



Stonehouse

SOUTH LANARKSHIRE

POPULATION **5,600**

Stonehouse is to be found in South Lanarkshire. It is the site of an old settlement from the Iron Age which developed in the 1800s as a weaving town and later as a mining town. It was intended as a site for a new town in the 1970s but plans were abandoned due to lack of interest from industry. It has an animal feeds production plant (Galloway and Macleod). The town is primarily residential and has local services. New housing has been built for commuters.

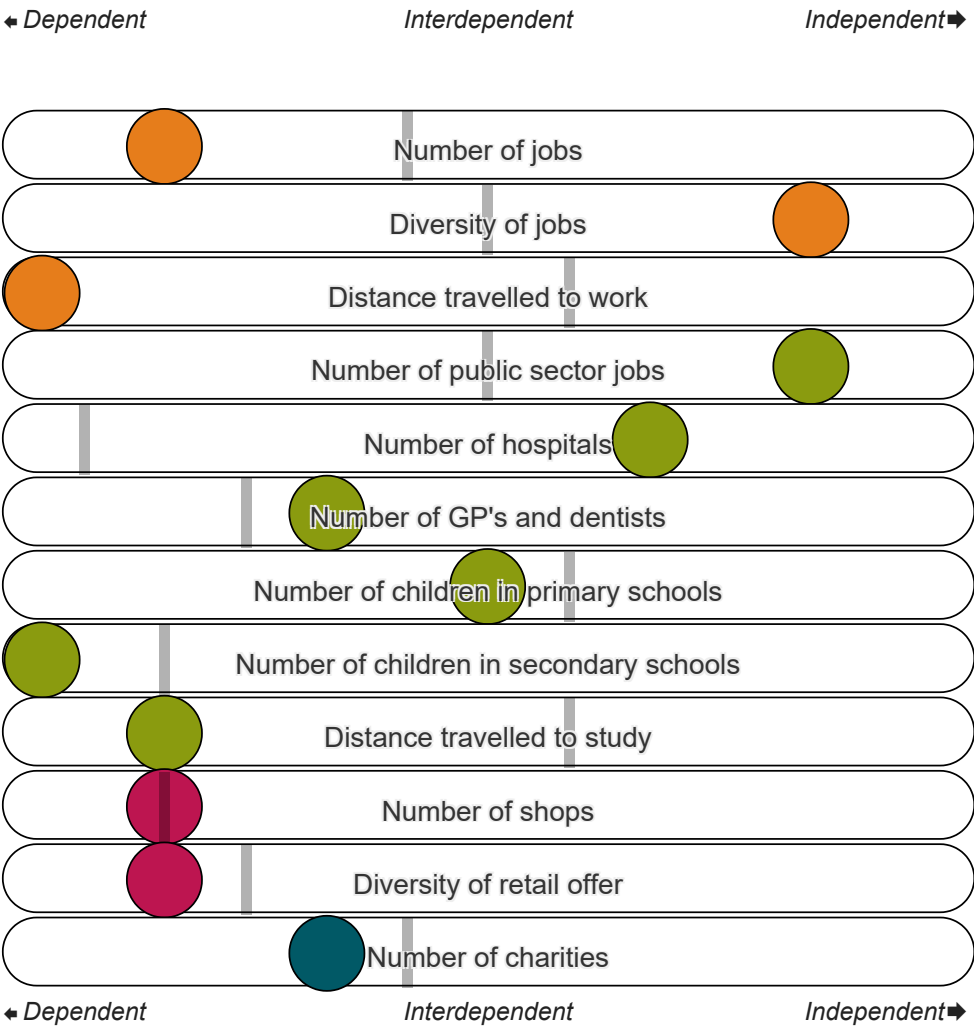
In this and similar medium towns, this population comprises families with a higher proportion of adults in the 25–44 age grouping. Higher rates of full time employment are found.

Stonehouse is an interdependent to dependent town.

Its most similar towns are [Bannockburn](#), [Bargeddie](#), [Carfin](#), and [Danderhall](#).

Stonehouse is an **interdependent to dependent** town.

Combining inter-relationships and typology, Stonehouse is grouped with 14 other towns. It has similarities to these towns in terms of the number of charities, children in primary schools, children in secondary schools, shops, GP's and dentists, and diversity of retail offer.

It differs in terms of the number of hospitals, jobs, and public sector jobs. It also differs in the diversity of jobs, and the distance travelled to study. Stonehouse differs most from its group in the distance travelled to work.

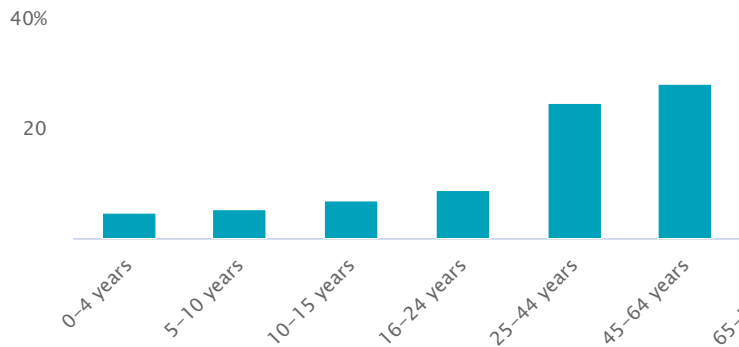

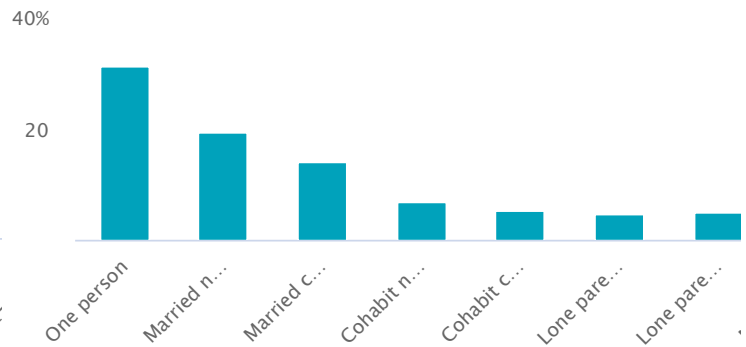

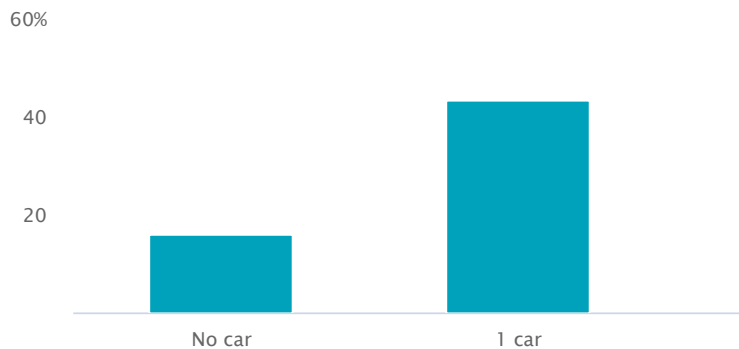

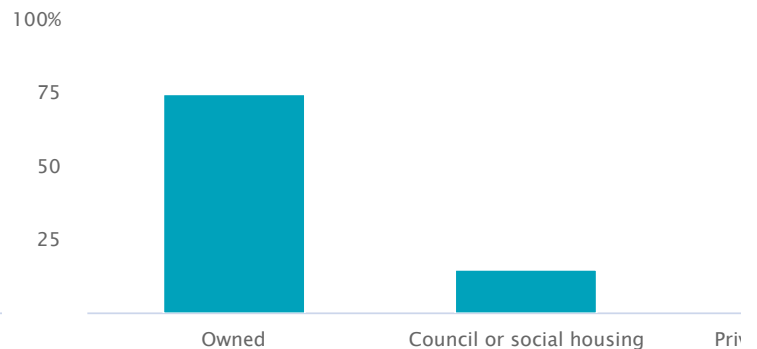

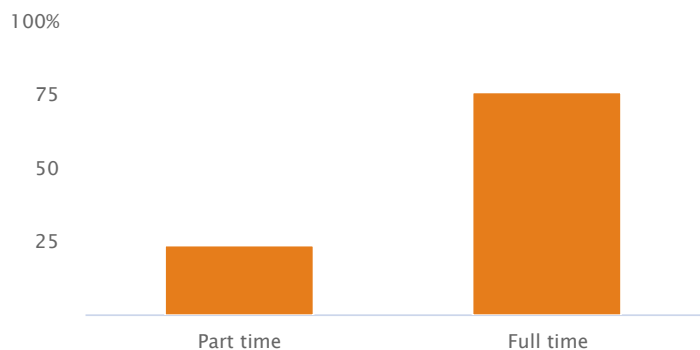

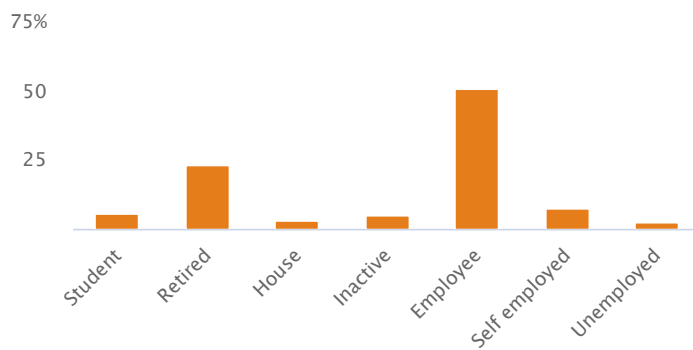
Employment type

(% working full time vs part time aged 16-74)



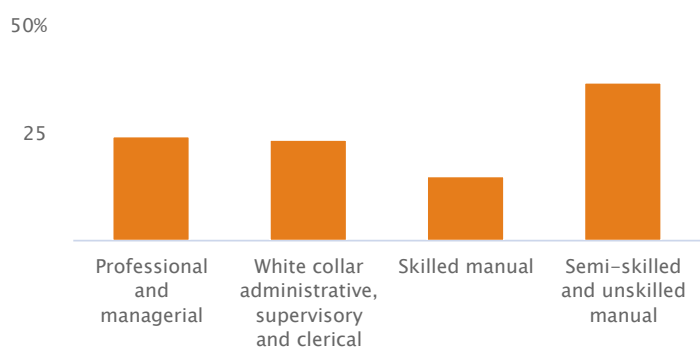
Occupation

(% aged 16-74)

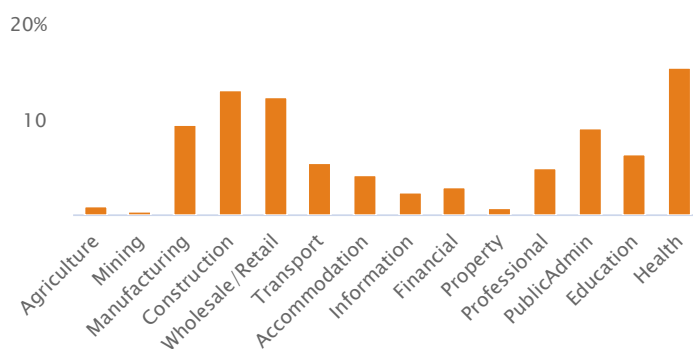

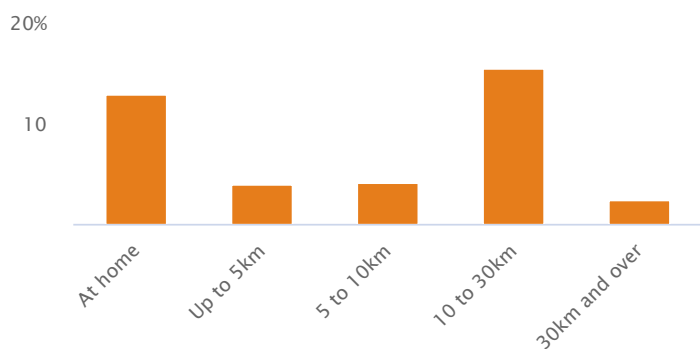
(% households aged 16-64)



Sector Diversity

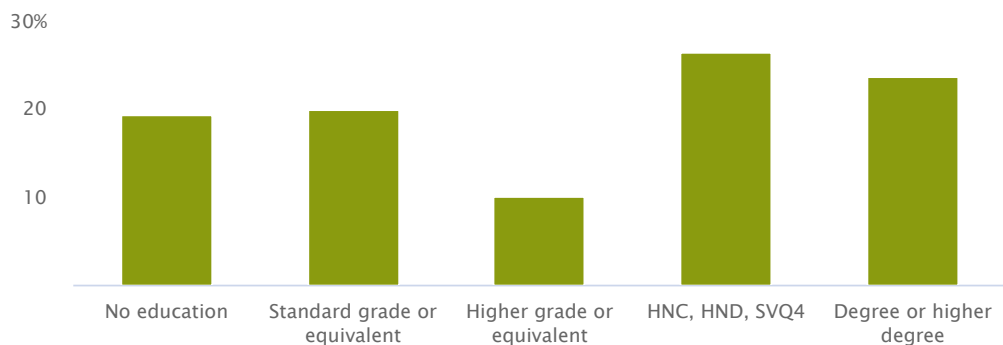


Distance travelled to work

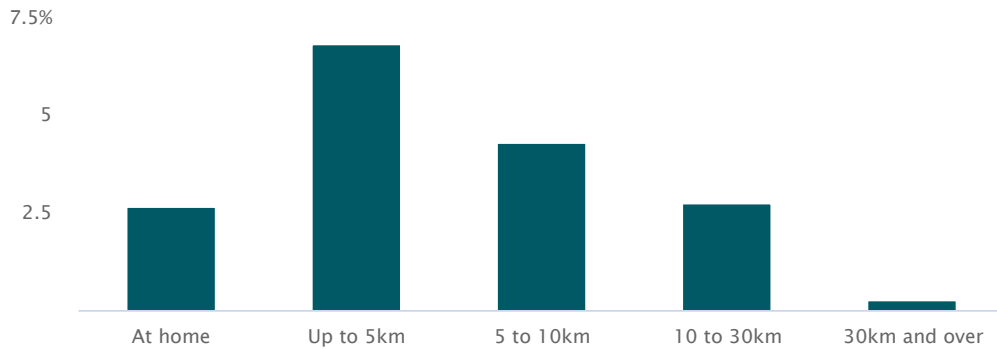
