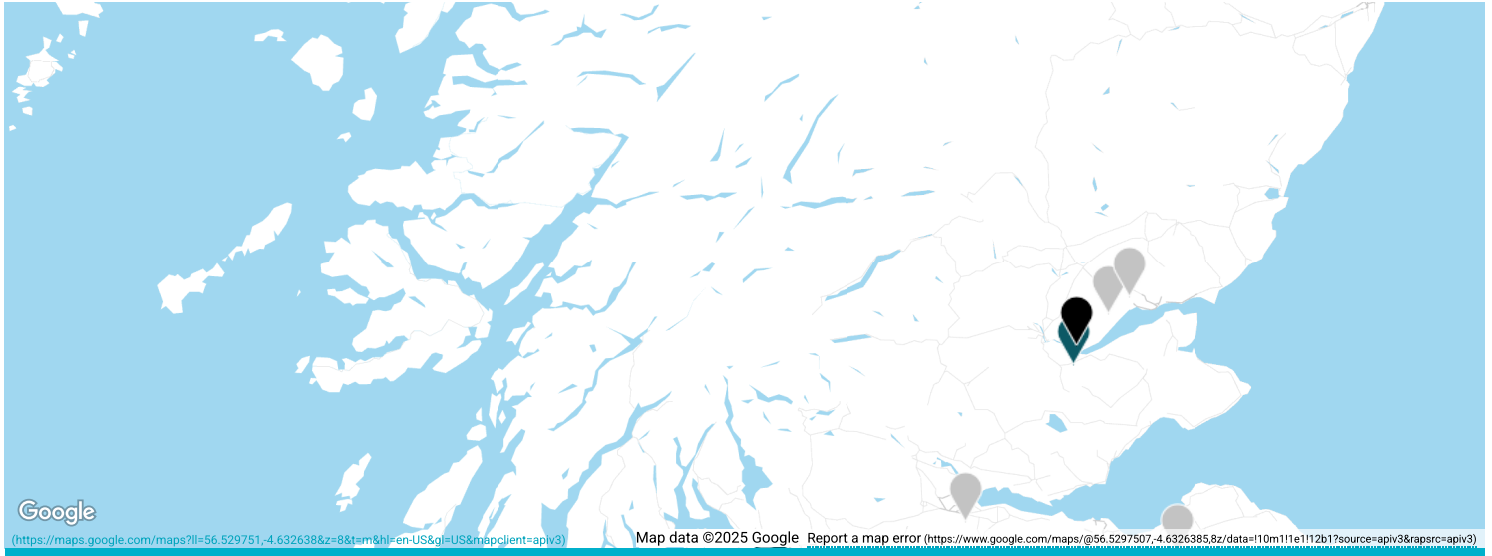




St Madoes and Glencarse

St Madoes and Glencarse are in Perth and Kinross. This was built as a planned estate village. It has developed as a commuter village. There are some local enterprises including construction businesses.

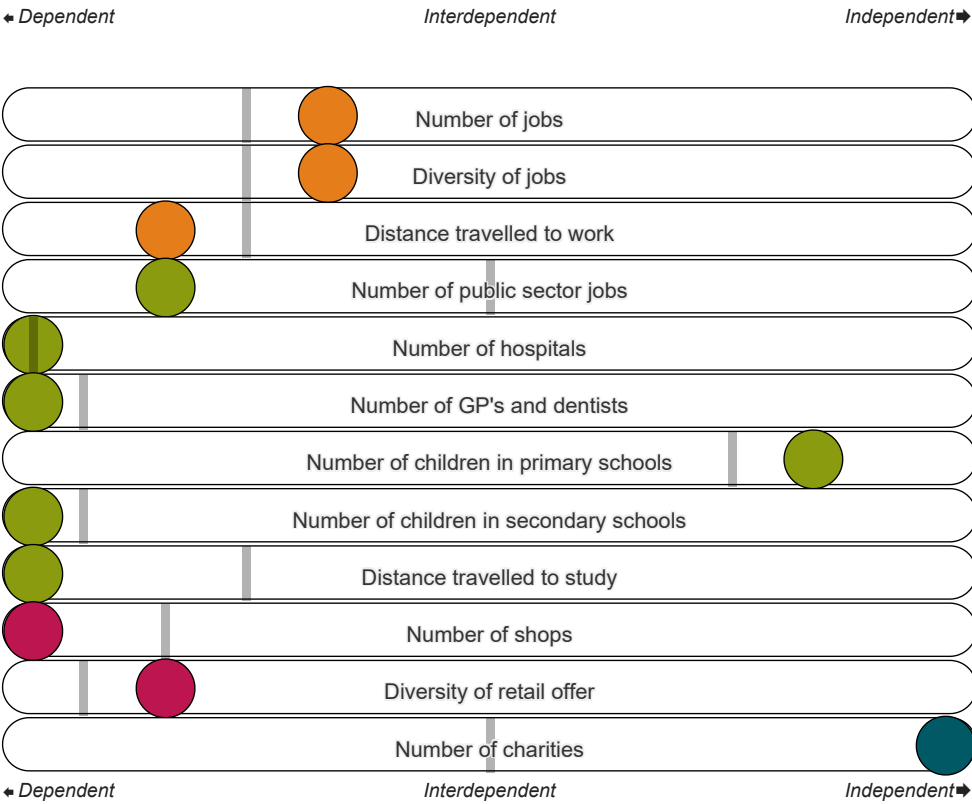
In this small town, this population is characterised by older working age families with teenagers. They are more highly educated and have higher social grades than some other groups. 2 car ownership is higher than in other groups.

St Madoes and Glencarse is a **dependent to interdependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, St Madoes and Glencarse is grouped with 14 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of hospitals, children in primary schools, children in secondary schools, jobs, shops, GP's and dentists, and diversity of retail offer. It also has similarities in the diversity of jobs, and the distance travelled to work.

It differs in terms of the number of charities, and public sector jobs. St Madoes and Glencarse differs most from its group in the distance travelled to study.

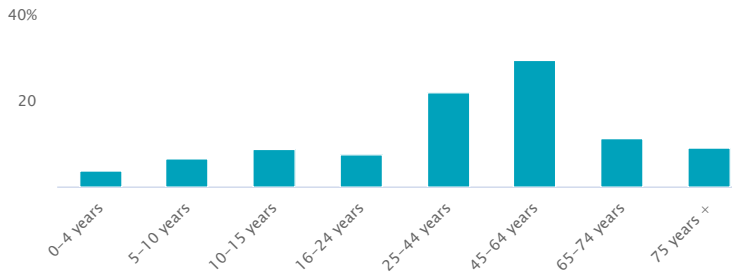

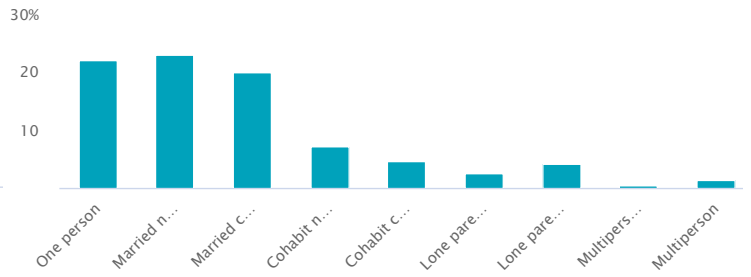

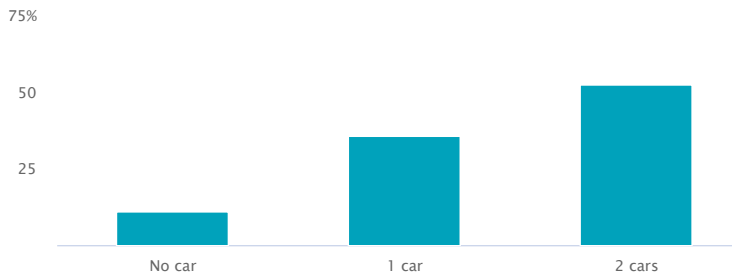

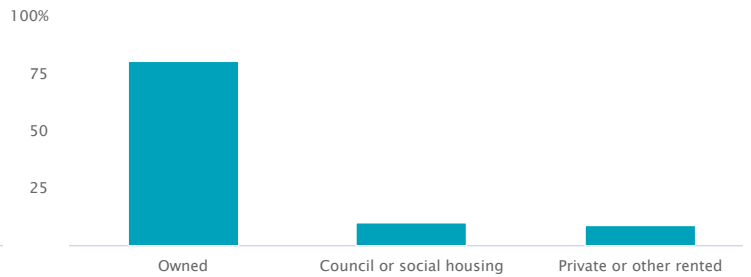

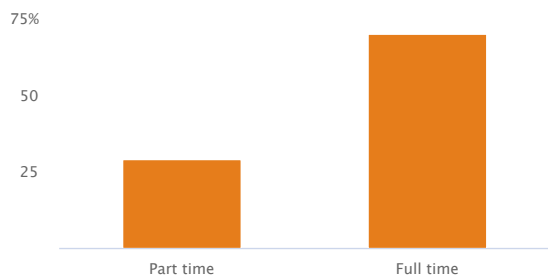

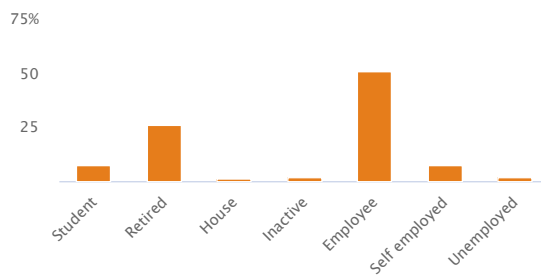
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



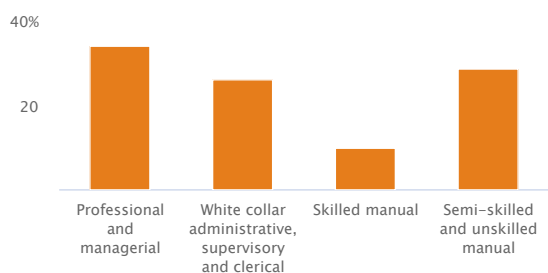
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

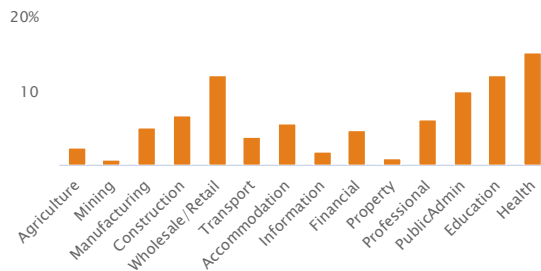


Social Grade

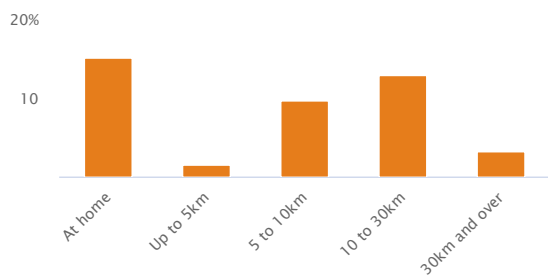
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

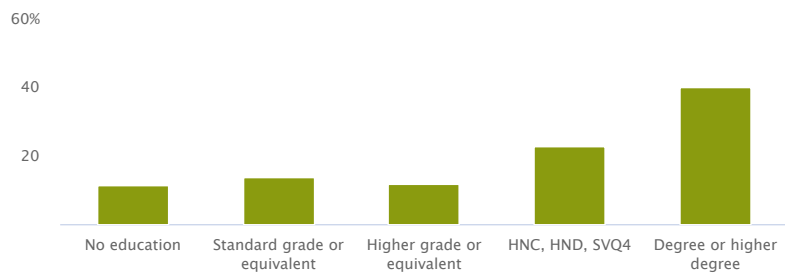


Distance travelled to work

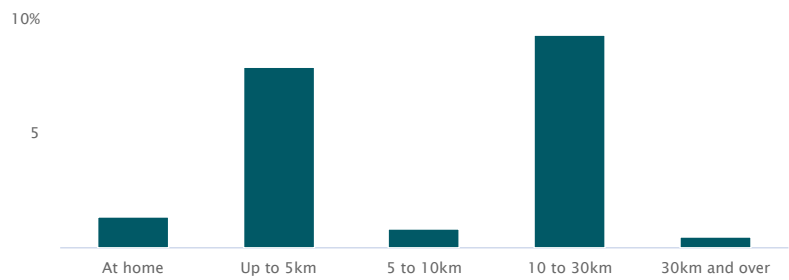
