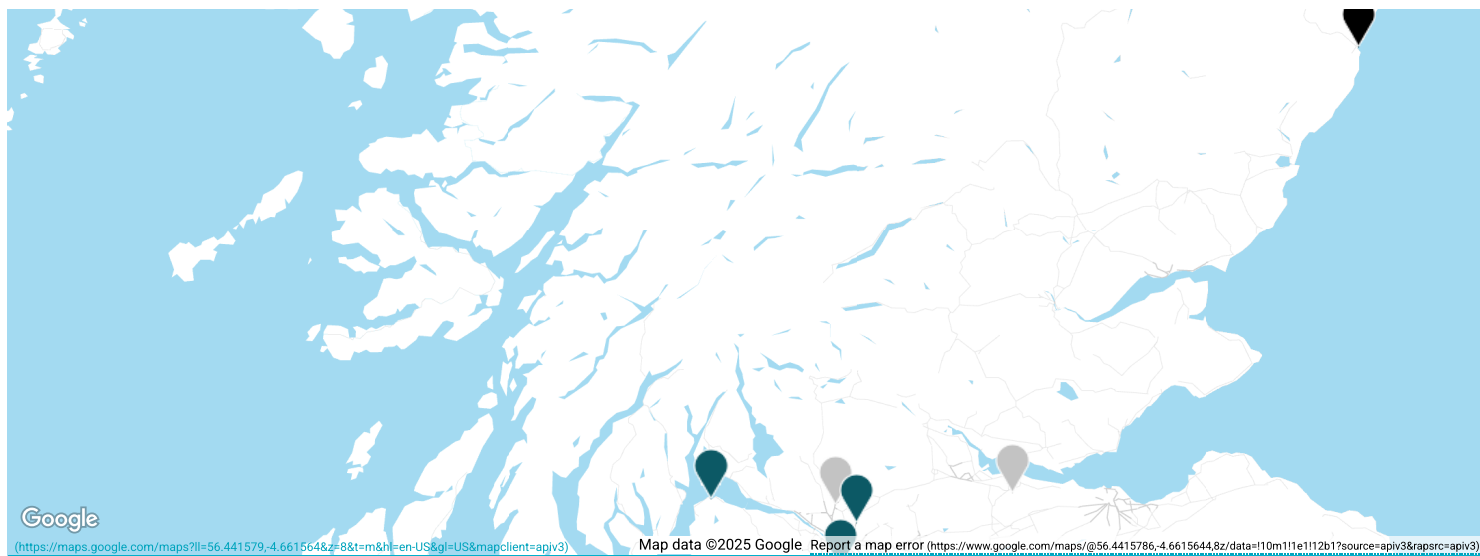




Stonehaven

Stonehaven is located in Aberdeenshire. It has a long history of settlement and was important as it lay at the end of the old route to inland Deeside. In the 19th century the harbour was extended and it was an important herring port. It developed as a seaside resort. It is a significant service centre and has a range of marine service industries (including Gemini) and other light industries (including Halcon).

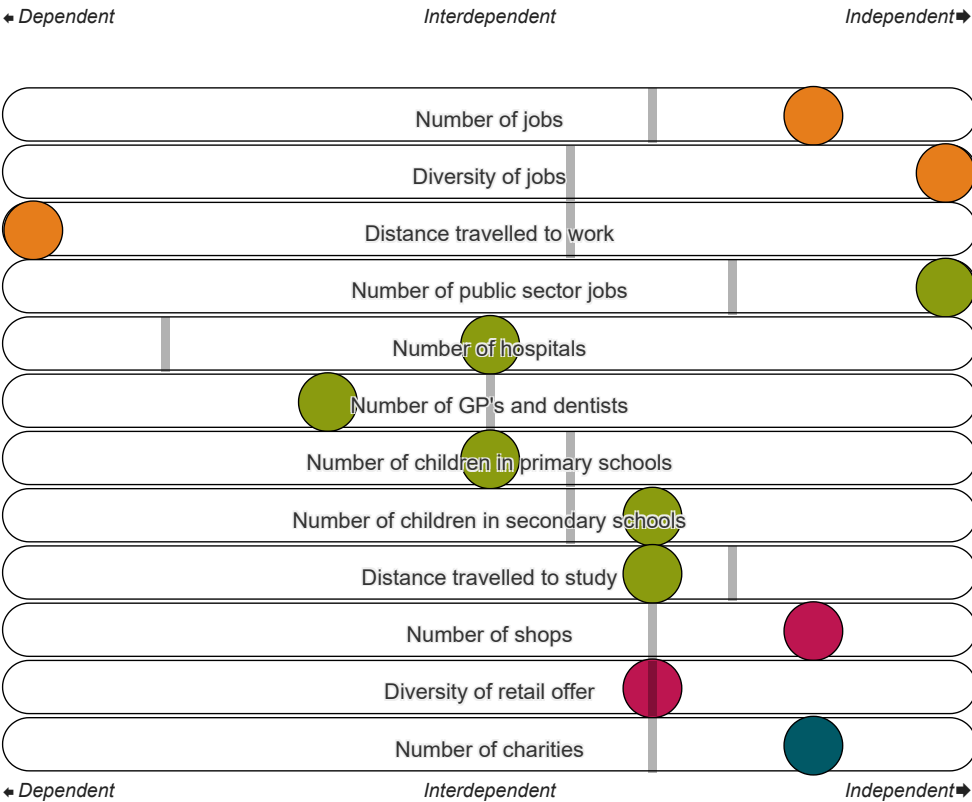
In large towns such as this one, the population typically is older. The group has higher social grade status than other groups, a higher proportion are owner occupiers and car ownership is also higher.

Stonehaven is an interdependent to independent town.

Stonehaven is an **interdependent to independent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Stonehaven is grouped with 7 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of children in primary schools, children in secondary schools, jobs, GP's and dentists, and diversity of retail offer. It also has similarities in the distance travelled to study.

It differs in terms of the number of hospitals. It also differs in the diversity of jobs. Stonehaven differs most from its group in the distance travelled to work.

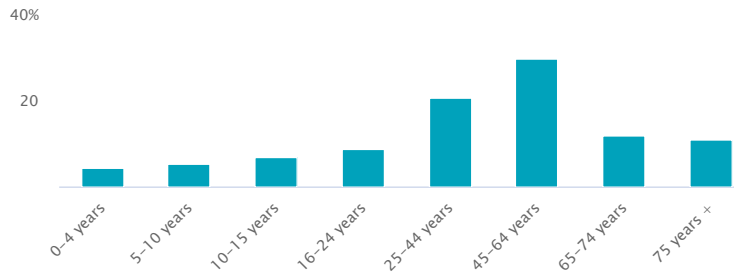

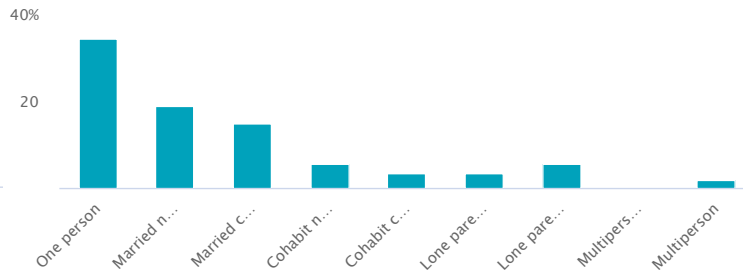

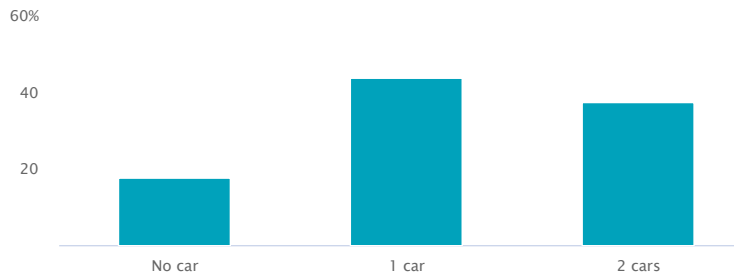

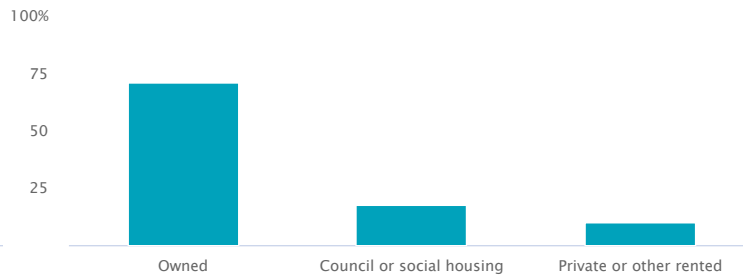

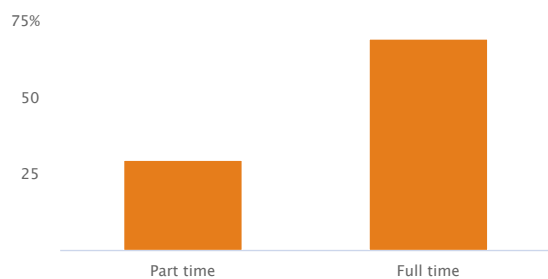

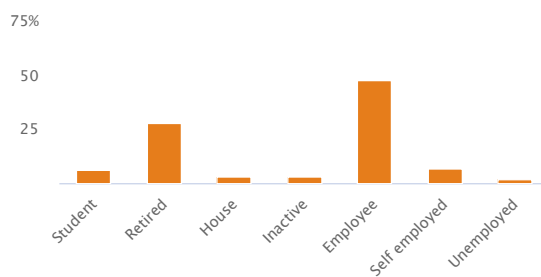
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



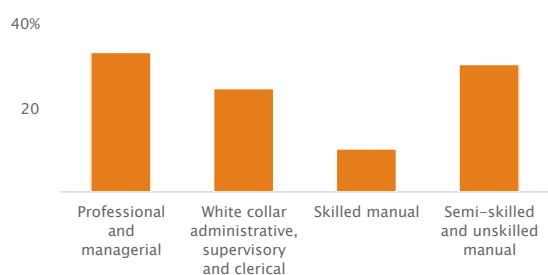
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

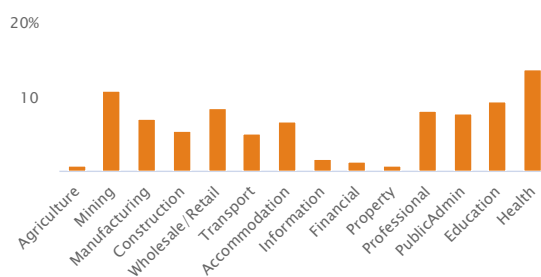

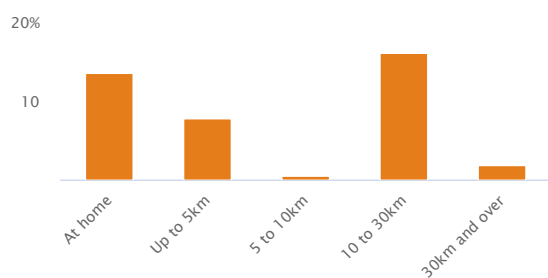
(% households aged 16-64)

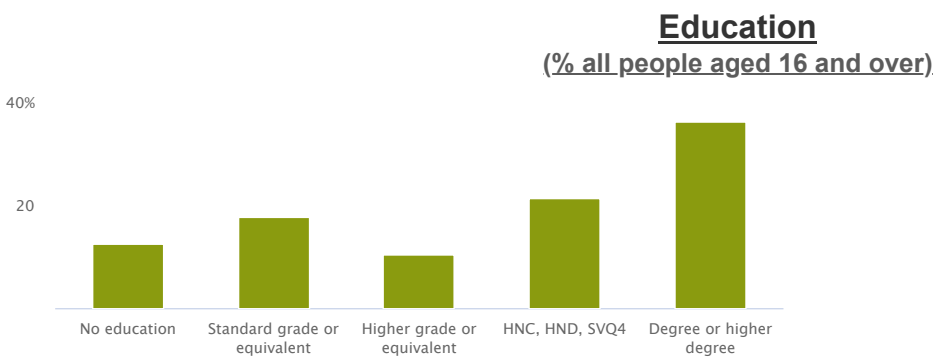


Sector Diversity

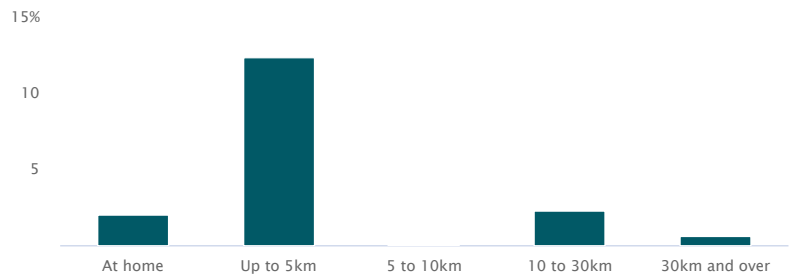
