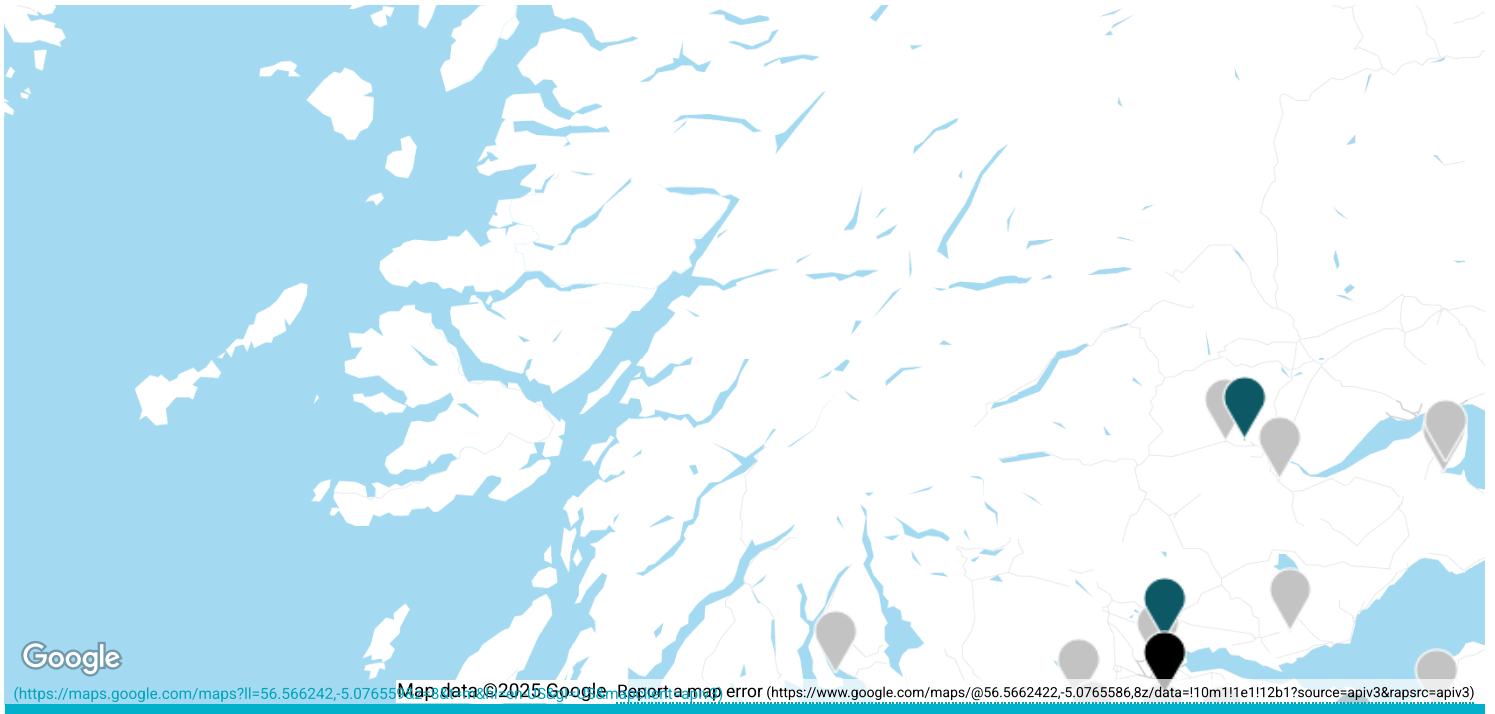




Shieldhill

Shieldhill is in Falkirk. The area was originally common grazings for summer pastures. The discovery of coal changed that in the second half of the 19th century and a settlement was built and expanded with the development of mining. Shieldhill Colliery was owned by the Carron Company and produced coke for iron smelters. It was later owned by NCB and public housing was built. New housing estates around the town have been built. The town is residential with few services and enterprises.

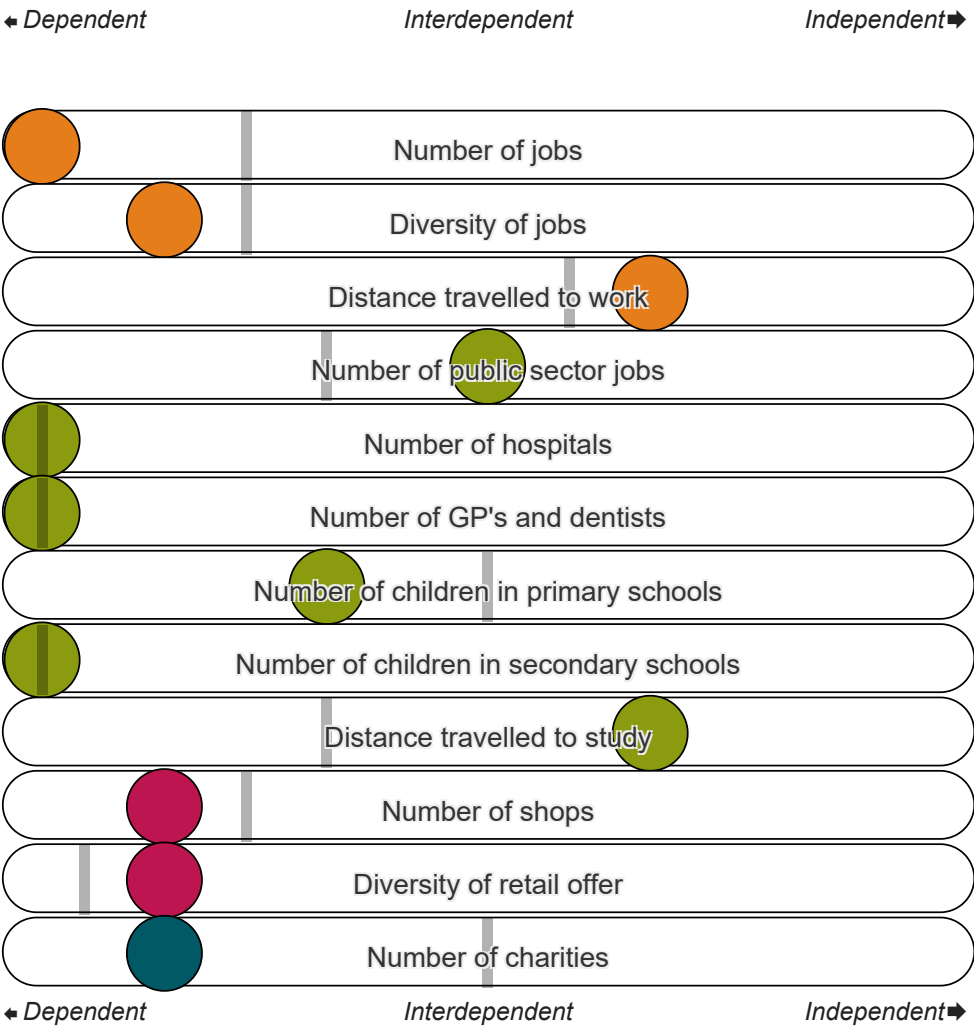
In this type of small town, the population comprises families with a higher proportion of adults in the 25–44 age grouping. Higher rates of full time employment are found.

Shieldhill is a dependent to interdependent town.

Shieldhill is a **dependent to interdependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Shieldhill is grouped with 25 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of hospitals, children in primary schools, children in secondary schools, shops, GP's and dentists, and diversity of retail offer. It also has similarities in the diversity of jobs, and the distance travelled to work.

It differs in terms of the number of charities. It also differs in the distance travelled to study. Shieldhill differs most from its group in the number of jobs.

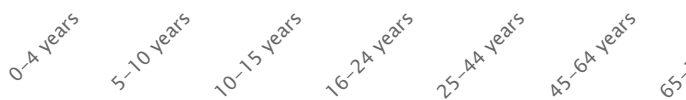

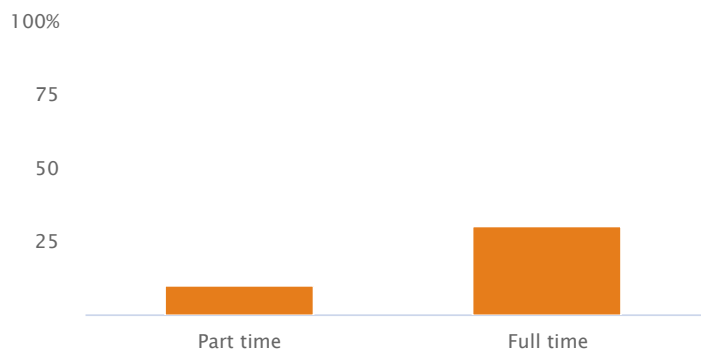

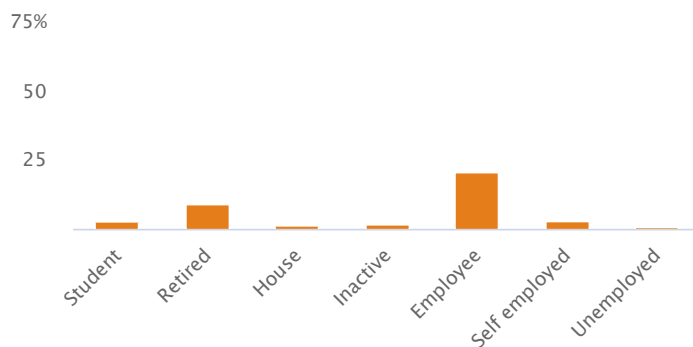
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



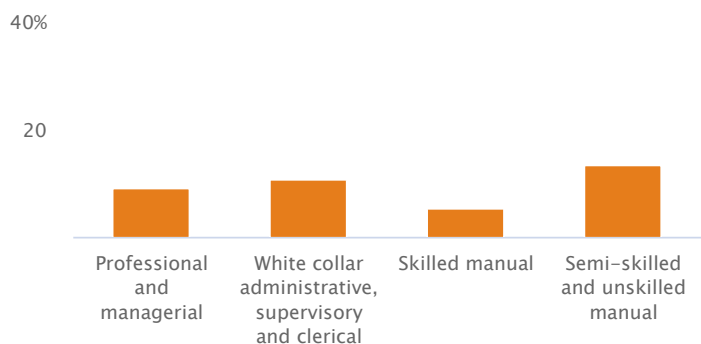
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

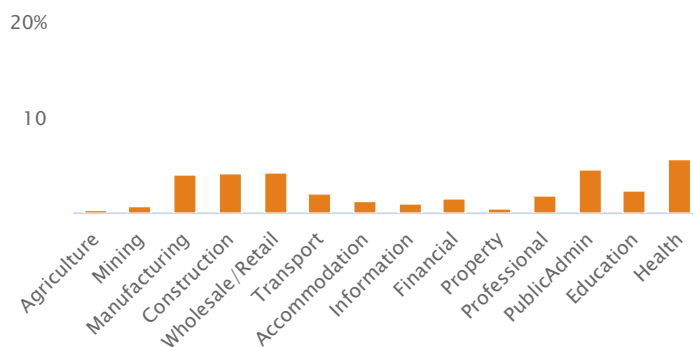

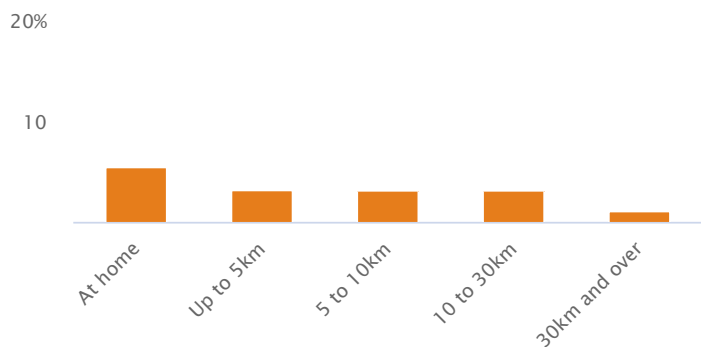
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

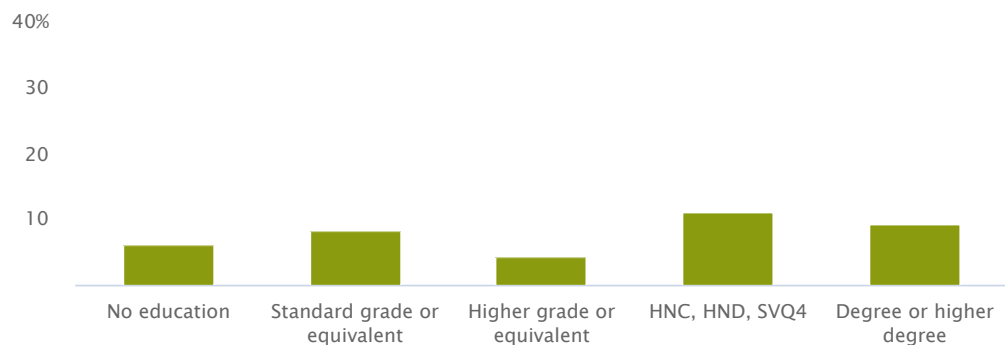


Distance travelled to work

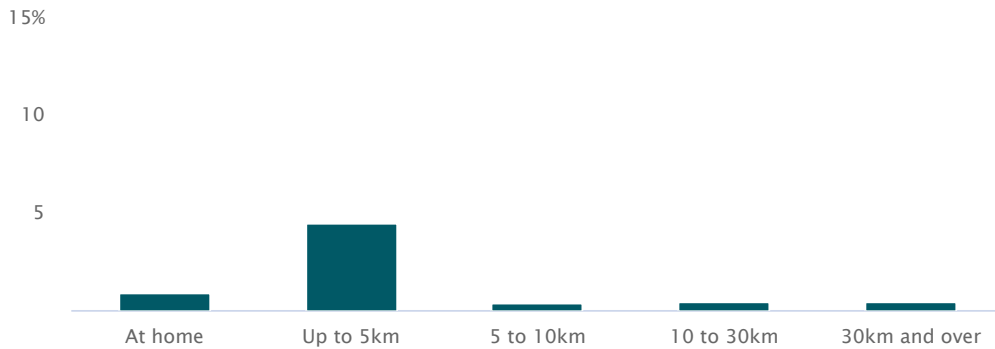
