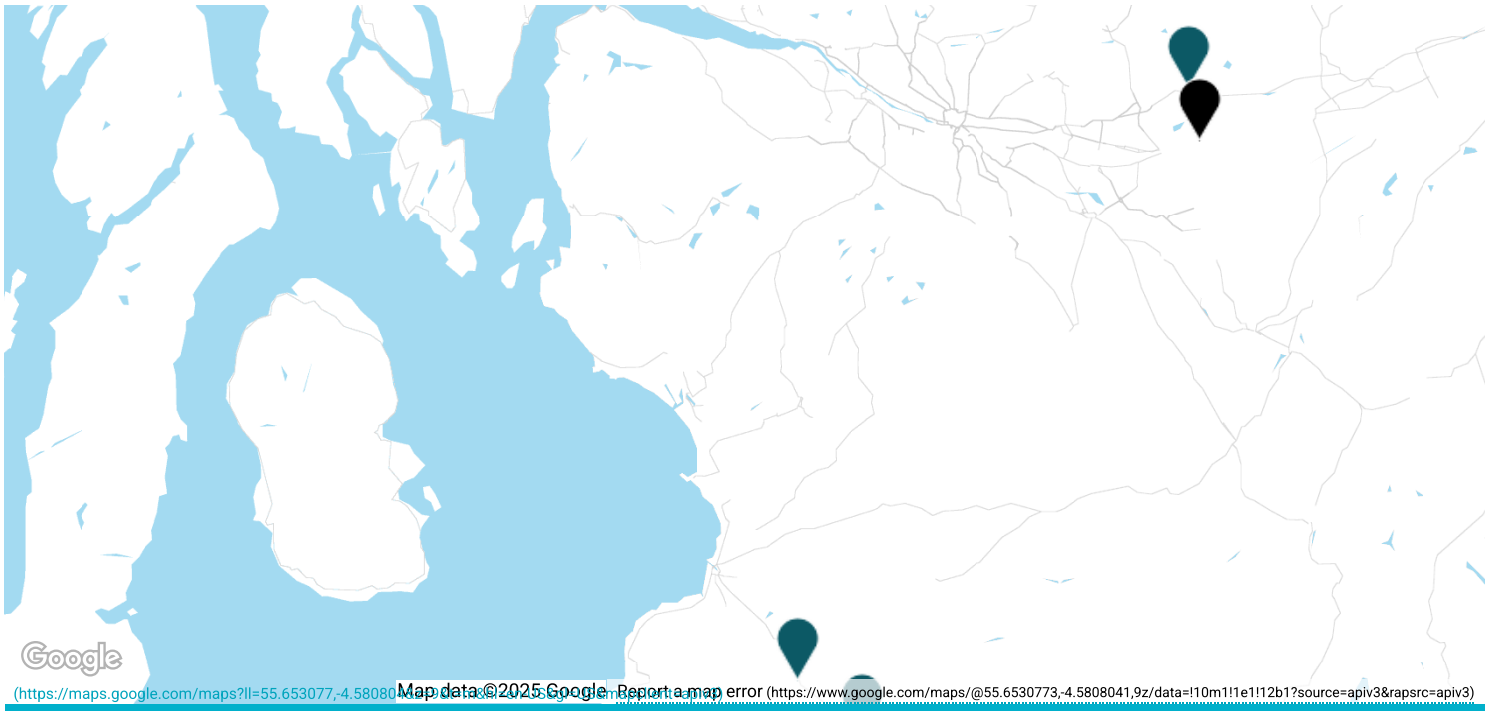




Salsburgh

NORTH LANARKSHIRE

Salsburgh is in North Lanarkshire. The name is from Sally's town, Sally being a landowner who extended the former row of houses known as Craighead in the 18th century. In the 19th century coal mining and quarrying were important. In the 20th century public housing was built for the miners. The last of five mines closed in the 1960s. It is predominantly residential Two coach companies have depots in the town.

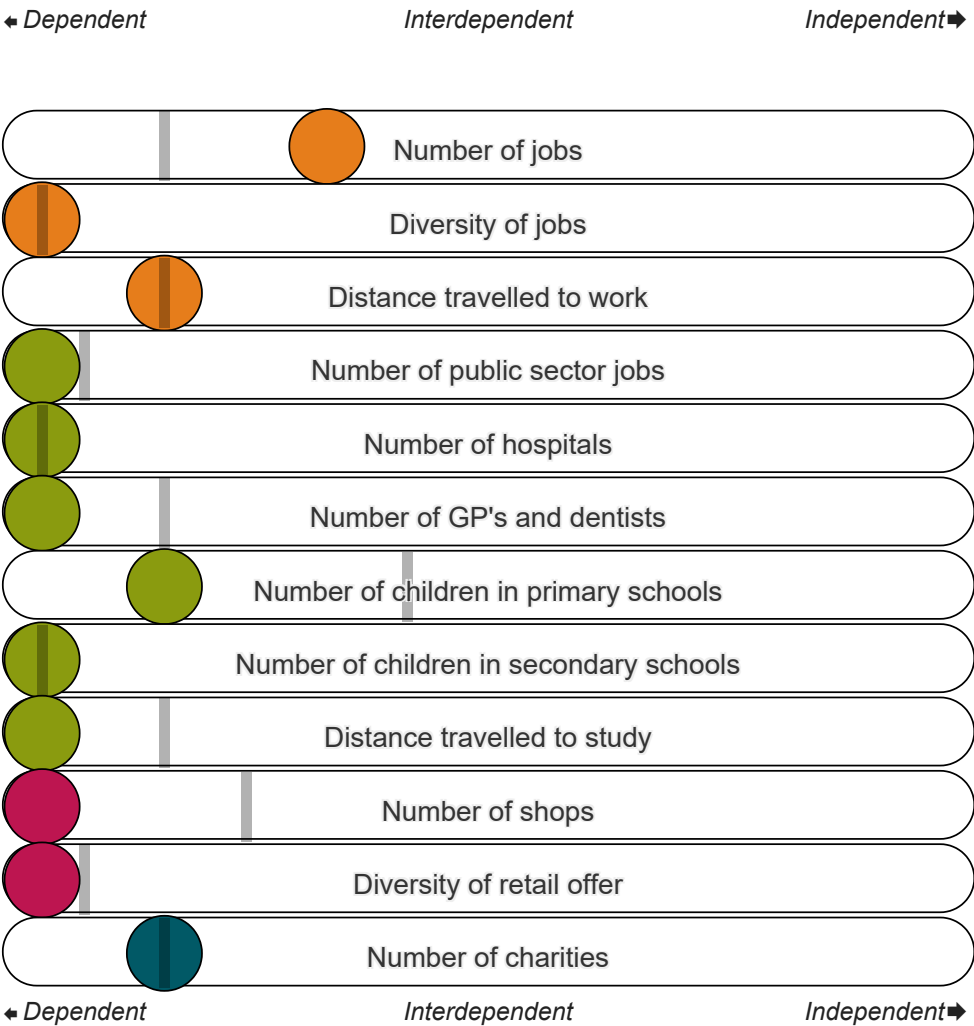
In this, and similar small towns, people experience more challenging circumstances with higher rates of unemployment, poorer health, lack of a car, lower levels of education and lower social grades than other groups. A higher proportion live in social rented housing. There is a higher proportion of single person households and lone parents.

Salsburgh is a dependent town.

Salsburgh is a **dependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Salsburgh is grouped with 4 other towns. It also has similarities in the diversity of jobs, the distance travelled to work, and the distance travelled to study.

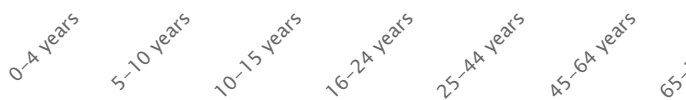

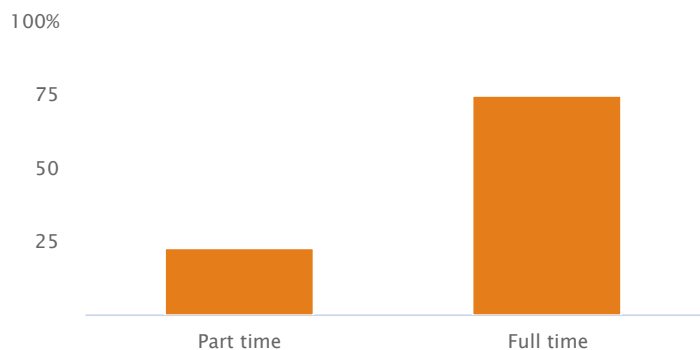

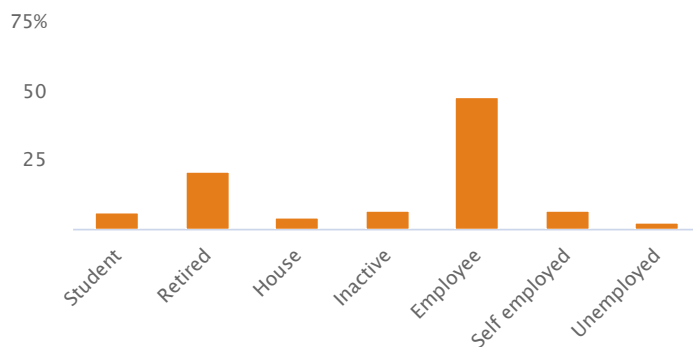
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



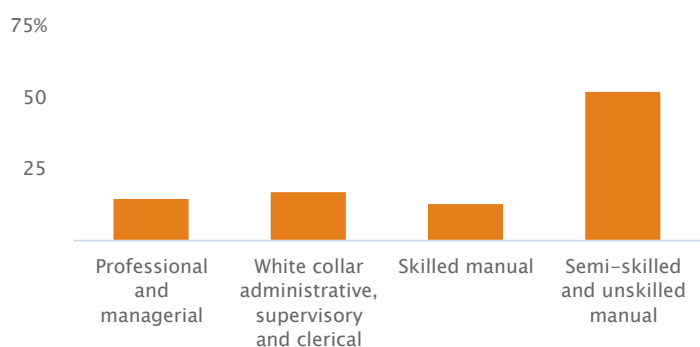
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

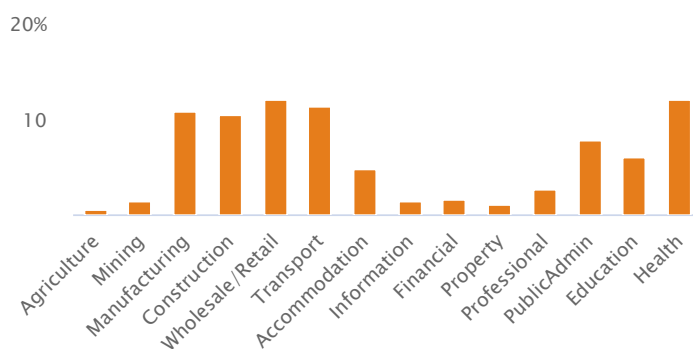


Social Grade

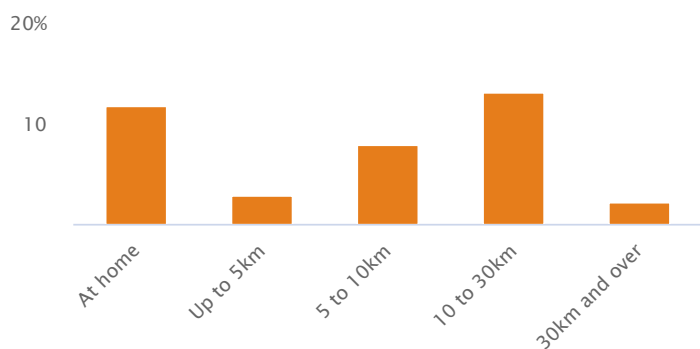
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

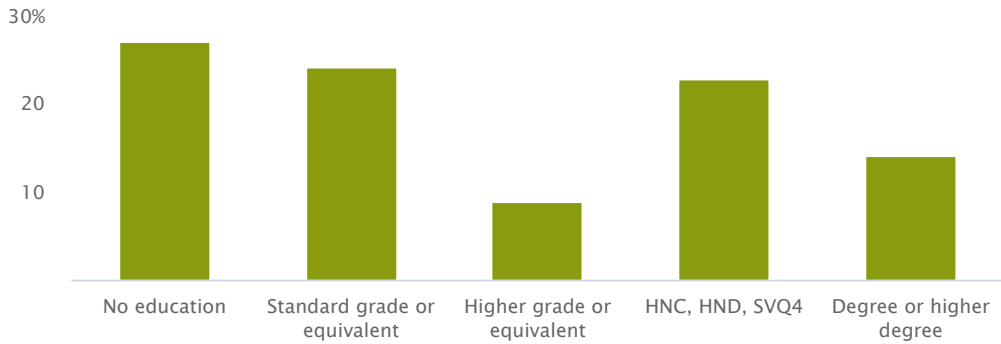


Distance travelled to work

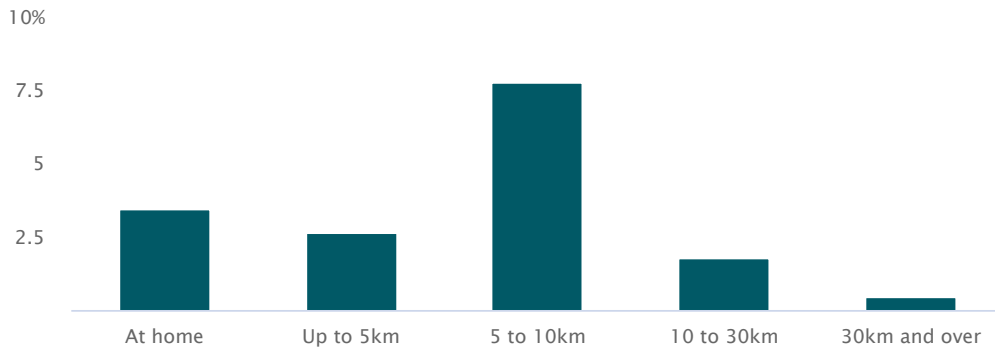
