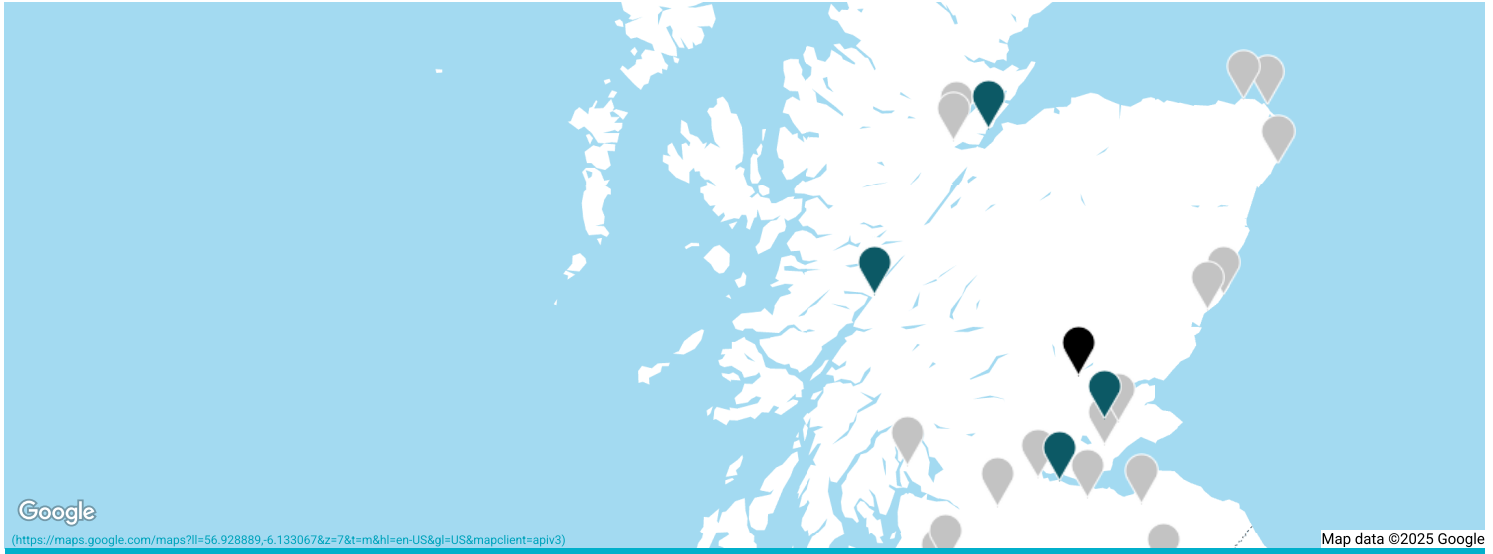




Stanley

Stanley is in Perth and Kinross. It was n 18th century planned village by the Atholl Estate. Cotton mills were established and the village housed workers. They old buildings are now a visitor attraction. Today it serves as a commuter town for Perth.

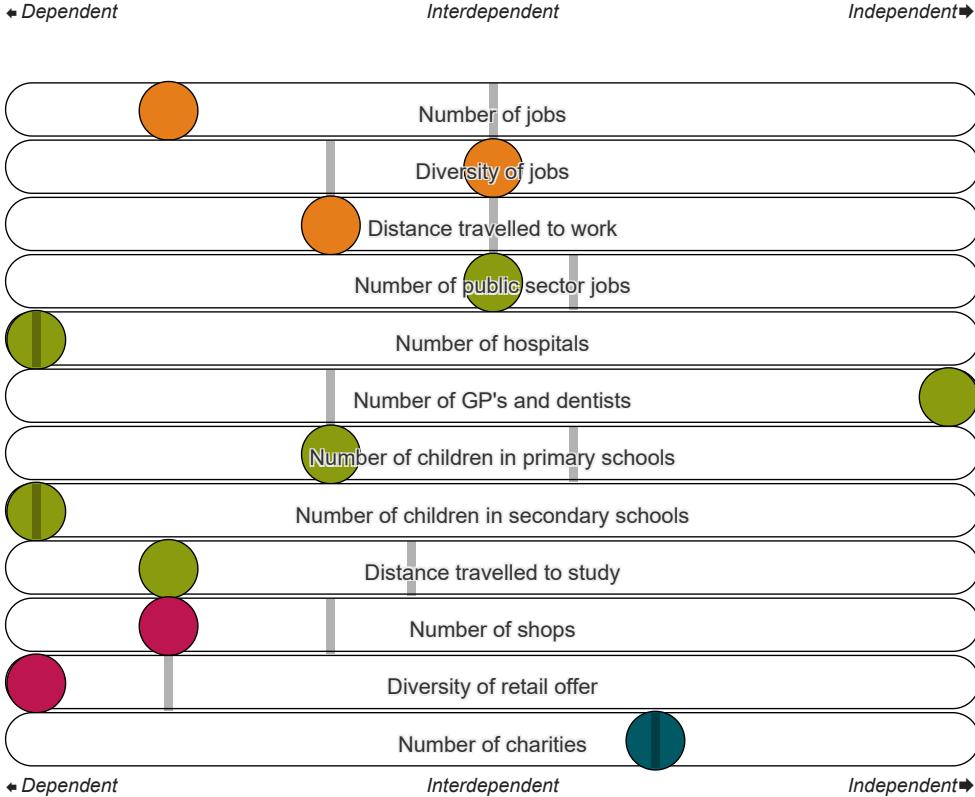
In this type of small town, the population comprises families with a higher proportion of adults in the 25–44 age grouping. Higher rates of full time employment are found.

Stanley is an **interdependent to dependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Stanley is grouped with 22 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of charities, hospitals, children in secondary schools, public sector jobs, and diversity of retail offer. It also has similarities in the diversity of jobs, and the distance travelled to work.

It differs in terms of the number of children in primary schools, and GP's and dentists. Stanley differs most from its group in the number of jobs.

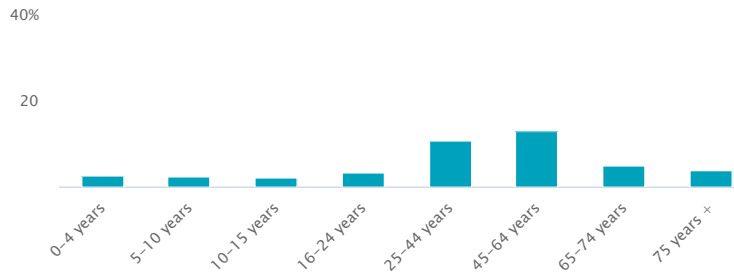

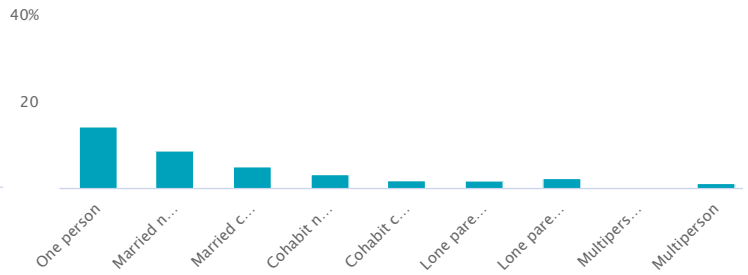

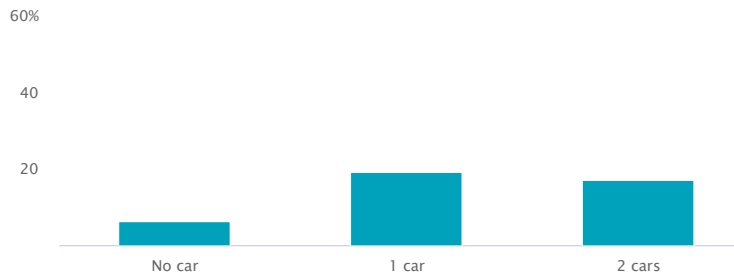
Age

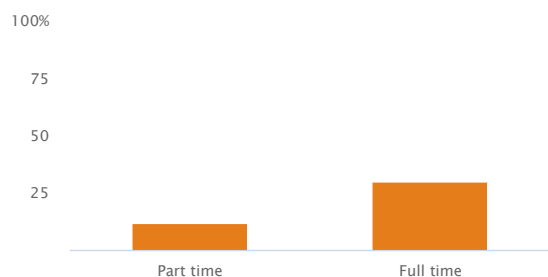

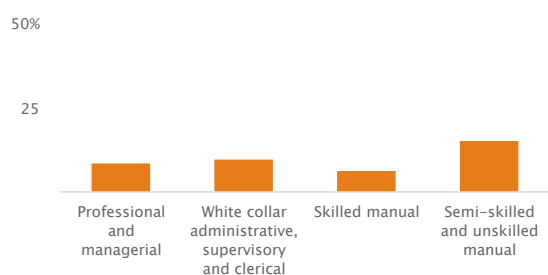
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



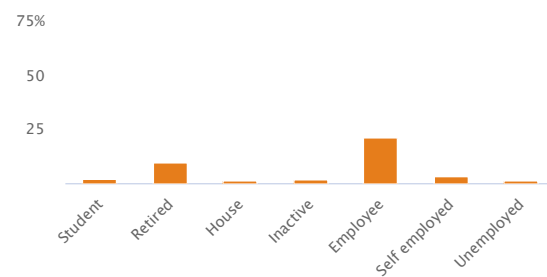
Social Grade

(% households aged 16-64)

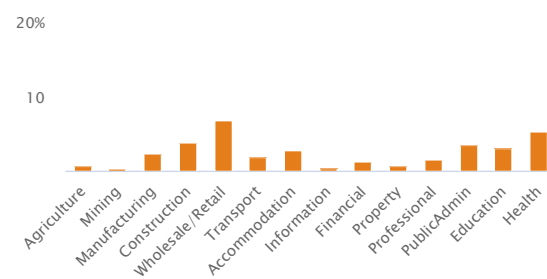

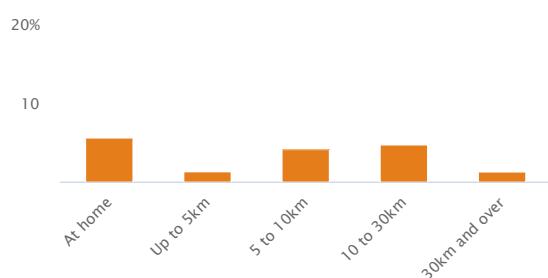

Sector Diversity

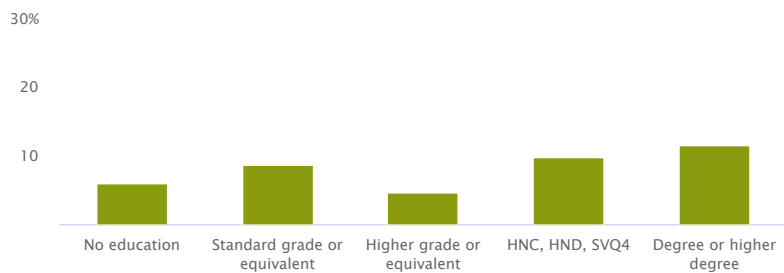


Distance travelled to work

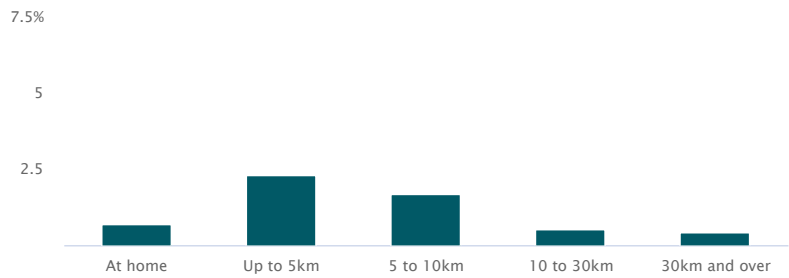
