Shotts is located in North Lanarkshire. In 1802 an iron works opened and housing was built for workers by the Shotts Ironworks Company. Later in the 19th century the discovery of coal brought further expansion of the town with Irish workers arriving. Gas lamp stands were a product that came to be associated with Shotts. Other industries including a bakery, textiles and an engine company were set up in the 20th century. The bakery and Lindon Engineering International are still in existence. A prison is also a major local employer.


In medium towns like this one, people experience more challenging circumstances with higher rates of unemployment, poorer health, lack of a car, lower levels of education and lower social grades than other groups. A higher proportion live in social rented housing. There is a higher proportion of single person households and lone parents.

Its most similar towns are Ballingry, Lochore and Crosshill, Faifley, Fauldhouse, and Hallglen.






Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)




Social Grade

(% households aged 16-64)




Distance travelled to work




Occupation

(% aged 16-74)




