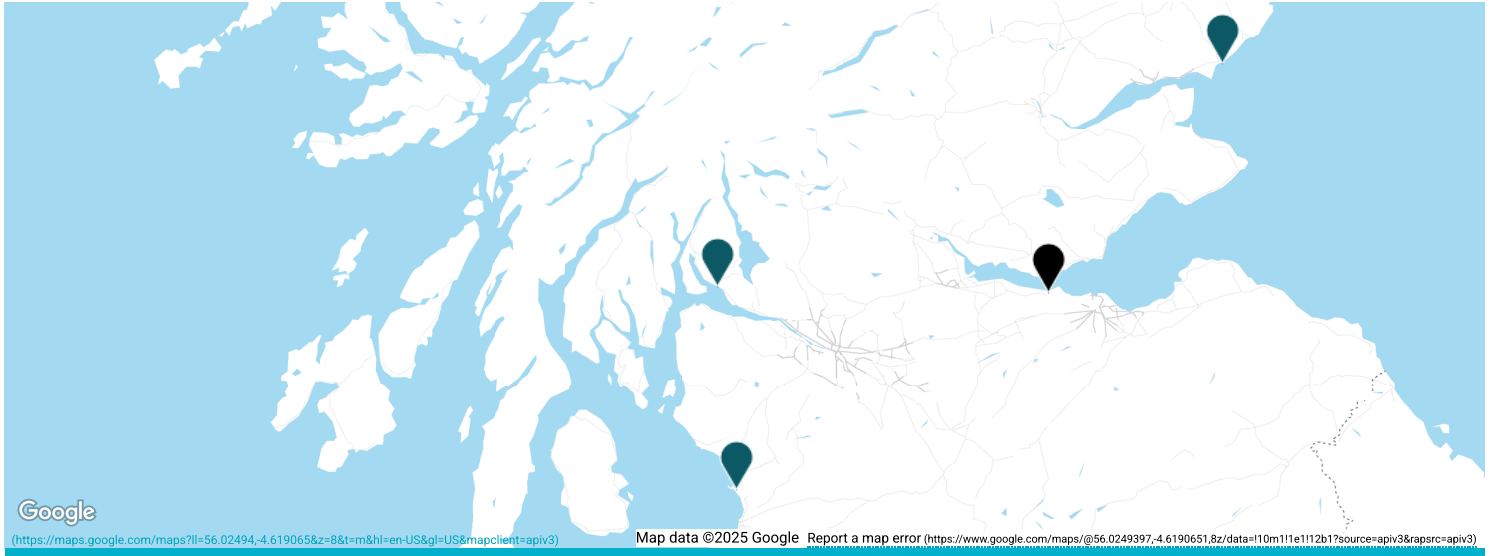




South Queensferry

South Queensferry is in Edinburgh City. It is an historic Forth crossing point to Fife and the southern landing point of the road and rail bridges. Today it has a marina and is a popular place for people from Edinburgh to visit. It is a commuter town.

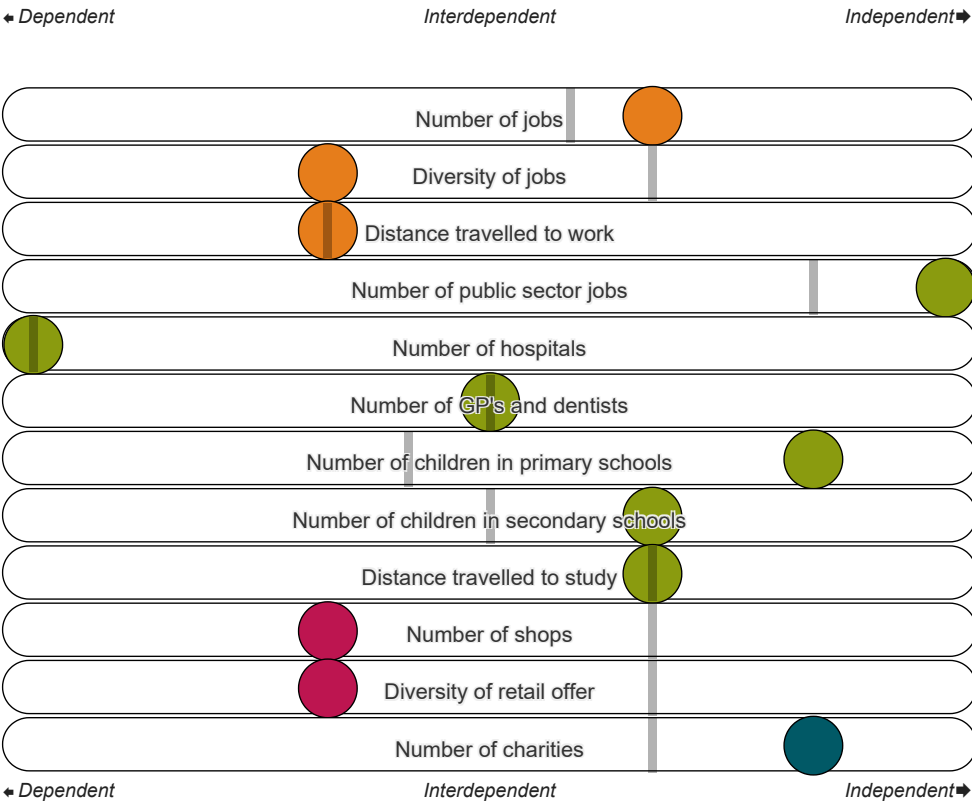
In large towns such as this one, the population typically is older. The group has higher social grade status than other groups, a higher proportion are owner occupiers and car ownership is also higher.

South Queensferry is an interdependent town.

Inter-relationships



South Queensferry is an **interdependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, South Queensferry is grouped with 3 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of charities, hospitals, jobs, and GP's and dentists. It also has similarities in the distance travelled to work, and the distance travelled to study.

It differs in terms of the number of children in primary schools. South Queensferry differs most from its group in the number of shops, and diversity of retail offer; and the diversity of jobs.

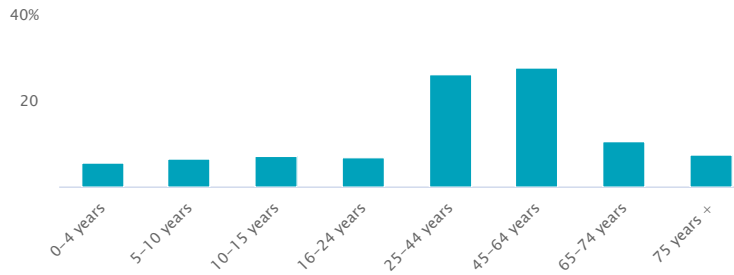

Population change 2011 to 2022**13%**

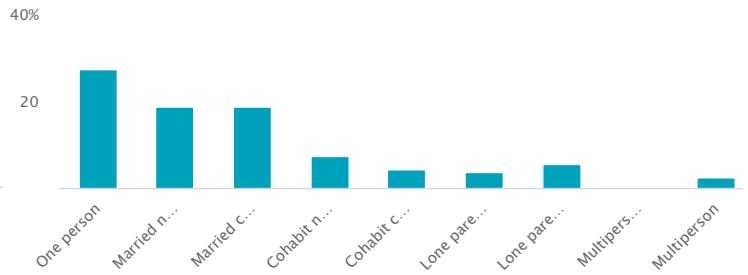

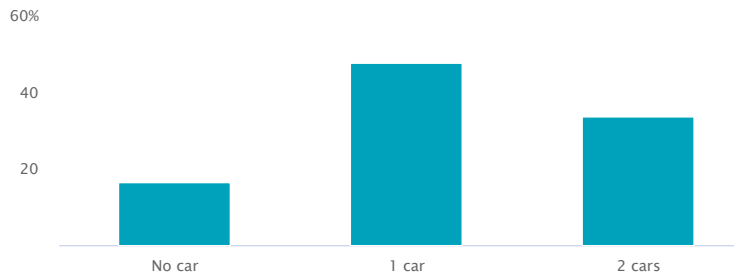

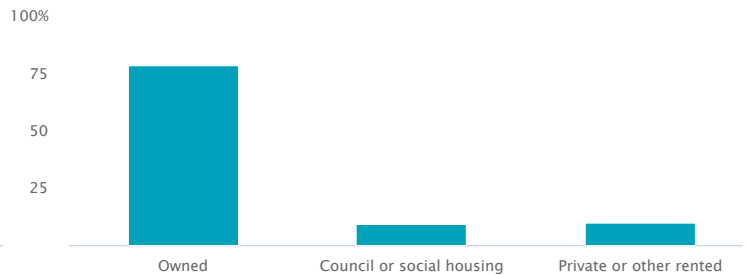
Household composition

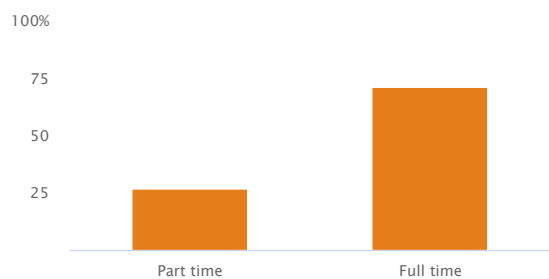

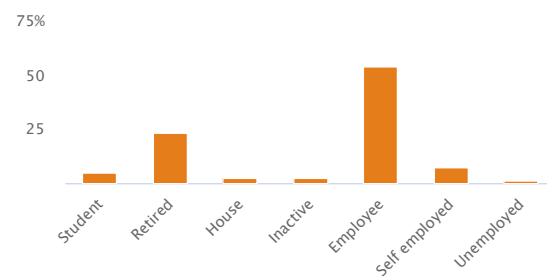
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



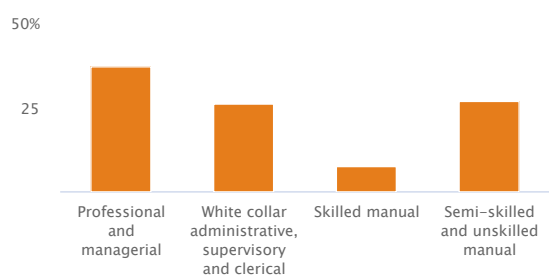
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

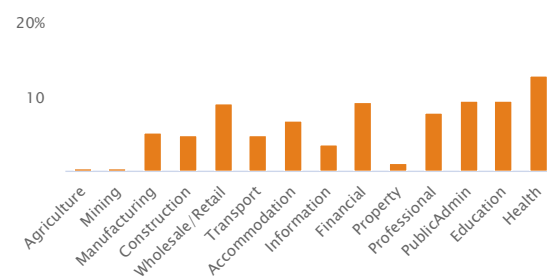

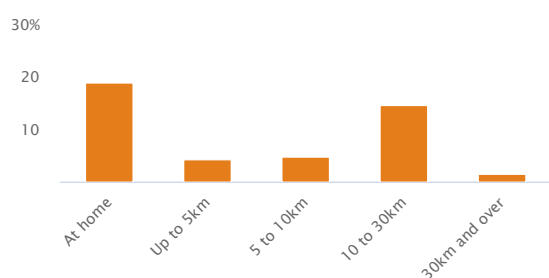
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

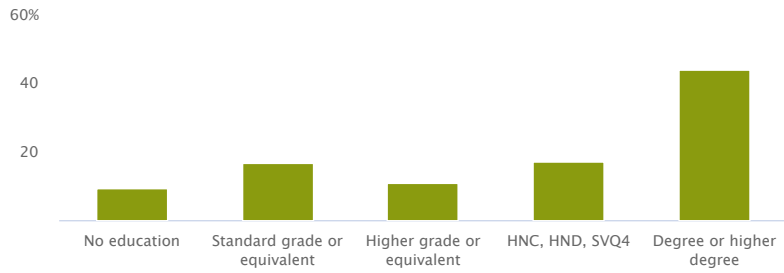


Distance travelled to work

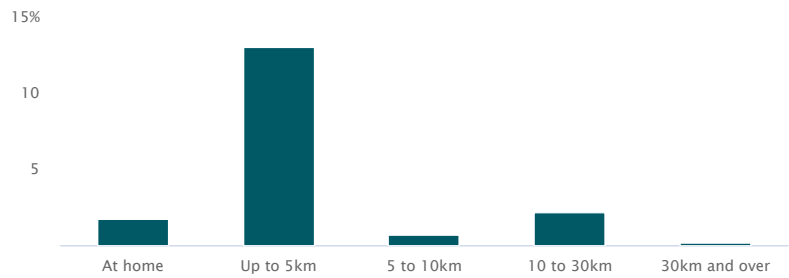
