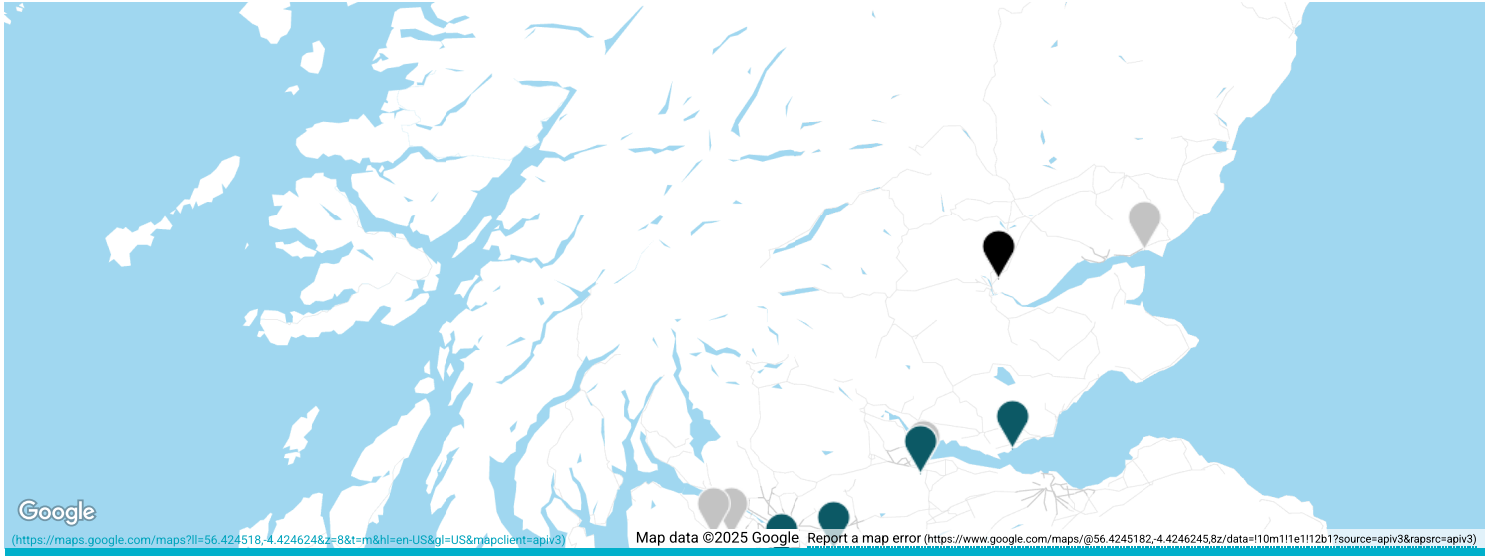




Scone

Scone is located in Perth and Kinross. The settlement was developed when in 1805 the residents of Old Scone were resettled from the grounds of Scone Palace. Perth airport is close by. The settlement acts as a suburb of Perth.

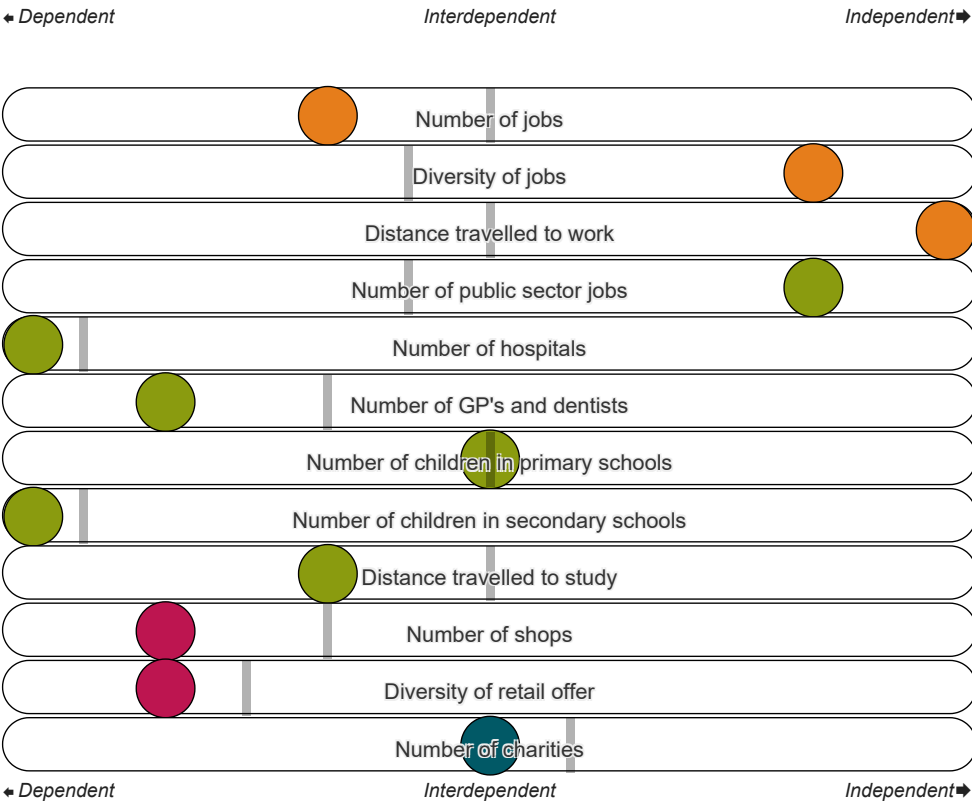
In medium towns such as this, the population is typically older. The group has higher social grade status than other groups, a higher proportion are owner occupiers and car ownership is also higher.

Scone is an **interdependent to dependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Scone is grouped with 10 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of charities, hospitals, children in primary schools, children in secondary schools, jobs, shops, and diversity of retail offer. It also has similarities in the distance travelled to study.

It differs in terms of the distance travelled to work. Scone differs most from its group in the number of public sector jobs; and the diversity of jobs.

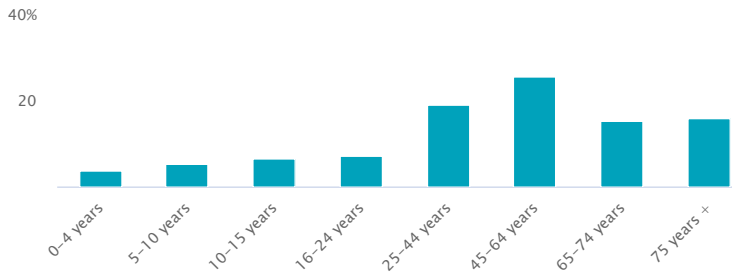
Population change 2011 to 2022

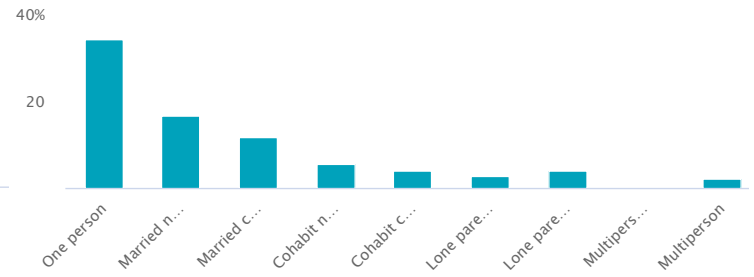

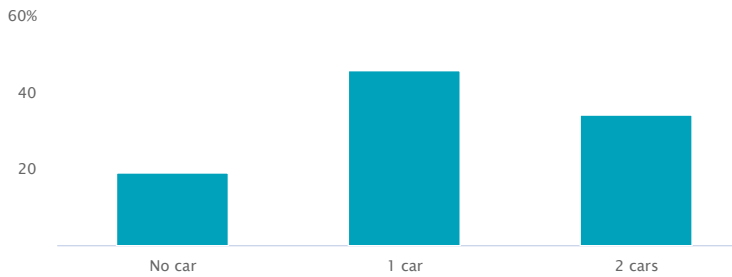

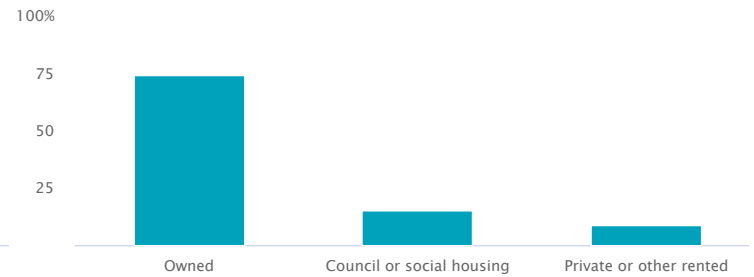
Household composition

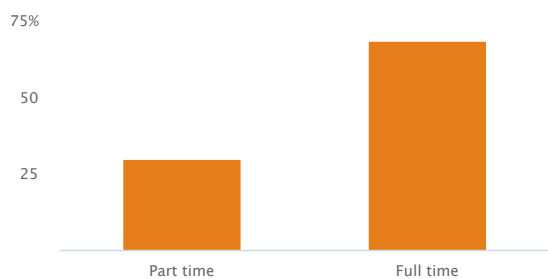

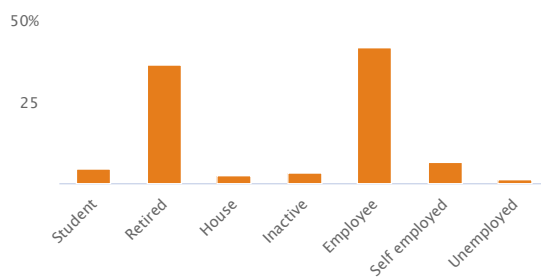
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



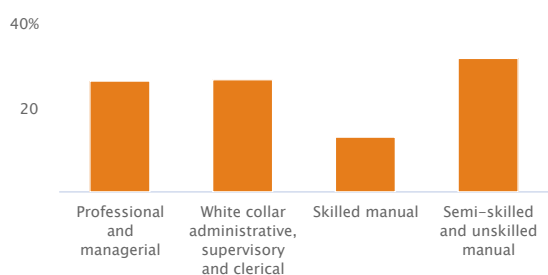
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

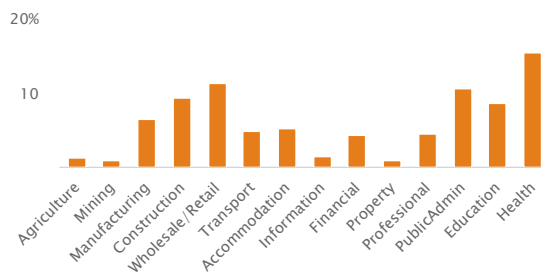

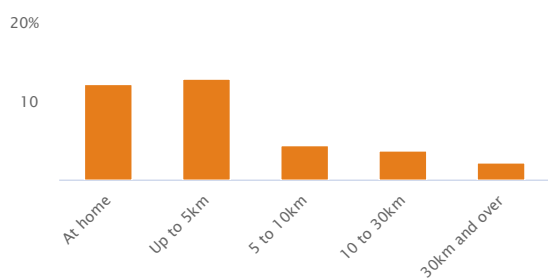
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

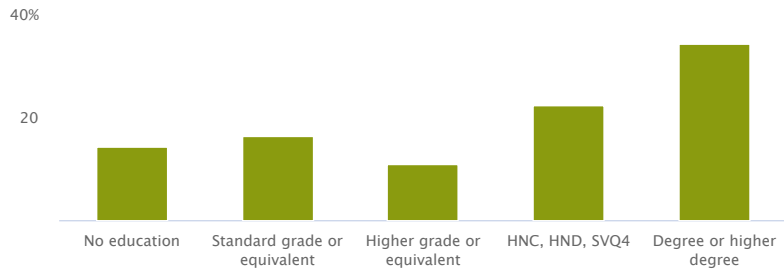


Distance travelled to work

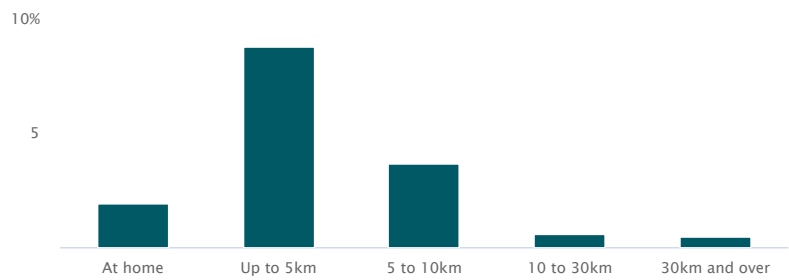
