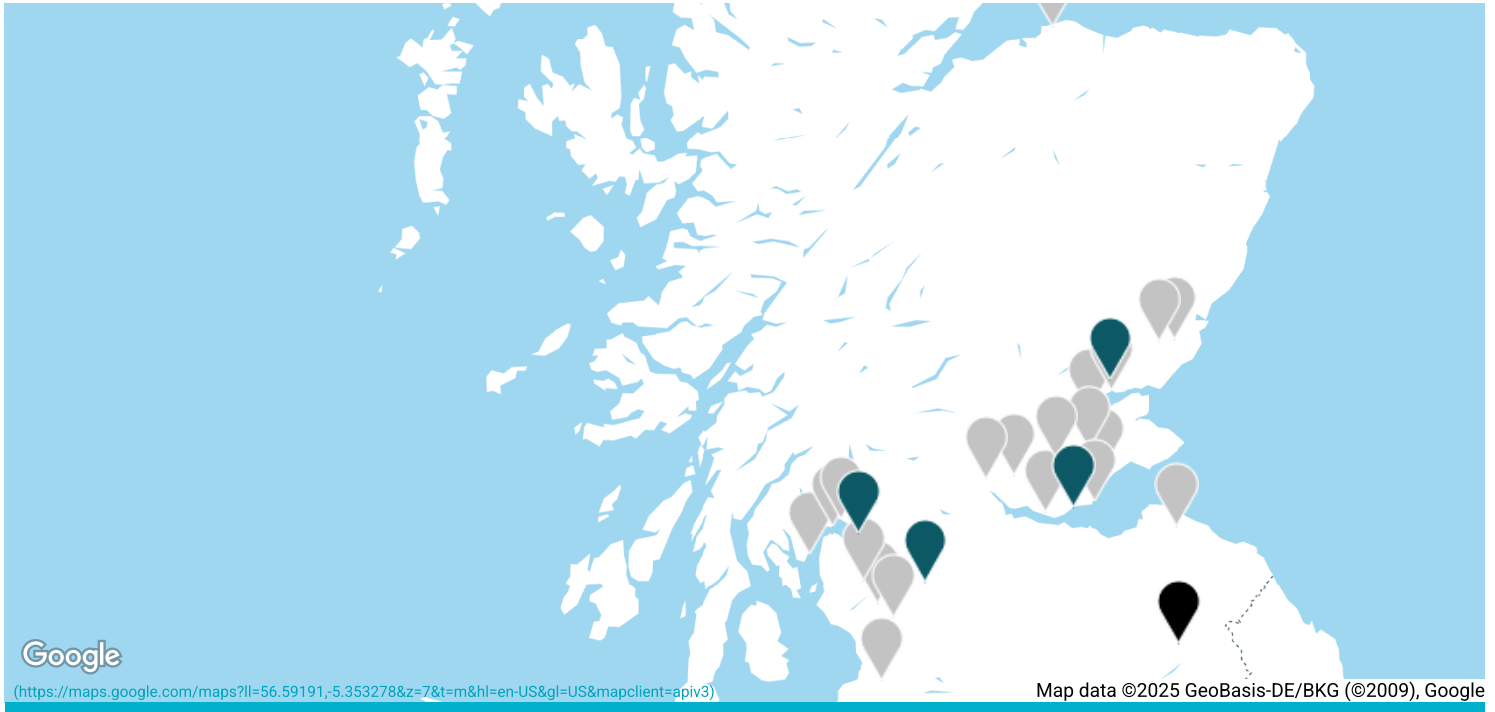




St Boswells

St Boswells is located in Scottish Borders. It is named after St Boswell and was an ecclesiastical centre expanding as market town with fairs and markets. The administrative headquarters for Borders Council in Newton St Boswells is a major local employer.

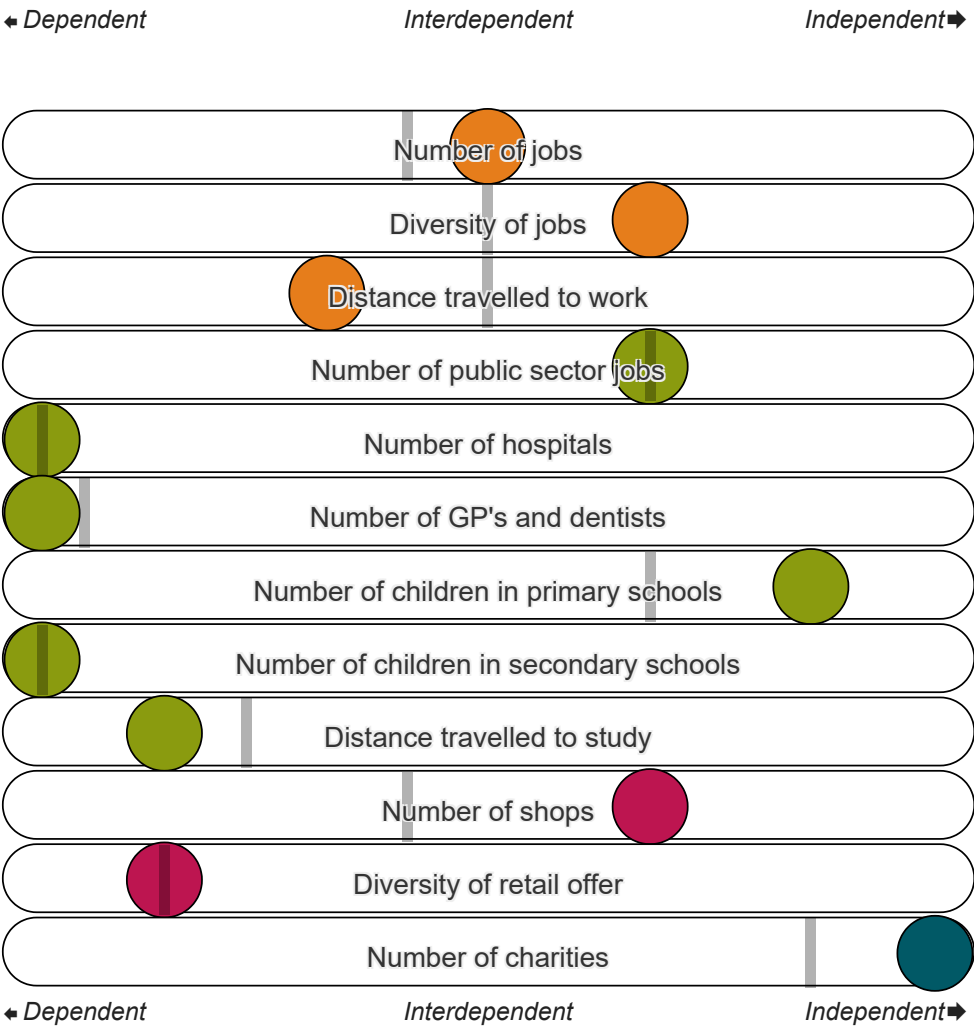
In this and similar small towns, the population is commonly older. The group has higher social grade status than other groups, a higher proportion are owner occupiers and car ownership is also higher.

St Boswells is an **interdependent to dependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, St Boswells is grouped with 24 other towns. It also has similarities in the distance travelled to work, and the distance travelled to study.

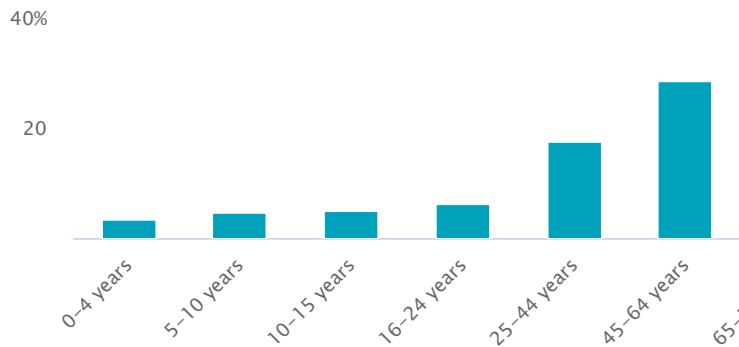

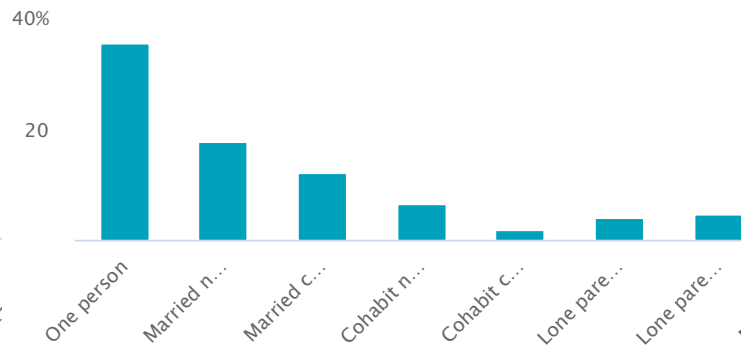

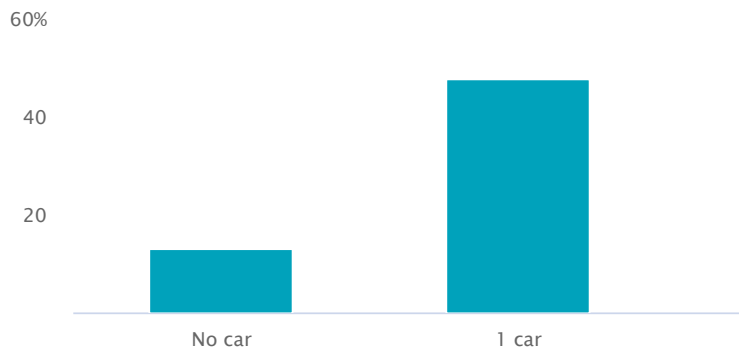

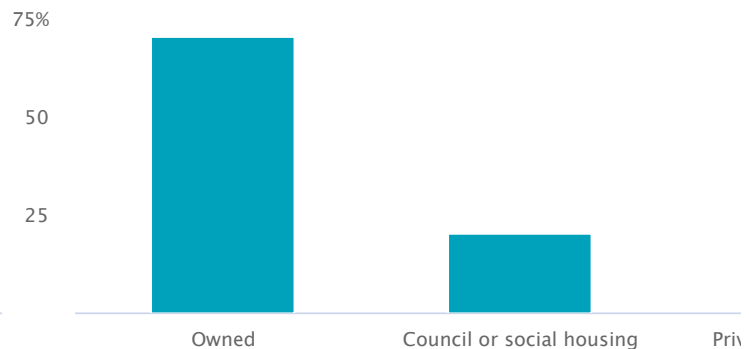
Household composition

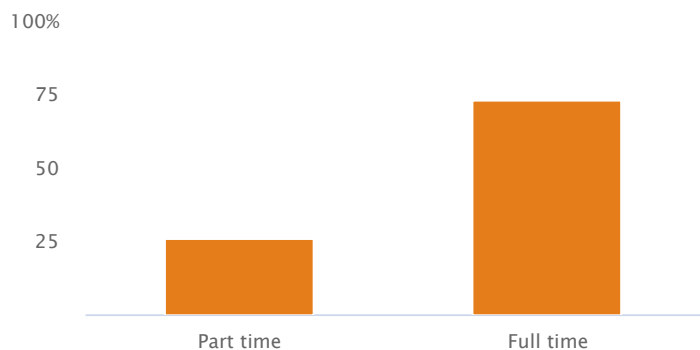

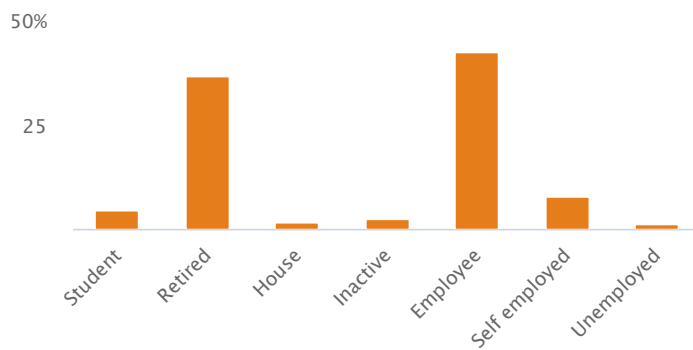
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



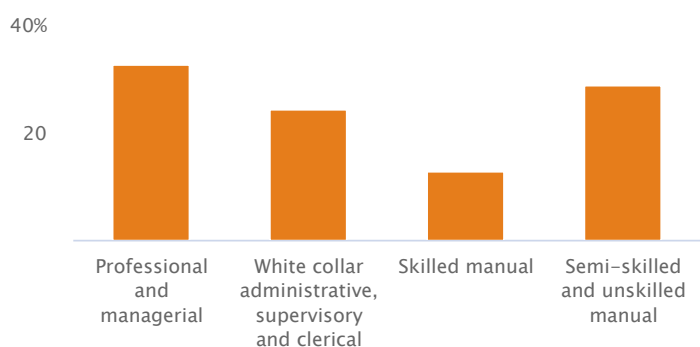
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

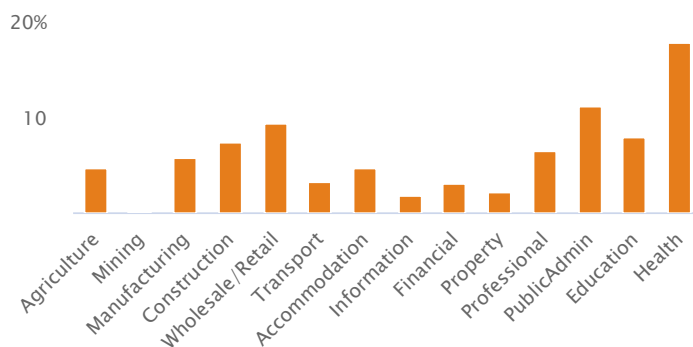


Social Grade

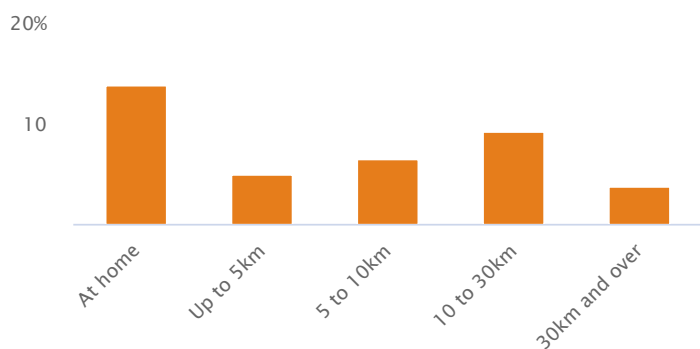
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

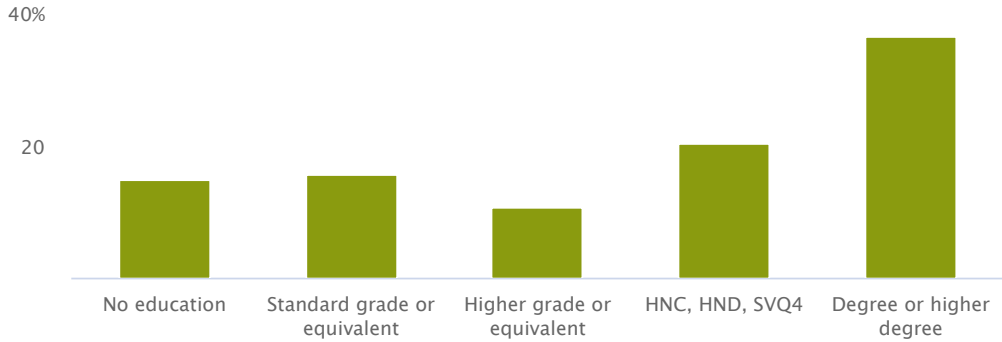


Distance travelled to work

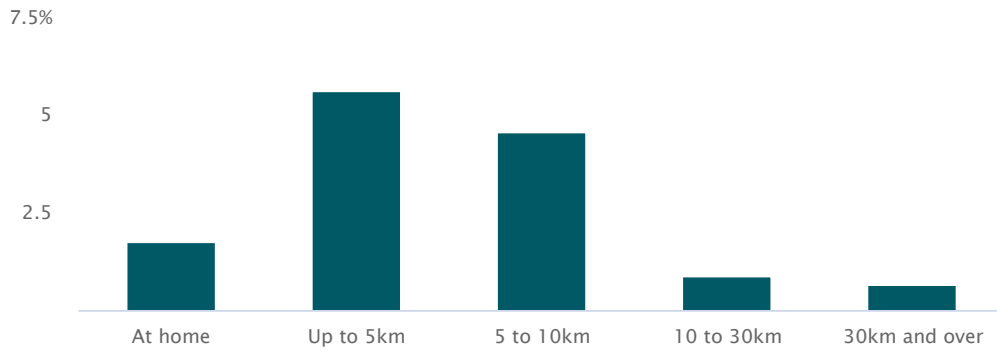
