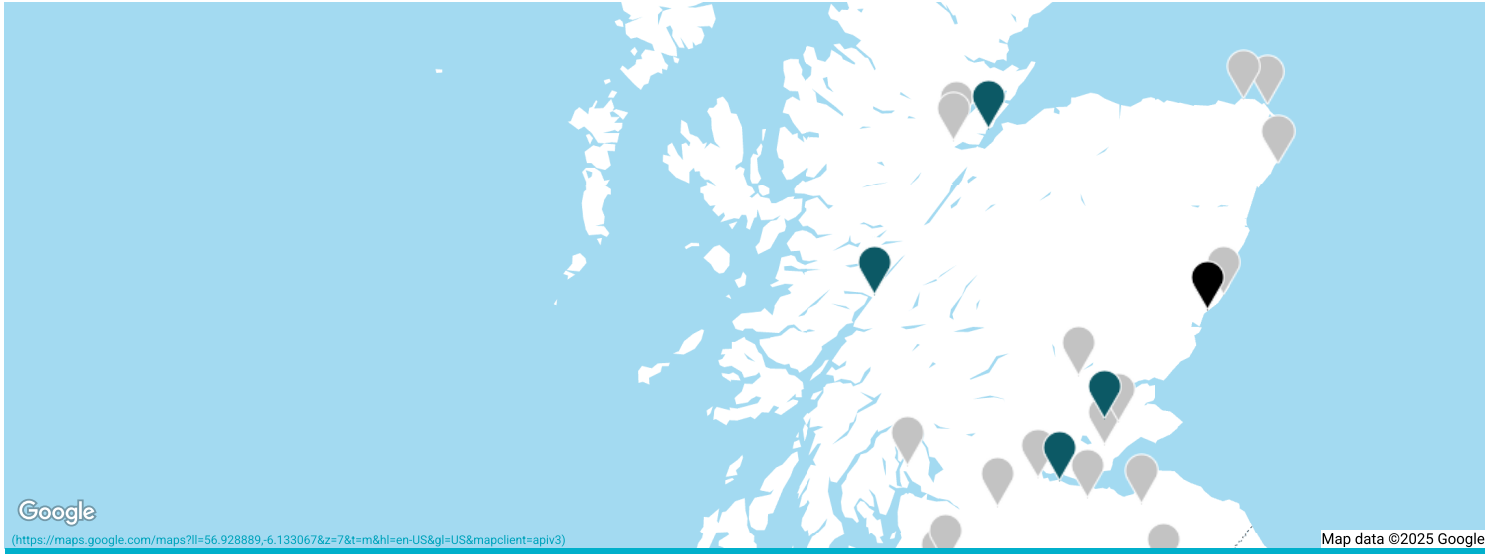




St Cyrus

St Cyrus in Aberdeenshire was an ecclesiastical town established in the 1700s. It was known as Ecclesgreig. Salmon fishing was the main economy of the town in times past and there is still traditional net salmon fishing today. Some new housing has been built on the north west of the town for commuters. Local services are limited.

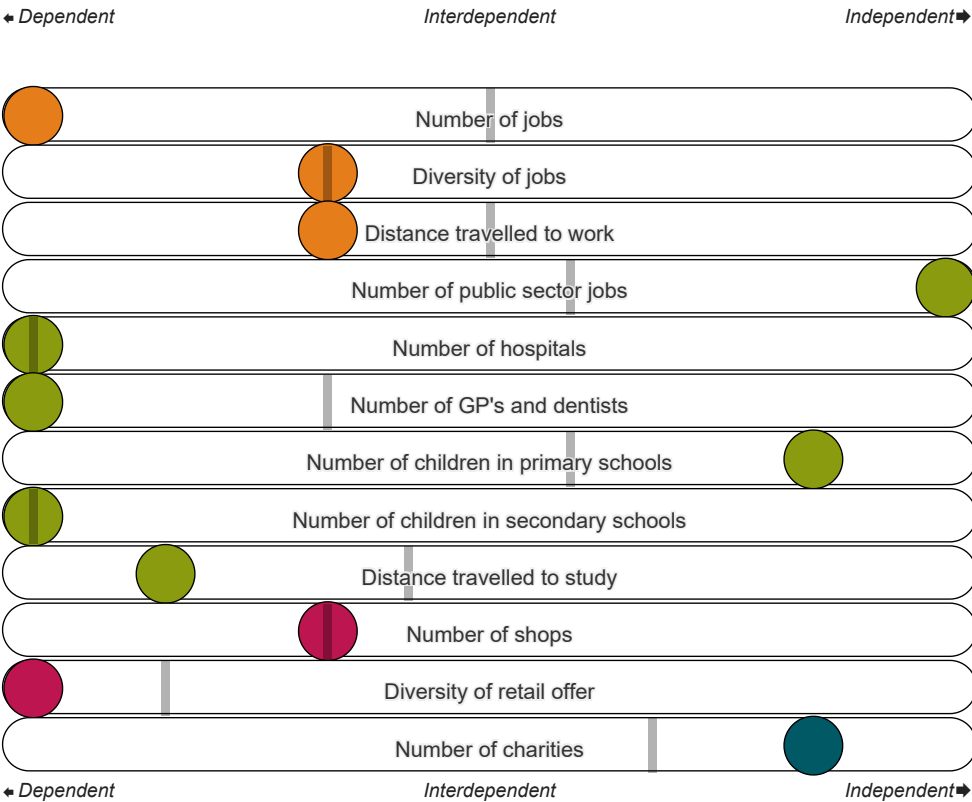
In this type of small town, the population comprises families with a higher proportion of adults in the 25–44 age grouping. Higher rates of full time employment are found.

St Cyrus is an interdependent to dependent town.

Inter-relationships



St Cyrus is an **interdependent to dependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, St Cyrus is grouped with 22 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of charities, hospitals, children in secondary schools, shops, and diversity of retail offer. It also has similarities in the diversity of jobs, and the distance travelled to work.

It differs in terms of the number of public sector jobs. St Cyrus differs most from its group in the number of jobs, and GP's and dentists.

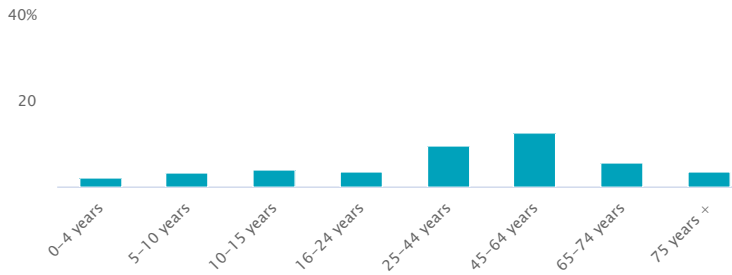

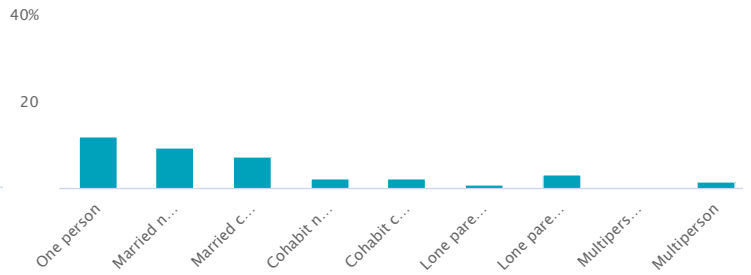

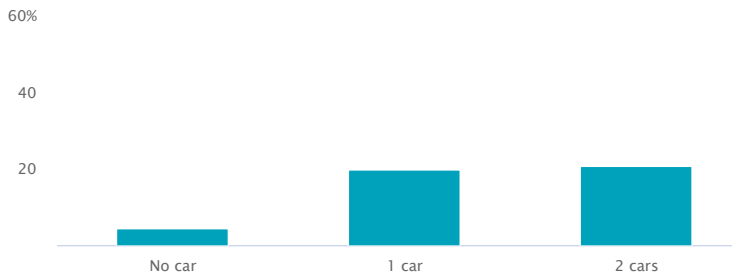

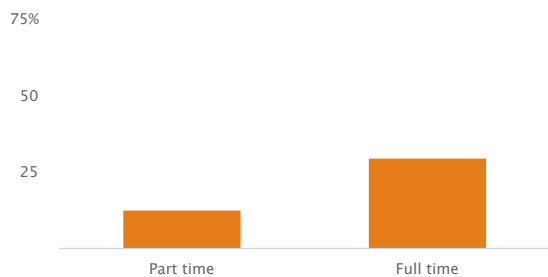

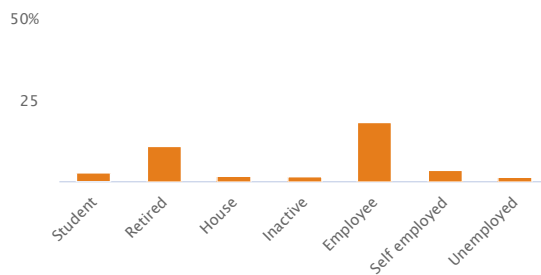
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



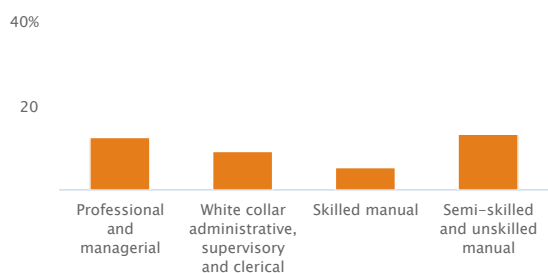
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

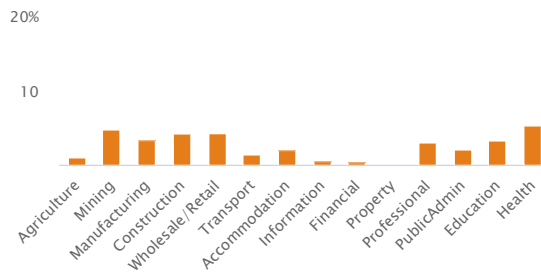


Social Grade

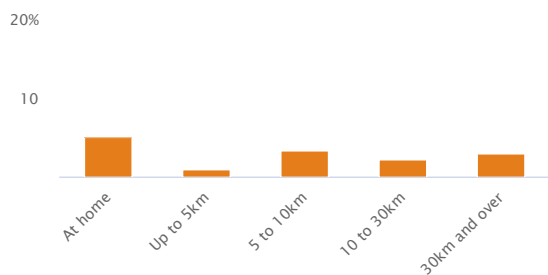
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

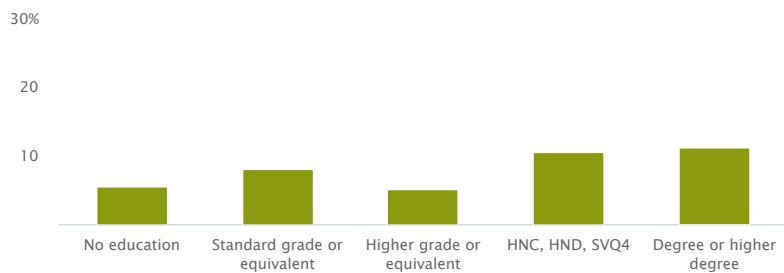


Distance travelled to work

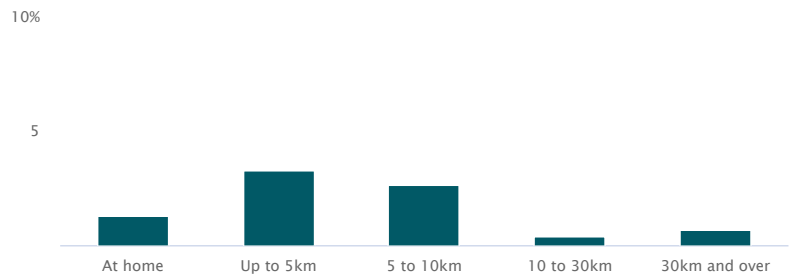
